BACK WHERE YOU BELONG

- The Colorado Rockies continue their second consecutive three-city, nine-game, 10-day road trip with the second of two games against San Diego tonight ... will play four games in San Francisco Thursday-Sunday and three-games at Los Angeles-NL May 21-23.
- This will be the 12th game of the season vs. the Padres ... have yet to play the Giants or the Dodgers.
- The Rockies hit three home runs in their 6-4 win over the Padres last night, their seventh three-plus home run game of the season, their sixth on the road ... Noel Cuevas hit his first Major League home run and Daniel Castro hit his first home run as a Rockies player, his first since 2015 as a member of the Atlanta Braves ... Gerardo Parra hit his first home run since the second game of the season, March 30 at Arizona.
- The Rockies lost to the Brewers 7-3 Sunday, going 2-4 on their six-game homestand ... the Rockies have not finished any of their three homestands above .500 and are now 7-11 (.389) at Coors Field, tied for the second-fewest home wins in the National League.

ANY GOOD PIZZA AROUND HERE?

- The Rockies have won six consecutive win on the road ... it's the 10th time in franchise history the Rockies have won at least six games in a row on the road ... won eight consecutive road games in 2017 (Aug. 26-Sept. 12).
- Colorado has won 16 games on the road, the third-most road wins in MLB, the second-most in the National League ... their .667 road winning percentage is tied for the fourth-best in MLB, second-best in the NL.
- Colorado's 3.33 road ERA (208.0 IP, 77 ER) is fourth-best in the NL ... rank third in the NL with 199 road strikeouts.
- Over their 24 road games Colorado starters have

gone 11-7 with a 3.13 ERA (135.0 IP, 47 ER) and 13 quality starts.

- Have averaged 3.9 runs scored per game with a .219 batting average (174-for-796), ranking 14th in the NL and 28th in MLB.

RECIPE FOR SUCCESS

- The Rockies are 19-4 on the season when scoring first, 18-2 when out-hitting their opponent.
- Colorado is 17-6 when their starter pitches at least 5.2 innings, 15-5 when their starter goes at least six innings ... Colorado has yet to have a pitcher go at least six innings at not record a quality start.

GO JOE

- Trevor Story accounted for all four runs batted in on Saturday, his second consecutive four-RBI game ... became the first Rockies player with back-to-back four-RBI games since Nolan Arenado did so Sept. 26-27, 2015.
- Story's 32 RBI are third-most in the NL ... is tied for fifth in the NL with 10 home runs.

PRESS START

- After allowing 13 runs to San Diego on April 23, including nine in the seventh inning, Colorado has posted a 3.26 ERA (160.0 IP, 58 ER) over their past 18 games while going 11-7 ... over that span, starting pitchers have allowed 38 earned runs over 107.1 innings of work (3.19 ERA) with 12 quality starts.
- The 3.26 ERA since April 24 ranks third in the NL, fifth in MLB.

TIDE PADS

- This will be the fourth series of the season vs. the Padres, the second at Petco Park ... the Padres and Rockies will not play again until Aug. 21-23 at Coors Field.
- The Rockies are 7-4 so far this season against San Diego ... took two of three against the Padres April 23-25 at Coors Field ... took three of four in San Diego April 2-5.
- Colorado went 12-7 against the Padres in 2017, including 6-4 at Petco Park ... it was their first winning season at Petco since 2013.
- Charlie Blackmon is a career .302 (116-for-384) hitter against San Diego with 19 home runs ... his .899 OPS against the Padres is the second-highest among active players (min. 400 plate appearances).

#COORS?

- 36 of the Rockies' 56 home runs have come on the road, the second-most road home runs in the NL and tied for the third-most in MLB.
- Charlie Blackmon's 10 road home runs are tied for the second-most in the Major Leagues ... hit his first seven home runs on the road before homering at Coors Field on April 22 vs. Chicago-NL ... per Elias, he is the first Rockies player to have his first seven home runs come on the road since Ian Stewart in 2010.

BEAT THE STREAK

- Nolan Arenado has reached base in 24 consecutive games since April 12, tied for the second-longest active streak in MLB and the second-longest streak of his career ... reached base in 30 consecutive games in 2014.
- Has batted .333 (30-for-90) with five doubles, one triple, seven home runs, 17 RBI, 15 walks and 23 strikeouts over the course of the streak.
- Arenado has reached base in 35 of his 37 games played this season ... currently ranks third in the NL in slugging percentage (.593), fourth in on-base percentage (.418) and fourth in batting average (.326).

