AT A GLANCE: The Yankees are 1-1 on their nine-game, 10-day road trip...finish their three-game set at Oakland tonight...will play 3G at Seattle (Fri.-Sun.) and 3G at Minnesota (Mon.-Wed.).

- ▶ Are 12-6 in their last 18G and 19-10 in 29G since 8/6...are 78-43 since 4/21.
- ▶ At 87-52 (.626), have the Majors' second-best record and second-most wins behind Boston (96-44, .686)...the Yankees and Red Sox have held the Majors' two best records for 27 consecutive days (since the end of play on 8/9), and held at least a share of the two best records for 111 of the last 125 days (since the end of play on 5/3).
- ▶ Are 35G over .500, 1G below their season-high watermark...have been 36G over .500 three times this season (last: 86-50 at the end of play on Saturday)...prior to this season, had not reached 36G over .500 since they were 86-50 at the end of play on 9/4/10.
- ▶ Are 8.5G behind Boston in the AL East...lead Oakland by 4.5G for the first AL Wild Card spot.
- ▶ Play 16 of their final 25 games on the road (are 1-1 so far).
- ▶ Have lost only 8-of-41 series since 4/19 (25-8-8).
- ▶ Own the Majors' best record when their starter tosses at least 6.0IP (54-9, .857).
- ▶ Have the Majors' second-best mark when scoring first (60-12, .833), behind Boston (64-11, .853).

YESTERDAY'S NEWS: The Yankees defeated the A's, 5-1, in Oakland on Tuesday...**LHP J.A. Happ** (6.0IP, 2H, 1ER, 1BB, 5K, 1HR, 1HP) started and took a no-decision...**1B Luke Voit** (1-for-4) hit a go-ahead solo HR in the eighth...**SS Adeiny Hechavarría** (1-for-1, 1R, 1HR, 1RBI) hit his first HR as a Yankee in the ninth...**LF Brett Gardner** (2-for-5, 2R, 1RBI, 1SB) had multiple hits for the second time since 8/13...**CF Aaron Hicks** (1-for-3, 1BB) had a pair of RBI...**Yankees batters** did not have a hit until **SS/2B Gleyber Torres** (1-for-3, 1BB) singled with two outs in the sixth...**Yankees relievers** retired 9-of-10 batters (3.0IP, 1BB, 4K).

- ▶ From the first through sixth innings, **Yankees batters** went 1-for-18 with OR...from the seventh through ninth, were 7-for-15 with 5R, 2HR and 5BB.

EARNING HIS PINSTripES: **LHP J.A. Happ** is 5-0 with a 3.10 ERA (40.2IP, 14ER) in his first seven starts as a Yankee...the Yankees are 10-3 in the 13 games started by either Happ or **RHP Lance Lynn**.

- ▶ In 41 career post-trade games (37 starts) with new clubs, has compiled a 20-8 record with a 3.24 ERA (216.1IP, 78ER).

GLEYBER DAY: **INF Gleyber Torres** has reached safely multiple times in 13 of his last 17G (since 8/18), batting .383/.479/.583 (23-for-60) with 9R, 4HR, 13RBI, 11BB and 2SB...has eight multi-hit games in that span.

- ▶ Was named AL "Player of the Week" for 8/27-9/2, his second career weekly award.
- ▶ Has 22HR this season, third-most among MLB rookies and fifth-most by a Yankees rookie in a single season.
- ▶ Has 99 career hits...with his next hit, would become the fourth-youngest player in Yankees history (21 years, 266 days today) to reach 100 career hits, behind Mickey Mantle, Joe DiMaggio and Ben Chapman.

BRONX BOMBERS: **Yankees batters** have hit multiple HRs in four of their last 6G...have hit a Major League-leading 227HR...is the eighth-highest single-season total in franchise history...are on pace to hit 265HR (the MLB record is 264HR by Seattle in 1997).

- ▶ Have hit 25HR in the last 13G and 52HR in the last 29G (since 8/6).
- ▶ Nine Yankees have hit double-digit HRs this season, tied for the second-highest total in the Majors (Blue Jays-10, Astros/Dodgers-9)...**C Austin Romine** (9HR), **INF Neil Walker** (9HR) and **1B Luke Voit** (7HR w/ NYY) are all on pace to join them...the Yankees record is 10 players (2012 and 1998), and the Major League record is 11, done four times (2017 Astros, 2016 Twins, 2015 Astros, 2004 Tigers).

SAINT 'LOUIS': 1B Luke Voit hit a go-ahead solo HR in the eighth inning on Tues. at Oakland...has homered in a career-high three straight games...**leads the Majors with 7HR and is tied for the AL lead with 13RBI since 8/24**...has homered in six of his 12G in that span.

