**ROSTER MOVES**—The Rays have designated OF **Jeremy Hazelbaker** for assignment and selected LH **Adam Kolarek** from Triple-A Durham...Kolarek, 29, made his major league debut with the Rays last season, making 12 apps over two stints in the majors...he was selected by the Mets in the 11th round of the 2010 June Draft...he was 4-1 with a 1.70 ERA (42.1-IP, 8-ER) in 29 apps (1 start) with Durham this season...following Wednesday's game, the Rays optioned RH **Ryan Weber** to Durham.

**RAY MATTER**—The Rays lost, 3-0, on Wed at MIA to snap a streak of three consecutive series wins (Yankees, Nationals, Astros)...the game's first pitch occurred 12 hours and 29 minutes following the conclusion of a 9-6, 16-inning win on Tues at MIA...the Rays were shut out for the sixth time, tied for 4th-most in the AL, and it was the 20th time they were held to 1 run or fewer, tied for 2nd-most in the majors to the Orioles (23).

- + The Rays are 9-3 in their last 12 games to improve from 6 games under .500 (34-40) to 43-43...their high-water mark of the season is 2 games over .500 (28-26)...twice over this span the Rays have lost when they would have returned to 2 games over with a win.
- + Since April 18, the Rays have gone 39-30 (.565) to improve from 4-13, which tied for the worst 17-game start in franchise history.
- + Tonight is the fourth game of a 6-game road trip against a pair of NL East teams: Miami (1-2) and New York (0-0)...the Rays are 3-13 in their last 16 road games, and they haven't won a series on the road since May 28-31 at OAK, going 0-5 in series play since then.

**PITCHING PLANS**—Tonight's game will be started by **Ryne Stanek**, his third app in a 4-game span (also Mon-Tues at MIA)...it will be the 16th time the Rays use an "opener," all since May 19, as well as the 10th time overall and eighth consecutive time they use Stanek in that role...Stanek has pitched to a 1.42 ERA (12.2-IP, 2-ER) in his 9 starts, while other Rays "openers" have pitched to a 16.20 ERA (5-IP, 9-ER) in 6 starts...while the Rays are 6-9 in games started by openers, the team has pitched to a 3.38 ERA (133.1-IP, 50-ER) in these games—and pitchers following the opener have a 3.03 ERA (115.2-IP, 39-ER)...since the debut of the "opener" on May 19, Rays pitchers lead the majors with a 2.78 ERA (392.1-IP, 121-ER).

**REDEFINING RELIEF**—So far this season, Rays relievers have totaled:

- + 29 apps of at least 50 pitches, most in the majors, ahead of the Marlins (13), and their most for a season since 2003 (29)
- + 13 apps of at least 70 pitches, most in the majors, ahead of the Marlins (7), and their most for any season in club history (2004, 7)
- + 64 apps of at least 2 IP, most in the majors (Padres, 53)
- + 32 apps of at least 3 IP, most in the majors (Marlins, 14)
- + 21 apps of at least 4 IP, most in the majors (Marlins, 8)
- + Rays relievers lead the majors with 392 IP, most in the majors by 39 IP (Marlins, 353 IP) and most in the AL by 66.1 IP (Angels, 325.2 IP)...Rays starters have covered 382.2 IP, fewest in the majors.

**PITCHING PROPERLY**—The Rays have pitched to a 1.86 ERA (87-IP, 19-R/18-ER) in their last 9 games and a 1.92 ERA (117-IP, 26-R/25-ER) in their last 12 games...they have allowed 3 runs or fewer in eight of their last 9 games and 10 of their last 12 games, including three shutouts.

- + The Rays rank 8th in the majors and 4th in the AL with a 3.59 ERA (774.2-IP, 309-ER), tied for the 2nd-lowest in franchise history through the first 86 games of the season behind 2015 (3.51).
- + The Rays are tied for 4th in the AL with 6 shutouts...all 6 shutouts have come since May 28, tied with the Giants for most in the majors over that span...three of them have come since June 23.

**RAYS vs. METS**—The Rays are 9-12 (.429) all-time against the Mets (5-7 at home, 4-5 on the road)...this series is the first meeting between the clubs

since Aug 7-9, 2015 at Tropicana Field, and first on the road since June 19-21, 2009—though the Rays did play at Citi Field last season, with the relocation of the Sep 11-13 home series against the Yankees due to the arrival of Hurricane Irma in Florida...the Rays are 3-9 in interleague play this season (2-5 at home, 1-4 on the road), 3rd-worst in the majors and 2nd-worst in the AL to the Tigers (1-9)...the Rays are 113-89 (.559) in interleague play since 2008—5th-best in the majors—and 187-193 all-time.

- + In the last 10 seasons (2008-17), the Rays have only one losing interleague record (7-11 in 2010)...the NL is 87-74 (.540) in IL play this season, but the AL has won each of the last 14 season series.

