## PHILADELPHIA PHILLIES (49-38) vs. NEW YORK METS (35-51)

**Monday, July 9, 2018 – Citi Field – Games 88 & 89 – Road 42 & 43**  
**Game 1 (4:10 EDT) – RHP Zach Eflin (7-2, 2.97) vs RHP Zack Wheeler (2-6, 4.36)**  
**Game 2 – RHP Aaron Nola (11-2, 2.41) vs RHP Corey Oswalt (0-1, 7.94)**

- YESTERDAY'S ACTION:** The Phillies fell to the Pittsburgh Pirates, 4-1, at PNC Park ... Starter Drew Anderson (L, 0-1) was summoned from Lehigh Valley for a spot start and allowed 4 runs on 8 hits with 1 walk and 4 strikeouts over 5.0 innings of work ... The Phils lone run came off the bat of Nick Williams who cranked a solo-shot in the 4<sup>th</sup> inning ... After taking the first two games of the series, Philadelphia secured their first series win in Pittsburgh since 2013.
- TRANSACTIONS:** Prior to today's game, **LHP Hoby Milner** was recalled from Lehigh Valley ... Additionally, **RHP Jake Thompson** was added to the roster from LV and will serve as the 26<sup>th</sup>-man for today's double-header.
- ONE-TWO PUNCH:** In today's double header, the Phillies will send **Zach Eflin** and **Aaron Nola** to the hill ... Their combined record this season is 18-4 with a 2.60 ERA (52 ER, 179.2 IP) ... The Phillies are 21-8 (.724 win %) in the 29 combined games started by Eflin and Nola this season and have won each of the last 10 games started by either hurler (6/10-current) ... Following their loss to the Brewers on June 9, the Phillies were 32-30, had lost seven of eight games and were third place in the NL East, 4.0 games back of the Braves ... However, since June 10 when Eflin and Nola started their run together, the Phillies are 17-8 and find themselves in sole possession of first place in National League East.
- A STAR IS BORN:** Last evening, it was announced that **Aaron Nola** would represent the Phillies at this year's All-Star game, July 17 in Washington ... Nola (25 years) is the youngest Phillies pitcher selected to an All-Star game since Cole Hamels (23 years) in 2007 and he is the first Phillies pitcher to be honored with an invite to the mid-summer classic since Cliff Lee in 2013 ... Nola enters tonight's game with an 11-2 record and a sparkling 2.41 ERA ... His 11 wins before the break are the most by a Phillies pitcher since both Cole Hamels and Roy Halladay each had 11 in 2011 ... If he can secure a win in tonight's nightcap, Nola's 12 wins would be the most by a Phillies pitcher before the break since Curt Schilling had 13 in 1999 ... Among all NL starters this season, Nola ranks T-1<sup>st</sup> in wins, 2<sup>nd</sup> in HR 9.0 IP (0.47) & OPP OPS (.567), 3<sup>rd</sup> in IP (116.0), 6<sup>th</sup> in SO (116) and 4<sup>th</sup> in ERA (2.41) & WHIP (1.03) ... Per *Baseball Reference's* calculation of WAR, Nola's 5.2 WAR this season is already the highest by a Phillies pitcher since Cole Hamels put up a 6.6 mark in 2014.
- ZACH ATTACK:** Game 1 starter **Zach Eflin** has won each of his last six starts (6/5-current) and he is the first Phillies pitcher to win six straight starts since 2011 when Cliff Lee won seven straight from July 30 to September 5 ... Since 2000, Only Eflin, Lee and Roy Halladay (6, 7/23-8/20/10) have won six straight starts as a Phillie.
- REMEMBER THE FIGHTINS:** The Phillies have won eight of 10 games and have posted a 17-8 record since June 10 ... Their .680 winning percentage in that span is T-1<sup>st</sup> in the NL with CIN and T-3<sup>rd</sup> in MLB, trailing only HOU (.769, 20-6) and BOS (.692, 18-8) ... They have the 3<sup>rd</sup>-best winning percentage in the NL this season (.563), trailing only MIL (.600) and CHI (.586).
- WHAT A RELIEF:** In the last seven games (since 6/30), the Phillies bullpen has allowed 3 ER in 30.1 IP (0.89 ERA), held opponents to a .196 AVG (21-107) and stranded all 9 inherited runners ... The Phillies bullpen tossed 15.1 straight scoreless innings from the 7<sup>th</sup> inn. on 6/30 vs WSH through the 3<sup>rd</sup> inn. of Friday's game ... Over the last seven games, despite having the 10<sup>th</sup>-highest innings pitched in that span, no team's bullpen has a lower ERA (next closest: COL, 1.80 ERA) ... The Phillies rank 5<sup>th</sup> in the NL in save percentage (70.3 %, 26-37), doing so with eight different pitchers (Hector Neris, Seranthony Dominguez, Jake Thompson, Victor Arano, Luis Garcia, Tommy Hunter, Adam Morgan, Edubray Ramos) ... It is the first time they have had eight players with a save in a season since 2007, when they tied a franchise record with nine players recording a save.
- WALK IT LIKE I TALK IT:** The Phillies boast three players who rank inside the top 12 in walk rate in the majors: **Carlos Santana** (3<sup>rd</sup>, 18.3%), **Cesar Hernandez** (10<sup>th</sup>, 14.7 %) and **Rhys Hoskins** (12<sup>th</sup>, 14.3%) ... They lead the majors in walk rate (10.3 %, next-closest: NYY: 10.1 %) and also rank 1<sup>st</sup> in pitches per plate appearance (4.04) and are T-2<sup>nd</sup> in walks with CHI (341), behind only CIN (349).
- EXTRA, EXTRA:** The Phillies have collected at least one extra-base hit in 83 consecutive games (since 4/4), which is the longest extra-base hit streak in the majors this season (next: DET, 67 G, 4/10-6/22) ... This current stretch marks Philadelphia's longest extra-base hit streak since 8/30/2008-6/25/2009, when they did so in 97 straight games (**see chart to the right**).
- WHEELS UP:** Today marks the fourth game of an 11-game, 10-day, four-city road trip that will take the Phillies to PIT (2-1), NYM (4 games), BAL (1 game) and MIA (3 games) leading into the All-Star break ... The trip features both a doubleheader (6/9 at NYM) and a one-game makeup (6/12 at BAL) ... It is the longest road trip of the year in terms of games, and tied for the longest in terms of days (11 day trip from 5/28-6/7) ... **Per Elias, the Phillies have not embarked on a four-city road trip since 8/22-9/4/2005, when they went 6-6 on a 12-game, four-city trip to SF, ARI, NYM and WSH** ... Their last 11-game road trip was 8/31-9/10/2017 to MIA, NYM and WSH.
- TWO FOR THE PRICE OF ONE:** Today's double-header marks the first for the Phillies at Citi Field since September 24, 2011 when the Mets took both games of that DH against Phillies' starters Cole Hamels and Joe Blanton.

