AT A GLANCE: The Yankees lost the opener of their seven-game road trip...includes 4G at Boston (0-1, through Sun.) and 3G at Chicago-AL (Mon.-Wed.)...went 4-2 on their recent six-game homestand (3-1 vs. Kansas City, 1-1 vs. Baltimore).

- ▶ At 68-39 (.636), have the Majors' second-best record behind Boston (76-34, .691)...the Yankees and Red Sox have held (at least a share of) the Majors' two best records on 84 of the last 92 days (since the end of play on 5/3).
- ▶ Are 29G over .500, 2G under their season high watermark (31G over at the end of play on Tuesday)...had not reached 31G over .500 since finishing the 2011 season 32G over .500 (97-65).
- ▶ Are 6.5G behind first-place Boston in the AL East, their largest deficit since they were 6.5G back at the end of play on 4/21.
- ▶ Have lost just four of their last 31 series, going 21-4-6 since 4/19...are 59-30 in their last 89G...are 50-9 (.847) when scoring first...are a Major League-best 42-6 (.875) when their starter tosses at least 6.0 innings.
- ▶ Have lost two straight games...have just one losing streak longer than two games this season (went 0-3 from 6/22-24, all at Tampa Bay).
- ▶ Are 1-2 so far in their stretch of 20 consecutive game days (7/31-8/19).

YESTERDAY'S NEWS: The Yankees lost, 15-7, in the opener of their four-game series at Boston on Thursday...**LHP CC Sabathia** (3.0IP, 3H, 2ER, 4BB, 2K, 1HR) started and took a no-decision...**SS Didi Gregorius** (2-for-5, 2R, 2HR, 4RBI) collected his team-leading fourth multi-HR game of the season...**CF Aaron Hicks** (1-for-3, 2R, 1HR, 1RBI, 2BB) hit a solo HR in the second...**RF Giancarlo Stanton** (2-for-4, 2R, 1HR, 2RBI) hit his 25th HR of the season.

▶ **Yankees pitchers** permitted 15R, their most since a 15-1 loss on 8/25/15 vs. Houston...their 19H allowed were their most since allowing 20H in a 10-5, 14-inning loss on 5/2/14 vs. Tampa Bay, and most in a nine-inning game since 20H on 4/8/14 vs. Baltimore...allowed 8R in the fourth inning, their second-largest inning in the last two seasons (9R in sixth inning on 4/10/18, also at Boston).

MAIN EVENT OF THE EVENING: According to *Elias*, tonight marks the latest in a season that the Yankees (68-39) and Red Sox (76-34) will face each other while holding the Majors' two best records since the teams played an AL East tiebreaker game in Game 163 on 10/2/78 at Fenway Park when they were both 99-63 (the Yankees won, 5-4).

▶ The Yankees and Red Sox have held (at least a share of) the two best records in the Majors on 84 of the last 92 days (since the end of play on 5/3).

BRONX BOMBERS: Since the start of July, **Yankees batters** are hitting .280/.352/.475 with 48 doubles, 3 triples and 43HR.

- ▶ Have hit a Major League-leading 174HR...are on pace to hit 263HR (the MLB record is 264HR by Seattle in 1997).
- ▶ Their 4HR on Thursday were their most since hitting a season-high 6HR on 7/1 vs. Boston...have homered in seven straight games (12HR total) after hitting just 1HR in their previous 5G.
- ▶ Lead the Majors in SLG (.460) and rank second in runs per game (5.21), OPS (.793) and XBH (385).
- ▶ Gregorius' 2HR game on Thursday was the Yankees' 19th multi-HR game this season...are the fourth team ever to have at least 19 individual multi-HR games within the first 107 games of a season (1996 Mariners-21, 1966 Braves-19, 1961 Yankees-19).
- ▶ With Aaron Judge (26HR), Giancarlo Stanton (25HR) and Didi Gregorius (20HR), the Yankees are one of three teams this season that have three players with at least 20HR, joining Cleveland (Encarnacion/Lindor/Ramirez) and Colorado (Arenado/Blackmon/Story).

THE WALK SHOW: INF Neil Walker is batting .375/.439/.521 (18-for-48) with 8R, 4 doubles, 1HR, 10RBI and 6BB in his last 16G (since 7/9) to raise his season BA by 41 points.

