The Reds finished their recent homestand with a **3-1 series win** vs the first-place **Phillies**...in their last 5 series **vs first-place teams**, beginning **6/21**, the Reds went **4-0 vs Cubs**, **2-1 at Atl**, **2-2 vs Mil**, **2-1 vs Cle** and **3-1 vs Phi** (13-5, .722).

MVP

All-Star **3B Eugenio Suárez** is on a 162-game pace to become the first Reds batter to hit **.300** with at least **37 HR** and **124 RBI** since **George Foster** in **1977** (.320, 52hr, 149rbi)...only 4 batters in Reds history reached those marks (**Foster**, **Frank Robinson** twice, **Tony Perez**, **Ted Kluszewski**)...**Suárez** is chasing the leaders in the National League's **Triple Crown** statistical categories:

REACHING BASE

The Reds have 2 of the top 9 leaders in the National League in **on-base percentage** in **Joey Votto** (1st, .426) and **Eugenio Suárez** (9th, .385)...injured Reds rookie **Jesse Winker** (.405) ranked second in the NL through last Tue but as of Wed's game no longer has enough plate apps to qualify among the leaders.

Scouter Gennett is 1 of only 5 players since **1968** to produced at least **40 HR** and **150 RBI** in his **first 2 seasons** with the **Redlegs**...he is the only player to do it while **hitting at least .300** (.302, 263-871).

TONIGHT'S GAME: Is **Game 2** (0-1) of a 3-game series vs **Jamie Shrewsbury's Mets** and **Game 8** (1-6) of an 9-game road trip that included a **2-game series sweep loss** at Det's **Comerica Park** and a **3-1 series loss** at Wsh's **Nationals Park**...following this series and Thursday's off day, the Redlegs return to **Great American Ball Park** for a 9-game homestand vs the **Diamondbacks** (3g), **Indians** (3g) and **Giants** (3g).

REHABBING: RHP **Jackson Stephens** (torn lateral meniscus, right knee) today was sent to Class AAA Louisville on a rehabilitation assignment...is scheduled to throw 1.0 inning/20-25 pitches in relief...was disabled on 7/24, when RHP **Homer Bailey** came off the DL.

SERIES NOTES: Beginning **9/24/13** the Reds have lost **25** of the last **32** games vs NYM (0-2 in 2013, 2-4 in 2014, 0-7 in 2015, 0-6 in 2016, 3-4 in 2017, 2-2 in 2018), including a **14-game losing streak** from **9/7/14-9/7/16** that ranks as Cin's **longest ever** vs the Mets and its longest vs any team since a **16-game skid vs Ari** from **5/8/01-8/13/03**...dating back to **1962**, the **7-0 series win** by the Mets in **2015** was the **first season series sweep** by either team, followed by NYM's **6-0 series win** in **2016**...**Reds vs Mets** information is on media guide **Page 325**.

BIG CITI LIGHTS: The Reds' **10-5 win** on **9/10/17** snapped their **9-game losing streak** at **Citi Field** dating back to a **2-1 win** here in the final game of a series on **4/6/14**...overall Cin has lost **12** of the last **14** games here and each of the **previous 4** series at **Citi Field** (1-3 in September 2017, 0-3 in April 2016, 0-3 in June 2015, 1-2 in April 2014).

DIAMONDBACKS UP NEXT: Beginning Friday night at **Great American Ball Park**, the Reds and Diamondbacks will meet for the second and final time this season...in their previous meeting, from **5/28-5/30**, the Diamondbacks earned a **2-1 series win**...the Reds went **3-3 vs Ari** last season and have lost 4 of the last 6 games vs Ari...**Reds vs Diamondbacks** information is on media guide **Page 318**.

APRIL 19: The Reds are **46-49** since **4/19**, when they replaced manager **Bryan Price** and pitching coach **Mack Jenkins**...bench coach **Jim Riggleman** became interim manager, Class AAA Louisville manager **Pat Kelly** (#60) was promoted to serve as interim bench coach, and Class AA Pensacola pitching coach **Danny Darwin** (#52) joined the Reds' Major League staff as interim pitching coach...**Price** went **279-387 (.419)** in his 5 seasons as manager, including **3-15 this year**.

