THE CAPTAIN: The Mets and David Wright announced that the captain will be activated for the Mets final homestand, September 25-30 and will start at third base on Saturday, September 29... Wright is a seven-time All-Star, two-time Gold Glove winner and two-time Silver Slugger recipient...He holds the franchise record for hits (1,777), RBI (970), runs scored (949), doubles (390), total bases (2,945), extra-base hits (658), walks (761) and go-ahead homers (87).

METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets are 6-4 in their last 10 games... The Mets are 28-19 in their last 47 games and 40-34 since July 1...New York is 35-33 vs. the NL East.

SEPTEMBER: The Mets are 13-7 this month, the second-best in the NL and the sixth-best winning percentage (.650) in the majors...The pitching staff has a 3.35 ERA this month, the fifth-lowest in the majors...The Mets have 27 homers in September, the third-most in the majors.

ON THE ROAD: New York is 39-40 on the road this year... The Mets rank fourth in the majors with a .330 road on-base percentage and sixth with 394 runs scored.

VS. WASHINGTON: The Mets have won 10 games vs. Washington this year...New York won six games all of last year vs. the Nats and had seven wins in 2016...The Mets have won the season series twice vs. Washington since 2010 (this year and 2015)...The Mets are 18-16 at Nationals Park since 2015...The Mets have hit 44 home runs in their last 28 games at Nationals Park.

CONFORTO CONNECTS: Michael Conforto has hit 13 home runs since August 12 (in 40 games), tied for the most homers in the majors with Christian Yelich during that span...He leads the majors with 37 RBI since August 12...Conforto has 77 RBI, extending career-high...He has a career high-tying 27 homers... Conforto has 16 homers (tied for fifth in the NL) and 47 RBI (third in the majors) since the All-Star break.

SIZZLING SEPTEMBER: Conforto leads all major leaguers with 24 RBI and 14 extra-base hits this month and is tied for the major league lead with eight homers.

NIMMO STREAKS: Brandon Nimmo has reached base safely in a career-high 28 straight games (.479 OBP)...The last longer streak by a Met was Carlos Beltrán (32 games in 2011)...He has also walked in nine straight games (three shy of the franchise record - Darryl Strawberry - 12 games in 1987).

NIMMO NOTES: Nimmo leads the NL with a .437 on-base percentage since the All-Star break...He has drawn 19 walks in September, the second-most in the majors and is fourth in the majors with a .451 OBP this month...Overall, Nimmo is third in the NL with a .398 OBP, 11th with a .888 OPS, tied for third with eight triples and leads the majors with 22 HBP (a single-season franchise record).

METS-NATIONALS NOTES: The Mets have won the season series for the first time since 2015 (11-8).

SEPTEMBER STARTERS: Mets starting pitchers are 8-3 with a 2.86 ERA (38 earned runs/119.2 innings), the second-lowest ERA in the majors this month...The 119.2 innings are most in September.

MLB RECORDS: Jacob deGrom has held opponents to three runs or less in 28 straight starts, the longest single-season streak in major league history...DeGrom has hurled 23 straight quality starts, the longest single-season streak in major league history...He has set a major league record with 19 starts in which he pitched 6.0 or more innings and allowed three or fewer runs but did not win...Research courtesy of Elias.

LEADERBOARD: DeGrom leads the majors in ERA (1.77)... According to FanGraphs, he leads major league pitchers in WAR (8.3), RA-9 WAR (8.6), FIP (2.03), opponent's slugging percentage (.284) and a .533 OPS and leads the NL in HR/9 (0.43), DRA (2.11), ERA+ (207) and .257 xwOBA (expected weighted on-base)...He is second in the NL and fourth in the majors in strikeouts (259)... DeGrom is one of three pitchers in franchise history with 250 or more strikeouts (Tom Seaver-3 times, Dwight Gooden-2 times).

SOME SEASON: DeGrom has a 1.77 ERA and 259 strikeouts and 46 walks this season...Since 1908, only two pitchers have had an ERA of less than 2.00, at least 250 strikeouts and 50 or fewer walks (Christy Mathewson 1908, Pedro Martinez 2000).

AMED ROSARIO: Has 67 hits since the All-Star break, tied for the seventh-most in the NL...Is tied for first in the majors with 27 hits this month...Rosario is hitting .329 (27-82) with five doubles, two triples, two homers, six RBI, 14 runs scored and five stolen bases this month...Rosario has become the 33rd player in team history with 20 or more stolen bases in a season...Rosario ranks second in the NL with 15 stolen bases since the All-Star break... He's hitting .337 (56-171) with a .350 OBP, nine doubles, two triples, five homers, 21 RBI and 30 runs scored in his last 39 games.

