AT A GLANCE: The Yankees are 4-0 on their nine-game homestand...won the opener of their 3G series vs. Boston on Tuesday...swept a 3G series vs. Cleveland...finish with 3G vs. Oakland (Fri.-Sun.)...following this homestand, depart on an 8G road trip to Washington (5/15-16), Kansas City (5/18-20) and Texas (5/21-23).

- ▶ Have won seven straight games, **the Majors' longest active winning streak**...are a season-high 15G over .500.
- ▶ At 25-10 (.714), **are tied for the best record in the Majors** with Boston (25-10, .714)...**is the latest in a season they have had at least a share of the Majors' best record since the end of play on 7/28/12** (tied with Cincinnati and Washington at 60-40)...last had sole possession of the best record this late in a season at the end of play on 7/27/12 (60-39).
- ▶ **Are tied with Boston for first place in the AL East**...is their first time with a share of first place since they were tied for first at the end of play on 3/31...trailed Boston by a season-high 7.5G at the start of play on 4/21 (Boston was 17-2, the Yankees were 9-9; since then, Boston is 8-8, the Yankees are 16-1).
- ▶ **At 25-10, matches their best 35-game start since starting 26-9 in 1998** (also 25-10 in 2003)...is tied for their second-best start over the last 67 seasons since 1952 (26-9 in 1998; 25-10 in 2003, 1994 and 1958).
- ▶ Have a +63 run differential, third-best in the Majors (Houston, +79; Boston, +66).
- ▶ **Are 10-8 vs. the AL East and 15-2 vs. all other divisions.**
- ▶ This marks their third straight opponent that led an AL division going into the series (Houston, Cleveland, Boston).

YESTERDAY'S NEWS: The Yankees won their seventh consecutive game on Tuesday, defeating the Red Sox in the opener of a three-game series at Yankee Stadium, 3-2...**RHP Luis Severino** (6.0IP, 6H, 2ER, 0BB, 1WP) struck out a season-high 11 batters in a no-decision...**DH Giancarlo Stanton** (2-for-3, 2 solo HR, 1BB) had his third multi-HR game of the season...**RF Aaron Judge** (1-for-4, 1RBI) drove in the game-winning run with a single in the seventh...**RHP David Robertson** (1.0IP, 1H, 2K) has recorded a win in three of his last five appearances...**LHP Aroldis Chapman** (1.0IP, 1K, 1HP) recorded his eighth save in nine opportunities.

- ▶ The Yankees are 7-2 (.778) in one-run games, the second-best record in the AL (Oakland, 6-1, .857)...improved to 9-3 in series openers (6-1 at home).

PERFECT 10: The Yankees have **set a current Yankee Stadium record by winning 10 consecutive games** (since 4/21)...broke the previous mark of nine straight, set from 5/30-6/15/10...have outscored opponents, 69-27, during this streak...is their longest home winning streak since also winning 10 in a row at the original Yankee Stadium from 7/5-23/08...**their last longer streak during a single season was a 12-game winning streak at the original Yankee Stadium from 4/25-6/1/85**...is the Majors' third-longest home winning streak since the start of 2017, trailing 11-game streaks by Cleveland (8/24-9/14/17) and Los Angeles-NL (6/7-25/17).

- ▶ **Are 15-5 (.750) at home in 2018, the most home wins and best home winning percentage in the Majors.**
- ▶ Since 9/2/17, **are 28-8 in their last 36 regular season home games** (plus 6-0 in postseason home games)...are 10-1-1 in their last 12 home series (since 8/31/17).
- ▶ Lead Major League clubs at home in runs (129), HRs (34), HR per game (1.70), XBHs (75) and OBP (.362)...are second in runs per game (6.45), slugging average (.476) and OPS (.839)...have homered in 13 of their last 14G at home.
- ▶ Have "walk-off" wins in three of their last five home games.

SEVY SEASON: **RHP Luis Severino** recorded a season-high 11K without issuing a walk in 6.0IP (6H, 2ER) in a no-decision on Tues. vs. Boston...marked the most strikeouts without a walk by a Yankee against Boston since Mike Mussina had 13K in his near-perfect game on 9/2/01 at Fenway Park.