**LAST START:** 7/3 vs BAL: W, 7.0 IP, 5 H, 2 R, 2 ER, HR, 6 SO ... Eflin vs Cobb ... Rhys Hoskins drove in two runs with an RBI double in the third and Andrew Knapp tripled home a run in the fourth ... Seranthony Dominguez locked down his eighth save of the season.

**TODAY'S START:**

- #Winning:** His 6 straight wins are a career high, and he is the first Phillie to win six straight starts since 2011 (Lee, 7 straight from 7/30-9/5) ... **Since 2000, only Eflin, Lee and Roy Halladay (6, 7/23-8/20/10) have won 6 straight starts as a Phillie** ... Jon Lester is the only pitcher in MLB this season with a win in more consecutive starts (7, 5/29-7/1)
- Last 6:** Eflin is 6-0 with a 1.91 ERA (8 ER, 37.2 IP), 0.93 WHIP, 6 BB, 34 SO and 1 HR in his last 6 starts since 6/5 ... he has the most wins in the majors in that stretch and the fourth-best ERA among qualifying pitchers
- Eleventh Hour:** Has made exactly 11 starts in each of the last 3 seasons:
  - 2018: 7-2, 2.97 ERA (21 ER, 63.2 IP), 14 BB, 63 SO, 5 HR
  - 2017: 1-5, 6.16 ERA (44 ER, 64.1 IP), 12 BB, 35 SO, 16 HR
  - 2016: 3-5, 5.54 ERA (39 ER, 63.1 IP), 17 BB, 31 SO, 12 HR
- Limiting Longballs:** Had a 32.2-inning homerless streak snapped in his last start, but has allowed just the one home run in his last 6 starts ... Eflin ranks first in the NL in HR/9.0 IP (0.24) since 6/5
- Striking Difference:** He is averaging 8.91 SO/9.0 IP 63 SO, 63.2 IP) this season, almost double his average of 4.65 SO/9.0 IP (66 SO, 127.2 IP) from 2016-17 ... He has struck out nearly a quarter of the batters he has faced this season (63 of 259, 24.3 %) ... Prior to this season had never struck out more than 6 in a start (both times with 6 were CG), and this season has struck out 6 or more in 5 of his 10 starts
- RISPy Business:** Has faced 58 batters with RISP this season, and has allowed a hit to only 8 of them (.178 AVG) ... Batters are 4-34 (.148) with RISP in his last 7 starts
- vs NL East:** 3-3, 3.58 ERA (22 ER, 55.1 IP) in 9 starts

