THE TWINS: The Twins are opening with a three-game four-day series at Baltimore with game two tonight...after tomorrow afternoon's series finale, the Twins will travel to Pittsburgh for two games in three days at PNC Park...after the roadtrip finale next Wednesday night, the Twins will travel home to begin their ninth season at Target Field with a 10-game, 11-day homestand with three against the Mariners, three against the Astros and four against the White Sox...they will continue on after that with two "home games" in Puerto Rico against the Indians.

TWINS START IN THE RIGHT-HAND COLUMN: The Twins lost to the Orioles on Thursday afternoon by a score of 3-2 in 11 innings...it marked their ninth ever extra innings (5-4) on Opening Day and first since playing 11 innings in 2004, beating Cleveland 7-4...four Twins pitchers made their club debut, including starter Jake Odorizzi, and relievers Zach Duke, Addison Reed and Fernando Rodney who was dealt the loss, allowing a walk-off home run to Adam Jones... Joe Mauer made his 14th Opening Day start, passing Harmon Killebrew for the club record:

TWINS AND BIRDS: The Twins are 6-3 in their last nine against the O's and 14-8 in their last 22, dating back to September of 2014.

- Max Kepler has hit safely in all eight career games against the Orioles, hitting .406 (13-for-32) with four doubles, one triple, two home runs, 11 RBI, four walks, a .472 OBP and a 1.235 OPS...hitting .333 (6-for-18) with three doubles and one homer in four career games at Camden.
- Joe Mauer is hitting .366 (37-for-101) with a .425 on-base percentage in his last 26 games against the Orioles with multiple hits in 12 of those.
- Robbie Grossman is hitting .365 (19-for-52) with six doubles, nine RBI, six walks and a .431 on-base percentage in 15 career games against the Orioles...hitting .474 (9-for-19) with a .524 on-base percentage in six games at Camden.

BUCK WHEELS: Byron Buxton's steal of second base in the fifth inning last game marked his 25th consecutive, extending the club record...his last caught stealing was May 23 in Baltimore at second base, caught by catcher Wellington Castillo...Buxton is 42-for-47 (89.3%) in his career and has been caught just once in his last 32 attempts...the all-time MLB record is 50 by Vince Coleman from 1988-89...11 different players have reached 35 straight, the last being Jimmy Rollins from 2007-08, in fact, Paul Molitor stole 36 straight for the Blue Jays from 1993-95.

HOLY HARDWARE!: On November 14, 2017 it was announced that Paul Molitor was the AL Manager of the Year, marking the third time in club history for a Twins Manager to win the award, joining Tom Kelly (1991) and Ron Gardenhire (2010)...Brian Dozier and Byron Buxton each were recipients of an AL Rawlings Gold Glove Award as Dozier became the second second baseman in club history to win, joining Chuck Knoblauch (1997)...Byron Buxton also was awarded with the AL Platinum Gold for best defensive player in the AL...Buxton posted the fourth-best Zone Rating (.951) for a centerfielder in baseball history and ranked third in baseball in defensive runs saved (24).

WHERE IN THE WORLD: A total of 254 players represented an all-time record 21 different countries and territories outside of the 50 United States on 2018 Opening Day 25-man rosters and inactive lists, marking another year of unprecedented diversity on major league rosters, Major League Baseball announced yesterday...among the 25 Twins on roster, eight different players make up four different countries outside the United States: three from Venezuela (Ehire Adrianza, Eduardo Escobar & Gabriel Moya), two from Puerto Rico (José Berríos & Eddie Rosario), two from Dominican Republic (Fernando Rodney & Miguel Sanó), and one from Germany (Max Kepler).

SPRING WRAP: The Twins finished spring training with a record of 14-14-3...Ryan LaMarre led the club in hits (19) and runs (13), Ehire Adrianza led the club in RBI (12), Adrianza and Miguel Sanó tied in homers (3)...José Berríos led the club in innings (19.0) and strikeouts (16)...additionally, the Twins drew 115,147 in attendance surpassing the 100,000 mark for the 17th consecutive year.

NEW BLOOD: Zach Duke was signed to a one-year contract December 28...Tyler Kinley was selected in the Rule 5 Draft...Lance Lynn was signed to a one-year contract March 12...Jake Odorizzi was acquired via trade with Tampa Bay February 17...Addison Reed was signed to a two-year contract January 15...Fernando Rodney was signed to a one-year contract (club option in '19) December 15...Logan Morrison was signed to a one-year contract February 25...Ryan LaMarre was signed to a minor league contract with an invite to spring training November 22...the Twins had just five new players on their 2017 Opening Day roster from the previous season: Jason Castro, Chris Gimenez, Matt Belisle, Craig Breslow and Justin Haley.

CAMDEN CALL-BACKS: Twins Manager Paul Molitor played 220 career games against the Orioles, hitting .297 (268-for-901) with 53 doubles, six triples, 21 home runs and 108 RBI...however, he hit just .252 (35-for-139) with one home run in 35 career games in this park.

