REHAB WATCH—Tonight RH **Chris Archer** (left abdominal strain) is scheduled to make his first rehab start for Class-A Charlotte vs. Fort Myers (Twins), throwing approximately 4 IP or 65 pitches..RH **Jake Faria** (left oblique strain) played catch today and is scheduled to throw a live BP session tomorrow at the Charlotte Sports Complex.

RAY MATTER—Yesterday at MIA, the Rays lost in walk-off fashion for the fifth time this season, tied for 4th-most in the majors behind the Twins (9), Mets (6) and Indians (6)..despite the loss, the Rays are 8-2 in their last 10 games, improving from 34-40 to 42-42 over that span...they are 13-7 in their last 20 games dating back to June 11 vs. TOR.

- + Since April 18, the Rays are 38-29 (.567), tied for the 5th-best winning pct. in the AL, behind the Yankees, Astros, Mariners and Red Sox—the four teams in the majors on pace to win 100 games...this stretch began after a 4-13 start, tied for the worst in club history.
- + Last night was the 15th time the Rays lost when yielding 3 runs or fewer, most in the majors, ahead of the Orioles (13).
- + The Rays are in 3rd place in the AL East and have been alone or tied for 3rd in the division for 43 of the last 46 days since May 18.

PITCHING PROPERLY—Last night the Rays allowed 3 runs, their most since June 24 vs. NYY (6), to snap a club-record streak of allowing 2 runs or fewer in six consecutive games...their current streak of allowing 3 runs or fewer in seven consecutive games is tied for their longest of the season (third time) and tied for the 3rd-longest in franchise history, behind Aug 4-16, 2014 (12) and July 24–Aug 4, 2016 (10)..in the last 7 games, the Rays have pitched to a 1.29 ERA (63-IP, 10-R/9-ER), and the 10 runs allowed match June 22-29 for their fewest over a 7-game stretch this season.

- + In the last 10 games, the Rays have pitched to a 1.55 ERA (93-IP, 17-R/16-ER), and the 17 runs allowed are their fewest over a 10-game stretch since July 18-29, 2014 (17)...they have allowed 2 runs or fewer in eight of these 10 games and 1 run or fewer in 5 games.
- + Since the debut of the “opener” on May 19 vs. LAA, Rays pitchers lead the majors with a 2.74 ERA (368.1-IP, 112-ER), ahead of the Yankees (3.08)..prior to this, they ranked 22nd in the majors and 9th in the AL with a 4.43 ERA (382.1-IP, 188-ER) in 43 games.
- + Twelve of the club’s last 13 wins have come when allowing 1 run or fewer, the only exception coming on June 24 vs. NYY (7-6 win).

FROM THE OTHER SIDE—The Rays are 9-3 in their last 12 games, but they are averaging only 3.42 runs per game over this stretch...18 of their 41 runs over this span came in a 2-game stretch on June 24 vs. NYY (7) and June 25 vs. WAS (11)—in the other 10 games, they are averaging 2.30 runs per game...they have been held to 3 runs or fewer in eight of their last 12 games, 2 runs or fewer in 6 games and 1 run or fewer in 3 games.

- + Five of the club’s 9 wins over this span have come when scoring 3 runs or fewer...in fact, since June 13, seven of their 11 wins have come on 3 runs or fewer, while only three of their first 31 wins have come in this fashion...their 10 wins this season when scoring 3 runs or fewer are tied for 3rd-most in the AL.
- + The Rays have hit only 1 HR in their last 6 games, and it came off the bat of **Mallex Smith** to snap the majors’ longest homerless drought at the time...they have hit 74 HR this season, 5th-fewest in the majors and 3rd-fewest in the AL...only 33.9 pct. of the club’s runs this season have scored via the home run, 4th-lowest rate in the majors, compared to a club-record 48.0 pct. last season.
- + The Rays have only two players with double-digit home runs this season: **C.J. Cron** (16) and **Wilson Ramos** (11)..they are one of six teams with double-digit homers from only two players (or fewer).

CLOSE SHAVES—44.0 pct. of Rays games have been decided by 1 run, compared to 27.9 pct. of games in the majors...the Rays are 16-21 (.432) in 1-run games, including 6-2 in their last eight 1-run games...the 37 1-run games are tied with the Mariners for most in the majors and the 21 1-run losses are most in the majors, ahead of the White Sox (17)..75.0 pct. of Rays games have either been wins or 1-run losses...50.0 pct. of their losses have come by one run, 2nd-highest rate in the majors (Astros, 51.6 pct.).

- + The Rays are the first team in the majors to play at least 37 1-run games within their first 84 games of the season since the 2011 Twins (37)...they are the first AL team with at least 21 1-run losses within the first 84 games since the 1968 White Sox (22) and A’s (21).
- + The Rays are on pace for 41 1-run losses, which hasn’t been done

since the 1975 Astros (41) or by an AL club since the 1968 White Sox (44)...the club record for 1-run losses in a season is 30 (2015).

