**AT A GLANCE:** The Yankees are 2-0 through the first 2G of a four-game series at Tampa Bay...marks their final road trip of the season...will finish the regular season with a three-game series at Boston (Fri.-Sun.).

- ▶ Have won two straight games...are seeking their first winning streak of at least 3G since winning four straight from 8/24-26...are 6-2 in their last 8G after going 1-4 in their previous 5G...are 22-14 in their last 36G and 29-18 in 47G since 8/6.
- ▶ At 97-60 (.618), have the Majors' third-best record and third-most wins behind Boston (106-51, .675) and Houston (100-57, .637)...matches 2011 (97-65) for their highest win total since going 103-59 in 2009...need to go 3-2 or better in their final 5G to record their 20th 100-win season in franchise history.
- ▶ **Are a season-high 37G over .500...marks their most games over .500 since they finished the 2009 season with a 103-59 record (44G over .500).**
- ▶ Have clinched their 54th postseason berth in franchise history (116 seasons, 46.6%)...have qualified for the playoffs in 20-of-24 seasons since 1995 (missed in 2008, '13-14, '16)...have gone to consecutive postseasons for the first time since 2009-12.
- ▶ Lead Oakland (95-63) by 2.5G for the first AL Wild Card spot...**their magic number for clinching home field in the AL Wild Card Game is 2** (if the Yankees and Oakland finish with the same record, the Yankees will host based on the intradivision record tiebreaker).
- ▶ Play 16 of their final 25 games on the road...are 11-9 so far (6-5 on the road, 5-4 at home).
- ▶ Own the Majors' best record when their starter tosses at least 6.0IP (61-9, .871)...have the second-best record when scoring first (69-16, .812) behind Boston (72-15, .828).

**WILD THINGS:** The Yankees have clinched their seventh AL Wild Card berth (1995, '97, 2007, '10, '15, '17-18)...is their third appearance in the AL Wild Card Game (lost in 2015, won in 2017), **matching Pittsburgh (1-2 in NLWCG from 2013-15) for the most appearances by a team in the Wild Card Game.**

- ▶ Will join the Pirates as the only teams to play in consecutive Wild Card Games (Colorado can also join this group).
- ▶ The Yankees (2x) and Pirates (3x: 2013-15) are the only teams to host multiple Wild Card Games...home teams are 5-7 all-time in the Wild Card Game (AL 3-3, NL 2-4).

**BRONX BOMBERS, INDEED:** Yankees batters have hit a **franchise-record 255HR this season...is the fifth-highest total in Major League history**, behind the 1997 Mariners (264HR), 2005 Rangers (260HR), 2010 Blue Jays (257HR) and 1996 Orioles (257HR)...are on pace to hit 263HR.

- ▶ Have homered in 27-of-31G since 8/24 (53HR total).
- ▶ Hit 3HR on Tuesday, matching their total from their first 7G at the Trop this season.
- ▶ Have homered in 13 of their last 15 road games (23HR).
- ▶ Are the first team in Major League history to have 12 players hit at least 10HR in the same season.

**SPOT CHECK:** According to *Elias*, **the Yankees need 1HR from the No. 9 spot in the order to become the first team in Major League history to hit at least 20HR from all nine batting spots:** No. 1 (27HR), No. 2 (38HR), No. 3 (25HR), No. 4 (41HR), No. 5 (32HR), No. 6 (25HR), No. 7 (23HR), No. 8 (25HR), No. 9 (19HR).

**TO BE THE BEST...:** Among the five AL playoff teams, the Yankees have the best record against the other AL postseason qualifiers, having gone 20-16 this season (5-2 vs. Cleveland, 5-2 vs. Houston, 3-3 vs. Oakland, 7-9 vs. Boston)...see chart at right.

**CUTCH CITY: OF Andrew McCutchen** is batting .300/.462/.625 (12-for-40) during his 11-game on-base streak after batting .152 (5-for-33) in his first 11G with the Yankees...has walked in 13-of-22 games.

- ▶ Has 16BB in his last 14G...**leads the AL with 21BB this month**, and is third in the Majors behind Bryce Harper (33BB) and Brandon Nimmo (25BB)...is third in the Majors with 47BB since the All-Star break, behind Harper (51BB) and Aaron Hicks (49BB).
- ▶ Has led off the first inning 19 times as a Yankee and reached safely 10 times, going 6-for-15 with 4BB.
- ▶ The Fort Meade, Fla., native has hit safely in all five career games at Tropicana Field, going 8-for-20 (.400) with 6R, 1 double, 2HR, 6RBI, 2BB and 2SB.
- ▶ With 20HR this season (15 with San Francisco, 5 with the Yankees), **joins Giancarlo Stanton and Nelson Cruz as the only players to hit at least 20HR in each of the last eight seasons** (2011-18).

