HERE'S THE STORY...

- ♦ The D-backs' 7-2 start matches the best 9-game start in team history (also: 2007, '08, '17)...they have started 8-2 once ('08).
- ♦ Arizona has opened the season with 3 consecutive series wins for the first time in club history.
- ♦ The D-backs are 7-2 in their last 9 games vs. Giants...Arizona went 12-7 vs. the Giants in 2017, including 4-5 at AT&T Park.
- ♦ The D-backs have won each of their 6 games when their opponent starts a left-handed pitcher since Sept. 26, 2017.
- ♦ **Paul Goldschmidt** is a .310 career hitter 16 doubles, 9 home runs and 41 RBI @ AT&T Park.

YESTERDAY'S RECAP

- ♦ The D-backs earned a series victory in St. Louis, defeating the Cardinals, 4-1.
- ♦ **David Peralta** went 2-for-4 with a 2-run home run (2)...**A.J. Pollock** also was 2-for-4 with a home run (1)...**Chris Owings** went 1-for-1, extending his hitting streak to 8 games (11-for-25, .440).
- ♦ **Taijuan Walker** allowed 1 run and 3 hits in 6.0 innings...**Yoshihisa Hirano** notched his first Major League win after tossing a perfect seventh inning...**Archie Bradley** earned his Major-League-leading fifth hold and **Brad Boxberger** earned his fourth save, tied for most in the Majors (also: Roberto Osuna, Jeurys Familia, Wade Davis).

- ♦ **Torey Lovullo** earned his 100th win yesterday in his 171st regular season game as a Major League manager, becoming the fastest active manager to reach 100 wins [source: Elias]:

FAST START

- ♦ Arizona's 7-2 (.778) record is tied for the best 9-game start in team history (also: 2007, '08 '17), and is tied with the Pirates for the second best record in the NL behind the Mets (.875; 7-1).

LOVIN' LEFTIES

- ♦ The D-backs have won each of their 6 games when their opponent starts a left-handed pitcher since Sept. 26, 2017, with the opposing lefties posting a 10.80 ERA (28 ER in 23.1 IP) in those contests.
- ♦ Since Aug. 12, 2017, Arizona is 17-3 when their opponents start a left-handed pitcher.

FOUR SCORE AND MANY WINS AGO

- ♦ Arizona has won 8 consecutive games when scoring 4 or more runs since Sept. 26, 2017, as well as 12 of its last 13 since Sept 13, and 22 of its last 26 since Aug. 22.

FROM THE TRAINING TABLE

- ♦ **Steven Souza Jr.** played in an extended Spring Training game this afternoon at Salt River Fields.
- ♦ **Randall Delgado** made a start for Single-A Adv. Visalia on Saturday (0 ER in 1.0 IP, 9 pitches), and will throw again for the Rawhide tomorrow.
- ♦ **Jake Lamb** began playing catch over the weekend.

ROAD WARRIORS

- ♦ Over their last 22 road games since Aug. 21, 2017, the D-backs are 15-7 (.682), the best record in the NL and third best in baseball behind the Indians (.783; 18-5) and Red Sox (.731; 19-7).
- ♦ In that time, Arizona's starting pitching has gone 10-6 with a 2.80 ERA (38 ER in 122.1 IP), 134 strikeouts and 50 walks.

GODLEY AT A GLANCE

- ◆ Fourth season with the D-backs.
- ◆ Acquired from the Cubs on Dec. 9, 2014, with RHP Jeferson Mejia, for C Miguel Montero.
- ◆ Cubs' 10th-round pick in the 2013 draft.

LAST START

- ◆ Earned the win in his 2018 debut on April 3 vs. Dodgers, allowing 1 run on 4 hits in 7.0 innings.
- ◆ Limited the Dodgers hitless in 6 at-bats with runners in scoring position.

THINGS TO KNOW...

- ◆ Is looking to win his first 2 starts of the season for the second time in his career (also: 2015).
- ◆ Earned his second win of 2017 on June 22 @ Rockies (ninth start).
- ◆ Will be making his first-ever appearance at AT&T Park.

VS. GIANTS

- ◆ Is making his fifth career appearance (third start)...is 1-1 with a 7.84 ERA (9 ER in 10.1).
- ◆ Has never pitched at AT&T Park.
- ◆ Won his first career start vs. Giants on Sept. 9, 2015 @ Chase Field (1 ER in 5.0 IP).

LIKING THE NL WEST ROAD LIFE

- ◆ Has allowed 3 runs or fewer in 6 of his 7 career road starts vs. NL West opponents.

