## PHILADELPHIA PHILLIES (8-5) vs TAMPA BAY RAYS (3-11)

Sunday, April 15, 2018 – Tropicana Field – 1:10 EDT – Game 14; Road 8

RHP Ben Lively (0-1, 5.56) vs LHP Ryan Yarbrough (0-0, 2.25)

- LAST NIGHT'S ACTION:** The Phillies won their fifth straight game, defeating Tampa Bay 9-4 to take the first two games of the series ... Starter Jake Arrieta made his second start of the season, tossing 6.2 innings and allowing 3 runs (2 ER) on 7 hits with 2 walks and 1 strikeout ... A six-run second inning fueled Philadelphia's offensive outburst ... J.P. Crawford was 2-for-3 with a double, home run, 2 RBI and 2 runs ... Scott Kingery doubled twice, drove in a pair and scored 1 run ... Eight of the nine starters recorded a hit in the game for Philadelphia ... Victor Arano struck out 3 batters in 1.1 innings in relief of Arrieta.
- ARMS RACE:** Over their last 10 games (since 4/3), Phillies starters have combined to post a 2.69 ERA (18 ER, 60.1 IP) with just three home runs allowed and a .222 opponents' batting average (49-221) ... **In that span, Philadelphia has the lowest starter's ERA in the NL and 2<sup>nd</sup>-lowest in MLB behind only KC (2.50)** ... In those 10 games, the rotation has allowed two earned runs or fewer nine times and four hits or fewer six times ... Overall this season Philadelphia's starters rank 2<sup>nd</sup> in the NL in 3<sup>rd</sup> in ERA (3.24) & lowest OPP OPS (.634), and 4<sup>th</sup> in fewest hits allowed (66) ... No team has allowed fewer home runs by its starters than the Phillies (3, also MIN & SF), and they rank 6<sup>th</sup> among ML clubs in fewest walks issued by starters (21) ... **As a pitching staff overall, the Phillies lead MLB in fewest HR/9.0 IP (0.53) and lead the NL in FIP (fielding independent pitching) at 3.20.**
- SOUTHPAW SLUGGING:** The Phillies are facing a left-handed starter for the fourth time this season ... In each of their first three games against southpaws, the opposing starter lasted 3.0 innings or fewer ... In those three games, Philadelphia scored 17 runs (15 ER) in 8.2 IP, drawing 10 walks and hitting four homers ... **Overall against lefties, the Phillies have posted a .905 OPS (1<sup>st</sup> in MLB), more than 40 points higher than the next club (SEA, .863).**
- KINGS AND ROOKS:** Scott Kingery is batting .296 (8-27) with four doubles, two home runs, nine RBI and six runs scored in his last seven games ... **Among all ML rookies thus far, he is 1<sup>st</sup> in extra-base hits (8) and doubles (6), 2<sup>nd</sup> in steals (2), T-2<sup>nd</sup> in hits (12) & RBI (9), T-3<sup>rd</sup> in runs (7) & homers (2).**
- EARLY AND OFTEN:** With six runs in the second inning yesterday, the Phillies have now scored within the first two innings for the ninth time in their 13 games this season ... They have scored 35 runs within the first three innings (14 in 1<sup>st</sup>, 10 in 2<sup>nd</sup>, 11 in 3<sup>rd</sup>) and 34 runs in all other innings combined.
- #WINNING:** The Phillies have won five straight games for the first time since 7/26-31/2017 (5), and are now three games over the .500 mark for the first time since 5/28/16, when they were 26-23 ... **A win today would mean six straight wins for the first time since 4/20-27/2017 (6), and Philadelphia's first consecutive three-game sweeps since 4/26-5/1/2016 (WSH, CLE)** ... During this win streak, Philadelphia has outscored opponents 27-14.
- INTERLEAGUE INTRIGUE:** With a win today, the Phillies will have completed a three-game or better sweep over an American League East club for the first time since 6/27-29/2003 at BAL (3-0) ... It would be their first-ever sweep over the Rays ... After losing eight straight Interleague games to start 2017, Philadelphia has gone 7-7 against AL teams since.
- JACKIE ROBINSON DAY:** On April 15, 1947, Jackie Robinson broke the color barrier and became the first African American player in Major League history ... He was 28 years old and had been playing with the Kansas City Monarchs in the negro leagues before signing with the Dodgers ... Robinson spent the 1946 season with Brooklyn's triple-A affiliate in Montreal ... He was named NL Rookie of the Year in 1947 and NL MVP in 1949 and helped the Dodgers win six pennants and one World Series (1955) before retiring following the 1956 season ... Robinson retired as a .311/.409/.474 career hitter with more walks (740) and extra-base hits (464) than strikeouts (291) ... He was inducted into the Hall of Fame on the first ballot in 1962, receiving 77.5 percent of the vote ... All on-field personnel will wear No. 42 jerseys today to honor Robinson.
- TAMPA BAY RAY-UNION:** Just 16.2 miles south of their spring training home in Clearwater, the Phillies wrap up a three-game set in St. Petersburg today against the Tampa Bay Rays ... This was the first time they have squared off against Tampa Bay since 7/20-22/2015 in Philadelphia, and the first time at Tropicana Field since 6/23-25/2009 ... In that series, current Phillies manager Gabe Kapler started two games in right field for the Rays, going 2-for-4, with two doubles, two walks and a run, and Phillies Wall of Famer Pat Burrell was the Tampa Bay DH for all three games ... This marks just the fourth regular season series the two teams have ever played at Tropicana Field, (1999, 2001, 2009), along with two games (1-1) in the 2008 World Series.
- FIRST DIBS:** With Scott Kingery and J.P. Crawford already hitting their first career home runs this season, the Phillies have now had nine different players hit their first major league homer since the beginning of the 2017 season: Crawford (4/11), Kingery (4/9), Cameron Perkins (9/14/17), Jorge Alfaro (8/15/17), Rhys Hoskins (8/14/17), Nick Williams (7/9/17), Ben Lively (6/24/17), Andrew Knapp (4/29/17) and Brock Stassi (4/10/17) ... In that span, only one other team (SD) has even had seven players do so.

