TONIGHT'S GAME: Is **Game 1** of a brief 2-game series vs **Nick Kappel's Royals** and **Game 1** of a 5-game road trip that includes a **3-game weekend series** at **Pit's PNC Park**...the Reds are coming off a **2-4 homestand** vs the **Rockies** (1-2) and **Cardinals** (1-2)...Cin returns to Great American Ball Park next Tue to begin a 6-game homestand vs the **Tigers** (2g) and **Cubs** (4g).

SERIES NOTES: The Reds are **8-13 all-time vs KC**, including a pair of **2-game sweep losses** in their most recent meeting in **2015**...Cin has lost **5 straight games** to the Royals, dating back to an 11-5 Reds win on **6/12/10 at Great American Ball Park**, and **9 of the last 10g vs KC**...the Reds' first appearance at **Kauffman Stadium**, a 3-game sweep there in **June 1999**, was their first appearance in **Kansas City** since the **Red Stockings** and **Cowboys of the American Association** met in **1889**...the first game of that June 1999 series was postponed because of a power failure...the Reds swept the next day's doubleheader, 9-4 and 7-4 in 10 innings, before winning the series finale, 14-3...was the first doubleheader in interleague history...**Reds vs Royals** information is on media guide **Page 334**.

INTERLEAGUE NOTES: This season the Reds are **2-1 vs the American League** (2-1 at Min)...their **2-1 series win** at Min's **Target Field** in April was their first interleague road series win of at least 3 games since a **3-0 series sweep** at Hou's **Minute Maid Park** in **September 2013**...between those series wins the Reds went **0-9 in interleague road series** of at least 3 games and **4-23 in games** in those series...the remaining interleague schedule includes home games vs the **Tigers** (2g, 5/19-5/20), **White Sox** (3g, 7/2-7/4), **Indians** (3g, 8/13-8/15) and **Royals** (2g, 9/25-9/26) and road games at KC's **Kauffman Stadium** (2g, Tue-Wed), at Cle's **Jacobs Field** (3g, 7/9-7/11) and at Det's **Comerica Park** (2g, 8/1-8/2)...beginning in **1997** the Reds are **140-198 all-time vs the AL**, at **.414 the lowest interleague winning percentage** of any Major League team...Cin hasn't produced a **winning record** vs the **American League** since **2013** (11-9)...in **5 seasons** since then are **25-58 vs AL** (.301)...**Reds vs AL opponents** information is on media guide **Page 332**.

PLAYER OF THE MONTH: **Scouter Gennett** in **May** (.398, 8hr, 24rbi) became the first Reds player to win the National League **Player of the Month Award** since **Jay Bruce** in **May 2011**...is **Gennett's** first career monthly award...twice in a 3-week span that month he was named **Player of the Week** (5/7-5/13, 5/21-5/27), the first Reds player to win the weekly award twice in a season since **Bruce** in **2012** and the first Reds player to win it twice in the same month since **Dave Parker** in **May 1985**...**Gennett** finished **May** ranked first in the NL in **slugging** (.720), second in **hitting** (.398), third in **RBI** (24), T3rd in **HR** (8), fourth in **hits** (37) and **on-base percentage** (.418) and T7th in **extra-base hits** (14).

DYNAMIC DUO: In **May**, **Scouter Gennett** (8hr, 24rbi) and **Eugenio Suárez** (8hr, 29rbi) became the first Reds teammates to produce at least **8 HR** and **24 RBI** in the same month since **Adam Dunn** (12hr, 27rbi) and **Ken Griffey Jr.** (11hr, 29rbi) did it in **August 2001**...**Dunn** and **Griffey** were the first Reds duo to do it since **Johnny Bench** (9hr, 32rbi) and **George Foster** (9hr, 38rbi) in **June 1977**...since **RBI** became an official statistic in **1920**, **Gennett** is the only **Reds second baseman** to produce at least **8 HR** and **24 RBI** in a calendar month (June 2017, May 2018) and **Suárez** is the only **Reds third baseman** to produce at least **8 HR** and **29 RBI** in a calendar month (May 2018).

REHABBING: RHP **Homer Bailey** yesterday for Class AAA Louisville vs **Columbus** allowed 5 runs on 6 hits in 3.0 innings in the Bats' 7-4 loss (1bb, 1k, 17BF, 68TP)...since **6/2** he has been disabled with **right knee inflammation**...he last pitched for the Reds in a 12-5 loss on **5/28 at Ari**.

THE OL' COLLEGE TRY: Reds draft selections from the University of Florida, **3b Jonathan India** (1st round pick) and RHP **Michael Byrne** (14th round pick) advanced to the College World Series after last night's **11-inning 3-2 win** over Auburn...in that game, **India** went **1-for-2 with a HR and 3 walks** while **Byrne** (3-1) earned the victory after pitching **4.0 scoreless innings** (1h, 1bb, 5k)...their Gators will face Texas Tech on Sunday (6/17) at 7 pm ET on ESPN at TD Ameritrade Park.