MONTHLY MUSINGS

- ◆ Is making only his third career appearance in April (1-0, 2.25 ERA).
- ◆ Has gone 5-2 with a 2.67 ERA (25 ER in 84.1) in 16 career starts from April-June.

NO TROUBLE WITH THE CURVE HERE

- ◆ Finished second in the Majors by throwing 852 curveballs in 2017, behind Rich Hill/LAD (871) and ahead of Gio Gonzalez/WSH (829) and Aaron Nola/PHI (820) [source: Baseball Prospectus].
- ◆ Opponents hit .151 with a .229 slugging pct. on the curve in 2017...threw a career-high 51 curve balls on Aug. 13, 2017 vs. Cubs.
- ◆ Changed how he threw his curveball after conversations with then teammate Jeremy Hellickson in 2015.

PLAYER PROFILE

- ◆ As a senior at University of Tennessee, in 2013, he led the SEC in complete games (6) and innings (108.1) and has second in strikeouts (98).
- ◆ Nickname is the "Bull" because his teammates at Tennessee called him that due to his demeanor on the mound and his sprints on and off the field.
- ◆ Is an avid bass fisherman...has accidentally sunk 2 boats.
- ◆ Roomed the majority of the 2017 with Andrew Chafin in his 42-foot RV.
- ◆ Was an alternate on the 2012 USA Baseball Collegiate National Team, appearing in 4 games.
- ◆ Married to Autumn.

WHO WANTS MORE CURVEBALL INFO?

- ◆ Ranked third in the NL on "whiff rates" on curveballs in 2017 (45.74)...only Jon Lester/CHC (50.32) and Robbie Ray/ARI (47.27) were better.
- ◆ His average velocity on his curveball (83.44) in 2017 was fourth hardest in the NL, trailing Jimmy Nelson/MIL (84.87), Luis Perdomo/SD (84.80) and Alex Wood/LAD (83.78).

2017 REVIEW

- ◆ Set career highs in starts (25), wins (8), innings (155.0) and strikeouts (165) in his third season with the D-backs, going 8-9 with a 3.37 ERA, 53 walks and a .221 opponent average.
- ◆ Among NL starters (min. 20 GS), ranked ninth with a 1.14 WHIP and .657 opponent OPS and 10th with a .221 opponent average.
- ◆ Recorded 4 strikeouts in the first inning on Aug. 13, 2017 vs. Cubs, the second pitcher in team history to record 4 strikeouts in a single inning, joining Oliver Perez on Sept. 20, 2014 @ Rockies.

POSTSEASON: Threw 5.0 innings of 2-run baseball with 5 strikeouts out of the bullpen in his lone appearance in NLDS Game 1 @ Dodgers.

#31 • BRAD BOXBERGER • R/R

STL Series: 2-2 SV, 0 ER/1.0 IP, K

- ◆ Has a 12-game scoreless streak (12.0 IP) dating back to Sept. 9, 2017.
- ◆ Left-handers are 0-for-5 (.000).
- ◆ Named the D-backs closer by manager Torey Lovullo on March 27.
- ◆ Limited to 30 games in 2017 due to a strained right flexor muscle, going 4-4 with a 3.38 ERA and 40 strikeouts (12.27 SO/9.0 IP).
- ◆ Was a 2015 American League All-Star and led the league in saves (41).
- ◆ Acquired from the Rays on Nov. 30, 2017 for RHP Curtis Taylor.

#25 • ARCHIE BRADLEY • R/R

STL Series: 2 HLD, 0 ER/1.1 IP, 2 K

- ◆ 5 of his 6 appearances have been scoreless.
- ◆ Registered at least 1 strikeout in 7 straight outings dating back to 2017 (11 SO total).
- ◆ Went 3-3 with 1 save, a 1.73 ERA, 79 strikeouts, 21 walks and a .207 opponents average in 63 games in 2017, his first season as a reliever...ranked among NL relievers in holds (T-2nd, 25), ERA (5th), WHIP (11th, 1.04) and strikeouts (T-11th).
- ◆ Set the single-season, club reliever record in ERA.
- ◆ Recorded the fifth triple by a pitcher (first by a reliever) in Postseason history in the 2017 Wild Card Game vs. Rockies.

