COMMUNITY CORNER—Before every Tuesday home game, the Rays host a youngster from the Make-A-Wish Foundation or Children's Dream Fund as a part of the "Tuesday's Champion" program...for today's game against the Braves, the Rays welcome 11-year-old **Christopher Shoup Jr.** from the Children's Dream Fund...as part of his special day, Christopher will meet Rays players and coaches and throw a ceremonial first pitch.

+ This morning, RH **Chris Archer**, Rays front office staff and Good Sports staff joined athletes, coaches and staff from Middleton High School in Tampa, and donated brand-new baseball and softball equipment...the donation, valued at more than \$42,000, included cleats, baseball and softball bats, fielding gloves, batting gloves, helmets and more...this is the fifth year the Rays, Good Sports and Archer have partnered to support youth in the Tampa Bay area.

RAY MATTER—The Rays are 2-3 over their last 5 games, including a 2-1 loss on Sun vs. TOR to snap a 6-game home winning streak...they failed to record their third sweep of the season, and they missed a chance to return to .500 for the first time since they were 1-1...it was their fourth consecutive loss when a win would have brought them back to .500.

+ The Rays are 11-4 over their last 15 games, which included an 8-game winning streak to tie for the 3rd-longest in franchise history...over this 15-game stretch, the Rays have a plus-32 run differential (84-52) and have out-hit opponents, 155-118 (+37).

+ The Rays have scored 5 runs or more in 8 games over this 15-game stretch, and are 8-0 when doing so...they have scored 6 runs or more in 7 games and 8 runs or more in 6 games...they have reached double-digit hits in 9 games over this 15-game stretch.

SERIES-LY SPEAKING—The Rays are 5-1-0 over their last 6 series, compared to 1-4-0 in their first 5 series...they have won the opening game of their last 6 series, and are 8-3 in series openers this season...the Braves enter this series leading the NL East at 19-14, a half-game ahead of the Phillies (19-15)...the Rays are 5-1 in their last 6 games against teams that entered a series in first place in their division, having swept the Twins from April 20-22 and going 2-1 at Fenway Park from April 27-29.

RAYS vs. BRAVES—This is the first meeting between the clubs since Aug 11-12, 2015 at Tropicana Field...the Rays are 10-18 (.357) all-time, their 2nd-worst winning pct. against any opponent (Reds, .333)...they are 6-11 at home and 4-7 on the road, and have won only one of six series between the clubs here...the Rays will go to Atlanta for a 2-game series from Aug 28-29, which will be their first time ever playing at SunTrust Park.

+ The Braves (.274) and Rays (.262) rank 1st and 3rd in the majors in batting avg., with the Red Sox (.269) in between...this series will mark the seventh and eighth times in an 11-game stretch the Rays will face a Top 5 team in hitting (also Red Sox, Tigers).

INTERLEAGUE INTRIGUE—Tonight is the Rays fourth of 20 interleague games this season...they were swept by the Phillies from April 13-15 at home, the first time they were swept in an interleague series since June 17-19, 2016 vs. SF...they went 11-9 in interleague play last season and have only one losing interleague record in 10 seasons of the "Rays" era (7-11 in 2010)...they are 110-83 (.570) since 2008—5th-best in the majors behind the Red Sox (.646), Rangers (.600), Yankees (.594) and Angels (.575)—and 184-187 all-time...the NL is 24-14 in interleague play this season, but the AL has won each of the last 14 season series.

SCHEDULE BREAKDOWN—This is the third of six consecutive series against teams that finished last season below .500...the Rays don't face

another postseason team from last year until May 22-24 vs. BOS...so far this season, the Rays are 6-9 (.400) against teams that made last year's playoffs and 9-8 (.529) against teams that missed the postseason.

+ Yesterday was the Rays second of three off-days in a stretch of 8 days...following Thursday's off-day, the Rays will play 40 games in 41 days (two off-days plus a double-header on May 12 at BAL).

CLOSE SHAVES—Five of the Rays last 7 games have been decided by 1-run margins...the Rays have played a majors-most 16 games decided by 1 run, the most by an AL team within their first 32 games of the season since the 2005 White Sox (16)...put another way, 50.0 pct. of the Rays games this season have been decided by 1 run, compared to 29.3 pct. of games in the majors this season...the Rays are 5-11 (.313) in 1-run games, the 6th-lowest winning pct. in the majors...they are the first team in the majors with at least 11 one-run losses within the first 32 games of the season since the 2006 Braves (11), and the first AL team since the 1989 Blue Jays (11)...since 2016, the Rays are 39-62 (.386) in 1-run games, 3rd-worst winning pct. in the majors and 2nd-worst in the AL over that span.

