HERE'S THE STORY

- ♦ The D-backs are 8-5 in their last 13 home games vs. NL East opponents and 13-7 in their last 20 overall games vs. NL East.
- ♦ 16 of the D-backs' last 19 games have been decided by 3 runs or fewer: 1 run - 10 times; 2 runs - 4 times; 3 runs - twice.
- ♦ **Robbie Ray**, in his last start, tossed 6.1 scoreless innings (2 H, 2 BB, 10 K) in a 6-0 combined shutout vs. Padres on September 4...in his last 3 starts, is 2-0 with a 1.08 ERA (2 ER in 16.2 IP), .190 opponent average and 26 strikeouts (14.04 K/9.0 IP)...in his last 3 home starts, is 1-0 with a 1.62 ERA (3 ER in 16.2 IP), .241 opponent average and 25 strikeouts (13.50 K/9.0 IP).
- ♦ **Paul Goldschmidt**, in his last 28 games, is hitting .393 (42-for-107)/1.196 OPS with 9 doubles, 9 homers, 22 RBI and 13 walks. • Has reached base safely in 41 of his last 42 games.
- ♦ **David Peralta**, in his last 22 home games, is batting .467 (42-for-90)/1.239 OPS with 8 doubles, 1 triple, 5 homers, 15 RBI, 3 walks.
- ♦ **Ketel Marte** has reached base via hit, walk or hit-by-pitch in 19 straight home starts (hit safely in 16 games), hitting .362 (25-for-69)/1.009 OPS with 3 doubles, 2 triples, 2 homers, 11 RBI, 11 walks and 2 hit-by-pitches.

LAST NIGHT'S RECAP

- ♦ The D-backs lost vs. Braves, 5-4 in 10 innings.
- ♦ **Clay Buchholz** allowed 2 runs (1 ER) and struck out 6 in 6.1 innings...has a 5-game streak allowing 1 earned run or less, tied for second longest in team history...also went 1-for-2 with 1 double and 1 RBI, his first career extra-base hit and RBI.
- ♦ **Daniel Descalso** was 1-for-4 with 1 double and 1 RBI...**David Peralta** had a single and 2 walks...**Steven Souza Jr.** had 3 walks.

ROSTER UPDATE

- ♦ The D-backs reinstated RHP **Zack Godley** from the Paternity Leave List on September 7.

DOWN THE STRETCH WE GO

- ♦ The D-backs have 20 games remaining (10 home/10 away) and their opponents' combined .543 winning pct. is higher than the Rockies (.522) and Dodgers (.497) [source: ESPN.com].
 - 13 games vs. NL West foes: 7 vs. Rockies (4 on road/3 @ home), 3 vs. Padres (on road), 3 vs. Dodgers (@ home).
 - 7 games vs. first place teams from other divisions: 1 vs. Braves (@ home), 3 vs. Astros (on road), 3 vs. Cubs (@ home).
- ♦ **Entering Thursday's game, the D-backs next 17 games were against teams currently in first place: ATL, COL, HOU, CHC and COL...per Elias Sports Bureau, if each team leads their respective divisions at the time of those games, the 17-game streak vs. first-place teams would be a Major League record...the current record is 14 by the 1993 Orioles (TOR, CHW, KC, CHW) and 1996 Tigers (TEX, NYY, TEX, CLE).

DAY GAMES

- ♦ **David Peralta** has hit in 4 of his last 5 games (.381, 8-for-21).
- ♦ **Paul Goldschmidt** has reached base via hit or walk in 9 straight day games, hitting .387 (12-for-31)/1.364 OPS with 2 doubles, 4 homers, 8 RBI, 8 walks and 1 HBP.
- ♦ **Daniel Descalso**, in his last 11 day games, is hitting .333 (8-for-24)/1.307 OPS with 2 doubles, 3 homers, 5 RBI and 9 walks.
- ♦ D-backs pitchers' 3.24 ERA for day games is the lowest in the NL/second in the Majors to the Red Sox (3.05) and their .231 opponent average is tied for third in the NL/seventh in the Majors.

