PHILADELPHIA PHILLIES (23-16) vs BALTIMORE ORIOLES (13-28)

Wednesday, May 16, 2018 – Camden Yards – 12:05 EDT – Game 40; Road 18

RHP Nick Pivetta (2-2, 4.15) vs RHP Andrew Cashner (1-4, 4.84)

- SUNDAY'S ACTION:** The Phillies defeated the New York Mets, 4-2, at Citizens Bank Park ... Starter Aaron Nola (W, 6-1), went 6.0 inning and allowed 1 run on 9 hits with 2 walks and 4 strikeouts ... In front of a 34,091 on Mother's Day, the Phils were trailing 1-0 in the bottom of the 6th inning when Nick Williams came through with a huge 3-run pinch-hit home run ... Carlos Santana followed with an insurance solo shot of his own and Edubray Ramos picked up his first career save as the Phils salvaged a split of the rains-shortened two-game series.

- PHILLIE SPECIAL:** The Phillies have won 23 of their first 39 games this season, and with a win today, could post their best record through 40 games since the 2011 season when they opened with a 25-15 record ... Additionally, a win today would bring them to eight games over the .500 mark for the season, a watermark they have not accomplished since the end of the 2011 season ... After getting off to a 1-4 start to 2018, the Phillies have gone 22-12 over their last 34 games (4/5-current) ... Their .647 win percentage in that span is tops among all National League teams and ranks 2nd in the majors, trailing only the Yankees (.706 %).

- RAGING BULL:** Odubel Herrera has reached base safely in a career-best 41 straight games (since 9/27/17), posting a .361/.426/.555 slash line over 176 plate appearances during the streak ... Per *Elias*, he is tied for the 5th-longest on-base streak in Phillies history with Pete Rose (1982) and Don Hurst (1929) ... Overall, Herrera's 41-game on-base streak is the longest of any major league player since 2016 when Freddie Freeman reached in 46 straight ... Herrera, hitting .360 (50-139) this season, owns the best batting average in the majors ... For the month of May, he is slashing .400/.500/.700 with 3 doubles, 3 home runs and 7 walks to 7 strikeouts in 48 plate appearances.

- NON-DIVISION DOMINANCE:** The Phillies have gone 8-14 against the National League East this season, but are a combined 15-2 against all other teams (7-0 vs NL Central, 5-2 vs NL West, 3-0 vs AL East) ... **Philadelphia's .882 winning percentage outside of their own division is the best mark in the majors (next: NYY, 17-3, .850).**

- SUNDAY, MONDAY, HAPPY DAYS, TUESDAY, WEDNESDAY, HAPPY DAYS...:** The Phillies are one of only two teams in the majors this season with a .500 or better record every day of the week ... The Phils have gone 2-2 on Monday, 3-3 on Tuesday, 4-2 on Wednesday, 3-2 on Thursday, 4-2 on Friday, 4-2 on Saturday and 3-3 on Sunday ... **The only other team in the majors that can claim a .500 record or better each day of the week are the New York Yankees.**

- ARMS RACE:** Philadelphia's starting staff has allowed 3 ER or fewer in each of their last eight starts (5/5-current), posting a 1.29 ERA (7 ER, 49.0 IP) in those eight games ... This season, the Phillies staff ranks 4th among all major league rotations in FIP (3.56), 5th in fWAR (4.4), 6th in walk rate (7.2%) and 7th in ERA (3.53) ... Furthermore, Philadelphia's staff has allowed 60 extra-base hits this season, third-fewest of any staff in baseball ... At 24.8 %, the starting staff is allowing the least hard contact (balls in play, 95 MPH+) of any staff in the majors (next: HOU, 29.3 %) ... The Phillies boast four pitchers inside the top six of least hard contact allowed in the majors: Jake Arrieta (1st, 20.5%), Aaron Nola (2nd, 22.3 %), Nick Pivetta (4th, 24.6 %) and Vince Velasquez (6th, 24.8 %).

- INTERLEAGUE INTRIGUE:** After losing eight straight Interleague games to start 2017, Philadelphia has gone 8-7 against AL teams since (6/15/17-current) ... In their first and only Interleague series to date this season, the Phillies swept the Tampa Bay Rays in a three-game set in Tampa ... With a win today, the Phillies will have a four-game winning streak in Interleague play for the first time since 2010 (6/22-24 vs CLE & 6/25 vs TOR).

- SLAMTANA:** First baseman **Carlos Santana** has collected 10 extra-base hits (4 2B, 3B, 5 HR) over his last nine games (5/4-current) and has posted a .324/.342/.892 slash line in those nine games ... Santana ranks 3rd among all ML players in extra-base hits and slugging in that span, behind only CLE's Francisco Lindor (11 XBH, 1.000 SLG) and CLE's Jose Ramirez (.11 XBH, .897).

- THANK YOU FOR YOUR PATIENCE:** The Phillies have seen a total of 6,142 pitches over 1,493 plate appearances this season ... Philadelphia's 4.11 pitches per plate appearance lead the majors (next: LAD, 4.08) ... The Phillies have reached base via a walk in each of their first 39 games this season and in 54 consecutive games (9/16/17-current) dating back to last season ... That is the longest base on balls streak for the Phils since a 62-game streak, July 5-September 10, 2010.