+ Strangely, with Sunday's 2-1 loss vs. TOR, the Rays are 4-6 (.400) when yielding 2 runs or fewer this season...the rest of the majors is a combined 273-48 (.850) when doing so.

ROAMING BUFFALO—On Sun vs. TOR, **Wilson Ramos** singled in the 2nd inning to extend his hitting streak to 14 games...his streak is:

- + the longest active streak in the major leagues
- + tied with June 9-July 11, 2014 for the 2nd-longest of his career behind April 24-May 19, 2015 (19, with the Nationals)
- + the longest by a Ray since **James Loney** (16) from June 19-July 5, 2013...the club record is held by **Jason Bartlett** (19) in 2009
- + Upon further review, his hitting streak is the longest in franchise history among catchers...from Aug 7-28, 2001, **Toby Hall** hit safely in 14 consecutive games as a catcher, but went 0-for-1 in appearances as a pinch-hitter on Aug 18 at MIN and Aug 26 vs. CWS

SNELL-ZILLA—Tonight's starter **Blake Snell** has won four consecutive decisions spanning 5 starts, matching the longest winning streak of his career...he has allowed 5 hits or fewer in a club-record 11 consecutive starts since Sep 12, 2017...he is averaging a career-high 95.1 mph on his fastball, 2nd among major league left-handed starters behind SEA **James Paxton** (95.5)...his 0.95 ERA (19-IP, 2-ER) at home ranks 3rd in the majors and 2nd in the AL behind OAK **Sean Manaea** (0.73)...he hasn't allowed more than 1 run in any of his 3 starts at home this season, and has only allowed 2 runs in his last 37 IP here dating back to the end of last season.

MEDICAL MATTERS—RH **Nathan Eovaldi** (loose bodies in right elbow) is scheduled for 2 IP or 35 pitches in a rehab start tomorrow for Class-A Charlotte at Fort Myers (Twins).

MINOR MATTERS—Class-A Bowling Green has won nine consecutive games, tying the longest winning streak in franchise history...they will go for a club-record 10th straight win tonight vs. Peoria (Cardinals).

+ Triple-A Durham won, 4-1, yesterday over Norfolk (Orioles)...**Christian Arroyo**, acquired from the Giants in the trade for **Evan Longoria**, hit the first grand slam of his professional career, and **Anthony Banda**, acquired from the Diamondbacks as part of the three-team trade for **Steven Souza Jr.**, did not allow a run in 6.2 IP.

THIS DATE IN RAYS HISTORY—On May 8, 2013 vs. TOR, **Matt Moore** improves to 6-0, joining **Jeff Niemann** (2010) and **James Shields** (2007) as the only starters in Rays history to start the season 6-0.

LAST START—On Wed at DET, failed to hold a 2-0 lead, allowing an RBI groundout in the 5th inning and game-tying solo homer to **James McCann**, his last batter faced, in the 7th inning...only allowed 1 hit through 4 IP, then allowed 4 hits over his last 2.2 IP...yielded 1 BB or fewer for a fourth straight start, longest such streak of his career...his 86 pitches were his fewest since his first start of the season on March 30 vs. BOS (84), and his pitch count by inning was 17-17-13-7-11-13 plus 8 pitches to 3 BF in the 7th inn. ...his line: ND, 6.2 IP, 5 H, 2 R, 1 BB, 4 SO, 1 HR, 86 pit, 57 str.

THE WIN COLUMN—Has won four consecutive decisions spanning 5 starts, matching the longest winning streak of his career...he previously did it spanning 7 starts from Aug 15-Sep 20, 2017 (4-0, 3 no-decisions)...over this 5-start unbeaten streak, he is 4-0 with a 1.89 ERA (33.1-IP, 7-ER) and 38/7 SO/BB ratio...prior to his no-decision in his last start, was the first Ray to win four consecutive starts since **Erasmus Ramirez** from May 30-June 15, 2015 at BAL/SEA, vs. LAA/WAS.

HARD TO HIT—Has allowed 5 hits or fewer in a club-record 11 consecutive starts since Sep 12, 2017...passed **Drew Smyly** (9) from Aug 11, 2014-May 5, 2015 and **Matt Moore** (9) from Sep 11, 2012-April 27, 2013.

INTERLEAGUE—Is 3-1 with a 2.48 ERA (40-IP, 11-ER) in 7 career interleague starts, including 2-0 with a 1.59 ERA (17-IP, 3-ER) in 3 IL starts at home.