- ♦ **Daniel Descalso's** 16 RBI in close-and-late situations are tied for sixth in the NL with J.T. Realmuto/MIA (leader: 20, Asdrubal Cabrera/NYM-PHI) while his .547 slugging pct. is 13th (leader: .697, Matt Carpenter/STL).
 - *Close & Late: seventh inning or later with the batting team ahead by one run, tied, or with the tying run on base, at bat or on deck.
- ♦ Among all players with fewer than 400 plate appearances, Descalso's 10 game-winning RBI and 16 go-ahead RBI are tied for first and second, respectively.

GOLDSCHMIDT LIKES TO GET ON BASE

- ♦ Paul Goldschmidt's 249 times on base are third in the Majors to Alex Bregman/HOU (251) and Mike Trout/LAA (250).
- ♦ Goldschmidt is Top-10 in the Majors in OBP (T-5th, .401), OPS (6th, .958), Offensive WAR (T-6th, 3.8), home runs (T-7th, 33), walks (9th, 85), SLG (10th, .557), Position Players WAR (13th, 4.9).

PERALTA & GOLDY VS. RIGHTIES

- ♦ **David Peralta** leads the Majors vs. righties with a .327 average and .575 slugging pct., is second with a .960 OPS, seventh with a .384 on-base pct. and tied for eighth with 44 extra-base hits.
- ♦ **Paul Goldschmidt** is fifth with a .387 on-base pct. and .918 OPS, tied for fifth with 46 extra-base hits, ninth with a .532 slugging pct. and is tied for 13th with a .291 average.

GOLDSCHMIDT HITTING .300

- ♦ **Paul Goldschmidt** reached .300 for the first time on Friday, after being at .198 on May 22...in 92 games since May 23, is batting .346 (124-for-358)/.440 OBP/.654 SLG/1.094 OPS with 22 doubles, 2 triples, 28 homers, 69 RBI and 57 walks.
- ♦ Courtesy Elias Sports Bureau, Goldschmidt is the first player in the liveball era (since 1920) to increase their batting average to .300 or higher in a season in which it was under .200 at some point after at least 200 plate appearances.

GOLDSCHMIDT'S SIGHTS ON RECORDS

- ♦ **Paul Goldschmidt's** next home run at Chase Field will be his 100th, the lone player to reach the mark.
- ♦ His 650 career walks are tied with Luis Gonzalez for the D-backs all-time record.
- ♦ Is the franchise leader (min. 1000 PA) with a .299 average, .400 OBP, .536 SLG, .935 OPS.

PITCHING IN

- ♦ The D-backs' 3.52 ERA ranks third in the Majors behind the Astros (3.08) and Dodgers (3.41) and ahead of the Red Sox (3.65), Rays (3.68) and Cubs (3.71)...their .234 opponent average is tied for fifth in the Majors with the Yankees behind the Astros (.216), Rays (.229), Braves (.232) and Dodgers (.232).
- ♦ Their ERA and OPP AVG are the club's lowest in a season.

GENTLEMEN START YOUR ENGINES

- ♦ D-backs starting pitchers have 79 games with 5.0 or more innings and 2 runs or less, the fourth most such games in the Majors behind the Astros (83), Cardinals (80) and Dodgers (80).
- ♦ D-backs starting pitchers, in their last 20 home starts (14 quality), are 9-4 with a 2.54 ERA (35 ER in 124.0 IP), .197 opponent average and 149 strikeouts (10.8 K/9.0 IP).

ON DECK: ROCKIES

- ♦ 7-5 vs. Rockies this season, 4-2 on the road.
- ♦ 12-5 in last 17 games at Coors Field, including 9 straight wins from June 21, 2017-July 10, 2018.
- ♦ **Hitters vs. Rockies in 2018:** **David Peralta** (10 G) is hitting .450 with 5 doubles, 2 homers, 9 RBI and 3 walks; **Chris Owings** (11 G) is hitting .429 with 3 doubles and 4 RBI; **Nick Ahmed** (11 G) is hitting .375 with 6 doubles, 1 triple, 3 homers and 16 RBI; **A.J. Pollock** (9 G) is hitting .371 with 3 doubles, 1 triple, 1 homer and 5 RBI.

- ♦ Has set career highs with 14 wins, 29 games, 28 starts, 159.2 innings and 170 strikeouts.
- ♦ Reinstated from the Paternity Leave List on September 7.
- ♦ He and his wife, Autumn, welcomed their first child, a daughter, Audrey Grace, on Wednesday at 10:13 p.m., weighing 7-pounds, 6-ounces and measuring 20 inches.
- ♦ In 5 career starts (3 quality) vs. Rockies, is 4-0 with a 2.56 ERA (9 ER in 31.2 IP), .200 opp. average and 36 strikeouts.
- ♦ In 3 starts at Coors Field, is 3-0 with a 2.89 ERA.

