RAY MATTER—The Rays are 2-4 in their last 6 games on the heels of a 5-game winning streak and 23-5 stretch from Aug 19-Sep 19...they have lost consecutive games for the first time since Aug 17-18 at BOS, and tonight are attempting to avoid matching their longest losing streak since the All-Star break (July 27-29 at BAL, Aug 3-5 vs. CWS)...at 17 games over .500, they are two shy of matching their high-water mark of the season.

- + The Rays are 16-7 (.696) in September, 2nd in the majors behind the Astros (18-4)...they are 38-23 (.623) since the All-Star break, 3rd in the majors behind the Athletics (40-21) and Red Sox (38-21).
- + The Rays are 8-0-2 in their last 10 series and 11-1-2 in their last 14 series, with the only loss in the last 14 series coming at Boston.
- + Last night the Rays allowed 9 runs, their most at home since July 9 vs. DET (9)...they allowed 7 runs in the 3rd inning, the fifth time this season they yielded at least 7 runs in a frame but the first time doing that at home since Sep 15, 2017 vs. BOS (7-run 15th inning).
- + The Rays are on pace for 90 wins, and since the second Wild Card was introduced in 2012 the only teams to win that many and miss the postseason are the 2013 Rangers (91) and 2012 Rays (90).
- + The Rays are 29-27 this season and 17-11 at home against the AL's five postseason teams, including 20-10 (.667) since June 22.

WHAT TO PLAY FOR—The Rays would need to go 3-2 or better in last 5 games for their sixth 90-win campaign in 11 seasons as the Rays...they would join the Red Sox (7), Dodgers (6, 88-70 this season) and Yankees (6) as the only teams with six 90-win seasons since 2008, while the Cardinals (5, 87-71 this season) have a chance to join this group as well...since 2008, the Rays are 942-836 (.530), 6th in the majors behind the Yankees (.567), Dodgers (.556), Cardinals (.553), Red Sox (.549) and Angels (.531).

- + Monday's loss officially eliminated the Rays from postseason contention—they were the last AL team to be eliminated...including the remaining games of this season, since becoming the Rays in 2008 the club will have played only 54 games in which they were mathematically eliminated from postseason contention.

DOME SWEET DOME—The Rays are 48-28 (.632) at home this season, 3rd-best winning pct. in the majors behind the Red Sox (55-21, .724) and Yankees (53-28, .654)...they are two wins shy of reaching 50 home wins for only the fourth time in franchise history, after going 51-30 in 2013, 52-29 in 2009 and 57-24 in 2008...the Rays are 15-4 in their last 19 home games and 36-12 in their last 48 home games after a 12-16 start.

- + The Rays have won in walk-off fashion nine times, tied for 5th in the majors and tied for 2nd in the AL behind the Athletics (10)...this is their most since a club-record-tying 13 walk-off wins in 2013...their five walk-off home runs are tied for most in the AL and are 2nd-most for a single season in franchise history behind 2011 (7).

RAYS vs. YANKEES—The Rays are 8-9 against the Yankees this season (5-3 at home, 3-6 on the road), including 8-4 in their last 12 games against them...most recently, they went 2-1 at Yankee Stadium, Aug 14-16, their first series win there since June 30-July 2, 2014 (3-0) to snap a streak of 12 consecutive series losses at Yankee Stadium, the longest streak ever by any team in the current building...the Rays would need to win tonight and tomorrow to avoid losing the season series for a fourth straight year.

- + Over the last two seasons, the Rays are 9-5 against the Yankees at Tropicana Field...over this same span, they are 5-14 at Yankee Stadium and 1-2 at Citi Field (relocation due to Hurricane Irma).
- + The Rays have gone 4-1 in 1-run games against them this season.
- + The Rays swept the Yankees in a 3-game series from June 22-24 at home, and remain one of two teams to sweep the Yankees in a multi-game series this season (Red Sox from Aug 2-5).

PITCHING PLANS—Tonight's game will be started by **Ryne Stanek**, the 53rd time the Rays will use an opener and their 28th time using Stanek in that role...the Rays opened the season with bullpen days as needed in place of a traditional starter, and since May 19, they have used openers to start games—generally facing 3-9 batters, depending on matchups.

- + In March, the Rays announced a season-opening rotation of **Chris Archer**, **Blake Snell**, **Nathan Eovaldi** and **Jake Faria**...all four pitchers spent time on the disabled list and two were traded in July...the Rays have used other starters in 88 of 157 games (56.1 pct.).
- + Since the debut of the opener, the Rays lead the AL and rank 2nd in the majors with a 3.38 ERA, behind the Dodgers (3.19)—before

that, their 4.43 ERA was 22nd in the majors and 9th in the AL.

