THE TWINS: The Twins have gone 5-5 through 10 games on their 11-day homestand...today they will play the three-game series finale against the Angels...the Twins will enjoy an off-day tomorrow, then begin a six-game roadtrip with three at Ron Gardenhire's Tigers from Tuesday-Thursday, then three at Cleveland next weekend.

ANOTHER ONE-RUN LOSS: The Twins lost to the Angels yesterday by a score of 2-1, suffering their 13th one-run loss (3-13)...Kyle Gibson (1-4) was the starter and loser, allowing two runs on five hits in 7.0 innings pitched, the only runs allowed for the Twins staff being solo homers by Ian Kinsler and Albert Pujols - both off Gibson...the offense recorded seven hits, drew just one walk and struck out 10 times...Miguel Sanó had two hits, marking just his fifth multi-hit game this season...Eddie Rosario also had two hits, his 25th multi-hit game this season.
⚡ The game was delayed four hours to start (5:10 first pitch), the second longest delay in Target Field's history, the previous being 4:50 on June 22 vs. Chicago-AL last season.

TWINS AND ANGELS: The Twins and Angels are playing the final of seven games this season...the Twins are 11-8 against the Angels since 2016, going 3-2-1 in those series...11 wins marks their most against any non-divisional opponent in that span...the Twins went 2-12 vs. the Angels from 2014-15.

⚡ Miguel Sanó has hit safely in 10 straight against the Angels, hitting .405 (17-for-42) in those games...in 18 career games vs. LAA, he is hitting .314 (22-for-70) with a .392 OBP.

EXTRA-BASE ESKY: Eduardo Escobar has hit safely in nine of his last 11 games...during that stretch he is hitting .405 (17-for-42) with six doubles, one triple, five home runs, 15 RBI and seven multi-hit games...he enters today tied with José Abreu for first in baseball in doubles with 24...he also is tied for second in baseball in extra-base hits with Mookie Betts and Mike Trout, trailing José Ramírez (38).

ROSIES ARE RED (HOT): Eddie Rosario has multiple hits in 10 of his last 15 games and six through 10 games on this homestand...on this homestand he is hitting .385 (15-for-39) with five home runs, six walks and 11 RBI...since the start of May, he is hitting .371 (56-for-151) with 12 doubles, 11 home runs, 31 RBI, 28 runs scored, a .410 on-base percentage, .669 slugging percentage and a 1.079 OPS in 37 games.

NO BROOMS ALLOWED: The Twins are looking to avoid being swept today for the fourth time this season and first at Target Field, the previous three sweeps being three games at Tampa Bay April 20-22, four games at New York-AL April 23-26 and three games at Seattle May 25-27...the last time they were swept at Target Field came in four games by Cleveland from June 16-18, 2017 (includes doubleheader)...last time the Twins were swept by the Angels came September 4-7, 2014 at Target Field in four games.

THE STARTERS: Twins starting pitching has posted a 2.05 ERA (22.0 IP, 5 ER) with four walks, 22 strikeouts and an opponent batting average of .192 in their last three games...in 27 games since May 12, they have combined to post a 3.93 ERA (155.2 IP, 68 ER) with opponents hitting .235, 53 walks and 155 strikeouts...they have been supported with 3.47 runs-per-game in that span.

CALL TO ARMS: Twins outfielders have 11 assists this season, five in their last five games and eight in their last 16, dating back to May 25...since that date they lead baseball in outfield assists...individual OF assists on the season: Eddie Rosario has five, Max Kepler has three, Robbie Grossman has two and Byron Buxton has one.

DID YOU KNOW?: Los Angeles Angels/Twins edition...

⚡ Twins first baseman Logan Morrison attended Maple Woods Community College in Kansas City in 2005 prior to being drafted by Miami...it is the same school Angels first baseman/designated hitter Albert Pujols attended in 1999.

⚡ Angels Assistant Hitting Coach Paul Sorrento was acquired by the Twins in November of 1988 from California in a package that included Blyleven going to the Angels...Sorrento played three seasons for the Twins from 1989-91, playing in 81 games, hitting .222 (42-for-189) with nine home runs and 27 RBI...he appeared in three World Series games for the 1991 Champs, getting two at-bats vs. Atlanta as a pinch hitter.

⚡ Angels reliever Cam Bedrosian's father Steve pitched one season with the Twins, also 1991, appearing in 56 regular season games...he appeared in three games in the 1991 World Series.

SKI-U-MAH: The University of Minnesota baseball team (ranked No. 14) played in the school's first-ever Super Regional against No. 3 Oregon State and the Twins' first round pick Trevor Larnach (LAR-nick) last night and was eliminated, losing by a score of 6-3 in game two of a best of three...Larnach went 2-for-3 with a double, two walks and an RBI.

