- ♦ The D-backs are 9-4 in their last 13 games since July 22.
- ♦ **Robbie Ray** is 3-0 with a 1.84 ERA (6 ER in 29.1 IP), .211 opponent average and 38 strikeouts (11.66 K/9.0) in his last 5 starts vs. Giants.
- ♦ **Steven Souza Jr.** is batting .339 (21-for-62)/.414 OBP/.565 SLG with 7 doubles, 2 triples, 1 home run, 13 RBI and 7 walks in his last 17 games.
- ♦ **Paul Goldschmidt** is hitting .389 (21-for-54) with 7 doubles, 1 triple, 4 home runs and 10 RBI vs. Giants this season.
- ♦ **David Peralta** is hitting .396 (19-for-48)/.431 OBP/.563 SLG with 5 doubles, 1 home run, 1 RBI and 8 runs scored in his last 12 games since July 20.

- ♦ The D-backs won vs. Giants, 9-3.
- ♦ **Nick Ahmed** recorded his second career multi-homer game, going 3-for-3 with 2 home runs and 4 RBI... **Ketel Marte** was 2-for-4 with a home run and 2 RBI, **Steven Souza Jr.** went 2-for-4 with a triple and 3 RBI, and **Paul Goldschmidt** was 2-for-3 with a run scored.

- ♦ When D-backs starters work 6.0+ innings, they are 35-12 with a 2.35 ERA (103 ER in 394.0 IP), .203 opponent average and 408 strikeouts (Arizona is 40-21)... since June 1, the D-backs are 24-7 when their starter goes 6.0+ innings.

IT'S RAY DAY!

- ♦ Among active pitchers since 2016, **Robbie Ray** is second with 11.70 strikeouts per 9.0 innings behind Max Scherzer/WSH (11.75) and ahead of Chris Sale/BOS (11.57), Stephen Strasburg/WSH (10.76) and Yu Darvish/CHI (10.73).
- ♦ Has held lefties to 1 hit in 18 at-bats in his last 2 games and 3 hits in their last 35 at-bats (.086).
- ♦ Has held opponents with runners in scoring position to 3 hits in their last 19 at-bats (.158), including 2-for-10 in his last 3 home games.

IN THE BIG-INNING

- ♦ Arizona leads the Majors with 92 first-inning runs, ahead of Colorado (82), Seattle (79) and Cleveland (78)... the D-backs' .381 on-base pct. in the first inning is also best in the Majors.
- ♦ The D-backs have scored 5+ runs in the first inning in back-to-back games for the second time in franchise history (also: May 19-20, 2017 @ Padres).
- ♦ The D-backs also rank second overall in runs scored in the first 2 innings (144), behind the Rockies (149) and ahead of the Nationals (139), Red Sox (137) and Indians (137).

NO RISP...NO REWARD

- ♦ Since June 7, Arizona leads the NL and is tied for third overall with a .289 average with RISP (146-for-505).
- **BEST AVG WITH RISP SINCE JUNE 7:** .301 – Houston; .291 – Minnesota; .289 – Arizona; .282 – Washington.

A COUPLE OF DEFENSIVE STALWARTS

- ♦ **Nick Ahmed** ranks second among Major League shortstops with 13 defensive runs saved, trailing only Andrelton Simmons/LAA (15), ahead of Addison Russell/CHC (11) and Francisco Lindor/CLE (11).
- ♦ **Jeff Mathis** is tied with Austin Barnes/LAD for the Major League lead with 9 defensive runs saved, ahead of Sandy Leon/BOS (8), and Buster Posey/SF (8).

REHAB ROAD

- ♦ **Deven Marrero** (strained left oblique) went 1-for-5 with a run scored last night in his third rehab game with Triple-A Reno... in 6 rehab games between Rookie-Level AZL D-backs and Reno, he has gone 6-for-18 (.333) with a double, 3 RBI and 3 walks.

ON DECK: PHILADELPHIA PHILLIES

- ♦ The D-backs won 2 of 3 @ Phillies from April 24-26.
- ♦ Arizona is 14-6 in their last 20 games vs. Phillies.
- ♦ The D-backs are 36-31 all-time vs. Phillies @ Chase Field, including taking 3 of 4 from June 23-26, 2017.

TOMORROW'S STARTER: RHP ZACK GODLEY (12-6, 4.46)

- ♦ Earned the win in his last outing on July 31 vs. Rangers, matching his career high with 10 strikeouts in 7.0 shutout innings.
- ♦ Will make his third career appearance (second start) vs. Philadelphia, going 0-0 with a 1.35 ERA (1 ER in 6.2 IP).
- ♦ Is 3-0 with a 2.64 ERA (9 ER in 30.2 IP) with 38 strikeouts and a .207 opponent average in his last 6 games (5 starts) since July 6.

- ◆ In his last 10 home games, is hitting .500 (15-for-30)/1.438 OPS with 7 RBI.
- ◆ His 44 RBI are a career high, surpassing his 33 RBI in 2016.
