OPEN AND SHUT CASE: Mike Montgomery pitched scoreless ball into the seventh inning while David Bote drove in a career-high three runs to pace the Chicago Cubs to a 5-0 win in Kansas City last night, the club's lone stop of a brief three-game road trip ... the Cubs have won five of their seven games in August and tonight wrap up a stretch of 21 games in 21 days out of the All-Star Break.

© Owners of the best record in the N.L., the Cubs last night improved to 19 games above .500 for the first time this season ... the club had nestled upon the 18-game-above-.500 mark six times prior to last night's victory.

© The Cubs also recorded their 12th shutout of the year last night, tied with Pittsburgh and Cleveland for most in the majors ... the Cubs had only eight shutouts a season ago.

© Including this series win in Kansas City, the Cubs are now unbeaten in five of their last six series, going 2-1-3 during this stretch ... the Cubs are also 11-9 in 20 games since the All-Star Break and own a 2.5 game lead in the N.L. Central, the largest divisional lead in the National League.

© The Cubs are 10-4 (.714) vs. the American League in 2018, the third-best winning percentage in the majors in interleague play this season ... after this series, the Cubs still have interleague sets remaining at Detroit (August 21-22) and at the White Sox (September 21-23).

© After today's series finale and tomorrow's off day, the Cubs return to Wrigley for a brief five-game homestand vs. Washington and Milwaukee starting Friday.

NO, HE REALLY IS 29: Anthony Rizzo today celebrates his 29th birthday and is two hits shy of 1,000 in his career ... the GLOAT has reached base in 12-straight games, batting .320 (16-for-50) with five homers, seven runs scored, nine RBI, two hit-by-pitches and two walks, contributing to a .370 OBP and 1.010 OPS during this stretch.

© In 23 games batting leadoff this season, Rizzo has batted .356 (32-for-90) with six doubles, one triple, six homers and 11 walks, contributing to a .443 OBP.

© Rizzo's recent homer binge has upped his total to 182 home runs with the Cubs, 11th-most in franchise history (Hack Wilson 10th with 190), as Rizzo's homer on Saturday surpassed Alfonso Soriano (181 homers) .. Rizzo's 182 blasts are third-most among Cubs left-handed batters, exceeded only by Billy Williams (392) and Bill Nicholson (205).

BREAK IT UP: Ben Zobrist has batted .451 (23-for-51) since the All-Star Break, second best in the National League (Milwaukee's Christian Yelich, .453) ... Zobrist's .483 on-base percentage since the Break is third best in the league.

#EVERYBOTEIN: David Bote leads all qualifying National League rookies with a .409 batting average since the All-Star Break ... Bote's 1.207 OPS since the break also leads all league rookies, ahead of Washington's Juan Soto's 1.197 OPS ... Bote's .727 slugging leads league rookies, ahead of Soto's .710 mark, while Bote's .480 on-base percentage trails only Soto (.487) among league rookies since the Break.

OUR BÁE: Javier Báez is already just the third different Cub in franchise history to reach 30 doubles, five triples, 25 homers and 15 stolen bases in a single season, joining Ryne Sandberg (1985 and 1992) and Alfonso Soriano (2007) ... thanks to Christopher Kamka.

© Additionally, it took Javy only 110 games to reach 25 homers this season ... according to STATS, Inc., he is the third-fastest second baseman to reach the mark in franchise history in the Modern Era (since 1900), trailing only Sandberg (92 games in 1990) and Rogers Hornsby (106 games in 1929).

© Báez's 88 RBI lead the National League and are tied for second most in the majors, trailing only Boston's J.D. Martinez (97 RBI) ... Báez also ranks at or near the top in several offensive categories, as seen on the left side of this page.

© Overall, Baez has already set career-high marks in homers (25), doubles (31), triples (7), RBI (88) and stolen bases (19) ... he is nearing career-highs with 72 runs scored (75 in 2017) and 125 hits (128 in 2017).

