THE DISTRICT SLEEPS TONIGHT

- The Colorado Rockies continue their first East Coast road trip of 2017 with the third of four games against the Washington Nationals ... they will also play three games at Pittsburgh, April 16-18.
- Have won the first two games of the series and will go for their second consecutive second consecutive road series win after losing the last two series at home against Atlanta and San Diego.
- Won last night's game by a score of 2-1, their second 2-1 victory this season ... scored their two runs on a solo home run and a sacrifice fly by Carlos González ... it was their second consecutive win in which there was only one player who drove in runs ... starter Kyle Freeland allowed one run on four hits with three walks and four strikeouts over 4.2 innings of work.
- DJ LeMahieu went 4-for-5 with two doubles, two home runs and four RBI in Thursday's 5-1 win, his second career multi-home run game (also: Aug. 26, 2017 at Atlanta) ... the four RBI were a career high and he also tied his career high with four hits (10x, last: Aug. 16, 2017 vs. Atlanta) ... became the third player in franchise history with two doubles and two homers in the same game, joining Corey Dickerson and Todd Walker.

GAVEL DOWN

- Yesterday, Major League Baseball announced a five-game suspension and fine for Nolan Arenado, a four-game suspension and fine for Gerardo Parra and a fine for German Márquez for their actions in Wednesday's brawl against the San Diego Padres ... Arenado and Parra both appealed the suspensions and played in last night's game.

SWIFT ATTACK

- DJ LeMahieu's four home runs on the season are halfway to his 2017 season total of eight ... in 2017, he did not hit his fourth home run until July 6 ... the quickest he has ever reached four home runs was in 2016, when he recorded his fourth home run on June 9.
- Carlos González has three home runs on the season ... hit his third home run of 2017 on May 21.

PINCH ME, WAKE ME

- Pat Valaika's pinch-hit single in the third inning of Wednesday's game snapped the Rockies' 0-for-22 hitless streak in the pinch ... the Rockies' are currently 1-for-26 (.038), the most pinch-hit at-bats in the Majors.

THWACK!

- The Rockies rank second in the NL in home runs with 20 (St. Louis ranks first with 21) ... in 2017, Colorado ranked 10th in the NL with 192 home runs.

- The Rockies .228 team batting average ranks 12th in the National League ... their .273 batting average in 2017 led the Major Leagues.
- The Rockies .276 batting average on balls in play ranks 13th in the National League ... they led MLB with a .332 BABIP in 2017.

DES-TINATIONS BEYOND

- Ian Desmond is playing his first series in Washington D.C. since his last season as a member of the Nationals in 2015.
- Desmond's 927 games played with the Nationals are the second-most in franchise history ... he hit .264 with 185 doubles, 21 triples, 110 home runs and 432 RBI ... was named an All-Star in 2012 and won the Silver Slugger at shortstop in 2013 and 2014.

MAIN EVENT

- Colorado play the Nationals seven times this year, including the Rockies' first four-game set in Washington since 2013.
- All-time vs. Washington and Montreal, Colorado is 109-83 ... the Rockies are 53-37 vs. Washington since the move to D.C. in 2005.
- In Washington, the Rockies are 29-16, including 22-12 at Nationals Park ... the Rockies have won two of three in D.C. each of the last three seasons, going 7-3 over that span.
- DJ LeMahieu is a career .378 hitter (45-for-119) against the Nationals ... prior to last night, had reached base safely in 12 consecutive games against Washington since the 2016 season with multiple hits in seven games ... went 24-for-50 (.480) that span since Aug. 15, 2016 ... LeMahieu is a career .365 hitter in D.C., going 23-for-63 with four doubles, four home runs and 14 RBI ... he has hit safely in 12 of 16 games at Nationals Park ... at Nationals Park, his average leads all active players with 60 or more plate appearances.
- In 31 career games against the Nationals, Nolan Arenado has batted .308 (36-for-117) with six home runs ... in 15 games at Nationals Park, Arenado has hit .345 (20-for-58) with three doubles, two triples and four home run.

OTTOMATIC

- Adam Ottavino has multiple strikeouts in seven of his eight games, including striking out the side three times ... leads Major League relievers with 18 strikeouts ... has allowed one hit and one walk over his 8.2 innings of work across eight appearances.

WE THREE KINGS

- Since the start of the 2015 season, Charlie Blackmon (587), DJ LeMahieu (571) and Nolan Arenado (561) rank first, second and third, respectively, among National League players in hits.
- Since the start of the '15 season, LeMahieu's .320 batting average is the highest in NL.
- Nolan Arenado leads all Major Leaguers with 460 RBI since 2014.

MOVING UP

- With two hits April 2, Carlos González passed Vinny Castilla to move into fourth place all-time in Rockies history with 1,207 hits ... he is 66 hits from passing Dante Bichette (1,278) for third-most in franchise history.

BACK IN BLACK

- Manager Bud Black led the Rockies to a postseason appearance in his first season in 2017 with the club going 87-75 and advancing to the National League Wild Card game ... it was the Rockies' first winning season since 2010.
- Black and Nationals Manager Dave Martinez were teammates on the San Francisco Giants from 1993-94.

