ROSTER MOVES: Prior to today's game, the Mets recalled infielder Luis Guillorme from Las Vegas (AAA) of the Pacific Coast League and optioned catcher Tomás Nido to Las Vegas (AAA)... Guillorme will wear #15 and will be available for today's game... Guillorme's first appearance will be his major league debut... Guillorme, 23, was hitting .300 (27-90) with seven doubles, one triple, one home run, 15 RBI and a .394 OBP in 28 games for the 51s...He was a mid-season and post-season All-Star last year for Binghamton (AA) of the Eastern League...He hit .283 (136-481) with 20 doubles, 43 RBI and a .376 OBP...Guillorme was the toughest player in the EL to strikeout, once every 10.15 plate appearances in 2017...He was the Mets 10th-round pick in the 2013 First-Year Player Draft from Coral Springs Charter HS (FL)... In 502 minor league games, he's hit .285 with 73 doubles, three homers, 187 RBI and a .362 OBP.

METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets have lost seven of their last eight games and are 2-8 in their last 10 games...New York is 11-6 on the road this season...The .647 winning percentage away from Citi Field is the eighth-best in the majors...The Mets are 2-2 in rubber games this year... After winning each of its first five series of the season, New York has lost five of its last six series.

VS. CINCINNATI: The Mets are 22-6 (.786) against the Reds since 2014, which is the highest winning percentage by any major league team against an opponent in its own league over the last five seasons...Research courtesy of Elias...New York has outscored the Reds, 147-96 during that span.

IN CINCY: New York is 13-5 in its last 18 games at Great American Ball Park...The Mets have outscored the Reds, 95-67, over those 18 contests.

HOME RUN NOTES: New York has hit five homers in during the first two games of this series and have 29 homers in its last 15 games at Great American Ball Park dating to 2014.

GREAT AMERICAN BALL PARK: Jay Bruce ranks second in the ballpark's history with 136 homers, Todd Frazier is sixth on the list with 63 homers...Joey Votto is first with 144.

FIRST INNING: The Mets have allowed 32 first-inning runs this season, the fourth-most in the majors...New York has been outscored 14-5 in the opening frame over the last eight games.

DAY BASEBALL: New York is 7-4 in day games this season...The pitching staff has posted a 2.99 ERA (34 earned runs/102.1 innings, the fifth-lowest ERA in the majors during day contests.

ADRIÁN GONZÁLEZ: Has 14 homers and 34 RBI in 34 career games at Great American Ball Park...González has five home runs and 11 RBI in his last three games in this ballpark...González has three career multi-home run games at Great American Ball Park.

ROAD WARRIOR: Adrián González has hit all five of his home runs this season in road games...During his career, he's hit 59.18 percent of his home runs in road games, the second-highest percentage among the 146 players in major-league history with 300 homers, behind Joe Adcock (59.23%)...Courtesy of the Elias.

HONORING RUSTY STAUB: Mets Hall of Famer Rusty Staub passed away on March 29 at age 73... The Mets will wear a patch on the right sleeve on their home and away uniforms during the 2018 season honoring Staub...A six-time All-Star, he had 2,716 hits and 292 homers during his 23-year career.



DEVIN MESORACO: Will wear #29...He was acquired yesterday along with cash from Cincinnati in exchange for RHP Matt Harvey...Mesoraco, 29, was named to the 2014 All-Star team and became the second catcher in Reds history (also Johnny Bench) to hit 25 home runs in a season and drive in 80 runs...The 6-1, 229-pounder hit two doubles, one home run and had three RBI while hitting .220 (9- 41) in 18 games for the Reds this year.

JAY BRUCE: Jay Bruce hit his first home run as a visitor at Great American Ball Park on Monday...Bruce played with Cincinnati from 2008 until the Mets acquired him on August 1, 2016 where he was a three-time All-Star (2011-2012, 2016)...During that span with the Reds, Bruce ranked first in games (1,220), homers (233), RBI (718), triples (27), second in doubles (238), slugging (.470) and walks (454)...Bruce is hitting .293 (17-58) with two doubles, one triple, two home runs and seven RBI over his last 15 games dating to April 20.

FAB 50: Michael Conforto hit his 50th homer on Monday in his 928th at-bat...No one who made his MLB debut with the Mets reached 50 home runs in so few at-bats...Next-fastest were Darryl Strawberry (936 at-bats) and David Wright (1,046 at-bats)... Research courtesy of Elias.

ASDRÚBAL CABRERA: Is fifth in the National League with a .326 batting average, eighth in the NL with a .553 slugging percentage, is tied for fifth in the NL with 17 extra-base hits, tied for 11th with 23 runs scored and tied for sixth in the NL with 10 doubles...Cabrera is hitting .333 (26-78) with six doubles, three homers, 16 RBI and 11 runs scored over his last 19 games.

AMED ROSARIO: Is hitting .280 (7-25) with two doubles and two RBI this month after batting .233 (17-73) in April...Rosario is batting .278 (5-18) with nine RBI with runners in scoring position.

