RAY MATTER—The Rays have won four consecutive games to improve to a season-high 12 games over .500, their most since finishing the 2013 season at 92-71...in the first four seasons under Manager **Kevin Cash**, their high-water mark was 10 games over .500, at 40-30 in 2015...the Rays are 13-2 in their last 15 games, their best 15-game stretch since July 8-27, 2013 (13-2), and they have outscored opponents, 76-37, over this span.

- + The Rays are 4-1-1 in their last six road series after going 1-7-0 in their previous eight...they are 5-2 on this trip to Atlanta (1-1), Cleveland (2-1) and Toronto (2-0) and have clinched a second consecutive winning road trip for the first time since April 25-May 2 and May 11-20...following tonight's series finale, 16 of the club's final 23 games are at home, where the Rays are a majors-best 29-8 (.784) since June 11 and have an active 8-game winning streak.
- + A win tonight would give the Rays their seventh winning streak of 5 games (or more) this season, their most since 2010 (7)...their six winning streaks of that type are tied with the Astros, who also have an active 4-game winning streak, for most in the majors.
- + The Rays are 26-16 (.619) since the All-Star break, 3rd-best winning pct. in the AL since then behind the Red Sox (.667) and A's (.651).

SEEKING SWEEP—Tonight the Rays have a chance to clinch their third sweep in the last five series (Aug 20-23 vs. KC, Aug 24-26 vs. BOS)...the Rays have swept 10 series this season—one 4-game series, seven 3-game series and two 2-game series...the 10 sweeps are their most since a club-record 12 sweeps in 2013, and are 4th-most in the majors behind the Red Sox (13), Yankees (12) and Astros (11)...furthermore, their eight sweeps in series of 3+ games are tied for 2nd in the majors behind the Red Sox (11).

- + The Rays have swept two road series this season: April 25-26 at BAL (2-0) and May 14-16 at KC (3-0)...the sweep of the Royals was their first in a series of 3+ games on the road since May 2016.

WHERE WE STAND—Last night's results pulled the Rays to within 7 GB of the Athletics for the AL's second Wild Card, the closest they've been to that spot since they were 6.5 GB of the Mariners through June 1.

- + The Rays trail the A's and Mariners for the AL's second Wild Card...they are 1.5 GB of the Mariners, but have gained 7 games on them in the second half and 10.5 games since the start of play on July 7.
- + The Rays are on pace for 88 wins, and no team has missed the post-season with that many wins since the 2013 Rangers (91).
- + It's worth noting that with 24 games remaining in 2011, the Rays were also 75-63 and 9.0 GB of the Red Sox for the AL's lone Wild Card...that season, the Rays passed the Red Sox on the final day.
- + A team with the same record as the Rays would be 1 GB in the NL East, 1 GB in the NL West and 3 GB in the AL Central.

RAYS vs. BLUE JAYS—The Rays are 9-2 against the Blue Jays this season (5-1 at home, 4-1 on the road), and are 7-1 in their last 8 games...the Rays have pitched to a 1.47 ERA (98-IP, 16-ER) and .169 opp avg. (56-for-331) in the season series, and have combined to allow 5 runs in the last 7 games...they have allowed 4 runs or fewer in all 11 games against them this season, 2 runs or fewer nine times and 1 run or fewer six times...they are a win away from clinching the season series for the ninth time in 11 years...they are 194-169 (.534) all-time, their most wins against any opponent.

- + The Rays have held the Blue Jays to 5 hits or fewer in seven consecutive games since June 12, tied for the longest streak by any team against a single opponent in the live ball era, according to Stats LLC...the Orioles held the Washington Senators to 5 hits or fewer in seven straight games from Sep 11, 1968-April 18, 1969.
- + Tonight the Rays are attempting to sweep a series at Rogers Centre for the fifth time in franchise history (last May 16-18, 2016)...this is actually the fourth consecutive time the Rays have an opportunity to sweep the Blue Jays, but they lost the series finale on May 6 at home and Aug 12 here (completed the sweep on June 13 at home).
- + This is the second of three consecutive road trips to go through Toronto, and the Rays host the Blue Jays in the final series of the season from Sep 28-30...this series continues a stretch facing them 13 times in the club's final 47 games of the season.