CANIS LUPUS

- Colorado's 2013 first-round pick (third overall) out of the University of Oklahoma will make his fourth start of the season, his third on the road.
- Started for the Rockies on Opening Day in Arizona, and joined Kevin Ritz (1996-97), Darryl Kile (1998-99), Mike Hampton (2001-02) and Ubaldo Jimenez (2010-11) as the only Rockies starting pitchers to make consecutive Opening Day starts ... also started Opening Day at Milwaukee in 2017 ... Jason Jennings (2003, 2006), Aaron Cook (2007, 2009) and Jorge De La Rosa (2014, 2016) all made two Opening Day starts but not in consecutive years

YOU GET ONE

- Took the loss his last time out, April 9 vs. San Diego in Denver ... allowed seven runs on 10 hits with one walk and six strikeouts in the 7-6 Rockies loss.
- The 10 hits tied his career high (three times, last: Aug. 7, 2016).
- It was his sixth career home start against San Diego and his first loss to the Padres at Coors Field ... prior to the loss, was 2-0 with a 1.69 ERA (32.0 IP, 6 ER) with three walks and 42 strikeouts (11.81 SO/9) against the Padres in Denver, including a 16-strikeout complete-game shutout on Sept. 17, 2016.

THOSE WHO WANDER

- Will be making his third road start of 2018, his first against a non-divisional opponent ... is 1-1 with a 2.45 ERA (11.0 IP, 3 ER) ... took the loss on Opening Day at Arizona after allowing three runs on six hits across four innings of work ... earned his first win of the season in his last road outing, April 4 at San Diego, after pitching seven scoreless innings with four hits allowed and seven strikeouts.
- In 2017, Gray went 5-3 with a 4.06 ERA (64.1 IP, 29 ER) in 12 starts on the road.
- After allowing eight runs at New York-NL on July 14, went 4-2 with a 2.55 ERA (49.1 IP, 14 ER), nine walks and 52 strikeouts over his final eight starts on the road ... logged six quality starts over that span.
- Over his final five road starts in 2017, went 4-1 with a 1.71 ERA (31.2 IP, 6 ER), six walks and 34 strikeouts.
- Overall, in 31 starts on the road, has gone 8-13 with a 4.38 ERA (172.2 IP, 84 ER), 169 hits, 69 walks and 191 strikeouts.

GOING NATIONAL

- Will be making his third career start against Washington, his second at Nationals Park ... is 0-1 with a 5.73 ERA (11.0 IP, 7 ER) with two walks and 11 strikeouts across both starts.
- Last faced Washington on July 30 of last season in Washington D.C. and took the loss in the 3-1 contest after allowing three runs on four hits (two home runs) with one walk and eight strikeouts.

SPRING FORWARD

- Made six Cactus League starts and went 1-2 with a 5.82 ERA (21.2 IP, 14 ER), five walks and 22 strikeouts.
- Over his last two Spring starts, pitched 9.1 scoreless innings, allowing five hits with one walk and 11 strikeouts.

SOMETHING TO BUILD ON

- Went 10-4 with a 3.67 ERA (110.1 IP, 45 ER), 30 walks and 112 strikeouts over 20 starts in 2017.
- Made three starts to begin the season, allowing six runs across 12.1 innings (4.38 ERA), before being placed on the disabled list on April 14 with a broken bone in his left foot.
- Returned from the disabled list on June 30 and went 10-4 with a 3.58 ERA (98.0 IP, 39 ER), 23 walks and 103 strikeouts across 17 starts to finish the season.
- In 13 starts to end the season from July 25 through the end of the season, ranked tied for first in the National League in wins (seven), second in ERA (2.64), third in innings pitched (78.1), sixth in strikeouts (80) and second in strikeouts-to-walk ratio (5.00).
- Ended the season allowing three or fewer runs in 13 consecutive starts, the second-longest single-season streak by a Rockies starter in franchise history (longest: Ubaldo Jimenez, 14 games, 2010).

PRINCE OF PUNCHIES

- His 354 career strikeouts are 16th in franchise history, two fewer than Adam Ottavino, who ranks 15th with 356.
- In 2016, set a Rockies rookie record with 185 strikeouts, the sixth-most strikeouts by any Rockies pitcher in franchise history and the most since Ubaldo Jimenez recorded the franchise record 214 strikeouts in 2010 ... his 9.91 strikeouts-per-nine-innings was a Rockies franchise record.
- Set a Rockies and Coors Field record with 16 strikeouts in his first career complete-game shutout, Sept. 17, 2016 vs. San Diego.

#COORS

- Made eight starts at home in 2017 and went 5-1 with a 3.13 ERA (46.0 IP, 16 ER), 43 hits, four home runs, 13 walks and 41 strikeouts.
- In 23 starts at Coors Field since 2016, has gone 12-4 with a 4.21 ERA (134.2 IP, 63 ER), 32 walks and 141 strikeouts ... the Rockies have gone 15-8 in his home starts over that span.
- In 28 career starts at Coors Field, has gone 12-5 with a 4.75 ERA (155.1 IP, 82 ER) ... his .706 winning percentage at home is tied for the third-best percentage in franchise history (min. 20 starts).