DOUBLE DUTCH: SS Didi Gregorius hit a three-run HR in the first and a solo HR in the fifth on Thurs. at Boston...was his fifth career multi-HR game...were his 19th and 20th home runs of the season.

- ▶ Marked his fourth multi-HR game of the season, all as a shortstop...no other Yankees shortstop has had more than two such games in one season...ranks third among shortstops this season in multi-HR games (Manny Machado-5, Francisco Lindor-5).
- ▶ Reached 20HR for the third consecutive season (also 25HR in 2017, 20HR in 2016)...was already the only Yankees shortstop ever to hit 20HR in consecutive seasons (min. 50% of G at SS)...tied Derek Jeter (1999, 2001, '04) for the most 20HR seasons by a Yankees shortstop...joins Colorado's Trevor Story as the only shortstops to hit at least 20HR in each of the last three seasons.
- ▶ Has 12RBI in 12 games since the All-Star break.

STANTON ISLAND: OF Giancarlo Stanton hit his 25th HR of the season on Thursday...reached 25HR in a season for the fifth consecutive season and seventh time in nine career seasons (2011-12, '14-18)...joins Mike Trout and Nelson Cruz as the only players to hit 25HR in each of the last five seasons.

- ▶ His first-inning single registered an exit velocity of 119.1 mph by Statcast, and his seventh-inning HR was 114.9 mph, marking his sixth game this season with multiple base hits at an exit velocity of at least 114.0 mph (all other MLB players have a combined four such games).
- ▶ Is batting .432 (16-for-37) with 10R, 3 doubles, 1 triple, 3HR, 9RBI, 3BB, 2HP and 2SB in 10 games vs. Boston this season...has hit safely in 9-of-10 games.

WALK WITH ME: CF Aaron Hicks went 1-for-3 with 2R, 1HR, 1RBI and 2BB on Thursday...has drawn at least 1BB in 10 consecutive starts (13BB, since 7/15), the second-longest streak in the Majors this season (Joey Votto-11G from 6/15-26)...is tied for the longest such streak by a Yankee since Jorge Posada's 12-start walk streak from 5/11-29/04...is 10th in the AL with a career-high 53BB.

- ▶ Has reached safely in 18-of-29 plate appearances in his last 7G, batting .474/.621/.842 (9-for-19) with 9R, 1 double, 2HR, 4RBI and 9BB.
- ▶ Has set career highs with 18HR and 34 extra-base hits (also 14 doubles, 2 triples).
- ▶ Ranks ninth among Major League outfielders with a career-high-tying 3.3 WAR (FanGraphs).

SAVES THE DAY: LHP Aroldis Chapman has struck out each of his last 7BE...is one shy of his career-long strikeout streak (8BF from 4/11-19/18)...prior to the current stretch, had struck out only two of his previous 15BF.

- ▶ Has converted 22 straight save chances since 5/8, the third-longest streak of his career (29 straight from 7/4/14-5/30/15; 27 straight from 6/26-9/4/12)...is the longest streak by a Yankee since Andrew Miller converted 24 in a row from 4/8-8/6/15.

DELLIN DONUTS: RHP Dellin Betances has allowed just 1R in 24.0IP (8H, 13BB, 41K, 3HP) over 25 appearances since 5/27...opponents are hitting .104 (8-for-77) in that span.

- ▶ His current streak of 24 consecutive relief appearances with at least 1K (since 5/29) is the second-longest in Yankees history, behind Andrew Miller's streak of 28G from 5/6-7/17/16...has at least 1K in 42-of-44 apps. this season.
- ▶ Ranks third among qualifying MLB relievers with a 15.80 K/9.0IP ratio (79K/45.0IP).

GREAT BRITTON: LHP Zach Britton allowed 1H over 0.2IP on Thursday at Boston...in 30 career relief appearances vs. Boston, has posted a 0.99 ERA (36.1IP, 30H, 6R/4ER, 13BB, 34K, 2HR).

SEVY SEASON: RHP Luis Severino has allowed one-or-zero earned runs in five of his 10 career starts vs. Boston...blanked the Red Sox for 6.2IP (2H, 3BB, 6K) on 7/1 at Yankee Stadium.

