TODAY'S GAMES: The Braves and Nationals open a four-game series today with a split doubleheader, the 13th and 14th meetings between the teams this season... This set marks the Braves' final trip to Washington this season; they will play host to the Nationals for the final three games between the teams, September 14-16.

A The clubs are making up a postponement from July 21...The Braves won the first game of that series before Washington earned a split with a 6-2 win on July 22.

A LHP Max Fried is set for his first career start against the Washington Nationals...The lefty is 1-2 with a 2.75 ERA (6 ER/19.2 IP) in four starts this seasons...He is 1-1 with a 3.72 ERA (4 ER/9.2 IP) in two road starts this season.

A LHP Sean Newcomb is 1-2 with a 6.46 ERA (11 ER/15.1 IP) in three career starts against Washington, including 1-1 with a 5.56 ERA (7 ER/11.1 IP) in two starts this season...His only career start at Nationals Park came last season in a 10-5 loss on July 9.

A RHP Jefry Rodriguez is set for his first career start against Atlanta and his second appearance...The rookie made his MLB debut against the Braves on June 3, tossing 4.2 scoreless innings of relief at SunTrust Park.

A RHP Max Scherzer is scheduled for his 21st career game, 19th start against the Braves...The righty is 2-1 with a 1.80 ERA (4 ER/20.0 IP) in three starts against the Braves this season, including tossing a two-hitter and striking out 10 in a 2-0 win here on April 9.

DOUBLEHEADER: The Braves are set for their second doubleheader of the season; they split two with the Mets on May 28 at SunTrust Park...Atlanta will also play host to Miami for two games on August 13 for their third of the season.

A The Braves' three doubleheaders this year come a season after they had four doubleheaders, including two split ones...From 2014-2016 the club had a total of two doubleheaders.

A Today will be the Braves and Nationals 20th career doubleheader and first since September 17, 2013... The Nationals took both games that day here in Washington, but the Braves are 3-2-14 in the 19th doubleheaders with their division rivals.

A The Braves last swept a doubleheader from the Nationals/Expos on May 6, 1984...They won 2-0 and 9-8 at Olympic Stadium that day.

ROSTER MOVE: The Braves named Kolby Allard the 26th man for today's doubleheader...The lefty joins the team for the second time this season...He started and won his major league debut on July 31 vs. Miami.

A Allard, 20, went 6-4 with a 2.80 ERA in 18 starts at Triple-A Gwinnett this year.

LEFTY SAVES: LHP Jesse Biddle collected his first career save on Sunday, working around a lead-off double to preserve a 5-4 win...Biddle became the third Braves left-handed rookie to collect a save this season, joining A.J. Minter (8) and Luiz Gohara (1).

A Since the save became an official stat in 1969, only two other clubs had three rookie left-handers collect a save: the 1990 Braves and the 1971 Chicago Cubs

A That 1990 Braves club got saves from Tony Castillo (1), Kent Mercker (7) and Mike Stanton (2).

60 WINS: The Braves collected their 60th win of the season on Sunday in game no. 108...This season marks the quickest the club reached 60 wins since 2013, when the team was 63-45 after 108 games.

A The Braves were 50-58 at this point last season, and would not earn win no. 60 until September 3.

CLUTCH HOME RUNS: OF Nick Markakis drove a 2-0, 10th-inning pitch from Tyler Bashlor over the fence in right-center field Sunday to put the Braves up in their eventual 5-4 win.

A The Braves have hit nine home runs in the eighth-inning or later this season that have given the club the lead...That total is tied for the most in the National League with St. Louis and Colorado.

THE BULLPEN: The Braves bullpen allowed one run over 4.1 innings on Sunday while striking out six...Since allowing 10 runs over a two-game stretch, July 8 and July 10, Atlanta relievers have compiled a 2.43 ERA (15 ER/55.2 IP) with 57 strikeouts and 16 walks.

A The Braves bullpen's 2.43 ERA over this stretch (since July 11) is the second best in baseball and trails only the Oakland Athletics (2.20) for the top spot in baseball.

A The Braves acquired two relievers, RHP Brad Brach and LHP Jonny Venters, in July trades, and neither has allowed a run yet...Brach has made three scoreless outings of 1.0 inning each with four combined strikeouts, while Venters has allowed two baserunners over four games and 3.0 innings.

VS. THE N.L. EAST: The Braves are 34-17 (.667) against the National League East this season...The club has a +86 run differential against the division this season and have gone 12-2-3 in intradivision series play this season.

A Only Boston (.725) and Cleveland (.688) have better intradivision records.

A The Braves went 33-43 (.434) against their own division last season.

A The Braves have not had a winning intradivision record since 2014, when they went 40-36...Over the three previous seasons, the club went 103-124 (.454) against the N.L. East.

