### TODAY IN YANKEES HISTORY

**April 6, 1982:** A freak snowstorm blankets the Northeast, forcing the cancellation of the season opener vs. Texas at Yankee Stadium and postponement of the Yankees' first four scheduled games. They finally open 1982 with a doubleheader vs. the White Sox on 4/11.

**April 6, 1974:** The Yankees play their first home game at Shea Stadium as Yankee Stadium begins a two-year remodeling effort.

**April 6, 1973:** At Fenway Park in Boston, the Yankees' Ron Blomberg becomes the Major League's first designated hitter. Batting in the top of the first inning, he walks with the bases loaded off Luis Tiant. He goes 1-for-3 with 1 RBI as the Yankees lose to the Red Sox, 15-5.

### TOMORROW IN YANKEES HISTORY

**April 7, 2007:** Down 7-6 with two out and bases loaded in the bottom of the ninth, Alex Rodriguez hits a "walk-off" grand slam off Chris Ray in a 10-7 win vs. Baltimore.

**April 7, 1994:** In an 18-6 win vs. Texas, Don Mattingly notches his 1,000th career RBI to become the ninth Yankee to reach the milestone and first since Mickey Mantle in 1961.

**AT A GLANCE:** The Yankees are 2-1 on their six-game homestand after sweeping 2G from Tampa Bay and dropping the opener of a four-game series with the Orioles on Thursday...following an off day on Mon., will begin a six-game road trip: 3G at Boston (Tue.-Thurs.) and 3G at Detroit (4/13-15).  
▶ Are scheduled to play their first 13G vs. the AL East.  
▶ Are 2-1 thus far on a stretch of 16 of 22G at home (4/3-26).  
▶ Seven of the Yankees' first 10G are day games (3-2).  
▶ Have two scheduled off days (4/9, 18) before starting a season-long stretch of games on 18 straight days (4/19-5/6).

**YESTERDAY'S NEWS:** The Yankees lost the opener of their four-game series with Baltimore at Yankee Stadium on Thursday, 5-2...**RHP Masahiro Tanaka** (6.1IP, 6H, 3ER, 0BB, 7K, 1HR) took a shutout into the seventh but suffered his first loss of the season...**RF Aaron Judge** (1-for-4) broke a 0-0 tie with a solo HR to right in the sixth...**SS Didi Gregorius** (1-for-1, 1R, 1 double, 2BB, 1HP) reached base all four times...**2B Tyler Wade** (1-for-2, 1 double, 2BB) reached base safely a career-high three times...**3B Miguel Andujar** (0-for-3) made his first career start at third base.

**TANAKA TIME:** **RHP Masahiro Tanaka** extended his Yankee Stadium scoreless streak to 28.0IP (regular and postseason) before allowing a two-run HR to Adam Jones in the seventh inning Thursday...had not permitted a run at home since Trey Mancini's solo HR in the sixth inning of a start vs. Baltimore on 9/14/17.

▶ Had won and tossed 7.0IP in each of his previous six starts at Yankee Stadium (regular and postseason).  
▶ Is tied for sixth in the Majors with 15K...no other pitcher with OBB has more than 10K.

**FOR STARTERS:** **Yankees starters** rank second in the AL and third in the Majors with a 2.06 ERA (39.1IP, 9ER), trailing Boston (0.86) and the Dodgers (1.99)...the 9ER are the rotation's fewest allowed over the first seven starts of a season since 1999, when the Yankees starters permitted just 8ER in their first seven starts (and 9ER in their first eight starts).

▶ Have held opponents to a .103 BA (3-for-29) with RISP.  
▶ Allowed 2R-or-fewer in each of their first six starts, the second Yankees rotation since at least 1908 to accomplish the feat (also 1911).

**SS Didi Gregorius** reached base safely in all 4PA on Thurs. vs. Baltimore, going 1-for-1 with 1R, 1 double, 2BB and 1HP.

▶ Of his 9H this season, has **eight extra-base hits, most in the Majors** (5 doubles, 1 triple, 2HR).

▶ Is the fifth Yankee since 1908 to tally at least 8XBH through the team's first 7G of a season, joining Alex Rodriguez (9XBH in 2007), Derek Jeter (8XBH in 1999), Rickey Henderson (8XBH in 1988) and Babe Ruth (8XBH in 1921).

▶ Is tied for the Major League lead with 9RBI and tied for second with five doubles.

▶ Has 5BB in 29PA this season (17.2%)...drew walks in just 4.4% of his PA's over his first three years with the Yankees.