PITCHING PROPERLY—Last night seven Rays pitchers combined on a 3-hit shutout of the Blue Jays...it was their 12th shutout of the season,

their most since 2015 (12), tied for 6th in the majors and tied for 3rd in the AL...they have achieved this despite being the 2nd-to-last team in the majors with one, with the first coming on May 28 at OAK...seven of their shutouts have come on the road, their most since 2015 (7), tied for 3rd in the majors and tied with three other teams for most in the AL.

- + Last night was the second time in franchise history the Rays used 7 pitchers (or more) in a shutout, joining Oct 2, 2010 at KC (eight pitchers in an 8-hit shutout)...they were the first team to do this in the majors since the Blue Jays on June 11, 2017 at SEA (7) and the first team to do this when allowing 3 hits or fewer since the Mets on Oct 4, 2015 vs. WAS (seven pitchers in a 2-hit shutout).
- + The Rays enter tonight's game having allowed 1 run in their last 18 IP...tonight they are attempting to allow 1 run or fewer in a third consecutive game for the third time this season (last Aug 19-21).
- + The Rays rank 3rd in the AL with a 3.63 ERA, their lowest mark since 2014 (3.56)...since Aug 10, the Rays lead the majors with a 2.33 ERA—they have yielded 3 runs or fewer in 17 of these 23 games (73.9 pct.) and 1 run or fewer in 11 of these 23 games (47.8 pct.).

THE WILL TO WIN—Last night **Hunter Wood** recorded his first career win, and he became the 23rd different Rays pitcher with a win this season, extending the club record, and most in the majors...the only pitcher on the active roster without a win for the Rays this season is **Tyler Glasnow**...excluding the four position players who have pitched, 23 of the 27 players (85.2 pct.) to pitch for the Rays this season have a win.

ABOUT THE OFFENSE—The Rays rank 3rd in the AL with a .257 avg. and 2nd in the AL with a .329 OBP...in the last 13 games, the Rays are averaging 5.62 runs, including 4 runs or more 12 times and 5 runs or more nine times...they have recorded double-digit hits in 10 of their last 13 games.

- + Last night was the 25th time this season the Rays won without the benefit of a home run, most in the majors...they have totaled 122 HR this season, 4th-fewest in the majors, and are on pace for 143 HR, which would be 85 HR fewer than their club-record 228 HR last season...they are 26-5 (.839) when hitting multiple homers.
- + The Rays rank 4th in the majors with 99 SB and 1st with a club-record 85 HBP...they are on pace for 100 HBP, which would rank 2nd in AL history behind the 2008 Indians (103).

PICK YOUR POISON—The Rays have two players batting at least .300 in **Mallex Smith** (.305, 6th in the AL) and **Joey Wendle** (.300, 9th in the AL and best among major league rookies) and a third player, **Matt Duffy** (.299, 10th in the AL and best among AL third basemen), flirting with a .300 avg. ...never in franchise history have three qualifying players finished with a .300 avg. or better...twice the Rays have had a pair of qualifiers do that—**Jason Bartlett** (.320) and **Carl Crawford** (.305) in 2009 and Crawford (.315) and **Melvin Upton Jr.** (.300) in 2007...the Rays haven't had a single qualifier hit .300 or better since **Casey Kotchman** (.306) in 2011.

- + Wendle is attempting to become the first Ray to lead major league rookie qualifiers in avg. ...**Rocco Baldelli**'s club-rookie-record .289 avg. in 2003 led AL rookies but ranked 3rd among ML rookies.
- + The Rays, Red Sox, Braves and Brewers are the only teams in the majors with two qualifying players batting .300 or better.