Today's Game

- A* Makes his fifth start and 10th appearance of the season, and the ninth start (19th appearance) of his career.
 - A* Faces Washington for the first time in his career.
- A* Has allowed just one hit with runners in scoring position this season, and has held opponents hitless in such situations with two outs.
 - A* Batters are 1-for-25 (.040) with 14 strikeouts with runners in scoring position, including an 0-for-10 mark with five strikeouts with two outs
 - A* Among pitchers with at least 25 at-bats with runners in scoring positions, Fried's .040 opponents' average is lowest in the majors.
- A* Made one appearance out of the bullpen since his last start, tossing a scoreless eighth inning on Saturday, 8/4, at NYM.
 - A* Is 2-3 with a 3.08 ERA (13 ER/38.0 IP) in eight career starts...Has pitched to an 0-2 record and a 4.91 ERA (8 ER/14.2 IP) in 10 relief appearances.
- A* Has three double-digit strikeout games this season between Atlanta and the minor leagues, and all three have come in his last eight starts...In total, has fanned 104 batters over 93.0 combined innings (10.06 SO/9.0 IP) across Atlanta, Gwinnett and Mississippi.
 - A* For reference, his 10.06 strikeouts per 9.0 innings would be the eighth-highest rate in the National League.

2018 Recap

- A* Returned from the disabled list and started against Los Angeles-NL, 7/28 at SunTrust Park...Allowed two hits and one run over 5.0 innings, but took the loss.
 - A* Atlanta did not score with him on the mound, and has been held scoreless in four of his eight career starts.
- A* Returned from his rehabilitation assignment to Double-A Mississippi and reinstated from the 10-day disabled list, 7/28...Missed 14 games with a left middle finger blister.
 - A* Made a pair of rehabilitation starts and did not allow a run over 11.1 combined innings...Tossed 4.2 hitless innings on 7/18 with Triple-A Gwinnett, before fanning 10 with just one hit and one walk over 6.2 innings on 7/23 with the M-Braves.
 - A* Started for Atlanta on 7/5 at MIL, and allowed four hits and four runs over 3.0 innings...Threw just 60 pitches...Was placed on the DL the following day.
- A* Set career highs in innings pitched and strikeouts, 6/30 at STL, fanning 11 over 6.2 innings...Allowed just four hits and three walks.
 - A* Became the seventh pitcher in Atlanta franchise history to record double-digit strikeouts within his first 15 career games, and the first to do so since Aaron Blair fanned 10 on 10/1/16 vs. DET.
 - A* Is just the second Atlanta starter to fan 10 or more batters in a scoreless effort within his first 15 career games...Kevin Millwood struck out 13 in a one-hit shutout on 4/14/98 vs. PIT.
- A* Made his first start with Atlanta, 5/28 vs. NYM in the first game of a doubleheader... Was added to the roster as the 26th man, and allowed two runs, one earned, over 5.0 innings.
 - A* Became the first Braves pitcher since Kevin Millwood in 1999 to pick off two runners in the same inning...Millwood did it on 7/18 at TOR... Since Millwood's two pickoffs, only six other major league pitchers have accomplished the feat, with MIN's Kyle Gibson doing it last on 9/7/16 vs. KC.
- A* Tossed 3.0 innings of one-run relief, 4/27 at PHI, but was saddled with his second consecutive loss...The 3.0 innings marked a career high out of the bullpen.
 - A* Was optioned to Triple-A on 5/5 after four total relief appearances with Atlanta.
- A* Recalled from Triple-A Gwinnett on 4/24 for his first stint on the roster and made his season debut that night at Cincinnati...Surrendered a walk and a walk-off home run to the only two batters he faced to take the loss, the first of his career in relief.
- A* Made 10 minor league starts between Triple-A Gwinnett and Double-A Mississippi this season, combining to go 2-4 with a 3.93 ERA (24 ER/55.0 IP) and 57 strikeouts.
 - A* Fanned a career-best 11 batters over 7.0 one-run innings, 6/13 at Norfolk...Earned his second win of the season.
 - A* Was the fourth double-digit strikeout effort of his minor league career.
 - A* Earned the first win of his Triple-A career in his second start, 4/18 vs. Scranton/Wilkes-Barre...Allowed a pair of runs over 5.1 innings.
 - A* Opened the season with Double-A Mississippi and made one start with the M-Braves, 4/8 vs. Tennessee...Allowed three hits and three walks over 4.2 innings, fanning six in a no-decision.
 - A* Was transferred to Gwinnett on 4/12.