TWINS WEEKLY MINOR LEAGUE HONORS: The Twins have named Double-A Chattanooga outfielder Brent Rooker and Single-A Ft. Myers right-handed pitcher Tyler Wells as Twins minor league Player and Pitcher of the Week...in six games for the Lookouts, Rooker hit .450 (9-for-20) with one double, one triple, one home run, six RBI, eight walks and a .586 on-base percentage...the former Mississippi State Bulldog was drafted by the Twins in the Competitive Balance Round A (35th overall) last season...Wells made one start for the Miracle last Sunday, allowing one run on two hits in 8.0 innings pitched with one walk and seven strikeouts, earning his fourth win (4-3)...the University of Cal-Berkeley alum was drafted by the Twins in the 15th round of the 2016 First-Year Player Draft.

LAST START: In his seventh big league start, Romero lasted six innings, allowing two runs on seven hits, and striking out four June 5 vs. Chicago-AL opposite Reynaldo López... allowed just his third home run of the season...four strikeouts was the third fewest of any start this season...Twins won the game 4-2.

AGAINST THE ANGELS: This will be his second start against the Angels this season...first time was in Anaheim on May 13, he lasted 5.0 innings allowing one run on four hits... record against the AL-West is 0-1 with a 2.25 ERA.

DOMINANT DEBUT: Romero shutout the Blue Jays over 5.2 innings in his major league debut on May 2, allowing four hits and three walks with five strikeouts, earning his first win...Romero retired the first three batters of the game, striking out the first batter he faced (Curtis Granderson)...he retired the first two batters he faced in the sixth inning but walked Kevin Pillar on a full count, ending his day...one of two pitchers to hold their opponent scoreless in their ML debut in 2018 (Nick Kingham, PIT)...he became the first Twins pitcher to win in his debut since Felix Jorge on July 1, 2017 at Kansas City.

TAKING OVER THE BIGS: Romero allowed his first earned of his big league career in his start against Los Angeles-AL in the fifth inning, ending his scoreless streak at 15.2 innings... this was the second longest scoreless innings streak to start a career in Twins history since 1974, following only Andrew Albers (17.1 IP)...Romero has notched wins in his first two outings, one of two Twins over the last 30 years to win their first two career starts: Albers (2013) and Eric Milton (1998).

ELITE ENTRANCES: Romero was the 63rd player and 40th pitcher to make his big league debut in 2018...he is also the seventh player on MLB.com's top-100 prospect's list to make his debut in 2018...Romero is one of five players in the Twins organization listed on the top-100 prospect list (Royce Lewis, 20; Stephen Gonsalves, 77; Nick Gordon, 79; Wander Javier, 100).

SEVENS UP: Romero is the second player in club history to ever appear in uniform number 77, joining third baseman Tony Batista, who wore it for 50 games in 2006...33 players in baseball history have ever worn 77, including current players: Toronto's John Axford, San Diego's Buddy Bauman, Miami's Merandy Gonzalez and Detroit's Joe Jimenez.

2017 RECAP:

- Optioned from Twins spring training to Double-A Chattanooga March 13 where he spent the entire season.
- Named Southern League Midseason All-Star.
- Named Twins minor league Player of the Week July 29, going 2-0, 0.90 ERA (10.0 IP, 1 ER) with four walks and 15 strikeouts in two starts for the Lookouts.
- Placed on 7-day disabled list with right shoulder impingement August 24, ending his season.
- Held right-handed hitters to a .239 average and left-handed hitters to a .276 average.
- Tied for seventh in all of Double-A in wins (11).
- Named sixth best prospect in Twins system by *Baseball America*, entering 2018.

TOP PROSPECT: Since being signed in 2011, Romero has been touted as one of the top prospects in the Twins system...*Baseball America* named him the Twins 12th ranked prospect in 2013 and has been rated as a top-30 prospect in the Twins organization since...entered 2018 as the number 66 prospect in all of baseball and the second best prospect in the Twins system according to MLB.com, while *Baseball America* rated him as the sixth best prospect in the Twins organization.

IN THE MINORS: Romero was signed as an undrafted free agent November 4, 2011...started 2018 in Triple-A Rochester, 0-1, 2.57 ERA (21.0 IP, 6 ER) in four games (3 starts)...after missing half of 2014 and all of 2015 recovering from elbow surgery, split 2016 between Low-A Cedar Rapids and High-A Ft. Myers...in six minor league seasons, 23-17, 2.83 ERA (324.1 IP, 102 ER) with 102 walks and 314 strikeouts.