**LUUUUUUUUKE:** Since joining the Yankees on 8/2, **1B Luke Voit** is hitting .302/.377/.621 (35-for-116) with 24R, 4 doubles, 11HR, 26RBI and 13BB in 35G...**since 8/24, his AL-high 11HR (in 28G) are second in the Majors to Christian Yelich** (12).

**FOR STARTERS:** Yankees starting pitchers have allowed 2ER-or-fewer in 15 of their last 17 starts, going 7-3 with a 2.62 ERA (86.0IP, 81H, 28R/25ER, 23BB, 82K, 6HR) over the span...**is the Majors' second-lowest rotation ERA since 9/7**, trailing only Tampa Bay (2.31).

**ROAD WARRIORS:** The Yankees are 14-6 (.700) in their last 20 road games since 8/6...is the AL's second-best road record over the span (Houston, 15-4, .789).

- ▶ At 44-32 (.579), have the fifth-best road record in the Majors...are tied for their most road wins in a season since going 45-36 in 2011 (also 44-37 in 2012).
- ▶ Are 2-0 in this series after going 1-5 in their first two trips to Tropicana Field this season...at 3-5, are tied for their third-most losses at the Trop in a single season (2-7 in 2012, 3-6 in 2011).

**YESTERDAY'S NEWS:** The Yankees took the second of four games at Tampa Bay on Tuesday, 9-2...**RHP Luis Severino** (5.0IP, 4H, 2ER, 3BB, 7K, 1HP) picked up his 19th win of the season, tied for the most wins by a Yankee since CC Sabathia also won 21 in 2009...**C Gary Sánchez** (2-for-4, 1BB) hit a three-run HR to cap a seven-run third inning and tied a season high with 4RBI...**SS Adeiny Hechavarria** (1-for-4) led off the third with a solo HR, his second HR as a Yankee...**LF Andrew McCutchen** (1-for-2, 1R, 2BB, 1HP) reached base four times, extending his on-base streak to 11G...**RHP Tommy Kahnle**, **LHP Stephen Tarpley** and **RHP Domingo Germán** combined to throw 4.0 scoreless innings of relief (1H, 8K).

- ▶ **Yankees batters** collected 3 singles, 2 doubles, 2 triples and 3HR...marked the second time this season that they had at least two of each in a game (5/20 at Kansas City).
- ▶ All nine starters hit safely in a game for the fifth time in 2018.

**SEVEN...SEVEN:** Yankees batters scored 7R in the third inning on Tues. at Tampa Bay, matching their highest-scoring frame of the season (7R in sixth inning on 4/21 vs. Toronto)...marked their highest-scoring inning on the road since 7R in the eighth on 6/14/16 at Colorado.

- ▶ Hechavarria and Sánchez both homered in the third inning, **the Yankees' 26th multi-HR inning this season, second-most in the Majors** (Cleveland-27).

**SEVY LIFTING:** RHP Luis Severino earned his 19th win of the season on Tues. at Tampa Bay, third-most in the Majors...are tied for second-most by a Yankee in the last 10 seasons (since 2009) behind CC Sabathia (21-7 in 2010).

- ▶ Since 2006, is tied for the second-highest win total by a pitcher in his age-24 season or younger behind Clayton Kershaw (21-5 in 2011).

**MASAHI-ROAD:** RHP Masahiro Tanaka is 7-0 with a 3.31 ERA (81.2IP, 30ER) in 14 road starts...**joins St. Louis' Miles Mikolas (9-0) as the only two pitchers undefeated on the road in 2018 (min. 7 decisions)**...with a win or ND tonight, would join Jimmy Key (10-0 in 1994) and Tom Zachary (9-0 in 1929) as the only Yankees to go 7-0 or better on the road in a season.

**PEN PALS:** Yankees relievers have retired 36-of-43 batters in this series while recording 20K in 12.0IP (3H, 1ER, 4BB).

- ▶ Since allowing 3ER in 1.0IP in his Major League debut on 9/2, **LHP Stephen Tarpley** has thrown 5.2 scoreless innings (3H, 2BB, 7K) over seven appearances...LHB are 1-for-11 (.091) with 5K and 1BB.

### TODAY IN YANKEES HISTORY

**Sept. 26, 2013:** In his final career appearance, Mariano Rivera is removed from the game by Derek Jeter and Andy Pettitte, who come out of the dugout to make the pitching change.

