RECENT RESULTS: The Tigers picked up a 5-4 win over the Royals on Saturday night at Comerica Park. Niko Goodrum returned to the lineup and went 3x4 with a double and two RBI, while Mikie Mahtook hit a go-ahead, two-run homer in the eighth inning. Nicholas Castellanos also added three hits in the win. Jordan Zimmermann started for Detroit and threw 7.0 strong innings, allowing two runs on three hits with two walks and five strikeouts in 7.0 innings. Joe Jiménez was credited with the win in relief after allowing a run in the eighth inning, while Shane Greene notched his 31st save of the season, giving up a run in the ninth inning. The Tigers and Royals wrap-up their four-game series this afternoon. Following today's game vs. Kansas City and an off day on Monday, Detroit wraps up the 2018 season next week with a six-game road trip, which includes three games at Minnesota (September 25-27) and three games at Milwaukee (September 28-30).

VMART CONCLUDES IMPRESSIVE CAREER: Victor Martinez wrapped up an impressive 16-year Major League career last night, starting at first base and going 1x1 with an infield single. In 1,973 games in his big league career, Martinez hit .295/.360/.455 with 914 runs scored, 423 doubles, three triples, 246 home runs and 1,178 RBI. Among all switch-hitters in MLB history, Martinez ranks 15th in RBI, tied for 16th in home runs, 18th in doubles and 23rd in hits (2,153). Martinez will finish his career as the Tigers all-time leader in RBI among switch-hitters, with 540. He is a five-time All-Star selection, a two-time Silver Slugger Award winner and the 2014 Edgar Martinez Award winner.

SAINT NICK: Nicholas Castellanos recorded his fourth consecutive multi-hit game last night, going 3x4 with a run scored and a double. Castellanos' three hits marked his 55th multi-hit game of the season, and his 19th game of three-or-more hits, which is tied with Seattle's Jean Segura for the Major League lead. With his double, Castellanos now has 45 doubles on the season, which ranks second in the American League and is tied for the 18th most in a season in franchise history. Through 20 games in September, Castellanos is hitting .405/.471/.676 with 10 runs scored, nine doubles, one triple, three home runs and 12 RBI. He leads the Majors with 30 hits and a .405 batting average this month, while he is tied for second in doubles and third in on-base percentage.

MAH-TOOK HIM DEEP: Mikie Mahtook belted his ninth home run of the season last night, a go-ahead, two-run shot in the eighth inning off Jason Hammel. After not homering in his first 33 games (122 PA) this season, Mahtook has hit nine home runs in his last 28 games (106 PA). Dating back to August 16, Mahtook ranks tied for fourth in the American League with nine homers.

CLOSE ENCOUNTERS: The Tigers played their 49th one-run game of the season last night, improving to 22-27 with a 5-4 win. Detroit's 49 one-run games are the third-most in the American League (Seattle, 57 and Tampa Bay, 56). In addition to the 49 one-run games, the Tigers have also played 30 games that have been decided by two runs.

WALKING ON SUNSHINE: The Tigers today will play their American League leading 70th day game of the season (out of 156 games, 44.9%). Detroit has posted a 30-39 (.435) record in the day time this season, as opposed to 33-53 (.384) at night.

AT COMERICA PARK: Detroit is 2-4 on its current seven-game homestand, which includes three games vs. Minnesota (0-3) and four games vs. Kansas City (2-1). The Tigers are concluding a stretch that will see them play 13-of-16 games at home. Detroit is 38-42 (.475) at Comerica Park this season. As a team, the Tigers are hitting .250/.308/.393 as a team, while the pitching staff has posted a 4.06 ERA (731.0IP/330ER).

TIGERS AND ROYALS: The Tigers trail the season series against Kansas City 10-8, but Detroit is 5-4 in nine

games at Comerica Park. With their win on Friday night, the Royals clinched the season series vs. the Tigers. It marks the fourth straight year that Kansas City has won the season series.

CENTRAL FOCUS: The Tigers are 32-40 against American League Central opponents this season. Detroit has gone 12-7 vs. Chicago (AL), 6-13 vs. Cleveland, 6-10 vs. Minnesota and 8-10 vs. Kansas City. This season marks the second straight year that the Tigers have finished with a below .500 record vs. divisional opponents.

ON DECK: The Tigers begin their final road trip of the season on Tuesday as they open a three-game series at Minnesota. The Twins have a 10-6 lead in the season series, including a 5-2 edge at Target Field. Detroit is 18-9 against Minnesota over the last 27 games played in Minneapolis. The Twins have won the season series over the Tigers for the second straight year.

NOTES ON THE SKIPPER: Ron Gardenhire is in his first season as the Tigers manager after being named to the position on October 20, 2017.

*Enters today's game with a 63-92 (.406) record as the Tigers manager and a 1,131-1,131 (.500) career record as a manager, which is the eighth-most wins among active managers and ranks 52nd in baseball history.

*Earned the 1,100th win of his managerial career on June 13 vs. Minnesota.