CHANGE IN APPROACH—The Rays have reduced their strikeout rate (SO/PA) from 25.0 pct. in 2017 to 22.5 pct. in 2018, the largest drop in the majors ahead of Oakland (24.3 to 22.0)...with Major League Baseball on pace to break its own strikeout record for an 11th consecutive season, the Rays are one of only eight major league teams that have reduced their SO/PA ratio from 2017...from 2017 to 2018, the Rays have raised their season batting avg. from .245 to .257 and their avg. with RISP from .227 to .248.

MINOR MATTERS—Yesterday the DSL Rays1 won the Dominican Summer League title with a 8-1 win in the decisive Game 5 over the DSL Rangers1...today Triple-A Durham, Double-A Montgomery, Class-A Bowling Green and Short-A Hudson Valley all begin postseason play, and Rookie-level Princeton continues its best-of-3 championship series (trailing 1-0).

- + A club-record six affiliates made the postseason this season...all nine affiliates finished the regular season at least 10 games over .500, and they combined for a 539-354 (.604) record.

LAST START—On Fri at CLE, his only run allowed in a career-high 7 IP was a solo homer by **Edwin Encarnacion** in the 7th inning...faced the minimum through 4 IP and did not allow a hit until a 2-out, 5th-inning single...averaged 11.3 pitches per inning, and never threw more than 13 pitches in a frame...became the fifth Rays pitcher (6th time) to lose a start of 7 IP (or more) and 2 hits or fewer, first since **Jake Odorizzi** on May 29, 2016 vs. NYY (7-IP, 1-H, 2-R/ER)...he was the first Rays starter to do this when allowing 1 run or fewer since **James Shields** on Oct 2, 2012 vs. BAL (9-IP, 2-H, 1-R/ER)...his line: L, 7 IP, 2 H, 1 R, 1 BB, 6 SO, 1 HR, 1 HBP, 79 pit, 56 str.

EARLY RETURNS—Is 0-2 with a 3.23 ERA (30.2-IP, 11-ER) and 38 SO in 6 starts with the Rays...min. 25 IP, since Aug 1 his 11.15 SO/9 IP ratio ranks 8th in the AL and his 4.70 hits per 9 IP ratio leads the AL and ranks 2nd in the majors behind **STL Jack Flaherty** (4.14)...has a 2.93 BB/9 IP ratio with the Rays, down from 5.46 with PIT.

- + Has yielded 3 hits or fewer in five of his 6 starts and 2 hits or fewer in 4 starts... has allowed 1 run or fewer in four of his 6 starts since the trade.
- + His max velocity with the Rays is 100.2 mph, in his start on Aug 7 vs. BAL...his max velocity this season is 100.4 mph, in relief on May 24 at CIN (with PIT).

STANDING TALL—Is the fifth pitcher in club history standing 6'8" or taller, according to Baseball Reference, following **Jeff Niemann** (6'9"), **Adam Russell** (6'8"), **Mark Hendrickson** (6'9") and **Billy Taylor** (6'8")...Rays pitching coach **Kyle Snyder** is also listed by Baseball Reference at 6'8" and spent parts of five years in the majors.

THE NEW GUY—Was acquired from the Pirates on July 31, along with outfielder **Austin Meadows** and a player to be named, for righthander **Chris Archer**...on Aug 14, the Rays acquired minor league right-handed pitcher **Shane Baz**, the No. 95 prospect in the minors, according to MLB.com, to complete the trade...at the time of the trade, his 72 SO were 3rd among NL relievers to **MIL Josh Hader** (99) and **COL Adam Ottavino** (77), and his 19 relief apps of at least 2 IP were most in the majors.

MAKING THE LEAP—Has a 3.31 ERA (51.2-IP, 19-ER) and .182 opp avg. (32-for-176) in 21 apps (6 starts) since June 15 vs. CIN (with PIT)...made the Pirates Opening Day roster for a second consecutive season...has pitched to a lower ERA in each calendar month this season: 4.70 in April, 4.30 in May, 4.20 in June, 4.09 in July and 3.23 in August.

