THE CAPTAIN: David Wright is a seven-time All-Star, two-time Gold Glove winner and two-time Silver Slugger recipient...He holds the franchise record for hits (1,777), RBI (970), runs scored (949), doubles (390), total bases (2,945), extra-base hits (658), walks (761) and go-ahead homers (87)...Wright hit .171 (7-41) with one double, two RBI, two walks and four runs scored in 12 rehabilitation games between St. Lucie (A) of the Florida State League and Las Vegas (AAA) of the Pacific Coast League...He last played on August 29 for the 51s vs. Tacoma...Wright's last major league game was May 27, 2016 vs. the Dodgers, going 1-4 with a solo homer.

SATURDAY DETAILS: The gates will open at 4:30 p.m. on Saturday so fans can watch the Mets take BP...The game will be simulcast on SNY and PIX11.

INTERESTING TO NOTE: Wright has homered in his last three major league games - May 23-27, 2016...Wright has homered in four straight games once during his career (June 7-10, 2007).

METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets are 5-5 in their last 10 games... The Mets are 30-21 in their last 51 games and 42-36 since July 1... New York is 37-35 vs. the NL East...The Mets are 21-18 in their last 39 home games and 34-43 overall at home...New York is 10-3-2 in its last 15 series.

ATLANTA: The Mets are 5-13 vs. Atlanta...The last time the Mets lost 13 or more games in one year to the Braves was in 2009 (5-13)...The last time they had more than 13 losses was in 1966 (a franchise-record 14 losses)...Also lost 14 times to the Braves in 1964.

SEPTEMBER: The Mets are 15-9 this month, tied for the seventh-best winning percentage (.625) in the majors...The pitching staff has a 3.52 ERA this month, the fifth-lowest in the majors.

CONFORTO CONNECTS: Michael Conforto has 17 homers (tied for the seventh-most in the majors) and 52 RBI (third in the majors) since the All-Star break...He is second in the majors with 43 RBI since August 1 and tied for fifth in homers (14) during that span...Conforto has 82 RBI, extending his career-high...He also has a career-high 28 homers (one more than last year).

SIZZLING SEPTEMBER: Conforto leads the majors with 29 RBI, nine homers and 18 extra-base hits this month...Only two other Mets players have had 29 or more RBI in September: Gary Carter (34 in 1985) and Darryl Strawberry (30 in 1984)...David Wright was the last Met with 29 or more RBI when he drove in 29 runs in June, 2010...The last Met with 30 or more RBI in a month was Carlos Beltran (32 RBI in July, 2006).

BRANDON NIMMO: Has walked eight times in his last three games...He has at least one walk in 12 of his last 13 games (18 total)...Has 27 walks this month, the second-most in the majors and is sixth in September with a .459 on-base percentage... Overall, ranks second in the NL and fifth in the majors with a .401 OBP...Nimmo has reached base safely in 31 of his last 32 games...He is tied for third in the NL with eight triples...Leads the majors with 22 HBP (a single-season franchise record)...Nimmo has a career-high 17 homers.

BRAVES-METS NOTES: The Mets are 9-18 vs. Atlanta at Citi Field over the last three years.

SEPTEMBER STARTERS: Mets starting pitchers are 9-4 with a 2.73 ERA (43 earned runs/141.2 innings), the lowest ERA in the majors this month.

MLB RECORDS: Jacob deGrom has held opponents to three runs or less in 29 straight starts, the longest single-season streak in major league history...DeGrom has hurled 24 straight quality starts, the longest single-season streak in major league history...He has set a major league record with 19 starts in which he pitched 6.0 or more innings and allowed three or fewer runs but did not win...Research courtesy of Elias.

LEADERBOARD: DeGrom leads the majors in ERA (1.70), FanGraphs WAR (8.8), RA-9 WAR (9.3), FIP (1.98), HR/9 (0.41), Opponent's Slugging (.277), Opponent's OPS (.521), ERA+ (219) and Road ERA (1.87)...He is tied for the major league lead in WHIP (0.91)...DeGrom leads the NL in DRA (2.14), Home ERA (1.54), Opponent's OBP (.244), Home ERA (1.54) and leads the NL in Baseball-Reference WAR (10.3).

SOME SEASON: DeGrom is the only pitcher in modern MLB history (since 1900) to have a season with at least 260 strikeouts, 50 walks or fewer, 10 home runs allowed or fewer and a sub-2.00 ERA.

STRIKEOUTS: DeGrom has 269 strikeouts this season, the fourth-highest single-season total in franchise history (Tom Seaver had 289 in 1971 and 283 in 1970...Dwight Gooden had 276 in 1984)...He reached 1,000 strikeouts for his career with his 10th strikeout (Ozzie Albies)...According to Elias, he reached the 1,000-strikeout mark faster than any Mets pitcher in club history (897.2 innings, previous fastest was David Cone, who reached 1,000 Ks in 1,048.1 innings).