▶ Has hit safely in 17 consecutive games vs. Baltimore (since 10/2/16), the longest Yankees hitting streak against the O's since Robinson Canó hit in 19 straight from 6/1/10-7/29/11... is hitting .406 (28-for-69) with 16R, 8 doubles, 5HR and 20RBI during the streak.

▶ Has reached base safely in 9-of-13 trips to the plate this homestand, going 5-for-9 with 4R, 2 doubles, 2HR, 8RBI, 3BB and 1HP.

**DOWN ON THEIR LUCK:** **Yankees hitters** have hit into a .250 batting average on balls in play (BABIP), the fourth-lowest mark in the Majors (CLE-.180, KC-.209, TB-.248)...in 2017, their .304 BABIP ranked 13th.

▶ **Yankees relievers** have a 6.65 ERA (21.2IP, 16ER) this season but have recorded 33K and just 6BB...opponents are hitting .526 (10-for-19) with RISP against the bullpen.

**ALL RISE:** After going homerless in his first 5G of 2018, **RF Aaron Judge** has homered in each of the last 2G.

▶ His 58 career home runs are the most by any player through 189 career games in Major League history...the all-time record for HRs through 200 career games is 59 by Mark McGwire and Rudy York (see chart)...McGwire is the fastest ever to 60HR, reaching the mark in 202 games.  
▶ Since the start of 2017, is hitting .415 (27-for-65) with 32R, 5 doubles, 12HR, 25RBI and 24BB in 20G vs. Baltimore...in 11 home games in that span, is hitting .459 (17-for-37) with 23R, 3 doubles, 9HR, 18RBI and 14BB.

**GOING, GOING, GIAN:** **OF Giancarlo Stanton** hit his third home run of the season in the first inning on Wed. vs. Tampa Bay, his first HR as a Yankee at Yankee Stadium.

▶ Hit 3HR through the team's first six games, the first Yankee to do it since 2011,

when Mark Teixeira hit 4HR and Jorge Posada hit 3HR...was the first player ever to hit at least 3HR in the first six team games in his first season as a Yankee.

▶ Has 270 home runs in 993 career games...has the fourth-most HRs through a player's first 1,000 career games, behind Ryan Howard (279), Ralph Kiner (277) and Harmon Killebrew (272).

▶ Has 1,999 career total bases.

▶ Has homered against all but five of the 30 MLB clubs: Baltimore, Cleveland, Kansas City, Miami, Minnesota...is 3-for-28 with OXBH in his career vs. Baltimore.

**POWER AND PATIENCE:** **Yankees hitters** are tied for second in the Majors with 12HR this season (CWS-14, MIN/STL/WAS-12)...marks the eighth time in club history that they have hit at least 12HR through seven team games.

▶ Have homered in 6-of-7 games this season, with multiple HRs four times.

▶ Have collected 27XBH (14 doubles, 1 triple, 12HR), ranking fourth in the Majors (HOU/LAA/TOR-28 each).

▶ Lead the AL with 31BB, which ranks third in the Majors (WAS-39, ARI-36).

▶ Are seeing an average of 4.07 pitches per PA, fourth-highest in MLB (PHI-4.41, STL-4.21, CLE-4.11).

**THE STOPPER:** **LHP CC Sabathia** makes his 2018 home debut tonight... in the 2017 regular season, went 9-0 with a 1.71 ERA (68.1IP, 13ER) in 11 starts following a Yankees loss.

▶ Ranks 18th on Baseball's all-time strikeout list with 2,850K, trailing 17th-place Jim Bunning (2,855) by 5K... ranks sixth in franchise history with 1,457K, trailing fifth-place Lefty Gomez by 11K.

▶ Is 19-10 with a 3.56 ERA (275.1IP, 109ER) in 41 career starts against the Orioles, tied for his third-highest win total against any opponent (21-Detroit; 21-Kansas City; 19-Chicago-AL; 19-Minnesota)...with a win, would join Justin Verlander (23-10 vs. Kansas City, 20-13 vs. Chicago-AL, 20-24 vs. Cleveland) as the only active pitchers with at least 20 wins vs. three opponents.