- ▶ Also had 10K in his previous start on 5/2 at Houston, marking the second time in his career that he has had back-to-back games with at least 10K.

SWEET 17: The Yankees **are 16-1 in their last 17 games** (since 4/21), **matching their best 17-game stretch since going 16-1 from 6/2-18/1953**, which was part of a larger 21-1 stretch from 5/27-6/18/1953...matches the best 17-game stretch in the Majors this season (Boston had two such 17G stretches, topping out with a 17-1 run from 3/30-4/20)...**with a win tonight, would match their best 18G stretch since going 17-1 from 6/2-18/1953**, also part of that 21-1 stretch.

- ▶ Have outscored opponents, 101-39, and out-homered opponents, 24-10.
- ▶ **Yankees pitchers** have posted a 2.06 ERA (153.0IP, 108H, 39R/35ER, 40BB, 172K, 10HR) over the span.
- ▶ **Yankees starters** have a 1.95 ERA (101.1IP, 22ER) during the stretch...have allowed 3R just three times while permitting 1R-or-fewer in 10-of-17 starts.
- ▶ **Yankees batters** have averaged 5.94 runs per game over the stretch, hitting .243/.326/.444 as a team with 101R, 38 doubles, 1 triple, 24HR and 70BB.

LUCKY NUMBER 7: The Yankees have a current seven-game winning streak (since 5/1), longest current winning streak in the Majors...along with their nine-game winning streak (4/21-29), join Boston as the only teams with multiple winning streaks of at least 7G in 2018 (Boston had streaks of 9G and 8G).

STANTON ISLAND: OF Giancarlo Stanton hit a pair of solo HRs on Tuesday vs. Boston, his third multi-HR game this season (also 2HR on 5/2 at Houston and 3/29 at Toronto)...is tied for the Major League lead in multi-HR games with Mookie Betts, Matt Davidson and Manny Machado.

- ▶ His 31 career multi-HR games are **the second-highest total through 1,021 career games in MLB history**, behind Ralph Kiner (35).
- ▶ The Yankees' nine individual multi-HR games in 2018 are tied for the second-most in Major League history through a team's first 35 games of a season (San Francisco, 10G in 1958; Seattle, 9G in 1996).
- ▶ Is batting .296/.371/.648 (16-for-54) with 15R, 4 doubles, 5HR, 9RBI and 7BB in his last 15 games (since 4/23).
- ▶ Has multiple hits in each of his last 5G vs. Boston (since 6/21/12), including all 4G this season...is the longest multi-hit streak by a Red Sox opponent since José Altuve (5G from 4/23-5/14/16).

WALK THIS WAY: INF Neil Walker is 5-for-11 (.455) with 7R, 2 doubles, 2RBI, 6BB and 1HP in his last five games, after going 13-for-80 (.163) with 5BB in his first 21G as a Yankee...over this stretch, has raised his season BA 35 points, his OBP 79 points and his slugging average 54 points.

DOUBLE DOWN: Yankees batters have hit a double in 29 straight games (4/5-present), **tied for their second-longest streak since at least 1908** (34G, 5/12-6/19/1936; 29G, 8/11-9/10/2002).

- ▶ Rank fourth in the Majors with 76 doubles in 35G.

MAIN EVENT OF THE EVENING: According to *Elias*, these are the first games in which the Yankees (25-10) and Red Sox (25-10) will face each other while holding the Majors' two best records since 6/2/02, when the Yankees entered at 37-19 and Boston at 36-16.

RISP MANAGEMENT: In 11 games vs. Boston at Yankee Stadium since the start of 2017, **Yankees pitchers** have held Red Sox batters to a .129 BA (9-for-70) with RISP, including 2-for-7 on Tuesday night.

EYES ON YES: With a 6.76 TV Household rating and 603,000 total viewers, Tues.'s game vs. Boston was the highest-rated YES Network broadcast since Derek Jeter's home finale on 9/25/14.

ON THE MEND: 1B Greg Bird went 1-for-5 with 1SB as the DH in an extended spring intrasquad game today in Tampa.

- ▶ Played five innings at first base in an extended spring game on Tuesday, going 2-for-4 with 1 single and a two-run HR.