TODAY IN YANKEES HISTORY

Aug. 3, 1959: In the second All-Star game of the 1959 season, Yogi Berra connects for his first and only All-Star Game home run, helping lead the AL to a 5-3 win at Los Angeles' Memorial Coliseum.

TOMORROW IN YANKEES HISTORY

Aug. 4, 2010: Alex Rodriguez becomes the seventh (and youngest) player in MLB history to hit 600 home runs, accomplishing the feat at 35 years, 8 days old in a 5-1 win vs. Toronto off Shaun Marcum.

Aug. 4, 2007: Alex Rodriguez hits his 500th career home run off Kansas City's Kyle Davies in a 16-8 Yankees victory. At 32 years, 8 days old, Rodriguez becomes the youngest player ever to reach the 500HR plateau.

OVERALL TRENDS: The Yankees are 5-5 vs. the Red Sox in 2018...will play the 11th of 19 games against the Red Sox tonight (9G in the Bronx, 10G at Boston)...are 19-13 in 32G vs. Boston since 9/27/16...**IN 2017:** Went 11-8 vs. Boston, including 6-4 at home and 5-4 at Fenway Park...held Red Sox batters to a .196 BA and .578 OPS, both the lowest figures for Yankees pitchers in the rivalry since at least 1954...**SEASON SERIES:** Have won four of the last six season series (2012-17)...have lost just four of 17 season series between the clubs since 2000, going 11-4-3 over the span...**AT FENWAY PARK:** Are 1-3 at Fenway Park in 2018...went 5-4 at Fenway Park in 2017...are just 8-15 at Fenway Park since the start of 2016, but are 31-28 there since the start of 2012...have won 8-of-13 series at Fenway Park since the start of 2014 (8-4-1)...are 498-479-4 (.510) all-time at Fenway Park, the only visiting AL team with a winning record there...**IN POSTSEASON:** Have met in the postseason three times, going 11-8 in games and 2-1 in series (2004 ALCS, 3-4; 2003 ALCS, 4-3; 1999 ALCS, 4-1).

RHP Luis Severino will make his 23rd start of the season tonight at Boston...the 24-year-old will start on extended five days' rest...is 1-2 with an 8.84 ERA (19.1IP, 19ER) in his last four starts after going 13-2 with a 1.98 ERA (118.1IP, 26ER) in his first 18 starts...has lost consecutive starts for the first time since losing six straight from 4/26-8/14/16...on 7/23 at Tampa Bay, became just the third Yankees pitcher to reach 500K prior to his 25th birthday...**his career-high-tying 14 wins are tops in the AL and second-most in the Majors behind Washington's Max Scherzer (15)**...his 2.94 ERA is eighth-lowest in the AL...is seventh in the AL and 10th in the Majors with 157K...did not earn his 14th win in 2017 until his 31st start and his final start of the season (9/27/17 vs. Tampa Bay)...the Yankees are 18-4 in his starts, the most *team wins started by one pitcher in 2018*... was named to his second career All-Star Game and tossed a scoreless second inning (1H, 2K)... finished third in 2017 AL Cy Young Award voting after posting a 14-6 record and 2.98 ERA (193.1IP, 64ER) in 31 starts...made his first career AL All-Star Team in 2017...was originally signed by the Yankees as a non-drafted free agent on 12/26/11.

LAST START: Lost his second consecutive start – and fourth loss of the season – in a 10-5 defeat on 7/28-G1 vs. Kansas City (4.1IP, 8H, 6ER, 1BB, 5K, 1HR, 1HP)...allowed a season-high-tying 6ER for the second consecutive start, the first time in his career he has done that...failed to complete 5.0IP for the first time since 9/20/17 vs. Minnesota, snapping a streak of 22 consecutive starts with 5.0IP+...in the third, gave up a two-run double to Rosell Herrera...in the fifth, allowed a two-run single to Salvador Perez and two-run HR to Lucas Duda.

THE WIN IS IN: Has tied his career high with 14 wins (14-6 in 2017), all prior to the All-Star break...leads the AL in wins and is second in the Majors (Max Scherzer-15)...the Yankees are 18-4 in his starts, the most *team wins started by one pitcher in 2018*.