## YANKEE DOODLES

### #17 AARON BOONE—MANAGER Career Managerial Record: 4-3

- Won his first home game as a manager, becoming the sixth straight Yankees manager to win his home Yankees managerial debut (also Girardi-2008, Torre-1996, Showalter-1992, Merrill-1990 and Dent-1989)...with 3/29 win at Toronto, became the 11th manager to win his Yankees managerial debut on *Opening Day* and the 18th to win his Yankees managerial debut *at any point during the season*.
- Is the 18th Yankees manager to have also played for the club.
- Was named the 33rd manager in Yankees history on 12/4/17, signing a three-year contract through the 2020 season with a team option for 2021.
- According to *Elias*, joins his father, Bob, as the third father-son duo to both serve as Major League managers, joining George and Dick Sisler and Bob and Joel Skinner...Bob Boone spent parts of six seasons as a Major League skipper.
- With his grandfather (Ray), father (Bob) and older brother (Bret), is part of the first family in Baseball history to produce three generations of Major League players.

### #41 MIGUEL ANDÚJAR—INF Current/Season-High Hitting Streak: 0G/0G

- Was 0-for-3 in Thursday's loss vs. Baltimore, making his first career start at 3B...did not play in previous two games...made his season debut in Sunday's loss at Toronto, starting at DH and going 0-for-4...was recalled from Triple-A Scranton/WB prior to the game.
- In 15 spring training games with the Yankees, batted .267 (12-for-45) with 8R, 2 doubles, 1 triple, 4HR, 10RBI, 3BB with a .928 OPS...was named the recipient of the 2018 James P. Dawson Award, given annually to the outstanding Yankees rookie in spring training.
- Saw his first Major League action in 2017, hitting .571 (4-for-7) with 2 doubles and 4RBI in five games with the Yankees.
- Earned the 2017 Kevin Lawn Award, presented annually to the organization's minor league "Player of the Year" after leading all Yankees farmhands in batting average (.315) and doubles (36), ranking third in RBI (82) and tying for fourth with a career-high 16HR over 125G with Double-A Trenton and Triple-A Scranton/WB.
- Entered 2018 tabbed by *Baseball America* as the Yankees' No. 5 prospect and the No. 59 prospect in Baseball.
- Was signed by the Yankees as a non-drafted free agent on July 2, 2011.

### #26 TYLER AUSTIN—1B Current/Season-High Hitting Streak: 0G/2G

- Was 0-for-4 in Thursday's loss vs. Baltimore...is hitless in last 7AB...**on homestand** is 1-for-10 with 3R, 1 double, 2BB and 1SB in 3GS (2-DH/1-1B).
- Hit two-run HR (#1) and solo HR (#2) and was 2-for-3 in Saturday's loss at Toronto...was his first career multi-HR game...made his first career Opening Day roster.
- Eight of his nine career HR have tied the game or given the Yankees the lead.
- Played in 20G with the Yankees in 2017...spent more than three months on the D.L. (3/30-6/5, fractured left ankle and 6/29-8/11, right hamstring strain).
- Was selected by the Yankees in the 13th round of the 2010 First-Year Player Draft.

### #29 BRANDON DRURY—INF/OF Current/Season-High Hitting Streak: 0G/2G

- Was 0-for-1 in Thursday's loss vs. Baltimore, pinch-hitting for Andújar in the ninth...**on homestand** is 0-for-8 with 1BB in 3G/2GS at 3B.
- Hit two-run HR (#1) in the third—his first homer as a Yankee (off Stroman)—and was 2-for-3 with 1BB in Sunday's loss at Toronto...his fourth-inning single (off Happ) on 3/29 at Toronto was his first hit as a Yankee.
- Was acquired by the Yankees from Arizona as part of a three-team trade on 2/20/18, in which the Yankees sent INF Nick Solak to Tampa Bay and RHP Taylor Widener to Arizona...additionally, OF Steven Souza, Jr. was traded from Tampa Bay to Arizona, and LHP Anthony Banda was traded from Arizona to Tampa Bay along with two players to be named later.
- In 2017, batted .267 (119-for-445) with 37 doubles, 13HR and 63RBI with a .764 OPS in 135G (109GS at 2B, 3 at DH, 1 at 3B) with the Diamondbacks.
- Was selected by Atlanta in the 13th round of the 2010 First-Year Player Draft...has started games at 2B, SS, 3B, LF, RF and DH in his career.

