MILWAUKEE BREWERS (39-25) vs PHILADELPHIA PHILLIES (32-30)

Sunday, June 10, 2018 – Citizens Bank Park – 1:35 EDT – Game 63; Home 31

RHP Brandon Woodruff (2-0, 6.05) vs RHP Zach Eflin (2-2, 3.74)

- YESTERDAY'S ACTION:** The Phillies fell to the Milwaukee Brewers, 12-3, at Citizens Bank Park ... Starter Jake Arrieta (L, 5-4), went 5.1 innings and allowed 5 runs (4 ER) on 4 hits with 3 walks and 4 strikeouts ... Rhys Hoskins made his return from a fractured jaw and went 2-for-4 with a HR and 3 RBI.
- HOME SWEET HOME:** The Phillies have returned home following a season-long 11-day, 10-game road trip to LAD (2-2), SF (0-3) and CHI (1-2) ... Philadelphia, whose 30 home games are tied for 7th-fewest in baseball will play 16 of their next 22 games at home through July 4 ... **Philadelphia is 19-11 (.633) this season at Citizens Bank Park, which is tied for the best home winning percentage in the National League (also, SF) and T-4th best in baseball, trailing only NYY (.710), BOS (.697) and CLE (.645).**
- 20/20 VISION:** With a win today, the Phillies will have secured their 20th victory at home on June 10 ... It would be the earliest in the season the Phillies reached the 20-win mark at CBP since 2011, when they started 20-10, clinching their 20th victory on June 6 of that season ... Below are the dates listed from 2012-2017 when the Phillies clinched win #20 in South Philly and their respective record at the time.

- GRAND CENTRAL:** The Phillies are in the midst of a 25-game stretch during which they do not play a single divisional opponent (5/26 vs TOR – 6/20 vs STL), but play their National League Central foes 12 times, all of which occur in a span of 15 games, 6/5 at CHI to 6/20 at STL ... Philadelphia is 10-6 against the NL Central this season, starting the year with an eight-game winning streak against teams from the division ... They are 15-8 against the division dating back to 7/6/17 at MIL.
- POWER PLAY:** Rhys Hoskins belted his seventh home run of the season in his return from the DL yesterday, a three-run shot that gave the Phillies the lead ... Each of Hoskins' seven home runs this season have put the Phillies ahead, and he is T-2nd in the NL and T-6th in baseball in that category ... As a club, Philadelphia has 29 go-ahead home runs this season, tied for the 4th-most in baseball with OAK, trailing only NYY (33), WSH (32) and STL (31)... Go-ahead home runs account for 44.6 % of the Phillies total home runs (29 of 65), while all the other teams with more go-ahead shots have hit between 12 and 38 more **total** homers than Philadelphia ... Since hitting their second go-ahead home run of the season on April 7, the Phillies have not gone more than four straight days without somebody hitting a home run to give them the lead in a ballgame ... In addition to Hoskins' putting the Phillies in front with all seven of his longballs, **Nick Williams** has done so with six of his seven homers, and **Odubel Herrera** with four of seven.
- YES SER!** Prior to allowing two runs in his second inning of work on 6/6 at SF, **Seranthony Dominguez** extended his streak of consecutive scoreless innings to begin his career to 15.2 with a perfect 8th ... **Per Elias, it was the longest scoreless streak by a Phillies' pitcher to begin a career since Marty Bystrom began his with 20.0 scoreless innings in 1980** ... During the streak, he faced 49 batters, allowed 3 baserunners (2 H, HB) and struck out 16 ... Additionally, Dominguez drew a walk in his first career plate appearance in the top of the ninth, recording his first walk at the plate before walking his first batter of his career on the mound ... Since his debut on May 7, Dominguez has allowed only three hits and one walk in 16.0 innings of work ... He has the best WHIP of any pitcher in the majors with at least 15.0 innings in that span.
- EXTRA, EXTRA:** The Phillies have collected at least one extra-base hit in 58 consecutive games (since 4/4) ... The only club in the majors with a longer extra-base hit streak this season is the Chicago Cubs (61 G, 3/29-current) ... This current stretch marks Philadelphia's longest extra-base hit streak since 7/30/2008-6/25/2009, when they did so in 97 straight games.
- THANK YOU FOR YOUR PATIENCE:** The Phils have seen a total of 9,418 pitches over 2,337 plate appearances this season and their 4.03 pitches per plate appearance rank 2nd in the NL and 3rd in the majors (best in both: LAD, 4.05) ... **Philadelphia has the 2nd-best walk in the majors this season at 10.2 % (best: NYY, 10.2 %) and they rank 3rd in the majors in walks with 238 (best:, NYY, 244) ... Cesar Hernandez (43, T-2nd), Carlos Santana (41, 5th) and Rhys Hoskins (34, T-10th)** all rank within the top 10 in the NL in walks this season, while Hernandez and Santana rank T-4th and T-8th, respectively, among all ML players ... The Phillies have not led the majors in walks for a full season in over 30 years (last: 1983, 640 BB).
- HONORING 1993:** Prior to today's game, members of the 1993 National League Champion Phillies will be honored on the field as we celebrate the 25th anniversary of that magical season in which they finished 97-65, made it to the World Series and captured the city's hearts with their energy and unmatched passion for the game ... During the third inning today, 1B John Kruk, 2B Mickey Morandini and 3B Dave Hollins will change the bases.