**Sept. 26, 1998:** David Cone earns his 20th win of the year in his final start of the season, tossing 7.0 shutout innings vs. Tampa Bay in a 3-1 Yankees victory. He finishes 20-7 with a 3.55 ERA, marking the second of two career 20-win seasons (also 20-3 with the Mets in 1988).

**Sept. 26, 1961:** Roger Maris hits his 60th home run of the season off Baltimore's Jack Fisher in a 3-2 Yankees win, tying Babe Ruth's Major League record.

### TOMORROW IN YANKEES HISTORY

**Sept. 27, 1998:** The Yankees defeat Tampa Bay, 8-3, on the season's final day to improve to 114-48 (.704). They become the first team since the 1954 Indians (111-43, .721) to finish a season with a winning percentage higher than .700.

**Sept. 27, 1938:** An ailing Lou Gehrig hits his 493rd and final major league home run, a solo shot off Senators' right-hander Dutch Leonard. On the same date exactly 15 years earlier (9/27/1923), the Yankees first baseman homered off Bill Piercy at Fenway Park for his first career home run.

**Sept. 27, 1923:** Lou Gehrig hits his first major league homer off Boston's Bill Piercy at Fenway Park.

## TONIGHT'S STARTING PITCHER: RHP MASASHIRO TANAKA (12-5, 3.67 ERA)

**RHP Masahiro Tanaka** will make his 27th start of the season tonight at Tampa Bay...the 29-year-old will pitch on regular four days' rest...has allowed 2R-or-fewer in nine of his last 12 starts (since 7/15) while posting a 2.64 ERA (75.0IP, 22ER), the AL's third-lowest ERA in that span...has the two longest scoreless streaks of his career this season: 21.1IP from 7/15-8/5 and 20.0IP from 9/1-14...was on the 10-day D.L. from 6/9-7/10 with mild strains of his left and right hamstrings (missed 29 team games)...is the second pitcher in Yankees history to reach double-digit wins in each of his first five Major League seasons, joining Andy Pettitte, who did it in each of his first nine campaigns (1995-2003)...has 163 career wins between MLB (64) and NPB (99)...surpassed Hisashi Iwakuma (63) for third-most MLB wins by a Japanese-born pitcher with his last win...his 794K are the most by a Yankee through his first five Major League seasons, surpassing Andy Pettitte (709K)...recorded his 700th career strikeout on 6/2/18 at Baltimore, becoming the sixth Japanese pitcher to record at least 700 Major League strikeouts...needs 6K to become the fourth Japanese pitcher to reach 800K (Nomo-1918K, Darvish-1070K, Kuroda-986K)...the 2014 AL All-Star was acquired by the club via the posting system from the Rakuten Golden Eagles of Japan and signed to a seven-year contract on 1/22/14...his contract runs through the 2020 season.

**LAST START:** Started and took a no-decision on Thurs. vs. Boston (4.0IP, 8H, 5ER, 0BB, 3K, 1HR)...was his shortest start of the season...had his scoreless streak snapped at 20.0IP with 1R in the first inning...was his first run allowed since the first inning of his 9/1 start vs. Detroit...was just the second time in his last 22 starts that he allowed more than 4R (6ER on 8/10 vs. Texas)...snapped a streak of 17 consecutive home starts with at least 5.0IP since 7/28/17...snapped a streak of six straight starts with at least 6.0IP...had not allowed a HR in his previous four starts, or in his previous four home starts...exited with a 6-4 lead.

**TANA-K-A:** His 794K are the most by a Yankee through his first five Major League seasons, surpassing Andy Pettitte (709K)...recorded his 700th career strikeout on 6/2/18 at Baltimore, becoming the sixth Japanese pitcher to record at least 700 Major League strikeouts...needs 6K to become the fourth Japanese pitcher to reach 800K (Nomo-1918K, Darvish-1070K, Kuroda-986K).

- Among pitchers debut since 2009, his 794K are fifth-most through a pitcher's first five seasons, behind Yu Darvish (1,021), Jacob deGrom (990), Clayton Kershaw (874) and Chris Archer (795).

**MASA-PIECE THEATRE:** Has the two longest scoreless streaks of his career this season: 21.1IP from 7/15-8/5 and 20.0IP from 9/1-14...*Elias* confirms that he is the first Yankees pitcher to record multiple scoreless streaks of at least 20.0IP in a single season since Ron Guidry in 1983 (22.2IP, 5/11-22/83; 21.1IP, 5/27-6/6/83)...the 21.1-inning streak was the longest streak by a Yankee since CC Sabathia's 23.2-inning streak from 6/30-7/10/2011.

