GONE STREAKING: The Dodgers, who have won their last three games, look to continue their hot streak this afternoon, as they will face the Milwaukee Brewers for the first time in Cactus League play. The clubs will meet once more this spring on March 18 at Maryvale Baseball Park and will matchup seven times during the regular season (July 20-22 at Milwaukee and July 30-Aug. 2 in Los Angeles). The Dodgers have 15 more exhibition games this spring; including seven at Camelback Ranch on two Spring Training weekends and will head back to Los Angeles for a three-game Freeway Series against the Angels on March 25-27. Following the I-5 matchup, the Dodgers will open the 2018 season on March 29 against the San Francisco Giants at Dodger Stadium.

Earlier today, the Dodgers faced off against the White Sox in a "B" game on Field 1. Right-hander Josh Fields made the start for Los Angeles, while closer Kenley Jansen, Brock Stewart and Dennis Santana each appeared in the game. Dodger All-Star shortstop Corey Seager played the field for the first time this spring and stroked a leadoff home run to begin the game.

AIN'T IT GRAND(AL): The Dodger offense continued its surge yesterday with a 13-7 victory over the Rockies at Salt River Fields. Dodger catcher Yasmani Grandal provided the offensive jolt, as he went 3-for-3 and drove in five runs, including blasting a grand slam in the fourth inning for his third homer of the spring. Matt Kemp continued his hot hitting, as he also went 3-for-3 and scored three runs, while also stroking his fourth Cactus League homer with a solo shot in the third. Kemp is currently riding a seven-game hitting streak, as he has gone 9-for-19 (.423) with two doubles, three homers and four RBI during the run. Starter Hyun-Jin Ryu made his Cactus League debut and recorded the win, after allowing four runs on two hits in 2.2 innings with two strikeouts. Dodger relievers Pat Venditte (1.1 IP), Wilmer Font (2.0 IP) and Corey Copping (0.1 IP) each contributed with a scoreless outing in yesterday's contest.

- Kemp currently leads the Dodgers with 11 hits and four home runs, while batting .423 (11-for-26) with six runs, two doubles and seven RBI. Non-roster invitee Jake Peter has driven in a team-leading 12 runs this spring, while hitting .320 (8-for-25) with a double, a triple and three home runs.
- The Dodgers 31 home runs this spring trail just the Indians (35), Giants (34) and Padres (34) for the most in the Majors.
- The Dodgers' 46 doubles this spring lead the big leagues and the offense currently ranks among the top teams in the Majors this spring in hits (178, 3rd), runs scored (118, 3rd), slugging percentage (.516, 4th) and OPS (.865, 4th).
- Dodger pitchers have recorded 156 strikeouts this spring, which ties the Giants for the fifth most in the Cactus League, trailing just the Indians (179), Reds (164), Cubs (161) and Angels (158).

<u>CAPTAIN CLAYTON:</u> Dodger ace **Clayton Kershaw** will take the mound today for his fourth Cactus League start, after allowing three hits and striking out two in 3.0 innings in his last outing on March 7 against the Angels. In three starts this spring, Kershaw has yet to allow a run in 6.0 innings and has struck out four against three walks, while holding the opposition to a .200 average. The seven-time All-Star had another stellar season last year, as he led the National League in wins (18, T-1st), ERA (2.31, 2nd ML), strikeout-to-walk ratio (6.73, 3rd ML) and opponents' OBP (.246, 2nd ML), despite being limited to just 27 starts. He also ranked among the best in the senior circuit in winning percentage (.818, 2nd), WHIP (0.95, 2nd), opponents' OPS (.604, 3rd), opponents' batting average (.212, 4th), opponents' SLG (.357, 5th), strikeouts per nine innings (10.39, 5th) and strikeouts (202, 8th).

The southpaw was tabbed as the 2018 Opening Day starter for the Dodgers for the eighth consecutive year. With the start, he will top Don Sutton (1972-78) for the most consecutive Opening Day starts in franchise history as well as surpassing Sutton and Don Drysdale (1958-61, '63, '65, '69) for the most lid-lifting starts overall.

A LOO	A LOOK BACK: The Dodgers posted a 104-58 record in 201						

A LOOK BACK: The Dodgers posted a 104-58 record in 2017, becoming the first team in NL West history to win the division in five consecutive seasons. The team earned a World Series berth after defeating the Chicago Cubs in the NLCS, 4 games to 1, and finished the season with their first NL Pennant since 1988.

- The Dodgers posted the seventh 100-win season in franchise history (third in Los Angeles history) and first since 1974 (102-60). The Dodgers won 90+ games for the fifth consecutive season, a feat that had only previously been accomplished once in franchise history, 1951-56 (6).
- Los Angeles finished with the best record in the Majors for the first time since 1974 and the National League's best record for the first time since 2009. The Dodgers set a Los Angeles record for victories with 104 (104-58), tying for the second most in franchise history (also: 1942, 104-50) and finishing one shy of the club record of 105 (105-49), set in 1953.
- The Dodgers topped the NL in ERA (3.38), opponents' batting average (.228, 1^{st} MLB), strikeouts (1,549), WHIP (1.15, 1st MLB) and shutouts (16). Los Angeles' 3.39 starters' ERA topped the Majors, while the 3.38 ERA by the club's relievers led the NL (4th, MLB).
- The Dodgers established franchise records with 553 extrabase hits (previous high: 541 in 1953), 312 doubles (previous high: 307 in 2006) and 221 home runs (4th, NL), which topped the club's previous high of 211 set in 2000. The club also set a Los Angeles record with a .437 slugging percentage, outpacing the previous high of .432 set in 2006.

COLLEGE BASEBALL CLASSIC: Yesterday, Dodger Stadium hosted the annual College Baseball Classic that featured three of college baseball's top 15 ranked teams. 15th-ranked Vanderbilt took down fourth-ranked Texas Christian University, 7-4, in the first game of the stadium's double-header. In the second game, USC beat their crosstown rivals and 11th-ranked UCLA, 3-2, as the Trojans scored two runs in the final two innings to come up with the victory.

TODAY'S PITCHING PROBABLES

- Lefty reliever **Tony Cingrani** is set to make his second appearance of the spring this afternoon, after tossing a scoreless inning of relief on March 9 against the Royals. The 28-year-old southpaw enters his seventh big league season and his second with the Dodgers after being acquired by the club on July 31, 2017 in a three-player trade with the Cincinnati Reds. Last season he appeared in a combined 47 games with the Reds and the Dodgers, posting a 4.22 ERA and holding hitters to a .247 average, while striking out 52 batters against 12 walks in 42.2 innings. In 22 relief appearances with Los Angeles, he posted a 2.79 ERA (6 ER/19.1 IP) and limited the opposition to a .214 average.
- Ambidextrous pitcher **Pat Venditte** will appear in his seventh game of the spring, after making his last appearance against the Rockies in yesterday's contest, allowing just one hit and striking out one in 1.1 innings. In six Cactus League games, he has allowed just one run in 7.1 innings (1.23 ERA) and has struck out 10 against one walk. He enters his first season with the Dodgers after spending 2017 with the Phillies' Triple-A Lehigh Valley, going 9-5 with two saves and posting a 3.36 ERA (26 ER/69.2 IP) in 52 relief appearances.