- ▶ Since making his Yankees debut on 8/2, is batting .322/.385/.678 (19-for-59) with 12R, 7HR, 15RBI and 6BB...his 8.43 AB/HR ratio is the best in the AL this season (min. 50AB).
- ▶ Five of his 7HR with the Yankees have tied the game or given the Yankees a lead...has the Yankees' last two go-ahead HRs in the seventh inning or later (Tuesday, and a tie-breaking HR in the seventh inning last Thursday vs. Detroit).

ALL I DO IS WIN: **RHP David Robertson** tossed a scoreless seventh inning to earn the win on Tuesday at Oakland...after leading Major League relievers with nine wins in 2017, is 8-3 in 2018, tied for the second-most wins by a reliever behind Tampa Bay's Ryan Yarbrough (11)...**is the first Yankees reliever to win at least eight games in a season since Alfredo Aceves went 10-1 in relief in 2009.**

- ▶ Is the third pitcher since 2006 to record at least eight wins in relief in consecutive seasons, joining Baltimore's Mychal Givens (2016-17) and Kansas City's Wade Davis (2014-15).
- ▶ Has a 53-32 record in 644 career relief appearances, tied for the most wins among active relievers (Ryan Madson, 53-43).
- ▶ Has thrown at least 60.0 relief innings in nine consecutive seasons (since 2010), the second-longest active streak in the Majors (Tyler Clippard, 10 seasons since 2009).
- ▶ With his next appearance, **will become the 13th pitcher in Major League history to make at least 60 appearances in nine consecutive seasons (Elias)**...he will join Clippard as the only two to appear in 60 games in each of the last nine seasons (2010-18).

TWO FOR YOU: **Yankees pitchers** tossed a two-hitter on Tuesday at Oakland, matching their fewest hits allowed in a game this season (third time, also 6/19 vs. Seattle and Opening Day, 3/29 at Toronto)...their 3G with 2H-or-fewer are tied for their second-most in any of the last 20 seasons since 1999 (had five such games in 2017).

ROAD TRIPPIN': The Yankees are 9-2 in their last 11 road games (since 8/6)...are 39-28 (.582) this season, the fourth-best road record in the Majors...with their next win, will match their 2017 road wins total (40-41).

- ▶ Starting with this series, 13 of their final 16 road games are against teams with winning records...are 1-1 so far.

SEVY LIFTING: **RHP Luis Severino** needs 1K to record his second career 200-strikeout season (also 230K in 2017)...would become just the third Yankees pitcher to record multiple seasons with at least 200K (also David Cone, 1997-98 and Ron Guidry, 1978-79).

- ▶ His career-high 17 wins are tied for the Major League lead...the Yankees are 22-6 in his 28 starts, the most team wins started by one pitcher in 2018.

JUST DÚ IT: **3B Miguel Andújar** went 0-for-3 on Tuesday to snap his career-long on-base streak at 17G...hit .333/.373/.565 (23-for-69) with 14R, 4 doubles, 4HR, 17RBI and 5BB during the streak (8/17-9/3).

- ▶ Was named AL "Rookie of the Month" for August after batting .320 (39-for-122) with 21R, 7 doubles, 10HR, 29RBI, 4BB and 1SB in 30 games...tied for the AL lead in HRs (with Oakland's Khris Davis) and tied for the MLB lead in RBI (with Texas' Rougned Odor).

DOWN ON THE FARM: The Yankees' two minor league affiliates to reach the playoffs will begin their postseason schedules tonight...Triple-A Scranton/WB hosts Lehigh Valley in Game 1 of the IL Semifinals, while Double-A Trenton visits New Hampshire in Game 1 of the EL Semifinals Game 1, with both games at 6:35 p.m. (ET).

TODAY IN YANKEES HISTORY

Sept. 5, 2007: Bob Sheppard works his final game as Yankees PA announcer, a 10-2 win over Seattle. Alex Rodriguez hits 2HR in an eight-run seventh inning, marking the first two-homer inning by a Yankee since Cliff Johnson on 6/30/77 at Toronto.

Sept. 6, 1995: Lou Gehrig's Major League record of 2,130 consecutive games played is broken when Baltimore's Cal Ripken, Jr. plays in his 2,131st game.

