## PHILADELPHIA PHILLIES (48-37) vs. PITTSBURGH PIRATES (40-47)

Saturday, July 7, 2018 – PNC Park – 4:05 EDT – Game 86; Road 40

RHP Jake Arrieta (5-6, 3.54) vs RHP Jameson Taillon (5-6, 4.05)

- LAST NIGHT'S ACTION:** The Phillies rolled to a 17-5 victory in the series opener against Pittsburgh at PNC Park ... Starter Nick Pivetta went only 2.2 innings, allowing 3 runs (1 ER) on 5 hits with 2 walks and 2 strikeouts, but the bullpen picked him up and allowed just 2 runs over the final 6.1 frames ... Odubel Herrera was 2-for-6 with a HR and 4 RBI, Andrew Knapp homered, doubled and drove in 3 and the club rapped out 18 hits en route to their fifth straight win.
- RECORD-BREAKING MARATHON:** Last night's game, at 4 hours, 30 minutes, was not only the longest 9.0-inning game in Phillies history (previous: 4:13 on 7/6/15 at LAD), but tied for the longest 9.0-inning affair in National League history (other: ARI at COL, 6/24/16), per Elias ... It was two minutes longer than the Phillies longest extra-inning game in 2018, a 13.0-inning, 4 hour, 28-minute win on 7/1 vs WSH... **They saw 236 pitches, the club's most in a 9.0-inning game since 6/13/2008 at STL (241), and most by any ML club since NYY on 7/28/15 at TEX (244), per Elias ... Their 17 runs were the club's most they scored on the road in more than 10 years (20 on 6/13/08 at STL) and tied for the club's 10<sup>th</sup>-highest road total ever ... Philadelphia walked 10 times in the game, the third time they have done so this season (others: 4/17 at ATL, 6/18 at MIL), more such games than any other club.**
- HEATING UP:** The Phillies have won five straight games, seven of eight and have posted a 16-7 record since 6/10 ... Their .696 winning percentage in that span is 2<sup>nd</sup> in the NL, trailing only CIN (.739), and ranks 3<sup>rd</sup> in MLB ... They have the 3<sup>rd</sup>-best winning percentage in the NL this season (.565), trailing only MIL (.602) and CHI (.576) ... **Philadelphia is currently tied with ATL for first place in the NL East, marking just the second time they have had any share of first place in 2018 (sole possession for one day on 5/26).**
- THE HOT HANDS:** Andrew Knapp has a career-long seven-game hitting streak, during which he is batting .417 (10-24) with 3 2B, 3B, 3 HR, 8 RBI and a 1.462 OPS ... He has an RBI in a career-best four straight games ... Maikel Franco is batting .354 (17-48) with 6 2B, 2 HR, 8 RBI and a 1.008 OPS since 6/17 ... Scott Kingery is batting .301 (22-73) with 3 3B, HR, 11 R in his last 20 games (since 6/14) ... He is leading all qualifying ML rookies in batting during that stretch ... Rhys Hoskins has 15 extra-base hits (7 2B, 8 HR), 27 RBI and 14 BB since coming off the DL on 6/9 ... He is T-2<sup>nd</sup> in RBI and T-6<sup>th</sup> in extra-base hits in that span ... Carlos Santana, has at least one walk in 15 of his last 18 games, walking 23 total times, most among all players since 6/16 ... His 67 walks are 3<sup>rd</sup>-most in MLB behind Mike Trout (78) and Bryce Harper (72).
