## WHAT'S BREWING?

### Winning

Including the postseason, the Brewers had 102 wins in 2018, a franchise record for a single year....the previous record of 101 wins was accomplished in 1982 and 2011.

The Brewers played 163 games for the fifth time in franchise history; also 1969, 1970, 1982 and 2000....they earned a 3-1 victory on 10/1 at Chicago in the first tie-breaker game in franchise history.

### We're Going Streaking!

The Brewers had a 12-game winning streak from 9/23-10/12, which included 4 wins during the postseason....it was the second-longest winning streak in a year in franchise history.

### Thanks for Coming!

The Brewers finished with a season attendance of **2,850,875** at Miller Park, which ranked 10th in the Major Leagues and sixth in the National League....it is the 11th time in the last 12 seasons that the team drew 2.5+ million fans.

### MVP

**Christian Yelich** became just the seventh player in Major League history to produce at least a .325 batting average with 35+ HR, 110+ runs, 110+ RBI and 20+ stolen bases in a season....the feat had not been accomplished since 1999 by **Ivan Rodriguez** (Texas).

### Batting Champion

**Christian Yelich** (.326) became the first player in franchise history to win a batting title.... five players in franchise history prior to Yelich finished second.

### Bi-Cycle

**Christian Yelich** became the fifth player in Major League history to hit for the cycle twice in the same season and first to do it against the same team....he accomplished the feat against the Reds on 8/29 (road) and 9/17 (home).

For the third time in franchise history, and second season in a row, the Brewers had three players with 30+ home runs.

**SEASON SUMMARY:** The Brewers went 96-67 in 2018, winning the NL Central Division in a tie-breaker game on 10/1 at Chicago (won 3-1)....the team qualified for the postseason for the fifth time in franchise history....Milwaukee posted the best record in the National League and tied a franchise record for wins in the regular season (96-66 in 2011)....the Brewers went on to sweep Colorado in the NLDS before losing to Los Angeles in the NLCS in seven games.

**FREE AGENTS (7):** At the conclusion of the 2018 season, the following players became free agents: **OF Curtis Granderson**, **LHP Gio Gonzalez** and **LHP Wade Miley**....they were joined by **3B Mike Moustakas** and **RHP Joakim Soria**, who both declined mutual options on 10/30, **RHP Jordan Lyles**, whose club option was declined on 10/31, and **C Stephen Vogt**, who cleared outright waivers and elected free agency on 11/1.

**ARBITRATION (13):** The following players are eligible for arbitration: **C Erik Kratz**, **INF/OF Hernán Pérez**, **C Manny Piña**, **INF Tyler Saldino**, **OF Domingo Santana**, **INF Jonathan Schoop**, **INF Travis Shaw**, **LHP Xavier Cedeño**, **RHP Zach Davies**, **RHP Junior Guerra**, **LHP Dan Jennings**, **RHP Corey Knebel** and **RHP Jimmy Nelson**.

**MANAGER:** **Craig Counsell** completed his fourth season as Brewers manager (316-308) and third full season (61-76 in 2015, 73-89 in 2016, 86-76 in 2017 and 96-67 in 2018)....he was named the 19th manager in franchise history on 5/4/15, replacing Ron Roenicke.

**COACHES:** Hitting coach **Darnell Coles** (4th season), pitching coach **Derek Johnson** (3rd season), coach **Jason Lane** (3rd season), bench coach **Pat Murphy** (3rd season), third base coach **Ed Sedar** (12th season, 8th as 3B coach), first base/infield coach **Carlos Subero** (3rd season) and bullpen coach **Lee Tunnell** (6th season) all returned from the 2017 staff....Coles, Johnson and Tunnell will not return to the Brewers for the 2019 season.