- ◆ Fourth season with the D-backs (2015-present) after spending parts of 5 with the Nationals (2010-13) and Tigers' (2014) organizations.
- ◆ 2017 NL All-Star Team @ Marlins Park (DNP).
- ◆ Acquired from Tigers with INF Domingo Leyba for INF Didi Gregorius on Dec. 5, 2014.

HERE'S THE STORY

- ◆ Is looking to win 3 consecutive starts since a 5-game stretch from Aug. 24-Sept. 15, 2017.
- ◆ Is 2-0 with a 1.08 ERA (2 ER in 16.2 IP) over his last 3 starts.
- ◆ Has allowed 3 runs or fewer in 6 straight starts, going 2-0 with a 2.59 ERA (9 ER in 31.1 IP).

LAST TIME OUT

- ◆ Earned the win on Sept. 4 vs. Padres with 6.1 scoreless innings, his first victory @ Chase Field since March 30 vs. Rockies.
- ◆ Did not allow a hit in the first 4.2 innings (Franklin Reyes single).
- ◆ Struck out 10, his second double-digit strikeout game of the season and 16th of his career.

VS. BRAVES

- ◆ Is 0-2 with a 4.82 ERA (5 ER in 9.1 IP) in 2 starts.
- ◆ Will be making his first start vs. Atlanta since Aug. 25, 2016 (2 ER in 5.0 IP).

I'D LIKE AN ORDER OF 6.0 INNINGS PLEASE

- ◆ Is 3-0 with a 1.15 ERA (4 ER in 31.1 IP) in 5 starts of at least 6.0 innings this season and 15-3 with a 1.49 ERA (24 ER in 145.1 IP) in 22 such starts since the start of 2017.

LEFTY ON LEFTY

- ◆ His .151 average vs. lefties is best in the NL and third among Major League starters (min. 5 GS, 60 BF) behind Blake Snell/TB (.142) and Francisco Liranio/DET (.146) and ahead of Ryne Stanek/TB (.156).

WITH RUNNERS IN SCORING POSITION

- ◆ Has a .175 opponent average (14-for-80) with runners in scoring position and a .121 average with RISP/2 outs (4-for-33).

PLAYER PROFILE

- ◆ Won a gold medal with USA Baseball's 18U National Championship Team that participated in the 2009 Pan-American Championships in Venezuela...was teammates with Cory Hahn, D-backs Coordination, Professional Scouting.
- ◆ Committed to pitch at the University of Arkansas before signing with the Nationals.
- ◆ Wears a protective cap insert on the left side of his head after being struck by a 108-mph line drive on July 28, 2017 @ Cardinals...was on the disabled list from July 29-Aug. 24.

STRIKEOUT STATS

- ◆ His 12.02 strikeouts per 9.0 innings ratio is second among NL starters (min. 5 GS, 25.0 IP) behind Max Scherzer/WSH (12.03).
- ◆ Among active pitchers since 2016, Ray leads the Majors with 11.75 strikeouts per 9.0 innings, ahead of Scherzer (11.73).

WHIFF ON THE SLIDE PIECE

- ◆ Opponents have whiffed on 43.69 percent of sliders swung at, the seventh-highest pct. in the NL [min. 200 pitches] behind Patrick Corbin/ARI (54.88), Max Scherzer/WSH (47.08), Jack Flaherty/STL (47.04), Noah Syndergaard/NYM (46.52), Kenta Maeda/LAD (45.45) and Julio Teheran/ATL (45.31).

WILL SOMEONE MAKE A DECISION?

- ◆ Did not factor in the decision in 7 consecutive starts from July 20-Aug. 25, the longest streak in franchise history by a starter, passing the previous record of 6 held by Armando Reynoso from June 22-July 21, 1999.

KEEPING IT "100"

- ◆ Made his 100th career appearance on July 2 vs. Cardinals and is third all-time among left-handed pitchers with 632 strikeouts in his first 100 career games [source: Elias Sports Bureau] behind Herb Score/CLE (679) and Frank Tanana/CAL (638) and ahead of Scott Kazmir/TB (628).
