TODAY'S GAME: Is Game 3 (1-1) of a 3-game series vs Bob Rosenberg's Cubs and Game 3 (1-1) of a 10-day, 9-game road trip heading into the All-Star break that includes upcoming series at Cle's Progressive Field (3g) and at StL's Busch Stadium (off day, 3g)...the Redlegs will open up the championship season's second half on Fri, 7/20 with a 10-game homestand vs the Pirates (3g), Cardinals (3g) and Phillies (4g).

<u>SERIES NOTES</u>: The Reds' 5-game winning streak vs Chi snapped yesterday was their longest vs the Cubs since 6/25-7/9, 2014 (5g)...the Cubs won 15 of the last 21 games played at Wrigley Field, including 11 of the last 15 games here...Billy Hamilton has 36 stolen bases vs the Cubs, the most by a Reds player vs Chi in the live ball era (Barry Larkin, 32)...over the previous 3 seasons (2015-2017), the Cubs' .702 winning percentage vs the Reds (40-17) was the best by any team against any division opponent...Reds vs Cubs information is on media guide Page 320.

INDIANS UP NEXT: The Redlegs and Tribe split last season's 4-game series...Cin won or tied 12 of the first 20 Ohio Cup season series, including 9 of the last 12, but lost 2 of the last 3 season series (1-5, 0-4, 2-2)...beginning in 2011, the Indians have won 6 of the last 7g at Progressive Field and 15 of the last 17 games there...beginning in 2002 and with a minimum of 40 games played, Cin's .317 winning percentage at Progressive Field (13-28) is its lowest at any current road ballpark...Reds vs Indians info is on Page 332.

INTERLEAGUE NOTES: Beginning with a 3-game series tomorrow night, the Reds and Indians will begin their annual Ohio Cup competition...this season the Reds are 8-2 vs the American League (2-1 at Min, 2-0 at KC, 2-0 vs Det, 2-1 vs WSox), including a 6-game winning streak vs the AL from 4/29-7/2 that ranks as their longest interleague winning streak...their 2-1 series win at Min's Target Field in April was their first interleague road series win of at least 3 games since a 3-0 series sweep at Hou's Minute Maid Park in September 2013...the remaining interleague schedule includes home games vs the Indians (3g, 8/13-8/15) and Royals (2g, 9/25-9/26) and road games at Cle's Jacobs Field (3g, Mon-Wed) and at Det's Comerica Park (2g, 8/1-8/2)...beginning in 1997 the Reds are 146-199 all-time vs the AL, at .423 the second-lowest interleague winning percentage of any Major League team (SD, 151-213, .415)...Reds vs AL opponents info is on Page 332.

<u>APRIL 19</u>: The Reds are 36-35 since 4/19, when they replaced manager Bryan Price and pitching coach Mack Jenkins... bench coach Jim Riggleman became interim manager, Class AAA Louisville manager Pat Kelly (#60) was promoted to serve as interim bench coach, and Class AA Pensacola pitching coach Danny Darwin (#52) joined the Reds' Major League staff as interim pitching coach...Price went 279-387 (.419) in his 5 seasons as manager, including 3-15 this year.

STREAKING: The Reds' active 5-series unbeaten streak (2-0 vs Det, 4-0 vs Chc, 2-1 at Atl, 2-2 vs Mil, 2-1 vs Cws) is their longest since a 6-series winning streak from 7/15-8/4, 2016 (2-1 vs Mil, 2-1 vs Atl, 2-1 vs Ari, 2-1 at SF, 2-1 at SD, 2-1 vs StL)...in fifth place since the fourth day of the season, the Reds have pulled to within 1.5 games of the fourth-place Pirates...from 6/21-7/1 the Redlegs played 3 consecutive series vs first-place teams and went 4-0 vs Cubs, 2-1 at Atl and 2-2 vs Mil...at 15-11 (.577) the Reds had the best record in the NL Central Division in June.

<u>ALL-STAR INFIELD</u>: The Reds' **infield** collectively leads the Major Leagues in **hits** (407), **batting average** (.291) and **on-base percentage** (.370)...**1B Joey Votto** leads the National League in on-base percentage while ranking third in walks...**2B Scooter Gennett** leads the league in overall hitting and hitting on the road...**3B Eugenio Suárez** is tied for the NL lead in RBI and leads the Major Leagues in fewest at bats per RBI...he also ranks second in the NL in both on-base percentage and slugging percentage and fifth in batting average...**SS José Peraza** ranks second in the league in most plate apps per strikeout.