*Spent the 2017 season as the bench coach for the Arizona Diamondbacks, who captured a National League Wild Card spot and advanced to the National League Division Series.

*Served as manager of the Minnesota Twins from 2002-14 and is the winningest manager in Twins history, posting a record of 1,068-1,039 (.507) over his 13 seasons...is one of 10 managers in baseball history to win 1,000-or-more games with a single team.

*Guided the Twins to six postseason appearances (2002-04, 2006, 2009-10), including a berth in the 2002 American League Championship Series...was the first manager in MLB history to guide his team to the postseason in six of his first nine seasons.

*Named the BBWAA American League Manager of the Year in 2010...also finished runner-up for the honor on five occasions.

ABOUT DANIEL: Norris will make his 10th appearance and seventh start of the season this afternoon in the series finale vs. Kansas City.

LAST TIME OUT: Norris took the loss in his start on Tuesday vs. Minnesota, allowing two runs on five hits with three walks and five strikeouts in 5.1 innings.

VS. KANSAS CITY: Norris has faced the Royals eight times in his career, posting a 1-2 record with a 3.89 ERA (41.2IP/18ER) and 29 strikeouts. He made one start vs. Kansas City earlier this season on April 20 and received a no decision, giving up one run on three hits with three walks and five strikeouts in 4.2 innings.

AT COMERICA PARK: Norris has pitched in 24 career games, including 22 as a starter, at Comerica Park, and is 3-11 with a 5.49 ERA (114.2IP/70ER) and 111 strikeouts. In four home starts this season, Norris has a 0-2 record with a 5.03 ERA (19.2IP/11ER) and 20 strikeouts.

AGAINST THE AL CENTRAL: Norris has made 26 career appearances, including 21 starts, against teams from the American League Central and has a 6-5 record with a 3.61 ERA (117.1IP/47ER) and 103 strikeouts. In four outings, including two starts, vs. divisional opponents this season, Norris is 0-2 with a 4.41 ERA (16.1IP/8ER) and 19 strikeouts.

RECORD IN SEPTEMBER: Norris has pitched in 23 games, including 15 starts, in his career during the month of September, compiling a 3-4 record with a 4.14 ERA (82.2IP/38ER) and 79 strikeouts. In four starts this month, Norris is 0-3 with a 5.59 ERA (19.1IP/12ER) and 22 strikeouts.

LEFT VS. RIGHT: Lefties are batting .256 (68x266) against Norris in his career, while righties are hitting .272 (219x804). In nine appearances, including eight starts, this season, lefthanders are hitting .303 (10x33), while righties are batting .231 (24x104).

STREAKS SNAPPED: Norris had a pair of streaks snapped in his loss at Tampa Bay on April 20, 2017. He allowed four earned runs in his start, ending his streak of allowing three earned runs-or-less at 21 consecutive starts, which was the longest active streak in the Majors. The loss was Norris' first loss in 17 road starts to begin his career. His streak of 16 road starts without a loss to start his career is tied with Todd Wellemeyer and Larry Jensen for the second longest streak since 1913.

HELPING HIS OWN CAUSE: Making his first professional plate appearance, Norris hit a two-run home run in the second inning on August 19, 2015 at Chicago (NL) to record his first Major League hit, home run and RBI. Norris became the first Tiger pitcher to homer in a game since Jason Johnson on June 8, 2005 at Los Angeles (NL). He also became the first American League pitcher to hit a home run at Wrigley Field.

EARNING HIS FIRST BIG LEAGUE WIN: Norris earned the first victory of his Major League career on April 9, 2015 at New York (AL). Norris pitched 5.2 innings against the Yankees and allowed three runs on six hits with two walks and five strikeouts.

MAKING HIS MAJOR LEAGUE DEBUT: Norris made his Major League debut on September 5, 2014 at Boston and struck out David Ortiz, the only batter he faced in the game.

BACK TO THE FUTURES: Norris was selected to the U.S. Team for the 2014 SiriusXM All-Star Futures Game at Target Field in Minneapolis. In the game, Norris pitched a scoreless inning with one strikeout.

MISCELLANEOUS NOTES: Norris was acquired by the Tigers along with lefthanded pitchers Matthew Boyd and Jairo Labourt from the Blue Jays on July 30, 2015, in exchange for lefthanded pitcher David Price. Norris was selected by the Blue Jays in the second round of the 2011 MLB Draft.

VS. MINNESOTA/AT TARGET FIELD: Turnbull's only career outing against the Twins came on Wednesday, when he took the loss after giving up six runs on six hits with one walk and two strikeouts in 4.0 innings. Turnbull will be making his first career appearance at Target Field on Tuesday night.

AT ERIE/TOLEDO: Turnbull spent most of the season with Double A Erie, starting 19 games and posting a 4-7 record with a 4.47 ERA (98.2IP/49ER) and 105 strikeouts. He also started two games for Triple A Toledo, going 1-1 with a 2.03 ERA (13.1IP/3ER) and 19 strikeouts.