TODAY IN YANKEES HISTORY

May 9, 2002: In a 3-1 Yankees victory over Tampa Bay, Mariano Rivera picks up career save No. 225, surpassing Dave Righetti (224) to establish a new franchise record.

May 9, 1999: Mike Stanton makes his first career start after 552 consecutive relief appearances to begin his career. Stanton records a no-decision vs. Seattle, tossing 4.0 scoreless innings (2H, 1BB, 3K).

May 9, 1930: The Yankees and Tigers combine for an AL-record-low two outfield putouts (Earle Combs and Babe Ruth) in a 5-4 Detroit victory at Yankee Stadium. (credit: Sporting News).

TOMORROW IN YANKEES HISTORY

May 10, 2015: Michael Pineda strikes out 16 Orioles in seven innings in a Mother's Day matinee at Yankee Stadium, tying David Cone for the Yankees' single-game record for strikeouts by a right-handed pitcher. Pineda also sets a modern AL record for the most strikeouts in a start of seven innings or fewer.

May 10, 1975: In his first start against his former team, Catfish Hunter tosses a two-hit complete-game shutout in a 3-0 Yankees win at Oakland.

TONIGHT'S STARTING PITCHER: RHP MASASHIRO TANAKA (4-2, 4.39 ERA)

RHP Masahiro Tanaka will make his eighth start of the season tonight vs. Boston...the 29-year-old will pitch on extended five days' rest due to Monday's off day...did not record a decision in his last start on Thursday vs. Houston (6.0IP, 5H, 3ER, 0BB, 5K, 1HP, 1WP)...is undefeated in his last three starts, going 2-0 with a 2.41 ERA (18.2IP, 5ER) and 19K...is tied for fifth in the AL with four wins...has 155 career wins between MLB (56) and NPB (99)...went 13-12 with a 4.74 ERA (178.1IP, 180H, 100R/94ER, 41BB, 194K, 35HR) in 30 starts in 2017...recorded his 600th career strikeout on 8/27/17 vs. Seattle, becoming the sixth Japanese pitcher to record at least 600 Major League strikeouts...was the first Yankee to record at least 600K through his first four Major League seasons...the 2014 AL All-Star was acquired by the club via the posting system from the Rakuten Golden Eagles of Japan and signed to a seven-year contract on 1/22/14...his contract runs through the 2020 season.

LAST START: Did not factor in the decision on Thursday at Houston after throwing 6.0IP with 5H and 3ER (0BB, 5K, 1HP, 1WP)...was his third consecutive quality start...did not allow a runner to reach third base until he loaded the bases in the seventh before exiting...departed with a 3-0 lead and Chad Green allowed all three inherited runners to score...recorded three 1-2-3 innings.

- ✦ Was his 37th career start of 0BB...is tied for the fifth-most 0BB starts since 2014 (Bartolo Colon-47, Josh Tomlin-46, Clayton Kershaw-41, Rick Porcello-38).

VS. BOSTON: Is 8-4 with a 4.04 ERA (93.2IP, 42ER) in 15 career starts vs. Boston...is 4-2 with a 3.21 ERA (53.1IP, 19ER) in his last eight starts since 4/29/16 and has allowed 3ER-or-fewer in six of those starts...will be his 16th career start vs. the Red Sox, tied (with Toronto) for his most starts vs. any team.

- ✦ His eight career wins vs. Boston are the most in the Majors since his debut in 2014.
- ✦ Started on 4/11 at Boston and earned the win (5.0IP, 7H, 6ER, 2BB, 3K, 2HR, 1WP)...allowed season highs in earned runs and HR...his 7H are also tied for his most in a game this season (also 4/17 vs. Miami)...received 10 runs of support.
- ✦ Went 2-2 with a 2.83 ERA (28.2IP, 9ER) in four starts vs. the Red Sox in 2017...tossed a three-hit complete-game shutout on 4/27/17 at Fenway Park (0BB, 3K), the second shutout of his career (also 5/14/14 at the Mets)...faced just two batters over the minimum and threw only 97 pitches (72 strikes)...marked his fewest hits allowed in a complete game (previously 4H in his other CGSHO on 5/14/14 at the Mets)...was the first complete-game shutout by a Yankee at Fenway Park since Mike Mussina on 8/28/02.
- ✦ Is 4-2 with a 3.98 ERA (43.0IP, 19ER) in seven career home starts vs. Boston.