The Phils offense plated multiple runs in the 1st inning for the fourth-straight game thanks to a 2-run shot from Rhys Hoskins ... Scott Kingery connected on his first career home run, a solo-shot in the 2nd inning and Nick Williams belted his first career pinch-hit home run to give the Phils the lead in the 8th ... Hector Neris successfully converted his 21st straight save opportunity.

**TODAY'S START:**

- **No Extra Rest:** Has made 10 of his 17 career starts on 5 or more days of rest, and in those starts has gone 2-5, 5.24 ERA (32 ER, 55.0 IP) ... On the regular 4 days rest, is 2-3, 3.40 ERA (17 ER, 45.0 IP) in 7 starts
- **Early Struggles:** Has allowed 22 ER in the 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> innings of his career combined (34.0 IP, 5.82 ERA), and only 27 in all other innings combined (66.0 IP, 3.68 ERA)
- **A Quality Start to His Career:** Lively finished his 2017 season with a quality start, his 10<sup>th</sup> in 15 career starts ... Among all pitchers to debut since 2016, only PIT's Jameson Taillon (11 QS) and COL's Kyle Freeland (10 QS) had as many in their first 15 career starts ... Since 1908, only 10 Phillies starters have had at least 10 QS through 15 career starts overall
- **Lively Bat:** In 2017, Lively finished T-2<sup>nd</sup> among ML pitchers in HR (2) and T-3<sup>rd</sup> in RBI (8) ... Among ML pitchers with at least 25 AB, his .462 SLG % was 2<sup>nd</sup> to Madison Bumgarner (.471) and his .231 AVG was T-4<sup>th</sup> ... In 4 starts from 6/24-8/20/17, Lively hit as many HR (1) as he gave up in 21.2 IP)
- **vs AL East:** 0-0, 3.86 ERA (3 ER, 7.0 IP) in 1 start (only Interleague start)

- **2018:** 0-1, 3.18 ERA (2 ER, 5.2 IP) in 1 start
- **Career:** 2-6, 3.98 ERA (28 ER, 63.1 IP) in 10 starts

**2017 SEASON:**

- 10 of his 15 starts were quality starts, including all of his starts in which he went at least 6.0 innings ... Was T-6th among all ML rookies in quality starts (5th in NL) despite starting at least 5 fewer games than all ahead of him
- In his ML debut on 6/3 vs SF, earned his first ML win and recorded his first ML hit ... Lively also became:
  - The first Phillies pitcher since Gavin Floyd (9/23/04 vs NYM), and just the seventh since at least 1913, to pitch 7.0+ innings with 1 or 0 runs allowed on 4 or fewer hits in his ML debut
  - Became the first Phillies SP to debut with 7.0 IP and a hit at the plate since Dave Downs in 1972
- Hit his first career homer on 6/24 at ARI, becoming the first Phillies pitcher to homer since Chad Billingsley on 5/10/15 vs NYM and the first Phillies rookie pitcher to homer since Tyler Green on 8/23/95
- On 9/5 at NYM, became the first Phillies pitcher to hit two homers in a season since 2011 (Lee), the first with at least one home run and 4 RBI in a game since 6/2/02 (Robert Person) and the first with multiple RBI in consecutive games since 1994 (Bobby Munoz) ... Was the first Phils pitcher since 1993 with 3 multi-RBI games in a season (Tommy Green)
- Tossed his first career CG (8.0 IP) on 9/10 at WSH
- Had 4 stints with Philadelphia (4/19-21, 26<sup>th</sup> man for a DH on 5/14 at WSH, 6/3-7/8, 8/20-end of season)

**CAREER:**

- Received the 2016 Paul Owens Award as the best pitcher in the Phillies minor league system ... Went 18-5, 2.69 ERA (51 ER, 170.2 IP), 0.94 WHIP (42 BB, 118 H), and 139 SO in 28 starts between Reading (AA) and Lehigh Valley (AAA)
- Acquired from Cincinnati in exchange for OF Marlon Byrd and cash considerations, 12/31/14 ... Named Reds MiLB Player of the Year in 2014 (13-7, 3.04 ERA)
- Selected by the Reds in the 4<sup>th</sup> round of the June 2013 draft out of the University of Central Florida ... Originally selected by Cleveland in 26<sup>th</sup> round of June 2010 draft but did not sign ... 2010 graduate of Gulf Breeze High School (Fla.)