- + The Rays have played six 1-0 games this season, most in the majors and already tied for their 2nd-most in a single season (2014, 10).
- + Since 2016, the Rays are 50-72 (.410) in 1-run games.

ROAD TRIPPIN’—Tonight is the second game of a 6-game road trip against the Marlins (0-1) and Mets (July 6-8)...the Rays are 2-12 in their last 14 road games since May 31, and their streak of 14 consecutive road games scoring 4 runs or fewer is the 2nd-longest in franchise history, behind Aug 22–Sep 22, 2000 (17)...they have been outscored, 59-28, in these 14 road games...only once over this stretch have they scored 4 runs (June 18 at HOU)—they have been held to 3 runs or fewer in 13 of the 14 games, 2 runs or fewer in 9 games and 1 run or fewer in 5 games.

- + The Rays have played 44 games on the road, tied for 2nd-most in the AL behind the Red Sox (46)...they will reach the All-Star break having completed 65.4 pct. of their road schedule.

RAYS vs. MARLINS—The Rays are 55-53 (.509) all-time in the “Citrus Series” (29-23 at home, 26-30 on the road), including 34-19 (.642) in the “Rays” era...last season, they went 3-1 against the Marlins, winning both games at Marlins Park and splitting at Tropicana Field...the Rays are 2-8 in interleague play this season (2-5 at home, 0-3 on the road), 2nd-worst in the majors, ahead of the Tigers (1-7)...the Rays are 112-88 (.560) in interleague play since 2008—5th-best in the majors—and 186-192 all-time.

- + In the last 10 seasons (2008-17), the Rays have only one losing interleague record (7-11 in 2010)...the NL is 78-65 (.545) in IL play this season, but the AL has won each of the last 14 season series.

LIGHTEN UP—Tonight is the second of 16 games in a row through July 22 against teams currently under .500, as well as 29 of 35 games through Aug 12...on Sunday, the Rays completed a stretch of 16 consecutive games against the Yankees, Nationals, and Astros—all postseason teams from a year ago—and they went 10-6 over that span, including 10-3 in their last 13 games...it also ended a stretch of 29 of 32 games from May 28–July 1 against teams that are currently .500 or better, and they went 17-15 over that span...this season, the Rays are 21-10 (.677) against teams currently below .500 and 21-32 (.396) against teams currently .500 or better.

CAN’T PREDICT BASEBALL—Last night the Rays scored the game-tying run in the 9th inning off reigning NL Reliever of the Month **Kyle Barraclough**, snapping his scoreless streak at 20.2 IP...his 2 hits allowed matched his total from his previous 22 apps combined...**C.J. Cron**’s game-tying double was the second time this season the Rays recorded a game-tying hit with 2 outs in the 9th inning, following **Brad Miller** on April 20 vs. MIN (single)...it was the first time they did it on the road since **Adeiny Hechavarria** on July 18, 2017 at OAK (single)...in the last two seasons, the Rays have recorded 6 hits of this type—prior to last year, they didn’t have a game-tying hit with 2 outs in the 9th inning since June 23, 2012 at PHI.

- + **Ryne Stanek** took the loss and snapped a 15.2 IP scoreless streak spanning 12 apps (7 starts) and the entire month of June.

BIG DAY ABROAD—Yesterday was the opening of the international signing period, and the Rays signed 10 players from the Dominican Republic, Venezuela and Curaçao...in fact, they landed five of the Top 50 international players according to *Baseball America* rankings: SS **Alejandro Pie** (No. 13), OF **Estanli Castillo** (No. 40) and SS **Daury del Rosario** (No. 50) from the Dominican Republic and 16-year-old twins SS **Ryson Polonius** (No. 30) and SS **Rainer Polonius** (No. 31) out of Curaçao.

#VOTERAYS—For the fourth consecutive season, All-Star balloting is being conducted exclusively online and via mobile devices at mlb.com, all 30 club web sites and the MLB At Bat and MLB Ballpark apps...the Mid-summer Classic will be held on July 17 at Nationals Park in Washington, D.C., the fifth All-Star Game to be played in the nation’s capital.

LAST OUTING—On Thurs vs. HOU, entered with 1-on, 2-out in the 2nd inning and loaded the bases on a single and hit by pitch, but got a strikeout to end the frame...his only run allowed in 6.1 IP was a solo homer to No. 9 hitter **Jake Marisnick** in the 5th inning...became the first reliever to take the loss in an outing of 6 IP (or more) and 1 run or fewer since CHC **Eddie Butler** on March 30 at MIA, and the first AL reliever since TEX **Ross Wolf** on June 8, 2013 at TOR...it was the 13th time in franchise history the Rays lost 1-0 on a solo homer and the first time on a solo homer by the No. 9 hitter...his line: L, 6.1 IP, 7 H, 1 R/ER, 1 BB, 4 SO, 1 HR, 1 HBP, 95 pit, 62 str.

+ Has allowed 11 HR, 2nd on the team to **Blake Snell** (12).