- + The Rays have a pitched to a AL-best 3.27 ERA in the 1st inning.
- + The Rays are 45-37 with traditional starters and 42-33 otherwise.
- + Rays starters have gone 3 IP or fewer 68 times this season, most by a team since Baseball Reference data is available (1908), ahead of the 1949 St. Louis Browns (40)...their starters have gone 2 IP or fewer 58 times, most ever by a team ahead of the 1977 Mariners (27).

REDEFINING RELIEF—Rays relievers have thrown 793.1 IP, most in major league history ahead of the 2012 Rockies (657.0)...prior to this season, only four teams ever saw its bullpen reach 600 IP, and all four finished with losing records...56.5 pct. of the team's innings this season have been covered by the bullpen...so far this season, Rays relievers have totaled:

- + 59 apps of at least 50 pitches and 28 apps of at least 70 pitches, both the most since Baseball Reference data is available (1908);
- + 87 decisions, most since Baseball Reference data is available;
- + 144 apps of at least 2 IP, most since the 1985 Braves (158);
- + 70 apps of at least 3 IP, most since the 1987 Angels (73);
- + 45 apps of at least 4 IP, most since BB-Ref data is available;
- + 31 apps of at least 5 IP, most since the 1917 Athletics (34)

ABOUT THE OFFENSE—The Rays rank 2nd in the AL with a .258 avg. and .333 OBP, trailing the Red Sox in both...never in club history have they finished among the AL's top two teams in either—their highest finish in avg. was 3rd in 2005 and their highest finish in OBP was 3rd in 2013.

- + The Rays have only four players with double-digit homers, tied with the Tigers for fewest in the majors and tied with 2001 for their fewest in a single season in franchise history...the Rays are the only team in the majors with only one player with 15 HR...in comparison, the Yankees have a major-league-record 12 players with double-digit homers and seven players with at least 15 HR.
- + The Rays have totaled 145 HR this season, 4th-fewest in the majors and 83 HR fewer than their club-record 228 HR last season...they have won 27 games this season without the benefit of a home run, tied with the Pirates for most in the majors, and most in the AL.
- + The Rays are tied for 2nd in the majors with 120 SB, behind the Indians (129) and their most since 2012 (134)...since the start of August, their 55 SB are most in the majors ahead of the Royals (51).

PHAM-ILY MATTERS—**Tommy Pham** has hit safely in 26 of his last 27 games, batting .396/.476/.717 (42-for-106) over that span...he has reached base in all 27 of those games, longest streak of his career and 2nd-longest active streak in the majors behind **WAS Anthony Rendon** (33)...his streak matches **Logan Morrison** (27) from June 7-July 7, 2017 for the longest by a Ray in the last six seasons...the last Ray with a longer on-base streak was **Evan Longoria** (34) spanning two seasons, Sep 19, 2012-April 23, 2013.

- + Since returning from the 10-day DL on Aug 16 at NYY, Pham ranks among AL leaders in avg. (.358, 1st), on-base pct. (.444, 2nd), slugging pct. (.642, 5th) and on-base plus slugging (1.087, 3rd).

CLOSE SHAVES—The Rays are 26-30 (.464) in 1-run games...the 56 1-run games are 2nd-most in the majors behind the Mariners (57) and are tied with 2010 and 2015 for the club record...the 30 1-run losses are most in the majors and are tied with 2015 for the club record...the Rays are 16-11 (.592) in 1-run games since June 19 compared to 10-19 (.345) before that.

SHIRTS OFF OUR BACKS—During this homestand, the Rays Baseball Foundation is hosting the annual "Shirts Off Our Backs" fundraiser, with proceeds benefiting the Foundation's efforts to support youth and education programs in the Tampa Bay region...over 200 volunteers are on hand this week offering scratch-off cards in return for donations...the wide variety of prizes are highlighted by game-worn jerseys which players and coaches will present to winners on the field following Sunday's game.

RECENT OUTINGS—Last pitched on Sun at TOR, working a second consecutive day and inheriting 1-on, 2-out in the 8th inning...got a pop out to third base off the bat of **Randal Grichuk**, his only batter faced...on Sat at TOR, inherited 1-on, 1-out in the 7th inning and got strikeouts of **Teoscar Hernández** and **Lourdes Gurriel Jr.** to end the frame...last started on Thurs at TOR, pitching a perfect 1st inning, then allowing hits to three straight batters to start the 2nd inning (double, homer, single)...the homer was by **Rowdy Tellez** and was the first of his career allowed to a lefty.

A NEW LOOK—Has made 27 starts, 2nd-most on the team behind **Blake Snell** (30)...all 27 starts have come since May 26, four more than any other pitcher in the majors over that span...is the first pitcher with 25 starts and 25 relief apps in a season since PHI **Hugh Mulcahy** (26 starts, 30 relief apps) in 1937 and the first AL pitcher since PHA **Eddie Rommel** (31 starts, 25 relief apps) in 1923...is the first rookie in major league history with 25 starts and 25 relief apps in a single season.