- WHAT A RELIEF:** In the last five games, the Phillies bullpen has allowed 3 ER in 25.1 IP (1.07 ERA), held opponents to a .202 AVG (18-89) and stranded all 9 inherited runners, despite pitching at least 6.1 innings in 3 of those games ... The Phillies bullpen tossed 15.1 straight scoreless innings from the 7<sup>th</sup> inn. on 6/30 vs WSH through the 3<sup>rd</sup> inn. last night ... The Phillies rank 6<sup>th</sup> in the NL in save percentage (69.4 %, 25-36), doing so with eight different pitchers (Hector Neris, Seranthony Dominguez, Jake Thompson, Victor Arano, Luis Garcia, Tommy Hunter, Adam Morgan, Edubray Ramos) ... It is the first time they have had eight players with a save in a season since 2007, when they tied a franchise record with nine players recording a save.
- HOMER HAPPY:** Philadelphia has hit at least one home run in 20 of their last 22 games (since 6/12), clubbing 33 round-trippers in that span ... Those 31 homers in that span are 2<sup>nd</sup> in the National League in that span, trailing only LAD's 40, and rank 5<sup>th</sup> in baseball ... The Phillies lead the NL in go-ahead homers (42, 2<sup>nd</sup> in MLB behind NYY's 46) and their 62 games with a home run are most in the NL ... The club already has five players (Odubel Herrera, Rhys Hoskins, Carlos Santana, Maikel Franco and Nick Williams) with double-digit home runs this season, marking the first time they have accomplished that before the All-Star break since 2008 (Ryan Howard, Chase Utley, Pat Burrell, Pedro Feliz, Jayson Werth).
- WALK IT LIKE I TALK IT:** The Phillies boast three players who rank inside the top 12 in walk rate in the majors: Carlos Santana (3<sup>rd</sup>, 18.4%), Cesar Hernandez (11<sup>th</sup>, 14.8 %) and Rhys Hoskins (12<sup>th</sup>, 14.7%) ... They lead the majors in walk rate by a considerable margin (10.5 %, next-closest: NYY: 10.0 %) and also rank 1<sup>st</sup> in pitches per plate appearance (4.05) and are 2<sup>nd</sup> in walks (338), behind only CIN (341).
- WALK THE PLANK:** Philadelphia has won five straight games against the Pirates for the first time since winning five straight from 6/5/11-4/5/12 ... They have not taken six straight from Pittsburgh since 7/8/2006 to 8/17/2007 (6) ... With a win today, the Phillies will have won consecutive games in a season at PNC Park for the first time since 4/25-26/2008, and just the third time since it opened in 2001 (other: 6/19-20/2001) ... It would also mean the first Phillies series win in Pittsburgh since 7/2-4/2013 (2-1) ... **Philadelphia's 17 runs were their most scored in Pittsburgh since 5/21/1951 (17), and prior to that they only scored more in the Steel City on 7/11/1910 (18), 6/28/1890 (18) and 7/13/1900 (23).**
- WHEELS UP:** Today marks the second game of an 11-game, 10-day, four-city road trip that will take the Phillies to PIT (3 games), NYM (4 games), BAL (1 game) and MIA (3 games) leading into the All-Star break ... The trip features both a doubleheader (6/9 at NYM) and a one-game makeup (6/12 at BAL) ... It is the longest road trip of the year in terms of games, and tied for the longest in terms of days (11 day trip from 5/28-6/7) ... **Per Elias, the Phillies have not embarked on a four-city road trip since 8/22-9/4/2005, when they went 6-6 on a 12-game, four-city trip to SF, ARI, NYM and WSH ... Their last 11-game road trip was 8/31-9/10/2017 to MIA, NYM and WSH.**