<u>DOT...DOT.</u>: Reds prospects RHP Hunter Greene and OF Taylor Trammell are on the U.S. roster for the SiriusXM All-Star Futures Game (Sun, 7/15, 4:00et, MLB Network)...the Reds trailed in 8 of their last 12 victories.

<u>REHABBING</u>: RHP Homer Bailey is 4 apps into a rehabilitation assignment at Louisville (4gs, 1-2, 6.35, 22.2ip, 29h, 16er, 2bb, 14k, 4hr, 1hbp)...he has been disabled since 6/2 with right knee inflammation...made his most recent start Tue vs Indianapolis and earned the 3-2 win (6.2ip, 7h, 1er, 0bb, 8k, 103 pitches, 69 strikes).

SLAMMING: The Reds lead the Major Leagues with 9 grand slams, tying the 2002 franchise single-season record and including a streak of 6 slams over a 17-game span from 6/13-7/1...the 1996 Expos, 1997 Braves and 2006 Mets are the only other teams in Major League history to produce at least 6 grand slams over a 17-day span...the 9 grand slams tie the 2010 Yankees for most ever prior to the All-Star break...the Reds hit 5 in June, a new club record for grand slams in a calendar month...the Reds' 9 grand slams were hit by Adam Duvall (2), Scooter Gennett, Eugenio Suárez, Joey

Votto, Jesse Winker, pitcher Anthony DeSclafani, Michael Lorenzen (pinch-hit) and José Peraza...on 6/23 vs Chi (off Brian Duensing), DeSclafani became only the fourth pitcher in Reds history to hit a grand slam (Bob Purkey 1959, Al Hollingsworth 1936, Ice Box Chamberlain 1892)...Lorenzen on 6/30 off Mil's Jacob Barnes became the first pitcher to produce a pinch-hit slam since Tommy Byrne of the WSox on 5/16/1953 at NYY.

RUTHIAN: In his last 7 plate apps RHP Michael Lorenzen singled, homered (pinch hit), walked, homered, homered (pinch-hit grand slam), struck out and struck out...his 3 HR are the most by a Reds batter whose primary position is pitcher since Micah Owings had 3 homers in 2009...in his career as a pinch hitter Lorenzen is 4-for-12 with 3 HR (4/6/17 off Pit's Adam Morgan, 6/24/18 off Chi's Mike Montgomery, grand slam on 6/30/18 off Mil's Jacob Barnes), including 3-for-5 this season (2hr, 5rbi)...5 times Lorenzen has come off the bench to homer, as a reliever or as a pinch hitter...all other active Major League pitchers combine for just 2 such games.

RED HOTS

Luis Castillo at just 25 years old is in his second Major League season...this afternoon is making his 19th start of the season and his 34th Major League appearance and start...will be his fourth career appearance and third of the season vs the Cubs...in Mon's 5-3 win vs WSox, left the game in the seventh inning with 2 outs and a 1-0 lead but was charged with the tying run scored on Yoán Moncada's RBI-double off Amir Garrett...his 3-game winning streak from 5/8-5/24 (4gs, 3-0, 2.78) was the first winning streak of his career...has 5 quality starts...in his 7-2 win on 5/8 vs NYM, retired his first 14 batters before Amed Rosario singled with 2 outs in the fifth inning...in the 10-4 win on 4/16 at Mil, took a 2-hitter and a 9-0 lead into the bottom of the seventh inning before allowing 2 runs on 3 hits and a walk...during spring training, from 3/13-3/17 spent time in New York with wife Delores while celebrating the birth of their first child, Brittany.

RED HOTS

Anthony DeSclafani's last name is pronounced DEE-sclafani...tomorrow at Cle will make his seventh start of the season...will be his third career appearance vs the Indians and his second appearance of the season vs an American League team...in 7 career starts vs the AL is 1-2, 5.18 (40ip, 23er)...in his last 5 starts this season is 3-0, 4.71 (28.2ip, 15er)...in the 11-2 win on 6/23 vs Cubs hit a grand slam (off Brian Duensing), the first home run of his career and only the fourth grand slam by a Reds pitcher (Bob Purkey on 8/1/59 vs Cubs, Al Hollingsworth on 5/28/1936 at Cubs, Ice Box Chamberlain on 4/30/1892 vs Wsh)...in the 9-6 loss on 6/5 vs Col made his first appearance for the Reds since a 2-1 win on 9/28/16 at StL...between his September 2016 and June 2018 apps, 17 pitchers made starts for the Reds...began the 2018 season on the 60-day disabled list while recovering from a left oblique strain suffered in his third spring training appearance...before he was reinstated the day of his 6/5 start vs Col, from 5/14-5/30 made 4 rehab starts for Pensacola and Class Louisville (0-3, 4.66).