#40 • ANDREW CHAFIN • R/L

STL Series: HLD, 0 ER/0.2 IP, K

- ◆ His 9-game scoreless streak (5.1 IP) dating back to 2017 ended on April 2 vs. Dodgers.
- ◆ In 2017, posted career highs in appearances (71) and strikeouts (61), going 1-0 with a 3.51 ERA and .246 opponents average...his 71 appearances were the second most by a D-backs lefty reliever all time (Randy Choate, 74 in 2004).
- ◆ Ranked among NL relievers in 2017 in inherited runners (4th, 49) and groundball/flyball ratio (T-6th, 3.08).
- ◆ Has lived in a RV during the season since 2016.

#29 • JORGE DE LA ROSA • L/L

STL Series: -

- ◆ Has an 8-game scoreless streak (5.0 IP) dating back to Sept. 22, 2017.
- ◆ Is the first D-backs pitcher to appear in the club's first 4 games of a season.
- ◆ Went 3-1 with a 4.21 ERA in a career-high 65 games in 2017, his first as primarily a reliever since 2006 with the Brewers and Royals...lefties hit .194/.253 OBP/.292 SLG.
- ◆ Led the Majors with a 3.0 inherited runners scored pct. (1 IRS/33 IR) in 2017, tied for the lowest pct. since 1974 (also: Wilton Lopez/HOU in 2010)...stranded his first 24 inherited runners to start the season (allowed run on Aug. 18 @ Twins).
- ◆ 1 of 5 Mexican-born pitchers with 100+ wins (104), joining Fernando Valenzuela (173), Esteban Loaiza (126), Yovani Gallardo (113) and Ismael Valdez (104).

#66 • YOSHIHISA HIRANO • R/R

STL Series: W, HLD, 0 ER/2.0 IP, 2 K

- ◆ Has held opponents scoreless in 5 of 6 outings...has not issued a walk.
- ◆ Earned his first Major League win on April 8 vs. Cardinals.
- ◆ Is the second player of Japanese descent to play for the D-backs (also: Takashi Saito).
- ◆ Appeared in 58 games for the Orix Buffaloes of Japan's Nippon Professional Baseball League in 2017, going 3-7 with 29 saves and 2.67 ERA.
- ◆ Led the NPBL in saves (40) in 2014 and earned the league's Most Valuable Middle Reliever honors in 2011...played 12 seasons (2006-17) with Orix, going 48-69 with 156 saves, a 3.10 ERA and 884 strikeouts in 549 appearances (68 starts).
- ◆ Signed a 2-year contract with the D-backs on Jan. 12.

#30 • T.J. McFARLAND • L/L

STL Series: -

- ◆ Went 4-5 with a 5.33 ERA in a career-high 43 appearances in 2017.
- ◆ Ranked among NL relief leaders last season in groundball pct. (1st, 69.8) and groundball/flyball ratio (2nd, 4.88).
- ◆ Limited lefties to a .222 average (16-for-72) with 3 extra-base hits and 16 strikeouts.
- ◆ Had 16 outings of more than 1.0 inning.

#57 • FERNANDO SALAS • R/R

STL Series: 0 ER/1.0 IP, K

- ◆ Tied his career high with 3.0 innings on April 3 vs. Dodgers (also: April 20, 2011 vs. Nationals).
- ◆ Made 61 appearances with the Mets and Angels in 2017, going 2-2 with a 5.22 ERA.
- ◆ Began 2017 with the Mets and pitched in 48 games before his release on Aug. 15...signed with the Angels as a Minor League free agent on Aug. 19 and was 1-0 with a 2.63 ERA and 0.66 WHIP in 13 games.
- ◆ Is 1 of 2 players from Huatabampo, Mexico to play in the Major Leagues (also: Mel Amada, who was the first Mexico-born player to play in the Majors).
- ◆ Pitched for Team Mexico in the 2013 and '17 World Baseball Classics.

#13 • NICK AHMED • R/R **6-2 • 195 • 28 (March 15, 1990)**
STL Series: 1-5, RBI, BB **Trip:** 1-5, RBI, BB

- ♦ Had a career-high 5 RBI on March 30 vs. Rockies...matched the team record for RBI in a single game by a shortstop (also: Stephen Drew, April 28, 2011 vs. Cubs).
- ♦ Limited to 53 games in 2017 after suffering a pair of right-hand injuries, hitting .251 with 6 homers and 21 RBI.
- ♦ Was initially placed on the 10-day disabled list on June 28...suffered a broken right wrist in a rehab on Aug. 27.
- ♦ Rated by *Baseball America* as the NL's second-best defensive shortstop in 2017.
- ♦ His 34 defensive runs saved at shortstop ranks third in the NL since 2015, behind Brandon Crawford (48) and Addison Russell (47).