YANKEE DOODLES

#17 AARON BOONE—MANAGER Career Managerial Record: 87-52

- Was ejected in the fifth inning of 8/31 win vs. Detroit by HP Umpire Nic Lentz (arguing balls and strikes during Torres at-bat)...served a one-game suspension for the incident on Sunday vs. Detroit...was his third career managerial ejection (also 5/22 at Texas, balls and strikes and 7/14 at Cleveland, balls and strikes).
- Was named the 33rd manager in Yankees history on 12/4/17, signing a three-year contract through the 2020 season with a team option for 2021.
- Is the 18th Yankees manager to have also played for the club.
- Won his managerial debut (3/29 at Toronto) and first home game (4/3 vs. Tampa Bay).
- According to *Elias*, joins his father, Bob, as the third father-son duo to both serve as Major League managers, joining George and Dick Sisler and Bob and Joel Skinner...Bob Boone spent parts of six seasons as a Major League skipper.
- With his grandfather (Ray), father (Bob) and older brother (Bret), is part of the first family in Baseball history to produce three generations of Major League players.

#41 MIGUEL ANDÚJAR—INF Current/Season-High Hitting Streak: 0G/7G (3x)

- Leads all rookies with 146H, 38 doubles, 76RBI, 63XBH and 45 multi-hit games, is tied for the lead with 23HR and is second with a .297 BA and 74R.
- Was named AL "Rookie of the Month" for August after batting .320 (39-for-122) with 21R, 7 doubles, 10HR, 29RBI, 4BB and 1SB in 30 games...tied for the AL lead in HRs (with Oakland's Khris Davis), tied for the MLB lead in RBI (with Texas' Rougned Odor), tied for second in the Majors in hits...marked the fifth time in Yankees history that a rookie hit at least 10HR in a calendar month, following Aaron Judge (15HR in Sept. 2017, 10HR in April 2017, 10HR in June 2017) and Gary Sánchez (11HR in August 2016)...was tied for the third-highest RBI total by a Yankees rookie in a month, joining Bob Meusel (42RBI in July 1920), Judge (32RBI in Sept. 2017), Hideki Matsui (29RBI in June 2003), Bill Johnson (29RBI in July 1943) and Joe DiMaggio (29RBI in June 1936).
- Of his 23HR, 11 have tied the game (4) or given the Yankees the lead (7)...seven of his HRs have come in the seventh inning or later.
- Over his last 52G, has hit .328 (65-for-198) with 37R, 13 doubles, 11HR and 37RBI.
- Was 0-for-3 in Tuesday's win at Oakland before being removed defensively in the eighth...snapped his career-long stretch of reaching base safely at 17 games...was 0-for-3 with 1BB in Monday's loss at Oakland...has 12H in last 39AB and 35RBI in last 37G...tied a career high with 3R and was 3-for-4 with 1 double, 1RBI and 1BB in Sunday's loss vs. Detroit.
- Has 63XBH this season, third-most in a season by a rookie in Yankees history behind Joe DiMaggio (88 in 1936) and Aaron Judge (79 in 2017)...has 65XBH in 133G, tied with Bob Meusel for the second-most XBH through 133G in Yankees history (Joe DiMaggio-88XBH)...is one of eight players in Baseball history with 14G with at least 2XBH within his first 133G and trails only Joe DiMaggio (20), Johnny Frederick (19), Ted Williams (17) and Evan Longoria (16).
- Hit 12HR before the All-Star break, becoming the fifth Yankees rookie with at least 10HR before the break, joining Aaron Judge (30HR, 2017), Gleyber Torres (15HR, 2018), Joe DiMaggio (11HR, 1936) and Nick Johnson (11HR, 2002)—credit: *Elias*.
- Was named AL "Rookie of the Month" for June, his first career monthly award.

#33 GREG BIRD—1B Current/Season-High Hitting Streak: 0G/8G

- Of his 51H this season, 26 have gone for extra bases (14 doubles, 1 triple, 11HR)...of his 11HR, four have tied the game or given the Yankees the lead.
- Has not played in last two games...has 3H in last 39AB...was 1-for-3 with 1 double in 8/29 loss vs. Chicago-AL, snapping an 0-for-21 stretch with a third-inning double.
- Hit grand slam (#11)—his second career grand slam (also 7/11/18 at Baltimore) and second homer in as many games—in 8/19 win vs. Toronto.
- Was placed on the 10-day D.L. from 3/29 (retro. to 3/26) - 5/25 recovering from right ankle surgery (missed the Yankees' first 47G of the season).
- Was selected by the Yankees in the fifth round of the 2011 First-Year Player Draft.