- AFTERNOON DELIGHT:** Per *Elias*, today's scheduled 12:05 matinee against the Baltimore Orioles marks the earliest scheduled start time for a road game in which the Phillies participated since June 11, 2016 at Washington (L, 8-0) ... The last time the Phillies were victors in a 12:05 or earlier start on the road was July 17, 2010 against the Cubs at Wrigley Field (W, 4-1).

- Zeros:** His last start was his second this season allowing 0 runs and 0 walks (other: 4/5 vs MIA), something he did not accomplish in any of his first 27 career starts ... 4 of his last 10 starts (since 9/24/17) are scoreless
- Last 11: Is 5-2, 3.21 ERA (20 ER, 56.0 IP) with 61 SO in his last 11 starts since 9/18/17** ... Has allowed 5 hits or fewer in 10 of those 11 starts
- Hit Me:** Pivetta has allowed 5 or fewer hits in 7 of his 8 starts in 2018 ... Only Justin Verlander, Julio Teheran, Blake Snell and Max Scherzer have allowed 5 or fewer hits in more starts among all ML starters (8 each)
- Strike First: Has thrown a first pitch strike to 68.3% of the batters he has faced this season, the 2nd-best percentage among qualifying NL starters behind Miles Mikolas (69.2%)** ... In 2017 threw a first pitch strike to 51.9 % of batters, 79th of 105 pitchers to throw at least 130.0 IP
- Early Struggles:** Has a 4.91 ERA (12 ER, 22.0 IP) in the 1st-3rd innings of his starts, allowing 3 of his 4 home runs in the 1st or 2nd inning ... From the 4th inning on has a 3.18 ERA (6 ER, 17.0 IP)
- Left Loose:** Lefties (.310) are batting almost 90 points higher against Pivetta than righties (.221) ... He has allowed 3 HR and 7 BB to RHH and 1 HR and 3 BB to LHH
- vs AL East:** 0-0, 0.00 ERA (7.0 IP) in 1 start
- vs Interleague:** 0-1, 3.06 ERA (6 ER, 17.2 IP) in 3 starts

ROAD:

- 2018:** 0-1, 9.00 ERA (10 ER, 10.0 IP) in 3 starts
- Career:** 4-8, 6.95 ERA (61 ER, 79.0 IP) in 17 starts
- Has a 6.95 ERA with 70 strikeouts and 42 walks in 79.0 IP in 17 career road starts and a 4.45 ERA with 112 strikeouts and 25 walks in 93.0 IP in 17 home starts

2018 SEASON:

- Had a career-best 4-game win streak come to an end on 4/28 vs ATL ... It was also the end of a string of 9 team wins in 9 straight Pivetta starts since 9/12/17, the longest such streak since PHI won 9 straight Cole Hamels starts in 2012
- His string of 8 straight starts allowing 5 hits or fewer from 9/18/17-4/22/18 was the longest by a Phillies starter since 1994 (David West, 10)
- Did not allow a home run in 41.2 consecutive IP over parts of 8 starts, 9/18/17 vs LAD to 4/22/18 vs PIT
- Struck out 9 batters and did not walk any on 4/11 vs CIN, becoming the first Phillie to do so since Mark Leiter Jr. accomplished the feat in relief, 8/5/17 vs COL and the first Phillies starter to do so since Vince Velasquez, 4/14/16 vs SD
- Had a career-best 18.0-inning scoreless streak (since 9/18/17) come to an end in the 3rd inning of his season debut, 3/31 at ATL

2017 SEASON:

- Among ML rookies, was 1st in SO/9.0 IP (9.47, min. 125.0 IP), 3rd in SO (140), 4th in starts (26) and 7th in innings (133.0)
- Was tied for the 9th-most SO in a season ever by a Phillies rookie and had the highest SO/9.0 IP and SO rate (24.0%) of any Phillies rookie ever to make at least 25 starts
- Had the most starts (26) in a single season by a Phillies rookie since 1990, when Pat Combs started 31
- Among all NL pitchers (min. 125.0 IP), ranked 4th in lowest % of pitches put in play (15.7), trailing ARI's Robbie Ray (13.7), WSH's Max Scherzer (14.3) and LAD's Rich Hill (14.7)
- Struck out a career-high 11 batters 8/16 at SD, which was the most by a Phillies rookie since Cole Hamels struck out 11 on 9/16/06 at HOU and the most by any Phillie since Vince Velasquez's 16-SO game on 4/14/16 vs SD ... Since at least 1913, Pivetta is the only Phillie to finish a start with at least 11 SO in 5.0 or fewer IP
- Recalled for the first time on 4/30 and made his ML debut that day at LAD as the starting pitcher (first of 4 stints with the Phillies)

CAREER:

- Acquired by Philadelphia from WSH for RHP Jonathan Papelbon and cash, 7/28/15 ... Originally selected by WSH in the 4th round of the June 2013 draft ... Attended New Mexico Junior College
- Pitched for Canada in 2017 World Baseball Classic ... Was a member of the Canadian Junior National Team from 2009-12 ... Was the first Canadian-born starting pitcher to debut for the Phillies since 6/17/06 (Scott Mathieson vs TB)