- A* Acquired by the Atlanta Braves along with INF Jace Peterson, OF Dustin Peterson and OF Mallex Smith from the San Diego Padres in exchange for OF Justin Upton and RHP Aaron Northcraft on December 19, 2014

Tonight's Game

- A Makes his 22nd start of the season and the 41st of his career.
- A Came within one strike of a no-hitter in his last outing, 7/29 vs. LAD...Chris Taylor hit a two-strike single to left with two outs in the ninth for the Dodgers first hit.
 - A Newcomb's performance was the longest a Braves pitcher took a no-hit attempt since Shelby Miller also went 8.2 no-hit innings on 5/17/15 at Miami...Miller allowed a first-pitch single to Justin Bour.
- A Miller and Newcomb are the only two pitchers in Atlanta franchise history to lose a no-hitter with two outs in the ninth inning, according to research from the Elias Sports Bureau.
- A Makes his fourth career start against Washington, and his third this season...Is 1-2 with a 6.46 ERA (11 ER/15.1 IP) in his first three career starts.
 - A Earned his first win against the Nationals in his last turn, 5/31 at SunTrust Park...Allowed four hits and two runs over 7.0 innings in Atlanta's 4-2 win.
 - A Allowed just 13 hits in 56 at-bats (.232) in his career versus Washington, but has walked 10 batters in 15.1 innings for a .338 on-base percentage.
- A Set for his eighth intradivision start of the season...Is 5-1 with a 2.34 ERA (11 ER/42.1 IP) over his first seven turns against the N.L. East.
 - A Lost his first start against the N.L. East, 4/2 vs. WSH...Since that turn, is 5-0 with a 1.42 ERA (6 ER/38.0 IP) over six total starts, while Atlanta is 5-1.

2018 Recap

- A Held Miami to four hits and one run, 7/23 at Marlins Park...Stopped a season-worst three-game losing streak, and stopped a five-game skid by Atlanta in his starts.
 - A Went 7-1 with a 2.49 ERA over his first 12 starts of the season...Went 1-4 with a 5.45 ERA in his next seven turns.
- A Made 19 starts before the All-Star break in his first full major league season, going 8-5 with a 3.51 ERA and 97 strikeouts.
 - A Eight wins before the break were most on the Atlanta staff, and the most for a Braves pitcher since 2014 (Julio Teheran and Aaron Harang).
- A Set career lows in innings pitched (2.2) and pitches (70), 7/3 at NYY...Allowed a season high-tying five earned runs.
 - A Yielded just three hits, two of which were home runs...Has allowed nine home runs over his last eight starts after allowing just three homers in his first 12 turns.
- A Beat the Padres 1-0, 6/16 at SunTrust Park...Tossed 6.0 scoreless innings with two hits and seven strikeouts.
 - A Is 3-0 with 18 scoreless innings against the Padres...Has thrown 6.0 scoreless frames in each of his three career starts.
- A Allowed a season high-tying five earned runs, 6/10 at LAD, to suffer his second defeat of the season.
 - A Snapped his career-best seven-game winning streak, which dated to 4/8 at COL...Went 7-0 with a 1.96 ERA (14 ER/64.1 IP) in 11 total starts.
- A Finished the month of May 5-0 with a 1.54 ERA (6 ER/35.0 IP) and no home runs allowed...Atlanta went 5-1 in his six starts.
 - A His five wins in the month were most in the majors, while his 1.54 ERA ranked sixth best in the N.L...His batting average against of .158 was the lowest in the league among qualifying pitchers.
- A Faced Miami for the second consecutive turn, 5/19, and allowed four hits and one run over 6.0 innings to earn his fourth consecutive win.
 - A A run-scoring groundout in the second inning snapped Newcomb's career-long scoreless streak at 21 consecutive innings.
- A Tossed 6.0 scoreless innings and allowed a career-low one hit, 5/13 at MIA...The start was his third consecutive scoreless turn.
 - A Became the first Braves pitcher over the last 110 seasons to allow two hits or fewer and no runs in three consecutive starts.
- A Allowed two hits and three walks over 6.0 scoreless innings, 5/8 at TB...Turned in consecutive scoreless starts for the first time in his career.
 - A Tampa Bay logged just two hits, both of which were singles...Newcomb became the first Braves starter since Greg Maddux (6/27 and 7/2/99) to log consecutive scoreless starts of at least 6.0 innings with two or fewer hits allowed.
- A Earned his first win of the season, 4/8 at COL, after allowing just five hits in 6.0+ scoreless innings...Did not walk a batter for the first time in his career.
 - A Walked at least one batter in each of his first 20 career games...Since the Braves moved to Atlanta in 1966, only two other pitchers opened their careers with longer streaks of walking at least one batter - Pete Smith (29 games) and Tom Glavine (27 games).

Career Recap

- A Selected by the Los Angeles Angels of Anaheim in the first round (15th overall) of the 2014 First-Year Player Draft.
