LEADING OFF: Angels play the fourth game (3-0) of their second road trip of 2018 to Texas (April 9-11; 3-0) and Kansas City (April 12-15)...Halos have won seven of eight contests...
LAA is 10-3 thru 13 games to match best 13-game start in Club annals (done twice previously in 1982 & 1979)...Best mark after 14 games is 11-3 in 1979...LAA has been 6-8 thru 14 G each of last four seasons...Angels 6-1 start on the road matches best seven game road start in club history (also 6-1 in 1970)...Best start through first eight road games is 7-1 (1970) (STATS LLC)...Following the road trip, Angels return home to face Boston (April 17-19) and San Francisco (April 20-22).

ABOUT THE OFFENSE: In last seven wins, Angels have outscored opponents by a 61-20 margin...**Angels' offense leads the Majors with 86 runs scored, 137 hits, 46 extra base hits, 20 HR and 227 total bases.**

BARRIA'S DAY: Jaime Barria is the first Panama-born pitcher in Angels history...The only other player in franchise history who was born in Panama is Hall of Famer Rod Carew...At 21 years, 267 days, Barria is the youngest Angels player to make his Major League debut since Mike Trout (19 years, 335 days) on July 8, 2011...He's the youngest pitcher to debut with Angels since Tyler Chatwood (21 years, 185 days) on June 19, 2011.

PLAYER OF THE WEEK: On Monday Shohei Ohtani was named the American League Player of the Week...He is the first Angels player to win the award since Matt Shoemaker claimed weekly honors for the period ending July 17, 2016.

SHOHEI'S DAY: On Sunday Shohei Ohtani (W; 7 IP, 1 H, 1 BB, 12 SO, 91 pitches/59 strikes) retired the first 19 batters faced... Third player all-time to pitch 7+ innings with one-or-fewer hits and 12+ strikeouts in one of first two career pitching appearances (Steve Woodard, MIL in 1997 and Juan Marichal, SF in 1960)...Third player all-time to homer in three consecutive games and have a double-digit strikeout game in the same season (Ken Brett in 1973 and Babe Ruth in 1916)... Became the first player with two wins and 3+ home runs in his team's first 10 games of a season since Jim Shaw for the 1919 Washington Senators (Shaw's three HR came in the games where he pitched (STATS LLC).

SHOKKKKKKKKK OHTANI: 18 total strikeouts this year tie Angels record in first two career pitching appearances (also, Tim Lincecum)...12 strikeouts Sunday tied the American League record for a player in one of their first two games as a pitcher (Fortugno in 1992 and Elmer Myers (Philadelphia A's) in 1915)...Third Angels rookie with 12+ strikeouts in a game (Fortugno in 1992 and Jorge Rubio (15 SO) in 1966)...Ohtani logged 25 swinging strikes among the 91 pitches he threw on Sunday -- the most by any pitcher in a game this season. Sixteen of those came on his splitter (MATT OLSON – STATCAST).

FISH FACTS: Last Sunday Mike Trout scored his 700th career run; fifth Angel all-time to do so...Only eight players have hit 200 home runs and scored 700 runs prior to their age-27 season all-time: Albert Pujols, Alex Rodriguez, Frank Robinson, Hank Aaron, Mickey Mantle, Eddie Matthews, Mel Ott and Jimmie Foxx.

BACK TO COMING BACK: Four of 10 wins on season have been in comeback fashion (Halos led MLB with 47 comeback wins in 2017)...LAA erased a 6-0 deficit to win 13-9 last Friday - second straight April Angels overcame 6-run deficit to win (also April 9, 2017 vs. Seattle).

THIS N' THAT: Sunday's home attendance of 44,742 marked the largest day game total (regular season) since the renovation in 1998...Halo relievers rank second in A.L. with a 2.43 ERA (59.1 IP – 16 ER) and lead circuit with a .197 BAA...LAA has committed just three errors thru 13 games...Halos hurlers have issued 61 free passes, most in Majors.

SO FAR, SHO GOOD: Ohtani set Angels' records with 16 total bases and 7 RBI through first four career games with a plate appearance...Just fourth player all-time to homer in his first three career home games with a plate appearance (also, Chris Davis, Tom Murphy and Matt Kemp).

PLAYER POINTS: With two RBI Tuesday, Albert Pujols (1,924 RBI) passed Jimmie Foxx (1,922 RBI) for sole possession of 9th in MLB career RBI (baseball-reference.com)...Andrelton Simmons leads Majors with 19 hits...In March/April-May across last two seasons, Zack Cozart is batting .323 (73/226)...Shohei Ohtani is the first Angel rookie to homer in each of his first three home games with an AB and the second Angel to hit a HR in each of his first three home games of a season (Bobby Bonds in 1977).

TWO-WAY SHOHEI: Ohtani is the first A.L. player to homer in three straight games in the same season that he started a game as a pitcher since Babe Ruth (five times; 1918-1921, 1930 - STATS LLC)...First player to earn a win and then hit a home run in a start as a non-pitcher in his next game since Babe Ruth on June 13-14, 1921...Ohtani became the first player to start as a non-pitcher on Opening Day and then start as a pitcher within his team's first 10 games since Ruth (BOS) in 1919 (STATS LLC).

ANOTHER TROUT NIBBLE: Mike Trout has four 9+ WAR seasons through his 26 year-old campaign. Only others to do so? Rogers Hornsby (4) and Ty Cobb (4).