APRIL 19: The Reds are **20-28** since **4/19**, when they replaced manager **Bryan Price** and pitching coach **Mack Jenkins**...bench coach **Jim Riggleman** became interim manager, Class AAA Louisville manager **Pat Kelly** (#60) was promoted to serve as interim bench coach, and Class AA Pensacola pitching coach **Danny Darwin** (#52) joined the Reds' Major League staff as interim pitching coach...**Price** went **279-387 (.419)** in his 5 seasons as manager, including **3-15 this year**.

7-YEAR ITCH: The **10-4 Reds victory** on **4/23 vs Atl** was the first for **Jim Riggleman** as his team's full-time manager since a **1-0 Nationals win** vs the **Mariners** on **6/23/11**...the Reds' **4-1 win** on **5/4 vs Mia** was his **1,500th game** as a Major League manager...since 1900, **Riggleman** is **1 of 14 managers** to work for at **least 5 Major League teams** (SD, Chc, Sea, Wsh, Cin)...**Jimmy Dykes**, **John McNamara** and **Dick Williams** each managed **6 teams**...the others who managed **5 teams** are **Chuck Dressen**, **Bucky Harris**, **Rogers Hornsby**, **Davey Johnson**, **Billy Martin**, **Bill McKechnie**, **Jack McKeon**, **Lou Piniella**, **Jeff Torborg** and **Joe Torre**.

FRONT OFFICE NEWS: Reds President of Baseball Operations **Dick Williams** on 5/10 announced the promotion of **Nick Krall** to **General Manager**...**Krall** had been the club's Vice President, Assistant General Manager since November 2015...**Williams** will remain the club's President of Baseball Operations and will continue to oversee that entire department.

ABOUT THE NEW GUYS: Interim manager **Jim Riggleman** managed in all or parts of **12 Major League seasons** with the **Padres**, **Cubs**, **Mariners** and **Nationals**, leading the **1998 Cubs** to the **NL Wild Card** game...interim bench coach **Pat Kelly** was in his first season as manager at Class AAA **Louisville** after spending the previous 3 years at Class AA **Pensacola**...he also managed in the Reds' system at Class A **Bakersfield** in 2014 and from 2011-2013 at **Rookie Billings**...interim pitching coach **Danny Darwin** was in his third season as **Pensacola's** pitching coach.

YOUNGSTERS: The Reds' **34 Major League debuts** over the **last 3 seasons** are the most of any team in either league and include **5 this season**.

RED HOTS

Sal Romano at just **24 years old** is in his **second Major League season**...tonight is making his 14th start of the season and his **30th Major League** appearance and start...will be his **first career appearance** vs the **Royals**...in 2017, in his Major League debut made 16 starts during 3 stints with the Reds...made spot starts in April and in early July before joining the rotation for good after the All-Star break...during the second half led Reds pitchers in innings (79.0) while tying Homer Bailey for the staff lead in starts (14)...in his last 8 starts of the season for the Reds went 3-3, 3.17 with 4 quality starts...overall after the All-Star break went 4-7, 4.44 in his 14 starts...the Reds went 7-9 in his 16 starts.

Tomorrow's Pitcher - #30 Tyler Mahle, RHP

RED HOTS

Tyler Mahle's last name rhymes with **RALLY**...at just **23 years old** is in his **second Major League season**...tomorrow will make his 14th start of the season and 18th appearance and start of his **career**...will be his **first career appearance** vs the **Royals**...leads the Major Leagues in strikeouts among all pitchers **age 23 and younger**...his career-high **11 strikeouts** on **4/24 vs Atl** are the most by a Reds pitcher this season...with **4 quality starts** is tied with **Luis Castillo** for the staff lead...in the 12-inning, 9-7 win on **4/24 vs Atl**, took a 5-0 lead and a no-hitter into the seventh before **Freddie Freeman** led off the inning with a solo HR...was the victim of a **blown save** when the Braves tied it at 7-7 with 4 runs in the ninth inning off **Amir Garrett** and **Raisel Iglesias**, including a second HR by **Freeman**, but the Reds won it on **Scooter Gennett's** 2-run, walkoff HR off **Max Fried**...pitched into the seventh inning for the first time in his career, then recorded 1 out in the seventh of his next start (4/29 at Min)...his third-inning single in the 5-0 loss on **4/8 at Pit** was the only Reds hit in **Jameson Taillon's** first career complete game...was the first **Reds pitcher** to record the team's only hit in a game hit since **Earl Yingling** did it on **9/19/1914 at Brooklyn Robins**...was 1 of 5 rookies on the **Opening Day roster** (RHP **Jackson Stephens**, RHP **Zack Weiss**, OF **Phillip Ervin**, OF **Jesse Winker**) and the only rookie to begin this season in the Reds' starting rotation...when he earned the 1-0 win in his season debut on 4/2 vs Cubs, at **23 years, 185 days** was the youngest pitcher in the Major Leagues with a victory.