**COMMON BOND**—Five former Rays players have gone on to manage major league teams and three of those were hired this past offseason...among the five are Rays Manager **Kevin Cash** (played for Rays in 2005) and Mets skipper **Mickey Callaway** (1999, 2001), who were on the Indians coaching staff together from 2013-14...the others are former White Sox/Marlins Manager **Ozzie Guillén** (2000), Nationals skipper **Dave Martinez** (1998-2000) and Phillies Manager **Gabe Kapler** (2009-10).

**TIP OF THE CAP**—The Rays are returning to Citi Field for the first time since Sep 11-13, 2017, when they played the Yankees as the home team in a 3-game series following to the arrival of Hurricane Irma in Florida...the Rays would again like to thank the entire Mets organization for their hospitality and for graciously hosting those games at Citi Field.

**LIGHTEN UP**—This series continues a stretch of 16 games in a row from July 2-22 against teams currently under .500, as well as 29 of 35 games through Aug 12...from June 14-July 1, the Rays played 16 consecutive games against the Yankees, Nationals, and Astros—all postseason teams from a year ago—and they went 10-6 over that span, including 10-3 in their last 13 games...from May 28-July 1, 29 out of the club's 32 games were against teams that are currently .500 or better, and they went 17-15 over that span...this season, the Rays are 22-11 (.667) against teams currently below .500 and 21-32 (.396) against teams currently .500 or better.

**CLOSE SHAVES**—43.0 pct. of Rays games have been decided by 1 run, compared to 27.6 pct. of games in the majors...the Rays are 16-21 (.432) in 1-run games, including 6-2 in their last eight 1-run games...the 37 1-run games are tied with the Mariners for most in the majors and the 21 1-run losses are most in the majors, ahead of the White Sox (18)...74.4 pct. of Rays games have either been wins or 1-run losses...48.8 pct. of their losses have come by one run, 2nd-highest rate in the majors (Astros, 51.6 pct.).

- + The Rays are on pace for 40 1-run losses, which hasn't been done since the 1992 Dodgers (40) or by an AL club since the 1968 White Sox (44)...the club record for 1-run losses in a season is 30 (2015).

**SIGNING UPDATE**—In advance of tonight's 5 p.m. deadline, the Rays have signed LH **Shane McClellan** (1st round, No. 31 overall) and OF **Beau Brundage** (33rd round, No. 990 overall)...McClellan went 5-6 with a 3.42 ERA (76.1-IP, 29-ER) and 120 SO in 14 starts as a redshirt sophomore at the University of South Florida...Brundage was named second team All-WCC after batting .378 (79-for-209) with 13 2B, 4 3B, 1 HR and 24 RBI in 53 games as a redshirt sophomore at the University of Portland.

- + The Rays have signed 35 of their 43 selections from the 2018 June Draft, including all 23 picks within the first 20 rounds.

**MINOR MATTERS**—Major League Baseball has announced the rosters for the SiriusXM All-Star Futures Game, and the Rays will be represented on the World Team by OF **Jesús Sánchez** and on the U.S. Team by INF **Nate Lowe**...the Rays have named C **Ronaldo Hernández** and LH **Colin Poche** as their Minor League Player and Pitcher of the Month for June, respectively...Hernández hit .366 (30-for-82) with 6 2B, 10 HR and 25 RBI in 22 games for Class-A Bowling Green, and Poche went 1-0 with a 0.57 ERA (15.2-IP, 1-ER) and 28 SO in 8 apps (2 starts) for Triple-A Durham.

**TURNING THE CORNER**—Since the beginning of June, has gone 0-1 with a 0.51 ERA (17.2-IP, 1-ER) in 14 apps (7 starts), and 13 of those 14 apps have been scoreless...opponents are batting .119/.224/.136 (7-for-59) against him over this stretch...in addition, he has pitched to a 1.14 ERA (23.2-IP, 3-ER) dating back to May 22 vs. BOS...this has lowered his season ERA from 7.36 to 1.98 and career ERA from 6.08 to 3.61.

**LAST OUTING**—Last pitched on Tues at MIA, and he went 2 IP to match his season high, and it was his longest relief app since Aug 5, 2017 vs. MIL...retired all 6 BF over the 12th and 13th innings...on Mon at MIA, did not record an out to 3 BF in the 10th inning, snapping a 15.2 IP scoreless streak for his second loss...last started on Sat vs. HOU, pitching around a 2-out single in the 1st inning for a scoreless frame.

**A NEW LOOK**—Will be making the 10th start of his career, all since May 26...this will be the 16th time the Rays use an "opener," all since May 19, as well as the eighth consecutive time they use Stanek in that role...he has pitched to a 1.42 ERA (12.2-IP, 2-ER) in his 9 starts, while other Rays "openers" have pitched to a 16.20 ERA (5-IP, 9-ER) in 6 starts...he has made 3 starts of 1 IP, 2 starts of 1.1 IP, 3 starts of 1.2 IP and 1 start of 2 IP, and has faced between 4-7 batters in all 9 starts...he started 41 games in the minors, most recently on June 4, 2016 at Double-A Jacksonville (Marlins).