**ALL-STAR GAME:** The Brewers were represented by **1B Jesús Aguilar** (1st time All-Star), **OF Lorenzo Cain** (2nd time All-Star), **LHP Josh Hader** (1st time All-Star), **RHP Jeremy Jeffress** (1st time All-Star) and **OF Christian Yelich** (1st time All-Star) at the All-Star Game in Washington....the team produced five All-Star players for the first time in franchise history.

**IN THE STANDINGS (187 days):** The Brewers spent the following number of days alone or tied at each position in the National League Central standings this season: **FIRST:** 66, **SECOND:** 95, **THIRD:** 22, **FOURTH:** 4, **FIFTH:** 0....the team clinched a postseason berth on 9/26 and the NL Central championship on 10/1....prior to clinching the championship with a win at Chicago in game #163, the Brewers had not been in first place since 7/12.

**SERIES-LY SPEAKING:** The Brewers went 31-15-7 in series play....the team won 12 of its last 13 series with the only loss coming from 9/14-9/16 vs. Pittsburgh (1-2).

**AT HOME:** The Brewers went 51-30 at home, going 16-7-3 in series play....their .630 home winning percentage was best in the National League and tied Tampa Bay for third in the majors....had a season-high 6-game home winning streak from 4/17-4/22 and a season-high 3-game home losing streak from 4/7-4/16.

**ON THE ROAD:** The Brewers went 45-37 on the road, going 15-8-4 in series play....their .549 road winning percentage ranked fourth in the National League....their 45 road wins marked the third most in franchise history (47-33-1 in 1982 and 46-34 in 1980)....the team won its last 6 road series and last 5 road games....had season-high 5-game road winning streaks from 4/30-5/11 and 9/23-10/1....had a season-high 6-game road losing streak from 7/11-7/15.

# 2018 MINOR LEAGUE RECAP

**COLORADO SPRINGS SKY SOX (TRIPLE-A):** In their fourth and final season as the Brewers Triple-A affiliate, the Colorado Springs Sky Sox finished with a 73-66 record and in second place in the Pacific Coast League American Northern Division.....the team entered the final series of the year with a magic number of 1 to clinch the division but were swept in 4 games by the Oklahoma City Dodgers to end up 1.5 games behind them.....the Sky Sox used 67 players in 2018 (32 position players, 35 pitchers), tied with 2005 for the most players used in a season in franchise history.....the Club had three players represent them at the Pacific Coast League All-Star Game, including **C Christian Bethancourt**, **INF Dylan Moore** and **INF Nate Orf**.....Bethancourt, who was also named a postseason All-Star and earned All-PCL honors, tied for the team lead with 20 home runs and batted .297 (116-for-391) with 59 runs, 22 doubles, 71 RBI and an .834 OPS in 104 games.....**OF Tyrone Taylor** also hit 20 homers and led the Sky Sox in triples (9), runs (73) and RBI (80), batting .278 (124-for-446) with 23 doubles, 13 steals and an .825 OPS across 119 games.....**INF Mauricio Dubon** appeared in 27 games and ended his season on a 23-game hitting streak, during which he batted .354 (35-for-99), prior to undergoing season-ending surgery in May.....**RHP Aaron Wilkerson** had two stints with the Club and went 4-5 with a 2.49 ERA (72.1ip, 20er) in 15 appearances (12 starts).....several Sky Sox made their way onto the big league roster, including **RHP Alec Asher**, **RHP Aaron Brooks**, **OF Keon Broxton**, **RHP Corbin Burnes**, **RHP J.J. Hoover**, **RHP Adrian Houser**, **RHP Jorge López**, **C Jacob Nottingham**, **INF Nate Orf**, **RHP Freddy Peralta**, **OF Brett Phillips**, **INF Tyler Saladino**, Wilkerson, **RHP Taylor Williams** and **LHP Mike Zagurski**.....Peralta made 7 starts prior to making his Major League debut, including earning the organization's Pitcher of the Month honors in April, and wound up making 13 starts for the Sky Sox, going 6-2 with a 3.10 ERA (61ip, 21er) and 87 strikeouts.