THE WILL TO WIN—His 7 wins are the most among major league rookies, ahead of CIN **Tyler Mahle** (6), OAK **Lou Trivino** (6) and BOS **Hector Velázquez** (6)...his 7 wins are 4th among rookies in franchise history before the All-Star break, behind **Rolando Arrojo** (10) in 1998, **Jeff Niemann** (8) in 2009 and **Jeremy Hellickson** (8) in 2011...has 5 wins out of the bullpen, 2nd among rookie relievers to Trivino (6).

START ME UP—Is 2-2 with a 5.23 ERA (20.2-IP, 15-R/12-ER) and a .263 opp avg. (21-for-80) in his 4 starts, compared to 5-2 with a 3.24 ERA (58.1-IP, 22-R/21-ER) and a .236 opp avg. (53-for-225) in his 15 apps out of the bullpen...his last start was June 11 vs. TOR, and he recorded his fifth win of the season despite yielding a run in the 1st inning, 2 runs in the 3rd inning and a run in the 4th inning...each time he allowed run(s), the Rays tied it or took the lead in the bottom half of the frame.

REDEFINING RELIEF—Leads the majors with 58.1 IP as a reliever, ahead of teammate **Austin Pruitt** (54.0)...so far this season, his 15 relief apps include:

- + 11 apps of at least 3 IP, most in the majors ahead of Pruitt (8), and the most for any pitcher over an entire season since BOS **Alfredo Aceves** (13) in 2011
- + 9 apps of at least 4 IP, most in the majors ahead of Pruitt (6), and the most for any pitcher over an entire season since BAL **Alan Mills** (11) in 1992
- + 6 apps of at least 5 IP, most in the majors ahead of Pruitt (5), and the most for any pitcher over an entire season since BOS **Bob Stanley** (11) in 1982
- + 10 apps of at least 50 pitches, 8 apps of at least 70 pitches and 6 apps of at least 90 pitches...all other relievers have combined for 3 apps of 90 pitches
- + His season high is 7 IP, which remains the most for any reliever in the majors this season...it tied for the longest outing for a reliever in franchise history.

MIX & MATCH—Is one of 13 different starting pitchers used by the Rays so far this season, most in the majors ahead of the Angels (12) and Athletics (12)...this is the fifth time the Rays have used 13 different starting pitchers for an *entire season*, following 2004 (14), 2003 (14), 2000 (13) and 1999 (13)...the Rays used eight starters all of last season—in fact, the 13 starters this season is only one shy of the previous three seasons combined (14 from 2015-17).

vs. MIAMI—Has never faced the Marlins...is 0-2 with a 6.60 ERA (15-IP, 11-ER) in 3 interleague apps (2 starts) and 0-for-2 at the plate.

LAST SEASON—Spent his first season in the Rays organization with Triple-A Durham after being acquired from the Mariners in a trade involving **Drew Smyly**...his 13 wins, 26 starts, 157.1 IP and 159 SO were all career highs...ranked 2nd among Rays minor leaguers in strikeouts, behind **Brent Honeywell** (172)...tied for 2nd in wins, one shy of **José Mujica** (14)...ranked 3rd in innings and 8th with a 3.43 ERA.

- + Increased his strikeout total from 99 SO (6.94 SO/9 IP) with Double-A Jackson in 2016 to 159 SO (9.10 SO/9 IP) with the Bulls...according to Fan-Graphs, generated swings-and-misses on 14.0 pct. of his pitches, 2nd-highest in the International League to teammate **Brent Honeywell** (14.3).
- + Led the IL in strikeouts, the second consecutive year and fifth time in seven seasons a Bulls pitcher was the league leader...tied for the IL lead in starts, ranked 2nd in wins, 3rd in innings, 4th in SO/9 IP, 5th in BB/9 IP and 8th in ERA.

LOCAL PRODUCT—Ryan grew up a Rays fan and kept some 2008 World Series gear in his bedroom of his Lakeland home, which he found after he was acquired in a four-player trade from the Mariners...he would often watch games in his bedroom, and his dad followed along as he worked in the garage...the two would sometimes meet in the middle of the house after the game's most pivotal moments.

- + His high school baseball coach encouraged him to find professionals to look up to...he admired **David Price**, **James Shields** and **Scott Kazmir** and still has a Kazmir jersey he received as a 15-year-old hanging in his closet.

- + Is in his fourth season as Rays manager...at age 40, is the majors' youngest active skipper—5 months younger than SD **Andy Green**.
- + His last ejection was July 18, 2017 at OAK, his seventh ejection as Rays manager...his 7 ejections are tied for 4th in franchise history.
- + Is the sixth Tampa-born manager in major league history, and second to manage the Rays...that list includes Hall of Famers **Al Lopez** and **Tony La Russa**, **Lou Piniella**, **Dave Miley** and **John Hart**.

- + Played 12 professional seasons as a catcher, incl. parts of eight seasons in the majors (2002-10) and two years (2005-06) in the Rays org.
- + Played in the 1989 Little League World Series (Tampa Northside LL), 1999 College World Series (Florida State) and earned World Series rings in 2007 (Red Sox) and 2009 (Yankees).