QUERIES ABOUT SERIES: Beginning **6/19** the Reds went **8-4-1** in their last 13 completed series (23-18, .561, 2-0 vs Det, 4-0 vs Chc, 2-1 at Atl, 2-2 vs Mil, 2-1 vs CWS, 1-2 at Chc, 2-1 at Cle, 2-1 at StL, 0-3 vs Pit, 2-1 vs StL, 3-1 vs Phi, 0-2 at Det, 1-3 at Wsh)...the Reds' **2-1 series loss at Cubs** completed on **7/8** snapped their **5-series unbeaten streak**, their longest since a **6-series winning streak** from **7/15-8/4, 2016**...the Redlegs had the best record in the NL Central Division in **June** (15-11, .577).

M*A*S*H: OF **Scott Schebler** (sprained AC joint, right shoulder) on Friday was returned from a rehabilitation assignment after 7 apps for Louisville (6-23, .261, 1 2b, 1hr, 2rbi, 5bb, 3k, 3r)...made his first 6 starts as the Bats' **designated hitter** and played **LF** in his most recent appearance there, on **Wed at Toledo**...suffered the shoulder injury on **7/14 at StL**, when he ran into the outfield walk while making a catch...there is no timetable for his return to game action.

ALL-STAR INFIELD: The Reds' infield includes **3 National League All-Stars** and collectively leads the Major Leagues in **hits** (504), **batting average** (.284) and **on-base percentage** (.364)...**All-Star 1B Joey Votto** leads the National League in **on-base percentage** and ranks T2nd in **walks**...**All-Star 2B Scouter Gennett** ranks among the leaders in **hitting** (6th), **RBI** (11th), **multi-hit games** (36, T8th), **hits** (T3rd) and **total bases** (13th)...**All-Star 3B Eugenio Suárez** ranks among the NL leaders in **RBI** (2nd), **hitting** (8th), **HR** (T3rd), **total bases** (9th), **on-base percentage** (9th), **slugging percentage** (4th), **OPS** (3rd), **fewest AB per RBI** (4.2, 1st) and **fewest AB per HR** (13.9, 3rd)...**SS José Peraza** leads the National League in **most at bats per strikeout** (9.6) while ranking among the leaders in **hits** (T7th) and **stolen bases** (8th).

SLAMMING: The Reds and Red Sox are tied for the Major League lead with **9 grand slams**, tying Cin's **2002 franchise single-season record** and including a streak of **6 slams** over a **17-game span** from **6/13-7/1**...the **1996 Expos**, **1997 Braves** and **2006 Mets** are the only other teams in **Major League history** to produce at least **6 grand slams** over a **17-day span**...the **9 grand slams** tie the **2010 Yankees** for most ever prior to the **All-Star** break...the National League record for grand slams in a season is **12** (1997 Braves, 2000 Cardinals), while the Major League record is **14** (2000 Athletics, 2006 Indians)...the Reds hit 5 in **June**, a new club record for **grand slams** in a **calendar month**...the Reds' **9 grand slams** were hit by **Adam Duvall** (2), **Scouter Gennett**, **Eugenio Suárez**, **Joey Votto**, **Jesse Winker**, pitcher **Anthony DeSclafani**, **Michael Lorenzen** (pinch-hit) and **José Peraza**...on **6/23 vs Chi** (off **Brian Duensing**), **DeSclafani** became only the fourth pitcher in Reds history to hit a **grand slam** (**Bob Purkey** 1959, **Al Hollingsworth** 1936, **Ice Box Chamberlain** 1892)...**Lorenzen** on 6/30 off Mil's **Jacob Barnes** became the first pitcher to produce a pinch-hit slam since **Tommy Byrne** of the WSox on **5/16/1953** at **NYN**.