RUNS SCORED TIX PROMO: For each run scored by the Mets during the six games on this road trip (Cincinnati & Philadelphia), fans will save \$1 off tickets for select seats during the next homestand May 15-23 when the Mets host the Blue Jays, Diamondbacks and Marlins...After the first two games, fans can already save \$9 off Baseline Box and Bud Light Landing seating areas while supplies last...Tickets will be available at mets.com/ runs approximately one hour after the game on Sunday, May 13.

MEDICAL HISTORY

- » Underwent Tommy John Surgery at the Hospital for Special Surgery on March 24, 2015...Did not pitch in the majors in 2015 or 2016.
- » On the D.L. from June 20-July 1, 2017 (biceps tendinitis)
- » On the D.L. from July 24-end of 2017 season (stress reaction in right arm)

LAST TIME OUT: Took his second loss of the season, falling to the Rockies at Citi Field in an 8-7 loss on May 4...Pitched 6.0 innings, tying career highs with eight runs and 10 hits allowed...All eight runs were earned...Also allowed a season-high two home runs...Pitched into the seventh inning for the second time this season...Wheeler struck out three and walked three...The last time Wheeler allowed eight runs was June 13, 2017 vs the Cubs...At the plate, Wheeler collected his third hit of the season, tied for sixth-most by a pitcher this season and one shy of tying his single-season high.

VS. CINCINNATI: Wheeler today is facing the Reds for the second time in his career and first time since, September 7, 2014 at Great American Ball Park...In that start, Wheeler tossed 6.0 innings, allowing one run, earned, on five hits while striking out six and walking two in the Mets' 4-3 victory.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: Wheeler's start today is his fourth start away from Citi Field of the season...In his first three road starts, he is 2-0 with a 3.94 ERA (seven earned runs/16.0 innings)...The Mets have won each of his three away starts in 2018...In 39 career road starts, Wheeler is 15-8 with a 3.17 ERA (79 earned runs/224.0 innings)...Has fanned 208 and walked 91 batters on the road...Last season, he was 1-2 with a 4.34 ERA (18 earned runs/37.1 innings) in seven road starts.

RISP-ECT: Since his debut in 2013, Wheeler has held opposing batters to a .243 batting average (86-354) with runners in scoring position...This season, opponents are 8-25 (.320) with RISP, including a .500 mark (4-8) in his last start...Has allowed four homers to 423 batters faced in those situations (0.9% HR rate with RISP) in his career...Only two pitchers with at least 400 batters faced with runners in scoring position since 2013 have allowed fewer homers in those scenarios (Dellin Betances and Brad Ziegler, three home runs allowed each)...With runners in scoring position and two outs, opponents have hit .199 (32-161) against the righthander, including a .125 (1-8) mark this season.

NL CENTRAL: The Mets' win in Wheeler's April 24 start at St. Louis halted a five-game losing streak in his starts against NL Central squads...In 14 career starts against the NL Central, Wheeler is 3-5 with a 4.18 ERA (28 earned runs/60.1 innings)...Has fanned 62 batters and walked 25 in his matchups vs. NL Central teams.

WHEELER'S CAREER SNAPSHOT

- » Selected by the San Francisco Giants with the sixth overall pick in the first round of the 2009 First-Year Player Draft.
- » Acquired by the Mets, along with cash considerations, in exchange for outfielder Carlos Beltran on July 28, 2011.
- » Made his Major League debut on June 18, 2013 at Atlanta...Became the third pitcher in team history to earn a victory while throwing 6.0 or more shutout innings in his major league debut.
- » Led the Mets in starts (32) and strikeouts (187) in the 2014 season.
- » Threw a three-hit shutout in the Mets' 1-0 victory over the Marlins on June 19 at Marlins Park...Became the youngest Mets pitcher (24yr, 20d) to throw a 1-0 shutout since Dwight Gooden threw two of them in 1985 at age 20 years and 240 days old.
- » Was placed on the 60-Day Disabled List on April 21, 2015 through the end of the season while recovering from Tommy John surgery...Missed the 2015 and 2016 seasons.
- » Returned to game action in 2017 after missing the 2015 and 2016 seasons recovering from Tommy John surgery...Made his second career Opening Day Roster...Allowed one run or fewer in six of his 17 starts.
- » His 2017 season ended when he was placed on the 60-Day Disabled List on September 23 after two stints on the 10-Day Disabled List.

FRIDAY'S STARTER: LHP STEVEN MATZ (1-3, 4.23)

LAST START: Turned in his first quality start of 2018, and first since July 3 of last season at Washington, in his last start, May 5 vs. Colorado...Was left a tough-luck loser in the Mets' 2-0 shutout loss after throwing a season-high 6.0 innings and allowing a season-low-tying one run, earned, on three hits with five strikeouts and one walk...The one run came on a Nolan Arenado solo home run in the first inning.

MATZ IN MAY: Matz will be making his seventh-career start in the month of May tonight...In six-career May starts, Matz is 4-1 with a 1.34 ERA (six earned runs/40.1 innings pitched)...Opponents have managed 24 hits in 142 at-bats vs. Matz in May (.169)...His 7.20 K/BB (36 strikeouts/five walks) ratio is the best out of any month in his career, as is his 0.72 WHIP.