+ Hasn't gone more than 2 IP or thrown more than 40 pitches this season, although his career high is 47 pitches on Aug 5, 2017 vs. MIL.

**GIVE HIM THE HEATER, RICKY**—Has averaged 98.2 mph on his fastball this season, according to StatCast, and his max velocity is 100.5 mph in his start on May 26 vs. BAL...35.0 pct. of his total pitches have been clocked at 98.0 mph or more, 2nd-highest rate in the AL behind NYY Aroldis Chapman (56.4)...last season he averaged 98.1 mph on his fastball, and he made 14 pitches of 100 mph or more, the most by a Ray since Fernando Rodney (23) in 2013...he has been ranked by Baseball America as having the Best Fastball in the organization in each of the past two seasons.

**JUNE BOOM**—He did not allow a run in 12 apps (7 starts) spanning 15.2 IP in the month of June...he became the first pitcher in the majors to make at least 12 apps and 7 starts within a single calendar month since PHI Karl Drews (12 apps, 7 starts) in June 1953 as well as the first AL pitcher to do this since Jim Walkup (14 apps, 7 starts) of the St. Louis Browns in August 1935.

+ Was the first pitcher to ever make 12 apps and 7 starts within a single calendar month without allowing a run.

**QUIRKS OF THE "OPENER"**—His last 7 starts have been scoreless, the longest such streak since Baseball Reference is available (1908)...has made 4 starts without allowing a hit, the most for any pitcher in a single season since Baseball Reference data is available (1908).

## TOMORROW'S STARTER: LH BLAKE SNELL (11-4, 2.24 ERA)

**LAST START**—On Sun vs. HOU, went 7.1 IP, matching the longest start of his career (also April 27 at BOS), and his only run allowed was a 7th-inning solo homer by Evan Gattis, snapping his scoreless streak at 17 IP, longest by a Ray this season...reached double-digit strikeouts for the fifth time in his career and fourth time this season (and second consecutive start)...retired 14 in a row at one point, until a 5th-inning single by Max Stassi...his only walk allowed was the last batter faced in his outing...his line: W, 7.1 IP, 4 H, 1 R, 1 BB, 10 SO, 1 HR, 100 pit, 66 str.

**WHEN HE'S ON**—Has yielded 2 runs or fewer in 15 starts, tied with WAS Max Scherzer for most in the majors, and most in the AL ahead of HOU Justin Verlander (14) and NYY Luis Severino (14)...has allowed 2 runs or fewer in eight of his last 9 starts, a 1.43 ERA (56.2-IP, 9-ER) over that span.

+ Has allowed 1 run or fewer in 11 starts this season, tied with ATL Mike Foltynewicz for most in the majors, and most in the AL ahead of Verlander (10).

**THE WILL TO WIN**—His 11 wins are tied for 3rd in club history before the All-Star break behind Matt Moore (13) in 2013 and David Price (12) in 2010...is tied for 3rd in the majors this season behind NYY Luis Severino (13) and CLE Corey Kluber (12)...has won three consecutive starts and seven of his last 8 decisions since May 18 at LAA.

**vs. NEW YORK**—Has never faced the Mets.

## #16 KEVIN CASH, MANAGER

+ Is in his fourth season as Rays manager...at age 40, is the majors' youngest active skipper—5 months younger than SD Andy Green.  
 + His last ejection was July 18, 2017 at OAK, his seventh ejection as Rays manager...his 7 ejections are tied for 4th in franchise history.  
 + Is the sixth Tampa-born manager in major league history, and second to manage the Rays...that list includes Hall of Famers Al Lopez and Tony La Russa, Lou Piniella, Dave Miley and John Hart.

+ Played 12 professional seasons as a catcher, incl. parts of eight seasons in the majors (2002-10) and two years (2005-06) in the Rays org.  
 + Played in the 1989 Little League World Series (Tampa Northside LL), 1999 College World Series (Florida State) and earned World Series rings in 2007 (Red Sox) and 2009 (Yankees).

- + Has appeared in 26 games and made 25 starts (21-1B, 3-DH, 1-LF)...the Rays are 15-10 in his 25 starts, including 12-4 in his 16 starts at home.
- + Among his season highlights is a 12th-inning, walk-off homer off Chasen Shreve on June 24 vs. NYY and a 4-hit game on June 25 vs. WAS.
- + Entered this season ranked by *Baseball America* as the No. 45 overall prospect in the minors...helped lead the Bulls to the Governors' Cup and Triple-A Championship last season, when he ranked among IL leaders in runs (79, 1st), walks (78, 2nd) and on-base pct. (.368, 5th).