- Ranks third in the AL with a 2.62 ERA (68.2IP, 20ER) in 12 starts since the All-Star break...trails Mike Clevinger (2.40) and Carlos Carrasco (2.53).
- Has completed 6.0IP in six of his last seven starts, going 3-2 with a 2.66 ERA (44.0IP, 13ER).

**WINNING WAYS:** Is the second pitcher in Yankees history to reach double-digit wins in each of his first five Major League seasons, joining Andy Pettitte, who did it in each of his first nine campaigns (1995-2003)...among all players who debuted since 1950, is just the fifth to win at least 12 games in each of his first five seasons, joining Pettitte (1995-99), Dwight Gooden (1984-88), Dennis Eckersley (1975-79) and Tom Seaver (1967-71).

**ON THE ROAD:** Is 7-0 with a 3.31 ERA (81.2IP, 30ER) in 14 road starts this season...*joins St. Louis' Miles Mikolas (9-0) as the only two pitchers undefeated on the road in 2018* (min. 7 decisions)...with a win or no-decision tonight, would join Jimmy Key (10-0 in 1994) and Tom Zachary (9-0 in 1929) as the only Yankees to go 7-0 or better on the road in a season.

- His seven-game winning road streak is his longest streak of winning road decisions in his career, the second-longest active road winning streak to Mikolas (10-0 since 2014)...is tied with Nathan Eovaldi (6/26-8/30/15) for the longest road winning streak by a Yankee since Iván Nova went 12-0 over 16 starts from 6/20/11-6/23/12...his 14-start road unbeaten streak is the longest since Nova's 16-start streak and tied for the sixth-longest in Yankees history.
- The Yankees are 10-4 in his road starts this season...12 of his 15HR allowed on the road are solo HRs.
- Has allowed one-or-zero runs in four consecutive road starts, posting a 0.65 ERA (27.2IP, 2ER) in that span (since 7/24).

**VS. TAMPA BAY:** Is 8-3 with a 3.58 ERA (83.0IP, 33ER) in 13 career starts vs. Tampa Bay...is 2-3 in his last five starts vs. Tampa Bay after going 6-0 in his first eight...allowed 13ER in 5.2IP in his first two starts vs. Tampa Bay in 2017, but has permitted just 3ER in 23.0IP (14H, 1BB, 29K, 1HR) in his last three matchups.

- Is 31-14 with a 3.58 ERA (371.2IP, 148ER) in 60 career starts vs. the AL East (4-3 vs. Baltimore; 8-4 vs. Boston; 8-3 vs. Tampa Bay; 11-4 vs. Toronto).
- Tossed a three-hit shutout (1BB, 9K) in his last start at the Trop on 7/24/18...was his third career shutout and sixth career complete game, first since a three-hit shutout on 4/27/17 at Boston...retired the first 12BF...his 29BF were tied for the fewest by a Yankee in a 9.0-inning complete game since 2002...was the first Yankee to allow 3H-or-fewer with at least 9K in a CG SHO since Mike Mussina on 8/17/03 at Baltimore.

**2018:** The Yankees are 16-10 in his 26 starts this season...opponents are hitting .226 (50-for-221) the first time through the lineup, .217 (46-for-212) the second time through the lineup and .289 (37-for-128) the third time through the lineup.

- Has retired the leadoff batter in 109-of-159 innings (.308 opp. OBP).
- Opponents are batting .218 (24-for-110) with RISP...are hitting .192 (15-for-78) in his last 16 starts (since 5/27) but are 10-for-36 (.278) in his last five starts.
- Has allowed at least 1HR in 17 of his 28 starts (24HR total)...has allowed only 2HR in 44.0IP over his last seven starts (since 8/16).
- Batters are hitting .177 (31-for-175) with 6HR, 10BB and 52K in at-bats ending with a slider (Brooks Baseball).
- Went 7-0 with a 3.12 ERA (80.2IP, 61H, 28ER, 22BB, 86K, 14HR, 4HP) over 14 starts from 4/23-8/5, the longest unbeaten streak of his career...is tied for the longest streak in the Majors this season (also Seattle's James Paxton and Colorado's Jon Gray)...was the third-longest unbeaten streak by a Yankee since 2005 (Iván Nova-20, CC Sabathia-15)...allowed 2R-or-fewer in 8-of-14 starts...the Yankees were 10-4 during the stretch.