**ROAD:**

- 2018: 3-1, 3.34 ERA (12 ER, 32.1 IP) in 6 starts
- Career: 6-6, 5.14 ERA (60 ER, 105.0 IP) in 19 starts
- Has allowed 2 runs or fewer in 5 of his 6 road starts, including each of his last 3 (4 ER, 17.2 IP)

**2018 SEASON:**

- Went 5-0 with a 1.76 ERA (6 ER, 30.2 IP), 6 BB, 0 HR, 28 SO and held opponents to a .218 AVG in 5 June starts ... Was T-1<sup>st</sup> in the majors in wins in June and HR/9.0 IP, and in the NL ranked 3<sup>rd</sup> in ERA, 4<sup>th</sup> in SO/BB (4.97) and 8<sup>th</sup> in WHIP (0.98)
- He was the first Phillie to win 5 games in a month since May 2012 (Hamels) and the first Phillie to have at least 30.0 IP in a month and 0 HR allowed since April 2012 (Halladay)
- Clubbed his first major league home run on 5/25 vs TOR
- Struck out a career-high 9 batters on 5/7 vs SF ... Needed only 3.2 innings to surpass his previous high of 6 (which he did twice, both in complete games)
- Took a perfect game through 5.0 innings in his 2018 debut, 5/1 at MIA
- Began the season with Lehigh Valley (AAA) before being recalled on 4/30 by PHI (1.69 ERA in 3 starts with LHV)

**2017 SEASON:**

- Began the season on the 10-day DL recovering from offseason surgery on both knees
- Had a career-best 29.0-inning streak without issuing a walk, 4/18-5/10; longest by a Phillie since 2013-14 (Cliff Lee, 31.0 IP)
- Had 3 straight starts with at least 7.0 IP and no walks, 4/18-5/4
- Was on the 7-day DL, 6/3-7/8 (right elbow strain)
- Placed on the 10-day DL on 8/22 (retro to 8/19) with a right shoulder strain, causing him to miss the remainder of the season
- Posted a 2.81 ERA (10 ER, 32.0 IP) in his first 5 starts of the season and a 9.46 ERA (34 R, 32.1 IP) in his final 6

- Aaron All-Star:** Yesterday, was named to the National League All-Star team, his first All-Star selection both at the major and minor league level ... **Nola is the first Phillies starting pitcher named to the All-Star team since Cliff Lee in 2013, and is the youngest Phillies starting pitcher to be an All-Star since a 23-year-old Cole Hamels made the team in 2007**
- Winner Take All:** His .846 winning percentage is tied with Jon Lester as for the best among NL pitchers and would be T-2<sup>nd</sup> best by a Phillies starter before the All-Star break (min. 10 starts) with Tommy Greene (1993) and Eric Milton (2004), trailing Steve Carlton (.900, 9-1 in 1981) ... **If he were to win today, he would be tied for 7<sup>th</sup>-most wins ever before the All-Star break by a Phillie ... The only with that many or more are Steve Carlton (1972, 1977, 1980), Robins Roberts (1953, 1955), Curt Schilling (1999), Jim Lonborg (1974)**
- NL Starter Rankings:** T-1<sup>st</sup> in wins (11), 2<sup>nd</sup> in HR/9.0 IP (0.47) & OPP OPS (.567), 3<sup>rd</sup> in IP (116.0), 6<sup>th</sup> in SO (116), 4<sup>th</sup> in ERA (2.41) and WHIP (1.03), 7<sup>th</sup> in OPP AVG (.209)
- Early or Never: In the first inning of games has allowed 10 ER in 18.0 IP (5.00 ERA) with 11 BB and 3 HR allowed ... He has allowed 3 HR in all other innings combined, and in all other innings has a 1.99 ERA (21 ER, 98.0 IP)**