- + Was ranked by *Baseball America* as a Top 50 prospect in the minors for four consecutive seasons (2014-17), including No. 16 entering the 2015 season and No. 14 entering the 2016 season...is 45-21 with a 2.02 ERA (593.1-IP, 133-ER) and 785 SO over parts of six minor league seasons.
- + Despite spending the first two months of last season in the Pirates rotation, his 140 SO for Triple-A Indianapolis ranked 3rd in the International League behind Durham's **Ryan Yarbrough** (159) and **Brent Honeywell** (152).

MIX & MATCH—Is one of a club-record 16 different starting pitchers used by the Rays this season, most in the majors ahead of the Angels (15)...the Rays used eight starting pitchers all of last season—in fact, the 16 starters this season are more than the team's total from the previous three seasons combined (14, 2015-17)...is one of a club-record 31 different pitchers used by the Rays this season.

ON THE CLOCK—Was selected by the Pirates in the fifth round of the 2011 June Draft out of William S. Hart High School in Santa Clarita, Calif.—the same school that produced former Ray and 2011 All-Star **James Shields** and Indians All-Star **Trevor Bauer** (signed with UCLA).

FRIDAY'S STARTER: LH BLAKE SNELL (17-5, 2.02 ERA)

LAST START—On Sat at CLE, yielded 8 hits, his most since May 8, 2017 vs. KC (10), but yielded only 2 R/1 ER in 6.2 IP, both in the 2nd inning, on RBI doubles by **Melky Cabrera** (unearned) and **Yan Gomes**...was replaced after a 7th-inning, 2-out single, snapping a streak of 10 consecutive batters retired...won a fifth consecutive decision, matching **Ryan Yarbrough's** current streak for the longest by a Ray since **Drew Smyly** (5) from July 30-Sep 13, 2016...his line: W, 6.2 IP, 8 H, 2 R/1 ER, 1 BB, 9 SO, 101 pit, 62 str.

PITCHER OF THE MONTH—Was named the American League Pitcher of the Month for August...he became the fifth Rays pitcher to receive the monthly honor, joining **Chris Archer** in July 2013, **Jeremy Hellickson** in

May 2011, **David Price** in Sep 2010 and **Scott Kazmir** in May 2008.

- + For the season, his 17 wins are tied with CLE **Corey Kluber** and NYY **Luis Severino** for the major league lead...his 2.02 ERA ranks 3rd behind NYM **Jacob deGrom** (1.68) and BOS **Chris Sale** (1.97).

vs. BALTIMORE—Is 1-2 with a 4.98 ERA (21.2-IP, 12-ER) in 4 starts against the Orioles, and has only faced them once this season, a 17-1 defeat on May 13 at BAL...is 1-1 with a 1.93 ERA (14-IP, 3-ER) in 2 starts at home.

- + Enters Friday's start having allowed 1 ER or fewer in 14 consecutive home starts, the longest such streak in the majors since 1913—when earned runs were officially kept in both leagues (Elias).

#16 KEVIN CASH, MANAGER

- + Selected by Astros Manager **A.J. Hinch** to join the AL coaching staff for the All-Star Game for a second consecutive season.
- + Is in his fourth season as Rays manager...at age 40, is the majors' youngest active skipper—5 months younger than SD **Andy Green**.
- + His last ejection was July 18, 2017 at OAK, his seventh ejection as Rays manager...his 7 ejections are tied for 4th in franchise history.
- + Is the sixth Tampa-born manager in major league history, and second

to manage the Rays...that list includes Hall of Famers **Al Lopez** and **Tony La Russa**, **Lou Piniella**, **Dave Miley** and **John Hart**.

- + Played 12 professional seasons as a catcher, incl. parts of eight seasons in the majors (2002-10) and two years (2005-06) in the Rays org.
- + Played in the 1989 Little League World Series (Tampa Northside LL), 1999 College World Series (Florida State) and earned World Series rings in 2007 (Red Sox) and 2009 (Yankees).