SPRING RECAP: In his eighth spring training with the Twins, finished the spring 1-2, 3.55 ERA (12.2 IP, 5 ER) in four starts (1 unofficial vs. AAA hitter)...

2017 RECAP:

- Was the Twins third starter to begin the season.
• Optioned to Triple-A after six starts, going 0-4 and allowing 24 earned runs over 26.1 innings on 39 hits.
• In return to Twins, recorded his first win on May 22 against Baltimore.
• Won his final six decisions, allowing 11 runs over 31.2 innings in the six wins, notching the longest win streak of his career.
• Made his 100th career start on April 12 at Detroit...the first pitcher to make 100 starts for the Twins since Francisco Liriano from 2005-11...was the 25th pitcher in Twins history to make 100-plus starts for the club.
• Began season 5-8, 6.29 (87.1 IP, 61 ER) in first 17 starts, compared to 7-2, 3.57 ERA (70.2 IP, 28 ER) in final 12 starts after July 21...enters tonight with career-high six-game win-streak.

AGAINST THE ORIOLES: Gibson is 2-2, 5.89 ERA (36.2 IP, 24 ER) against the Orioles in seven career starts...in 2017, 1-1, 13.00 ERA (9.0 IP, 13 ER) against the Orioles, was 0-1 and allowed seven runs in 4.0 IP in his lone home start and was 1-0 at Camden Yards, giving up six runs in 5.0 IP on May 22...career 1-1, 6.19 ERA (16.0 IP, 11 ER) against Baltimore at Target Field...is 1-1, 5.66 ERA (20.2 IP, 13 ER) in four career starts at Camden Yards.

ROAD WARRIOR: In 13 road starts in 2017, Gibson posted a 6-3 record with a 4.34 ERA in 74.2 innings on the road...went 6-7 with a 5.72 ERA in 16 starts at home...owns a career 24-22 career record on the road with a 4.56 ERA as opposed to a 20-26 record and 4.83 ERA at home...has won three straight decisions on the road, his last loss coming July 17 at Houston.

REST UP, GIBBY: On four days rest, Gibson is 24-30, 4.79 ERA (388.2 IP, 207 ER) in his career while he's 15-7, 3.85 ERA (238.1 IP, 102 ER) when given five day's rest...that trend is beginning to turn after last year, however, when Gibson was 8-4, 4.48 ERA on four day's rest and 3-4, 5.18 ERA on five day's rest.

KILLING TWO BIRDS WITH ONE STONE: Gibson induced 26 double plays in 2017, ranking third in the AL...his 1.48 GIDP/9 ranked fourth in baseball among pitchers who threw more than 150 innings in 2017...since 2014, Gibson is tied for the lead in GIDP in the majors with 96 and is second in GIDP/9 with 1.27.

KEEP THE K'S COMING: Gibson has improved his strikeouts per 9 innings rate nearly every year in his career, setting a career-high in 2017 with 6.89 K/9...with more strikeouts, however, Gibson has increased his number of free passes allowed...he set a career-high in walks per-9-innings in 2017 with 3.42.

TOMORROW'S STARTER - JOSE BERRIOS (SEASON: ---, --- ERA ; CAREER: 14-12, 5.42 ERA)

Berrios is entering his third season with the Twins...in 40 career games (39 starts), 17-15, 5.07 ERA (204.0 IP, 115 ER)...Berrios is making his fourth career start against Baltimore and his second at Camden Yards...in three starts against the Orioles, Berrios is 2-0, 4.67 ERA (17.1 IP, 9 ER)...in his most recent start on July 6, 2017, Berrios allowed three runs in six innings with four strikeouts and no walks...also earned a win on May 24, 2017 at Baltimore, allowed three runs on four hits in 6.1 innings.

• His 2.85 ERA pre-ASG in 2015 was the fourth-lowest for a Twins starter since 1992 with a minimum of 80.0 IP (Liriano - 1.83 in 2006, Santana - 2.75 in 2007, Radke - 2.77 in 1998).
• In 2014, his first full season in the majors, became one of three pitchers in Twins history to win each of their first three games while posting a sub-1.00 ERA.
• Earned the win in his MLB debut 6/29/13 vs. KC allowing three runs on eight hits in 6.0 innings.
• Named the Twins Minor League Player of the Week for May 12, 2013 after tossing a CG SHO.
• Named an Arizona Fall League Rising star in 2012 and the AFL Player of the Week, 10/23/12.
• Selected to the 2011 Futures Game where he tossed 1.1 inning, allowing two hits.
• Named to the 2010 Eastern League Mid-Season All-Star Team.
• Named the Florida State League Pitcher of the Week, May 3, 2010.
• Selected in the first round (22nd overall) by the Twins in the 2009 First-Year Player Draft out of the University of Missouri as a senior...major was communications.