### #11 BRETT GARDNER—OF Current/Season-High Hitting Streak: 0G/2G (2x)

- Was 0-for-4 with 1BB in Thursday's loss vs. Baltimore...is hitless in last 7AB...**on homestand** is 3-for-12 with 4R, 1BB and 1SH in 3GS in CF.
- Hit his second career Opening Day homer in 3/29 win at Toronto (also 4/6/15 vs. Toronto)...made his 10th career Opening Day roster (2009-18), all with the Yankees...has made seven O.D. starts in LF, tying Babe Ruth for the second most O.D. starts at that position in Yankees history (Roy White - 9).
- Set career highs with 21HR and a .428 slugging pct. in 2017, becoming the fifth Yankee to hit 20HR from the leadoff spot in a single season (seventh time).
- With 21HR/235B in 2017, became the 13th Yankee in team history with at least 20HR and 20SB in a single season and first since Granderson in 2011 (41HR, 25SB).
- Has seven seasons with at least 20SB (2009-11, '13-15, '17), the third-most 20SB seasons in Yankees history behind Derek Jeter and Hal Chase (eight each).
- Is the Yankees' longest-tenured player...was selected by the club in the third round of the 2005 First-Year Player Draft and made his Major League debut in 2008...is one of five players drafted by the Yankees to collect at least 1,000 hits with the club (also Thurman Munson, Don Mattingly, Derek Jeter and Jorge Posada).

### #18 DIDI GREGORIUS—SS Current/Season-High Hitting Streak: 1G/4G

- Collected 9H through his first seven games, with eight going for extra bases (5 doubles, 1 triple, 2HR)...is the fifth Yankee since 1908 to tally at least 8XBH through the team's first 7G of a season, joining Alex Rodriguez (9XBH in 2007), Derek Jeter (8XBH in 1999), Rickey Henderson (8XBH in 1988) and Babe Ruth (8XBH in 1921).
- Was 1-for-1 with 1R, 1 double, 2RBI and 1HP in Thursday's loss vs. Baltimore...**on homestand** is 5-for-9 with 4R, 2 doubles, 2HR, 10RBI, 1BB and 1HP in 3GS at SS...hit three-run HRs (#1/#2) in the third and seventh and was 4-for-4 with 3R, 1 double, 8RBI and 1BB in Tuesday's win vs. Tampa Bay...his career-high 8RBI were the most RBI in a single game by a shortstop in franchise history and most by any Yankee since Alex Rodriguez had 10RBI on 4/26/05 vs. Los Angeles-AL...marked his second career multi-HR game (also 2HR on 7/23/17 at Seattle) and tied his career high in hits (seventh time) and runs (eighth time).
- Had career highs with 73R, 25HR and 87RBI (in 534AB) in 2017 and set a single-season HR record by a Yankees SS (Jeter, 24HR in 1999)...with 20HR in 2016, is the first Yankees SS ever with consecutive 20HR seasons...ranked among SS with 25HR (T2nd MLB), 87RBI (3rd MLB) and a .478 SLG (4th MLB)...missed the first month of the season on the D.L. (right shoulder strain)...hit 1HR in the AL Wild Card win vs. Minnesota and 2HR in ALDS Game 5 win at Cleveland, becoming the first Major League ever to hit at least 3HR in winner-take-all games in a single postseason.
- Was acquired by the Yankees from Arizona in a three-team trade on 12/5/14 in which Detroit acquired RHP Shane Greene from the Yankees and Arizona acquired LHP Robbie Ray and INF Domingo Leyba from Detroit.

### #99 AARON JUDGE—OF Current/Season-High Hitting Streak: 4G/4G

- Hit his 58th career home run in his 189th career game, the fewest games to reach the mark in Baseball history.
- Hit solo HR (#2)—his second in as many days—in the sixth and was 1-for-4 in Thursday's loss vs. Baltimore...**on homestand** is 4-for-10 with 5R, 2HR, 4RBI and 3BB in 3GS in RF...made his first Major League start (and appearance) in CF in Saturday's loss at Toronto.
- Was unanimously named the AL "Rookie of the Year" and placed second in AL MVP voting in 2017, setting a rookie record in home runs (52)...was the ninth Yankee to be named "Rookie of the Year" and first since Derek Jeter in 1996...hit .284 (154-for-542) with 128R, 52HR, 114RBI and 127BB in 155G, earning his first career Silver Slugger Award...joined Ted Williams (1939) as the only rookies in Baseball history with at least 100R, 100RBI and 100BB in a single season.
- According to MLB Statcast, had a 94.9 mph average exit velocity on balls in play, highest among all Major League hitters...led the AL in WAR (8.2, 1st MLB), runs scored (2nd MLB), home runs (2nd MLB), walks (2nd MLB) and ranked second in RBI (6th MLB), on-base pct. (.422, 3rd MLB) and slugging pct. (.627, 2nd MLB).
- Hit 33HR in 77G at Yankee Stadium, the most single-season HRs ever by a Yankee at any home venue (surpassed Babe Ruth, 32HR at home in 1921).
- Was selected to his first career All-Star Game and won the Home Run Derby.
- Made his playoff debut and set a single-postseason Yankees rookie record with 4HR.