**LAST START:** 7/1 vs WSH: 5.0 IP, 4 H, 3 R, 2 ER, 2 BB, 2 SO ... Arrieta vs Gonzalez ... The bullpen combined for 8.0 innings of scoreless relief as Gabe Kapler deployed eight different relievers ... Andrew Knapp slugged Philadelphia's first walk-off home run in over two years.

**TODAY'S START:**

- **He Didn't Earn It:** Has allowed 15 unearned runs this season, most in baseball and more than twice as many as the next-closest NL pitcher (7) ... It has been 20 years since a Phillies pitcher allowed that many unearned runs in an entire season (1999, Paul Byrd, 17)
- **Double or Nothing:** Has induced 16 ground ball double plays this season, most among NL starters and tied for most among all starters with SEA's Marco Gonzales and Mike Leake... There was only 1 other season in his career he induced more than 10 in an entire year (17 in 2016)
- **Pirate Killer:** Allowed 1 hit over 7.0 shutout innings against PIT on 4/19, recording his only double-digit strikeout game of the season ... He has allowed 3 ER or fewer in 18 of 21 career starts against Pittsburgh
- **Hard to Hit:** Has held opponents to a .225 AVG in his career, which is the 5<sup>th</sup>-lowest among active starters (min. 1,000.0 IP), behind only Clayton Kershaw (.207), Chris Sale (.220), Stephen Strasburg (.223) and Max Scherzer (.224)
- **vs NL Central:** 34-19, 2.93 ERA (131 ER, 402.2 IP) in 67 starts

**ROAD:**

- **2018:** 2-4, 5.05 ERA (20 ER, 35.2 IP) in 7 starts
- **Career:** 50-34, 3.78 ERA (265 ER, 630.2 IP) in 106 starts

**2018 SEASON:**

- Posted a 0.90 ERA (3 ER, 30.0 IP) in his 5 starts during May, becoming 1 of just 7 Phillies ever to make 5+ starts in a month with a sub-1.00 ERA (last: Cliff Lee, Aug. 2011)
- Per Elias, was the first Phillies pitcher to allow 1 or 0 home runs in consecutive months in which he made 5 or more starts since 2001 (Brandon Duckworth, Aug.-Sep.)
- Had a 13.1-inning scoreless streak, 5/6-5/18
- Did not allow a homer in 28.1 straight IP in parts of 6 starts, 4/8-5/6
- Had a stretch of 18 straight starts allowing 3 ER or fewer from 7/2/17-4/25/18, the second-longest such streak of his career
- Struck out 10 batters on 4/19 vs PIT, his 14<sup>th</sup> career double-digit strikeout game and first start of 10+ SO, 1 H or fewer by a Phillie starter since Cole Hamels' no-hitter in his final start as a Phillie, 7/25/15 at CHI
- Pitched in his 200<sup>th</sup> career game on 4/19 vs PIT and made his 200<sup>th</sup> start on 5/23 vs ATL

**2017 SEASON:**

- Led the team in wins (14) and totaled at least 30 starts for the third consecutive season
- In 12 starts following the All-Star break, posted a 2.28 ERA (17 ER, 67.0 IP), which ranked 6<sup>th</sup> among qualifying NL pitchers (3<sup>rd</sup> among starters) in that span
- Named NL Pitcher of the Month for August (4-1, 1.21 ERA), when he led all NL starters in ERA and T-1st in wins
- Had a stretch of 72 consecutive starts (9/2/14-4/22/17) of at least 5.0 innings snapped, 4/28 at BOS (4.1 IP); that was the longest stretch by a CHI pitcher since 1908
- Went 1-1 with a 0.84 ERA (1 ER, 10.2 IP) in two postseason starts: Game 4 of the NLDS, 10/11 vs WSH and Game 4 of the NLCS, 10/18 vs LAD

**CAREER:**

- Was the 2015 National League Cy Young Award Winner (5<sup>th</sup> in CHI history), and in 2016 earned his first career All-Star selection and Silver Slugger Award
- Has tossed two career no-hitters: 8/30/15 at LAD and 4/21/16 at CIN
  - Became the 8<sup>th</sup> pitcher in MLB history to throw a no-hitter in consecutive seasons ... His second came in his 10<sup>th</sup> start after tossing his first, the third-shortest time between no-hitters in MLB history
- Recorded a career and CHI franchise-best 20 consecutive wins from 8/4/15-5/25/16, which tied for the third-longest streak in MLB history (since 1913)
- In 9 career postseason starts, is 5-3, 3.08 ERA (18 ER, 52.2 IP), 66 SO (most in CHI postseason history), .189 OPP AVG and hit a HR as a batter ... Allowed just 3 ER in 11.1 IP (2.38 ERA) in two starts during the 2016 World Series
- Signed by PHI as a free agent on 3/12/18 ... Originally selected by BAL in the 5<sup>th</sup> round of the June 2007 draft