HIT MACHINE: Jeff McNeil has a .335 (70-209) batting average since his debut on July 24, which is the seventh-highest in the majors (min. 195 PA)...He is tied for seventh in the majors in hits since his debut...Is tied for second in the majors with 32 hits this month...Has the sixth-highest batting average (.356) in the majors this month (min. 60 PA)...McNeil has 70 hits through his first 59 career games with the Mets...Only José Reyes (73) had more...McNeil's .335 average in his first 59 career major league games with the Mets, is the highest average in franchise history (min. 180 PA)...McNeil is tied for the major league lead with six triples since the All-Star break...Only Mookie Wilson (8 triples in 1981) and Darryl Strawberry (7 triples in 1983) had more as a rookie in team history.

AMED ROSARIO: Has 70 hits since the All-Star break, tied for the 10th-most in the NL...Rosario is tied for fifth in the NL with 30 hits in September...Overall, ranks 10th in the NL with 22 stolen bases...He is tied for third in the NL with eight triples.

LAST START: Vargas tonight makes his 20th start of the season and fourth against Atlanta...Received the no-decision in his last start on September 20 vs. the Nationals at Nationals Park...Pitched 5.2 innings and allowed two runs, earned, on three hits while walking two and striking out eight in the Mets' 5-4 victory over Washington...Vargas singled to centerfield in the third inning and went on to score on a Michael Conforto home run...Was his second hit and second run scored in as many games.

VS. ATLANTA: Vargas is 1-2 with a 6.14 ERA (10 earned runs/14.2 innings) in three starts vs. Atlanta this season...In his last start against Atlanta, August 2 at Citi Field, Vargas suffered the loss as the Mets fell, 4-2, to the Braves...Tossed 5.0 innings and allowed four runs, earned, on six hits while striking out seven and walking a season-high-tying three batters...In five career games, four starts against the Braves, Vargas is 1-2 with a 5.60 ERA (11 earned runs/17.2 innings) with eight walks and 16 strikeouts...In three starts against the Braves in 2018, Vargas is 1-2 with a 6.14 ERA (10 earned runs/14.2 innings pitched) with six walks and 12 strikeouts.

RECENT VARGAS: Owns a 3.11 ERA (13 earned runs/37.2 innings) over his last seven starts, a stretch that includes all three of his quality starts in 2018...Has won four of his last five decisions and has thrown 5.1 innings or more in six of his last seven starts...Had pitched 5.0 innings or fewer in each of his first 12 starts...The Mets are 5-1 in Vargas' last six starts after going 2-11 in his first 13 outings.

VARGAS AT HOME: Vargas will be making his eighth home start of the season...Is 3-4 with a 4.78 ERA (17 earned runs/32.0 innings) through seven starts at Citi Field this season...Earned the win in his last home start, September 13 vs. Miami...Vargas pitched 6.0 innings, allowing two runs, earned, on three hits for his third quality start of the year...Walked two while striking out seven in the Mets' 5-2 win over the Marlins...Overall, Vargas is 51-41 at home in 131 career games (122 starts)...Owns a 3.72 ERA (312 earned runs/754.0 innings) with 198 walks and 548 strikeouts.

PITCH BREAKDOWN: This year, Vargas has generated a 37.2 percent and 37.7 percent whiff rate (swinging strikes per swings) with his curveball and changeup, respectively, this season according to Statcast...Conversely, Vargas has a 15.1 percent whiff rate on his sinker and a 17.0 percent whiff rate on his four-seam fastball.

1,000 K'S: Vargas joined the 1,000-strikeout club last month...In doing so, he became the 141st southpaw in MLB history to reach the milestone...He is also one of 16 active lefthanders and one of 59 active pitchers overall to rack up 1,000 strikeouts in his career.

- » Vargas was selected by the Florida Marlins in the second round of the 2004 First-Year Player Draft.
» Acquired by the Mets on November 20, 2006...Started two games for the Mets in 2007.
» Acquired by Seattle on December 10, 2008 as part of a three-team, 12-player trade.
» From 2010-12, was one of eight lefthanded pitchers to log 192.0 innings or more each year...During that time, his 168 walks were third-fewest among MLB lefties behind only Mark Buehrle (134) and Cole Hamels (157).
» Acquired by Los Angeles-AL on December 19, 2012 in exchange for Kendrys Morales.
» Named AL Pitcher of the Month in May, 2013, going 5-0 with a 2.30 ERA (11 earned runs/43.0 innings).
» Signed to a four-year contract by the Kansas City Royals on November 22, 2013.
» Selected to his first All-Star team in 2017... Worked a scoreless fourth inning in Miami.
» Tied Clayton Kershaw, Carlos Carrasco and Corey Kluber for the major-league lead with a career-best 18 wins in 2017.
» Signed by the New York Mets to a two-year contract with a team option for a third year on February 18, 2018.

- Is batting .356 (32-90) over 22 games in September with five doubles, three triples, a home run, nine RBI and 16 runs scored...His 32 hits in the month are tied for the second-most in the majors and his .356 average ranks sixth in the majors for September (min. 70 PA).
- Has hit safely in 31 of his last 36 starts, going 56-151 (.364) with nine doubles, six triples, 15 RBI and 27 runs scored in a stretch that includes 17 multi-hit games.
- Has 19 multi-hit games overall this season...Has eight games with at least three hits, the most in Mets history through 59 career games.