HIT MACHINE: Jeff McNeil has a .328 (64-195) batting average since his debut on July 24 is the eighth-highest in the majors (min. 180 PA)...He is tied for eighth in the majors in hits since his debut...Is tied for third in the majors with 26 hits this month...Has the fourth-highest batting average (.342) in the NL this month (min. 60 PA)...McNeil has 64 hits through his first 56 career games with the Mets...Only José Reyes (70) had more...McNeil's .328 average in his first 56 career major league games with the Mets, is the highest average in franchise history (min. 175 PA).

TRIPLES: McNeil is tied for the major league lead with six triples since the All-Star break...Only Mookie Wilson (8 triples in 1981) and Darryl Strawberry (7 triples in 1983) had more as a rookie in team history.

LAST TIME OUT: Oswalt today makes his 11th start of the season...In his last start, tossed 2.2 innings at Fenway Park, limiting the Red Sox to one run, unearned, on three hits with one walk and three punchouts...Was his shortest start since his first-career start on June 29 at Miami (also 2.2 innings).

VS. WASHINGTON: Oswalt today will make his second start and third appearance vs. the Nats...In his last start against the club, July 15 at Citi Field, held the Nationals to one run, earned, on two hits...Did not walk a batter and whiffed one hitter...Also appeared in relief against Washington on August 26, allowing six runs, earned, on six hits in 1.0 inning...Today marks his first outing at Nationals Park.

IN THE MAJORS: Oswalt will be making his 16th-career major league appearance (11th start)...Will be his ninth appearance away from Citi Field and his sixth road start...Made his major league debut out of the bullpen on April 25 at St. Louis, pitching 4.2 innings and allowing two runs, earned, with four strikeouts...Was the longest outing by a Mets reliever making his MLB debut in team history...Is one of two Mets hurlers in franchise history to record four or more strikeouts in a relief outing for his major league debut (also, Buzz Capra in game one of a doubleheader on September 15, 1971).

2018 SEASON: Oswalt has appeared in 15 games (10 starts) over six stints with the Mets...Made 11 starts for Triple-A Las Vegas this season, going 4-4 with a 6.02 ERA (35 earned runs/52.1 innings)...Has 52 strikeouts and 20 walks for the Las Vegas 51s...Allowed one hit over 5.0 scoreless innings on April 13 at El Paso...Tossed 6.0 shutout innings on June 11 vs. Round Rock...Had four quality starts in 11 outings at Triple-A.

SPRING RECAP: Posted a 2.84 ERA (two earned runs/6.1 innings) this spring in four Grapefruit League games, striking out five and walking none...Did not allow a run in three of his four Grapefruit League outings, all of which came in relief.

IN THE MINORS: In 97 games (91 starts) in the Mets minor league system, Oswalt is 41-22 with a 3.64 ERA (202 earned runs/500.0 innings)...Went 12-5 with a 2.28 ERA (34 earned runs/134.1 innings) in 24 starts with Double-A Binghamton in 2017 en route to being named a Mid-Season and Post-Season Eastern League All-Star as well as the Eastern League Pitcher of the Year.

OSWALT'S CAREER SNAPSHOT

- » Graduated from Madison (CA) High School in 2012...Was committed to UC Santa Barbara as a position player (third base/shortstop).
- » Selected by the New York Mets as a pitcher in the seventh round of 2012 First-Year Player Draft.
- » In 2014, his first season at the A-level, was named to the Mid-Season New York-Penn League All-Star Team representing the Brooklyn Cyclones.
- » In 2016, he pitched for Scottsdale in the Arizona Fall League, going 4-1 with a 3.33 ERA (10 earned runs/27.0 innings) in seven starts for the Scorpions.
- » Was named the Eastern League Pitcher of the Year in 2017 after going 12-5 with a league-leading 2.28 ERA with Binghamton...His 2.28 ERA led all Double-A pitchers.
- » Was tabbed as the Mets' Sterling Organizational Pitcher of the Year for his 2017 campaign at Binghamton.
- » In 2017, finished second in the Eastern League in victories (12), third in WHIP (1.18) and fifth in opponents average against (.236)
- » Also in 2017 was named to the Eastern League's mid-season and post-season All-Star teams.
- » Made his major league debut on April 25 at St. Louis, pitching 4.2 innings out of the bullpen with four strikeouts...Was the longest outing by a Mets reliever making his major league debut.

TOMORROW'S STARTER: LHP STEVEN MATZ (5-11, 4.03 ERA)

LAST START: On September 18 at Philadelphia, Matz took his fourth consecutive no-decision, pitching 5.0 shutout innings, giving up two hits, tying a career-high with five walks (also, June 22, 2017 at Los Angeles-NL) and striking out four...Was his first start giving up zero earned runs since July 1 at Miami and his fifth this season.

MATZ BATZ: Hit a solo home run to left-center field to give the Mets a 1-0 lead on September 18 at Philadelphia...Was his second-consecutive start with a home run, making him one of three Mets pitchers to go deep in two-straight starts (also, Ron Darling, 1989 and Tom Seaver, 1972)...Matz is the first pitcher to homer in consecutive starts since Travis Wood, August 30 and September 5 of last season with the San Diego Padres.