#11 BRETT GARDNER—OF Current/Season-High Hitting Streak: 2G/7G (2x)

- Six of his 12HR this season and 12-of-20HR since 6/23/17 have tied the game or given the Yankees the lead...since 2017, the Yankees are 24-4 when he homers.
- Has 255SB, the third-most in franchise history...stole his 252nd base on 8/18 vs. Toronto, surpassing Willie Randolph (251).
- Was 2-for-5 with 2R, 1RBI and 1SB in Tuesday's win at Oakland...has 6H in last 22AB...was 1-for-3 with 1 double in Monday's loss at Oakland.
- Has 14 career leadoff HR, tied with Frank Crosetti for sixth most in franchise history...has three leadoff HR this season (last on 7/7 at Toronto).
- Is the Yankees' longest-tenured player...was selected by the club in the third round of the 2005 First-Year Player Draft and made his Major League debut in 2008...is one of five players drafted by the Yankees to collect at least 1,000 hits with the club (also Thurman Munson, Don Mattingly, Derek Jeter and Jorge Posada).

#29 ADEINY HECHAVARRIA—INF Current/Season-High Hitting Streak: 2G/9G

- Hit solo HR in the ninth—his fifth of the season and first as a Yankee—in Tuesday's win at Oakland after entering game at shortstop in the eighth...started at SS for the second consecutive game and was 1-for-2 before being removed for PH (Walker) in the seventh...his fifth-inning single was his first hit as a Yankee...made his Yankees debut as ninth-inning defensive replacement at SS in Saturday's win vs. Detroit...was added to the Yankees' active roster prior to the game.
- Was acquired by the Yankees along with cash considerations from Pittsburgh in exchange for a player to be named later or cash considerations on Friday.
- Hit .254 (66-for-260) with 31R, 11 doubles, 4HR and 29RBI in 76 combined games with Tampa Bay (61G) and Pittsburgh (15G) this season...played all 76G/69GS at SS...was acquired by the Pirates from the Rays on 8/6/18 with cash considerations in exchange for RHP Matt Seelinger...is signed through 2018.
- In his career, has played for the Blue Jays (2012), Marlins (2013-17), Rays (2017-18), Pirates (2018) and Yankees (2018)...has appeared at SS, 3B and 2B.
- Was originally signed as a non-drafted free agent by Toronto in 2010.

#31 AARON HICKS—OF Current/Season-High Hitting Streak: 1G/6G

- Has set career highs with 24HR, 42XBH and 68RBI this season (previous: 15HR, 33XBH, 52RBI in 2017)...has 10HR in 30G as a leadoff hitter and 14HR in 88G in all other spots this season...has 18HR in his last 69G (hit 6HR in his first 49G).
- Has 37BB in 42G since the All-Star break...has reached safely in 71 of his last 165PA (.430 OBP — 36H, 34BB, 1HP).
- Was 1-for-3 with 2RBI and 1BB in Tuesday's win at Oakland...has 7H in last 24AB...was 0-for-2 with 1RBI, 1SF and 1BB in Monday's loss at Oakland.
- Drew 1BB in 10 consecutive starts from 7/15-8/2 (13BB total), the longest such streak by a Yankee since Brett Gardner's 10-start streak from 8/25-9/5/10 (14BB).
- Collected his first career 3HR game in 7/1 win vs. Boston...was the first by a Yankee since Alex Rodriguez on 7/25/15 at Minnesota...was the first Yankees leadoff hitter ever to hit 3HR in a game.
- Was acquired by the Yankees from Minnesota for C John Ryan Murphy on 11/11/15.

#66 KYLE HIGASHIOKA—C Current/Season-High Hitting Streak: 0G/4G (2x)

- Has not played in last two games...is hitless in last 10AB.
- Threw out runner trying to steal second to end 8/21 win at Miami in the bottom of 12th.
- Is his second stint with the Yankees this season (6/25-7/19, 7/24-present).
- With solo HRs on 7/1, 7/3 and 7/4, became the second Yankee in franchise history to have his first three Major League hits go for HRs, joining Alfonso Soriano (from 9/24/99-4/9/00)...was the first Major Leaguer to do so since Colorado's Trevor Story (first 4H were HRs) in April 2016.
- Hit solo HR (#1) off Price—the first hit and HR of his Major League career—and was 1-for-4 in 7/1 win vs. Boston...snapped an 0-for-22 stretch to begin his career, the longest drought by a Yankee to start his career since RHP Hal Reniff (0-for-25 from 1961-64)...was the first Yankee to homer for his first MLB hit since Tyler Austin and Aaron Judge hit back-to-back HRs in their first PAs on 8/13/16 vs. Tampa Bay.
- In 52G with the RailRiders, hit .198 (37-for-187) with 15R, 9 doubles, 5HR and 22RBI.
- The 2008 seventh-round Yankees draft pick made his Major League debut in 2017 (0-for-18) after spending parts of 10 seasons in the minors.

#26 ANDREW McCUTCHEN—OF Current/Season-High Hitting Streak: 0G/13G