3000/600: Albert Pujols is 17 hits shy of 3,000...When he reaches the mark, he will become just the fourth player in MLB history with at least 3,000 knocks and 600 HR joining Hank Aaron, Willie Mays and Alex Rodriguez.

2,000 RBI: Pujols enters today with 1,924 RBI (9th all-time)...Only three players have ever reached 2,000 in an MLB career: Hank Aaron (2,297), Babe Ruth (2,214) and Alex Rodriguez (2,086) – BASEBALL REFERENCE.

@ ROYALS: Royals claimed 2017 season series 6-1 and have won seven of last eight games vs. Halos...LAA is 7-13 in last 20 matchups spanning back to 2015...Halos were swept in a three-game series in last visit to KC (April 14-16, 2017)...Angels are 2-7 in last nine meetings at Kauffman Stadium...LAA leads all-time series 290-286...Pujols is a career .310 (110/355) hitter with 23 HR and 77 RBI in 92 career games vs. Kansas City.

THIS DATE IN ANGELS HISTORY

April 12

(1981) Rod Carew stole home at Seattle with two outs in the top of the ninth...The run proved to be the game-winner; (1998) Tim Salmon scores a club-record five runs at Cleveland.

April 13

(2014) Angels became the first big-league club to have a 20-year-old (Mike Trout), a 30-year-old (Albert Pujols) and a 40-year-old (Raul Ibanez) hit back-to-back-to-back homers in ascending order by age; (2001) Angels' pitcher Shigetoshi Hasegawa faces Seattle's Ichiro Suzuki in the first ever Japanese pitcher-batter matchup in Major League history...Suzuki would hit an infield single to shortstop but Hasegawa would earn the victory over fellow countryman Kazuhiro Sasaki; (1991) Dave Winfield hit three home runs at Minnesota and finished the day with 15 total bases, establishing a club record for total bases in a game.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER – RHP NICK TROPEANO

First regular season appearance since July 18, 2016

- Making first start of the season and first Major League appearance since July 18, 2016 (vs. Texas)...Recalled from Triple-A Salt Lake prior to tonight's game.
- **THE INJURY:** Missed entire 2017 season recovering from Tommy John surgery, performed in August 2016.
- **WITH THE BEES:** Made one start for Triple-A Salt Lake on April 6 vs. Albuquerque and tossed 3.2 innings scoreless innings allowing three hits and three walks with seven strikeouts.
- **2018 SPRING TRAINING:** Appeared in three Cactus League games (two starts) for Angels this Spring, going 2-0 with a 3.12 ERA (8.2 IP – 3 ER) with 11 strikeouts and two walks...Also appeared in minor league games and intrasquad games...Worked 5.1 scoreless innings with nine strikeouts in final Spring start on March 18 at Surprise Stadium vs. Rangers.
- **HALOS STARTERS:** With today's start, becomes eighth different starting pitcher used by Angels this season...Eight different starting pitchers through the Angels first 14 games of a season is a new franchise record.
- **WIN STREAK:** Earned wins in last two decisions before suffering right elbow UCL injury (May 18, 2016 vs. Dodgers and May 23, 2016 at Texas)...A victory today would match his career-best streak of winning decisions.
- **AT HIS BEST vs. THE WEST:** Against A.L. West foes, is 6-2 with a 3.28 ERA (68.2 IP – 25 ER)...Against all other teams, is 1-5 with a 4.42 ERA (59 IP – 29 ER).
- **RISP-Y BUSINESS:** Held opponents to a .135 (7/52) batting average with runners in scoring position in 2016, which ranked fourth in the A.L. (min. 60 BF)...Opponents were 2-for-35 (.057) with two outs and runners in scoring position against him from 2015-16.
- **VS. KANSAS CITY:** Did not factor in decision in only career start vs. Royals on April 27, 2016 at Angel Stadium after tossing 5.1 innings and allowing two earned runs on eight hits with two walks and six strikeouts.
- **AT KAUFFMAN STADIUM:** Tonight marks first career appearance at Kauffman Stadium.
- **CAREER NOTES:** Native of West Islip, NY...Originally drafted by Houston in fifth round of 2011 First-Year Player Draft out of Stony Brook University...Acquired by Angels on Nov. 5, 2014 with C Carlos Perez in exchange for C Hank Conger.

- Hits in 10 of first 13 games as an Angel.
- Collected for second triple of the season last night...Nine triples over the last two season are tied for fifth in the Majors and tied for third by an infielder.
- Connected for first career walk off hit April 3 with a 13th inning solo home run...Was the first walk off home run by an Angel since Albert Pujols Aug. 3, 2016 vs. Oakland.
- On Opening Day, became the 28th Angel all time to homer in first game with the Club and first since Carlos Perez in 2015.
- In eighth big league season (seventh full) and first as an Angel...Spent first seven big league seasons with the Cincinnati Reds...Signed as a free agent Dec. 15, 2017.
- Opening Day start at second marked first career game defensively at any position other than shortstop (744 career games at shortstop)...Made first career start at third base last Friday (March 30).
- In 2017 with the Reds, was tabbed as an All-Star for the first time in career...Hit .297 (130/438) with 24 doubles, seven triples (career high), 24 home runs (career high) and 63 RBI (matched a career high).