A BRONX TALE: Is 1-2 with a 4.50 ERA (18.0IP, 9ER) in three home starts this season...earned his first home win of the season on 4/23 vs. Minnesota, throwing as season-high 6.2IP and allowing just 3H and 1ER (2BB, 5K, 1HP)...did not allow a home run for the first start at home this season...in his first home start on 4/5 vs. Baltimore, took a shutout into the seventh inning before surrendering 3ER to take the loss (6.1IP, 6H, 0BB, 7K, 1HR)...extended his Yankee Stadium scoreless streak to 28.0IP (regular and postseason) before allowing a two-run HR to Adam Jones in the frame.

- ✦ Has allowed 1ER-or-fewer in eight of his last 12 reg. season home starts (since 6/23/17) and has thrown at least 6.0IP in eight-of-nine starts since 7/28/17.
- ✦ Was 9-5 with a 3.22 ERA (95.0IP, 34ER) in 15 regular season home starts in 2017...his 112K were the third-highest total in a season at the current Yankee Stadium.
- ✦ Since the beginning of 2016, the Yankees are 24-9 in his 33 home starts.

MISSION CONTROL: His 5.12 career K/BB ratio (681K/133BB) is the second-highest (min. 500.0IP) in the Modern Era (since 1900), trailing Boston's Chris Sale (5.14).

- ✦ Recorded 15K prior to issuing his first walk of the season (Moreland in first inning on 4/11 at Boston)...became the first Yankee since 1908 (and just the eighth MLB pitcher) to record at least 7K and not walk a batter in each of his first two starts of a season.

2018: Has recorded quality starts in five of his seven starts, which is tied for ninth most in the AL...has permitted 10 of his 22R in the fifth inning.

- ✦ Yankees are 5-2 in his starts.
- ✦ After allowing at least 1HR in his first 4GS (5HR total), has only allowed just 1HR over his last 3GS.
- ✦ Batters leading off innings have reached in just 8-of-43 frames (.186 OBP).
- ✦ Batters are hitting .185 (12-for-65) with 23K in at-bats ending with a splitter (Brooks Baseball).

K ZONE: Has recorded 681K in 112 career regular season starts, the most strikeouts through 112 career games in Yankees history...are the 16th-most through 112 games in Major League history...was the first pitcher in Yankees history to record at least 600 strikeouts through his first four Major League seasons.

THURSDAY'S STARTING PITCHER VS. BOSTON: LHP CC SABATHIA (2-0, 1.39 ERA)

LHP CC Sabathia will make his seventh start of the season in Thursday's series finale vs. Boston...the 37-year-old will pitch on extended five days' rest due to Monday's off day...is 2-0 with a 0.39 ERA (23.1IP, 14H, 4R/1ER, 3BB, 16K, 1HP) in four starts since returning from the D.L. on 4/19, with the Yankees winning all four...was on the 10-day D.L. from 4/7-19 with a right hip strain...leads active Major League pitchers in career strikeouts (2,869), complete games (38) and quality starts (305)...ranks second in wins (239), innings pitched (3,349.1) and starts (515) to Bartolo Colón (241 wins, 3,353.2IP, 533 starts)...is 17th on the all-time strikeout list (2,869K), third all-time among left-handers.

WELCOME BACK: Is 2-0 with a 0.39 ERA (23.1IP, 14H, 4R/1ER, 3BB, 16K, 1HP) in four starts since returning from the D.L. on 4/19, with the Yankees winning all four...his four-start streak with 1ER-or-fewer, and his three-start streak with at least 6.0IP and 1R-or-fewer, are both his second-longest as a Yankee (had at least 7.2IP and 1R-or-fewer in five straight starts from 6/25-7/16/11).

- ✦ Opponents are hitting .165/.202/.212 (14-for-85) during this stretch...lefties are just 1-for-14 with 0BB.