- + This will be the 53rd time the Rays use an opener, all of them coming since May 19 at LAA...he is 0-2 with a 2.92 ERA (37-IP, 12-ER) in his 27 starts.
- + 21 of his 27 starts (77.8 pct.) this season have been scoreless.
- + Min. 20 starts, his 1.37 ERA in the 1st inning is 6th in the majors and 3rd in the AL behind TB **Blake Snell** (0.90) and CLE **Trevor Bauer** (1.33).

MAKING THE LEAP—Since the start of June, is 1-2 with a 2.35 ERA (53.2-IP, 14-ER) and .191 opp avg. (36-for-188) in 48 apps (25 starts) to lower his ERA from 4.66.

- + Ranks among AL rookies in apps (57, tied for 4th) and starts (27, 1st)...min. 50 IP, is 2nd among AL rookies with a .188 opp avg. and 5th with 10.80 SO/9 IP.
- + Has only allowed 2 XBH in 94 PA against lefties this season.
- + His 0.84 ERA (32-IP, 3-ER) at home is 3rd-best in the majors (min. 20 IP).
- + His avg. fastball velocity this season is 97.9 mph, according to StatCast, and his max velocity is 100.5 mph in his start on May 26 vs. BAL.

WATCH YOUR BACK—On Fri at WAS, NYM **Jacob deGrom** recorded his 28th consecutive start yielding 3 runs or fewer, the longest single-season streak in major league history...deGrom is also starting tonight vs. Atlanta...Stanek has allowed 3 runs or fewer in all 27 starts this season, the 2nd-longest single-season streak.

QUIRKS OF THE OPENER—His 11.68 SO/9 IP ratio as a *starter* is 2nd-highest for a rookie in a season (min. 20 starts) to CHC **Kerry Wood** (12.58) in 1998.

- + Has made 8 starts without allowing a hit, the most for any pitcher within a single season since Baseball Reference data is available (1908).
- + From June 7–July 10, made nine consecutive scoreless starts to set a major league record—though he totaled only 13.2 IP over this span—passing LAD **Zack Greinke** (6, 43.2 IP), LAD **Orel Hershiser** (6, 55 IP) and LAD **Don Drysdale** (6, 54 IP).
- + According to Stats LLC, his 10 scoreless starts before the All-Star break were a major league record.

FROM THE OTHER SIDE—Is winless in all 27 starts, the longest winless streak in club history...this is tied for the 3rd-longest in the majors since Baseball Reference data is available (1908) and is one shy of the record shared by ATL/TOR **Jo-Jo Reyes** from June 18, 2008–May 25, 2011 and OAK **Matt Keough** from Sep 6, 1978–Aug 8, 1979...his 27 starts of 2 IP or fewer are the most for a pitcher within a single season—before this year, no other pitcher made more than 8 starts of this type in a season...his 13 starts of 1 IP or fewer are the most in a single season, passing PIT **Max Butcher** (7) in 1940.

RUBBER ARM—Is the first pitcher to start on 0 days' rest five times in a season since STL/DET **Grover Lowdermilk** (5) and DET **Harry Coveleski** (5) in 1915...on Sep 3-4 at TOR, he became the second pitcher in club history to start back-to-back *days*, joining **Sergio Romo** on May 19-20 at LAA...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, he was the first rookie to start on consecutive days since STL **George Munger** from July 28-29, 1943 vs. PHI.

ELITE COMPANY—Named after Hall of Famer **Ryne Sandberg** despite being born into a family of Cardinals fans...last season, became the third "Ryne" in major league history, following Sandberg and All-Star pitcher **Ryne Duren**...his manager in Durham was Sandberg's nephew, **Jared Sandberg**.

- + Selected by Astros Manager **A.J. Hinch** to join the AL coaching staff for the All-Star Game for a second consecutive season.
- + Is in his fourth season as Rays manager...at age 40, is the majors' youngest active skipper—5 months younger than SD **Andy Green**.
- + On Sep 11 vs. CLE, was ejected by home plate umpire **Mark Carlson**, his eighth ejection as Rays manager, first since July 18, 2017 at OAK.
- + Is the sixth Tampa-born manager in major league history, and second

to manage the Rays...that list includes Hall of Famers **Al Lopez** and **Tony La Russa**, **Lou Piniella**, **Dave Miley** and **John Hart**.

- + Played 12 professional seasons as a catcher, incl. parts of eight seasons in the majors (2002-10) and two years (2005-06) in the Rays org.
- + Played in the 1989 Little League World Series (Tampa Northside LL), 1999 College World Series (Florida State) and earned World Series rings in 2007 (Red Sox) and 2009 (Yankees).