MARQUE IT

- 23-year-old right-hander is a member of his second career Opening Day roster ... broke camp with the 2017 club as a reliever.
- Made his debut on Sept. 8, 2016 at San Diego, pitching an inning of relief.
- Acquired from Tampa Bay on Jan. 28, 2016 along with left-handed pitcher Jake McGee in exchange for outfielder Corey Dickerson and infielder Kevin Padlo.
- Pronounced HAIR-mahn MAR-keh-z

POWERFUL PADRES

- Is 2-1 with a 5.48 ERA (23.0 IP, 14 ER) in six games vs. the San Diego Padres ... 2-1 with a 5.03 ERA (19.2 IP, 11 ER) in four starts.
- 1-1 with a 7.20 ERA (10.0 IP, 8 ER) in two starts at Petco Park ... 1-1 with an 8.03 ERA (12.1 IP, 11 ER) in three games, two starts, in San Diego ... debuted here on Sept. 8, 2016, allowing two hits and three runs in 2.1 innings of relief in a 14-1 loss.
- Facing the Padres for the second time this year ... previous start cut short on April 11 in Denver after he was ejected for fighting ... had pitched three scoreless innings and allowed one hit and one hit batter with four strikeouts.

ROAD WARRIOR

- His 1.96 road ERA (23.0 IP, 5 ER) ranks seventh in the National League in four previous road starts this year ... his three quality starts have all come his past three road games, allowing five earned runs in 18.0 innings ... Rockies are 3-1 in his four road outings.
- In 21 career starts on the road, has gone 7-6 with a 4.05 ERA (109.0 IP, 49 ER) ... made two road relief appearances in 2016 and allowed three runs in 4.1 innings pitched (6.23 ERA) ... combined, is 7-6 with a 4.13 ERA (113.1 IP, 52 ER).

COORS HEAVY

- In 20 career appearances, 19 starts, at Coors Field, is 7-6 with a 5.17 ERA (108.1 IP, 62 ER) ... 0-3 with a 10.34 ERA (15.2 IP, 18 ER) this year.
- Is 0-4 with a 7.41 ERA (34.0 IP, 28 ER) in his past seven starts at home since Aug. 29, 2017 ... has not won in Denver since Aug. 18, 2017 against Milwaukee.

GOOD TEAM WIN

- The Rockies have won 14 of his past 24 starts since July 7, 2017 (8-7, 4.66, 131.1 IP, 68 ER).

A DENVER OPENER

- Started the Rockies home opener on April 6 and walked a career-high six batters en route to an 8-3 loss vs. the Braves at Coors Field ... allowed four runs in the first inning and charged with three in the fifth, working 4.2 frames ... game was delayed one hour due to inclement weather and eventually began at 27 degrees, the second-coldest start temperature in club history.

A YEAR TO REMEMBER

- Named to the *Topps* All-Star Rookie Team, the second pitcher in franchise history to earn that honor (Jason Jennings, 2002).
- Made 29 starts in his rookie season in 2017 and went 11-7 with a 4.39 ERA (162.0 IP, 79 ER), 49 walks and 147 strikeouts.
- Led all Major League rookies in strikeouts and quality starts (14) and finished tied with Kyle Freeland in wins ... finished second in innings pitched (162.0) and tied for first in games started (29).
- Recorded six consecutive quality starts from July 7-Aug. 8, the longest streak by a Rockies rookie in franchise history.
- Per Elias, became the first rookie in Rockies history to record at least nine strikeouts in each of three consecutive games in a single season, July 17-29 (9 SO, 9 SO, 10 SO).

THURSDAY'S STARTER: RHP CHAD BETTIS (4-1, 3.12)

The 28-year-old right-hander will make his ninth start of the season, his sixth on the road, when the Rockies begin a four-game series at San Francisco on Thursday ... his 1.35 road ERA (33.1 IP, 5 ER) leads the NL ... all four wins and five decisions have come on the road ... tied for fifth in the National League overall in victories and tied for first in the Majors in road wins ... 3.12 ERA ranks 14th in the NL ... allowed season highs of 10 hits and seven runs on May 11 at home vs. Milwaukee ... career mark of 15-16 and a 4.29 ERA (239.1 IP, 114 ER) in 52 games, 41 starts, outside of Denver ... is 3-4 with a 4.50 ERA (50.0 IP, 25 ER) in 11 games, seven starts, vs. the Giants ... is 1-1 with a 4.80 ERA (15.0 IP, 8 ER) in four games, two starts at AT&T Park ... hasn't pitched in San Francisco since May 6, 2016, a 6-4 loss (6.0, 8, 5, 5, 2, 4) ... had no decision in a 4-3 win at home last year vs. SF (5.1, 5, 3, 3, 0, 3).

- His 10 road home runs are second in the Major Leagues ... was the first Rockies player since Ian Stewart in 2010 to record his first seven home runs on the road ... lone Coors Field home run April 22 vs. Chicago-NL.
- Played his 800th career game Sunday (all with Colorado), becoming the ninth player in franchise history to reach 800 games played with the Rockies.
- Eight-game hitting streak April 28-May 6, the longest streak on the Rockies thus far this season.
- Hit his 29th career leadoff home run May 1 at Chicago-NL, his first this season.
- First multi-home run game of the season March 31 at Arizona, ninth of his career ... second time in franchise history the Rockies won on two solo home runs by the same player (also: Nolan Arenado, April 17, 2016 at Chicago-NL).