PITCHING DEEPER—Has gone at least 6 IP in five consecutive starts, matching the longest such streak of his career (also Aug 10-Sep 1, 2017)...has gone at least 7 IP six times in his last 15 starts since Aug 20, 2017 vs. SEA, compared to once in 35 career starts prior to that.

LEADERBOARDS—Ranks among AL leaders in wins (4, tied for 4th), starts (7, tied for 7th), ERA (2.55, 11th), opp avg. (.190, 9th), WHIP (0.94, 9th), and pct. of swings that miss (32.2, 4th)...is averaging a career-high 95.1 mph on his fastball, 2nd among major league left-handed starters behind SEA **James Paxton** (95.5)...13.7 pct. of his total pitches are swings and misses, 9th in the AL and 3rd among AL lefties behind BOS **Chris Sale** (16.1) and SEA **James Paxton** (14.6).

+ His 0.95 ERA (19-IP, 2-ER) at home ranks 3rd in the majors and 2nd in the AL behind OAK **Sean Manaea** (0.73)...hasn't allowed more than 1 run in any of his 3 starts at home this season...has only allowed 2 runs in his last 37 IP here dating back to the end of last season.

WHERE HE LEFT OFF—In 17 starts since his Aug 8 recall last season, he is 9-2 with a 2.72 ERA (99.1-IP, 30-ER) and .194 opp avg. (68-for-350)...he has allowed 1 ER or fewer in 10 starts, and hasn't allowed an earned run in 5 starts...both losses have come against the Yankees at Yankee Stadium—he hasn't lost to any other opponent since July 24, 2017 vs. BAL, or any other opponent on the road since June 28, 2017 at PIT...he is 5-0 with a 1.63 ERA (55.1-IP, 10-ER) in 9 starts at home over this span, compared to 4-2 with a 4.09 ERA (44-IP, 20-ER) in 8 starts on the road.

KING OF THE K—Snell has the three highest strikeout totals for the Rays this season, recording 10 SO on April 10 at CWS and 9 SO on April 16 vs. TEX and April 27 at BOS...his start against the White Sox was the second time in his career reaching double-digit strikeouts (13, Oct 1, 2017 vs. BAL)...he also became the fifth pitcher in Rays history to yield 1 hit or fewer while recording at least 10 SO, first since **Drew Smyly** on April 19, 2016 at BOS (8-IP, 1-H, 11-SO).

APRIL IN REVIEW—Went 4-1 with a 3.00 ERA (30-IP, 10-ER) and 39 SO over 5 starts in April...his 4 wins tied for 2nd in club history for the month behind **Matt Moore** (5-0 in 5 starts) in 2013...his 39 SO tied for 4th in club history behind **Chris Archer** (43 in 6 starts) in 2016, **David Price** (41 in 5 starts) in 2014 and **Drew Smyly** (41 in 5 starts) in 2016...min. 25 IP, his 11.70 SO/9 IP ratio ranked 2nd behind Archer (11.97) in 2016 for the month of April.

PRICE-TRADAMUS?—In May 2017, while Snell was struggling through a rough beginning to his season, **David Price** told the *Tampa Bay Times*: "[Snell's] stuff is better than my stuff at his age; I like his stuff way more. He'll get through it. ... It takes some time. This game ain't easy, especially at that age. There's a small number of guys that come up at that age, especially in this division, and be really good at the beginning. It takes time."

NO BRUISES INFLICTED—Has never hit a batter in 50 career starts, the longest streak by a Rays starter at any point in franchise history, passing **James Shields** (38) in 2009-10...it is the longest active streak in the majors, ahead of LAD **Clayton Kershaw** (43).

OVERVIEW—Is in his third major league season, having been on the active roster for three stints in 2017 and two stints in 2016...selected as the No. 2 starter on March 15 by Manager **Kevin Cash**, up from No. 4 in last year's season-opening rotation.

+ Is in his fourth season as Rays manager...at age 40, is the majors' youngest active skipper—5 months younger than SD **Andy Green**.
 + His last ejection was July 18, 2017 at OAK, his seventh ejection as Rays manager...his 7 ejections are tied for 4th in franchise history.
 + Is the sixth Tampa-born manager in major league history, and second to manage the Rays...that list includes Hall of Famers **Al Lopez** and **Tony La Russa**, **Lou Piniella**, **Dave Miley** and **John Hart**.

+ Played 12 professional seasons as a catcher, incl. parts of eight seasons in the majors (2002-10) and two years (2005-06) in the Rays org.
 + Played in the 1989 Little League World Series (Tampa Northside LL), 1999 College World Series (Florida State) and earned World Series rings in 2007 (Red Sox) and 2009 (Yankees).