© Projected over 162 games, Báez is on pace to record 44 doubles, 36 homers, 27 stolen bases and 126 RBI this season.

Q QUOTIENT: Since joining the Cubs during the 2017 All-Star Break, José Quintana has gone 17-10 with a 3.95 ERA (87 ER/198.0 IP) in 35 starts ... he joins teammate Jon Lester (20-6) as the only two N.L. southpaws to reach 17 wins since last year's Break ... Lester and Quintana are two of only five lefties in baseball to reach 17 wins in this time, joining J.A. Happ (18-11), Chris Sale (17-8) and Blake Snell (17-7).

"SECOND HALF" SPLENDOR: In the last four seasons since 2015, the Cubs have amassed a 160-82 record after the All-Star Break, and the team's .661 win percentage is by far the best in the baseball ... Cleveland is a distant second with a .613 mark (146-92) in that span.

IT'S JOB ONE: Mike Montgomery last night recorded a quality start (6.0+ IP, 0 ER), the club's second this series but just the seventh by a Cubs pitcher in the club's 20 games since the All-Star Break and only their fifth on the road starting June 17 ... the Cubs have turned in quality starts in back-to-back games on the road for the first time since July 9-10 in San Francisco.

© Cubs starting pitchers are 27-7 with a 1.40 ERA (43 ER/276.0 IP) in 43 quality starts this season.

LIGHTS, RED BARON, NO ACTION: 30 years ago tonight the Cubs attempted to play the first night game in the history of Wrigley Field ... ace Rick Sutcliffe got the start vs. the Philadelphia Phillies but the game was postponed due to rain in the fourth inning ... the next night, the Cubs defeated the Mets, 6-4, in the first official night game at Wrigley Field.

TO THE LEFT, TO THE LEFT: The Cubs will throw all left-handed starting pitchers this week against the Royals, as the club's rotation currently features four southpaws (Lester, Hamels, Montgomery and Quintana) and one right-handed starter (Kyle Hendricks) ... last week, the Cubs started a left-handed pitcher in four-straight games for the first time since September 21-23, 1966 at Wrigley Field vs. the Reds (Ken Holtzman, Dave Dowling) and Dodgers (Curt Simmons, Dick Ellsworth), and the Cubs are scheduled to do so again by the end of this series ... thanks to Ed Hartig for his research assistance.

PLEASE PARDON THIS HIGHLY OFFENSIVE INFORMATION: The Cubs lead the National League with a .267 team batting average, comfortably ahead of Atlanta (.258) and Cincinnati (.257) ... Ben Zobrist is fifth in the N.L. with a .313 average, while Albert Almora Jr. (.300) and Javier Báez (.300) are tied for ninth.

© The Cubs lead the National League in runs (565), on-base percentage (.345) and OPS (.771) ... Chicago's 359 extra-base hits are fourth in the N.L. ... the Dodgers lead with 382.

WHAT'S THE DIFFERENCE?: The Cubs lead the N.L. with a +105 run differential ... that mark ranks fifth in the majors, trailing Houston (+202), Boston (+194), the Yankees (+130) and Cleveland (+109) ... the Dodgers are the closest N.L. club with a +97 differential.

José tonight makes his 22nd start of the season, and team-high 13th on the road ... has taken a decision in 17 of his 21 starts ... is 4-1 with a 3.54 ERA (11 ER/28.0 IP) in his last five starts and the Cubs are 5-1 in his last six starts.

- Ⓞ Has reached the 10-win plateau for the third-straight season ... his career-high is 13 wins in 2016.
- Ⓞ Did not allow an earned run in three-straight road starts, May 4-31 (17.0 consecutive innings) ... tied for the most consecutive road starts with 0 ER by a Cubs starter since 1912.
- Ⓞ Led all Cubs starters with three wins and a .256 opponent batting average in July.
- Ⓞ With 10 strikeouts in 5.2 innings against the Phillies on June 6, he became the first Cubs pitcher to record at least 10 strikeouts in an outing shorter than 6.0 innings since Jake Arrieta on June 5, 2016 vs. Arizona (12 SO, 5.0 IP).
- Ⓞ Made his season debut April 1 at Miami ... allowed six runs in 6.0 innings in the Cubs' 6-0 setback.
- Ⓞ Has six starts of at least 6.0-scoreless innings this season (including two starts of 7.0-scoreless frames).
- Ⓞ Earned his first win of the season in the Cubs' 3-0 victory at Milwaukee on April 8, allowing just three hits and striking out six over 6.0 scoreless innings.
- Ⓞ Recorded his 1,000th-career strikeout during the Cubs' 9-7 win at Colorado on April 22 ... became the first Colombian-born pitcher to reach 1,000 career strikeouts.
- Ⓞ Has gone 4-4 with a 2.88 ERA (16 ER/50.0 IP) in nine starts vs. the N.L. Central this season ... overall is 8-5 with a 2.93 ERA (32 ER/98.1 IP) in 17 starts vs. divisional opponents since joining the Cubs.

Career Notes

- Ⓞ José made his 200th career start on July 4, becoming the 14th active left-handed pitcher to reach the mark ... his 3.58 ERA (499 ER/1253.1 IP) ranks seventh among all active lefties with at least 200 starts ... with his seven strikeouts against Colorado on April 22, he also became the 14th active left-handed pitcher to reach 1,000-career strikeouts ... since the start of the 2013 season, José ranks in the top 10 among all left-handed pitchers in games started (182), innings pitched (1,117.0), strikeouts (1,008) and wins (61).
- Ⓞ Joins teammate Jon Lester as the only lefties to start at least 32 games in each of the last five campaigns.
- Ⓞ Debuted with the White Sox in 2012 and went 50-54 with a 3.51 ERA (412 ER/1,055.1 IP) in 172 appearances, all but three as a starter on the South Side.
- Ⓞ Was named a 2016 A.L. All-Star ... finished 13-12 with a 3.20 ERA (74 ER/208.0 IP) in 32 starts in 2016.
- Ⓞ Pitched in the 2017 World Baseball Classic for Colombia ... made one start, allowing one run on just one hit in 5.2 innings pitched.
- Ⓞ Is one of 20 Colombian-born players to appear in the majors all-time.
- Ⓞ Has 199 strikeouts since the Cubs traded for him on July 13, 2017, the most of any Cubs pitcher during that span.

Friday's Starter vs. Washington – RHP Kyle Hendricks (8-9, 4.07)

Kyle makes his team-high 24th start of the season, and 13th at home, Friday against the Nationals ... earned his second-straight win last Saturday vs. the Padres, allowing four runs in 5.2 innings in the Cubs 5-4 victory ... has fanned at least seven batters in three-straight starts for the second time in his last (also, September-October, 2015).

- Ⓞ Has a 3.75 ERA (30 ER/72.0 IP) in 11 home starts compared to a 4.45 ERA (30 ER/60.2 IP) in 11 road starts.
- Ⓞ In 2017, Kyle went 7-5 with a 3.03 ERA (47 ER/139.2 IP) in 24 starts ... led all Cubs starting pitchers with the 3.03 ERA ... posted a 2.62 ERA (36 ER/123.2 IP) in his final 21 starts beginning April 25, the fourth-best mark in the N.L. among pitchers with at least 10 starts in that span.
- Ⓞ Has gone 2-2 with a 2.67 ERA (9 ER/30.1 IP) in five-career starts in the regular season against Washington ... has lost each of his last two regular season starts ... has a 1.80 ERA (4 ER/20.0 IP) in three-career starts against Washington at Wrigley Field ... started Games 1 and 5 in the NLDS at Washington last year ... the Cubs won both games.