IN A PINCH: As a pinch hitter, RHP **Michael Lorenzen** is **3-for-8** (2hr, 5rbi) this season and **4-for-15** (3hr, 6rbi, 1bb, 4k, 1sh) in his career, with **home runs** on **4/6/17** off Phi's **Adam Morgan**, **6/24/18** off Chi's **Mike Montgomery** and **6/30/18** off Mil's **Jacob Barnes** (grand slam)...**Lorenzen** most recently hit in the 6-4 loss on **8/6**, pinch hit and struck out...5 times in his career came off the bench to homer, as a reliever or as a pinch hitter...all other active Major League pitchers combine for just 2 such games...4 times in his career, including 3 this season, entered games as a pinch hitter and remained in the game to pitch...over **5 straight plate apps** from **6/7-6/30**, he **singled**, **homered** (pinch hit), **walked**, **homered** and **homered** (pinch-hit grand slam)...became the first Major League pitcher to homer in **3 consecutive at bats** since Col's **Mike Hampton** in **2001**...his **3 HR** are the most by a Reds batter whose primary position is pitcher since **Micah Owings** had **3 homers** in 2009.

RED HOTS

Sal Romano at just **24 years old** is in his **second Major League season**...was born in **Syosset, NY** and graduated from **Southington (CT) High School**... tonight is making his 24th appearance and 22nd start of the season and his **40th Major League appearance**...will be the fourth career start and second of the season vs the **Mets** and his second career appearance at **Citi Field**...with **7 quality starts** is tied with **Tyler Mahle** for the staff lead...in the fourth inning of the 6-4 loss on **7/15 at StL**, the final game prior to the **All-Star break**, pitched out of the bullpen for the first time after **35 career starts**...pitched in relief of starter **Anthony DeSclafani**...during the first 3 games of the second half was available out of the bullpen but did not pitch, then started the Reds' sixth game after the **All-Star break**...made his second relief appearance on **7/28 vs Phi**.

Tomorrow's Pitcher - #55 Robert Stephenson, RHP

RED HOTS

Robert Stephenson doesn't turn **26 years old** until **February** but already is pitching in his third **Major League season**...tomorrow will make his season debut and his **20th Major League start**...will be his third career appearance and start vs **NYM** and his first career appearance at **Citi Field**...is filling the scheduled spot in the rotation vacated by **RHP Anthony DeSclafani**, who had to pitch **Sat at Wsh** following Fri night's weather postponement...**Stephenson** has spent the entire season at Class AAA Louisville, where he ranks among the International League's leaders in **wins** (11, T1st), **strikeouts** (135, 2nd) and **ERA** (2.87, 6th)... opponents are hitting just **.184**, lowest in the IL...in his **last 7 starts** for the Bats went **6-0, 1.23** (44ip, 6er)...on **7/30** was named **International League Pitcher of the Week** (2gs, 1-0, 1.29)...in the **3-0 win** on **7/24/g1 vs Buffalo** (7ip, 2h, 2bb, 3k, 87pch) became the first Bats righthander to throw a shutout since **RHP Homer Bailey** did it on **5/2/2009/g1**, also vs **Buffalo**.

- Accent mark on the "e" in José.
- Leads the National League in most plate apps per strikeout (9.6)...this season has produced 3 streaks of at least 40 plate apps without a strikeout (45pa from 7/11-7/25, 43pa from 4/15-4/25, 40pa from 5/22-6/2)...current streak is 2 plate apps.
- Has followed an 0-for-17 skid with 6 hits in his last 19 at bats (.316, 2 2b, 1hr, 4rbi).
- In his last 58 apps beginning 5/27 is hitting .318 (74-233, 13 2b, 3 3b, 4hr, 27rbi, 9sb, .365obp).
- From 5/26-6/24 reached base safely in 23 consecutive apps (.330ba, .392obp)...was the longest on-base streak of his career and the longest by a Reds batter this season.
- Leads the team in starts at 3 spots in the batting order, including leadoff (40gs), second (36gs) and seventh (22gs)...also has batted eighth (8gs)...beginning 7/15 made his last 18 starts batting leadoff (19-75, .253, .291obp).
- Produced 11 hits at StL in the series preceding the All-Star break (7/13-7/15), tying the club record for most hits over any 3-game span (Vada Pinson vs Mil/Phi, 8/12-8/14, 1959)...Peraza is the only player in Reds history with 11 hits in a 3-game series.

7 EUGENIO SUÁREZ, inf

Road Trip: 10-26 (.409), 1 2b, 2hr, 7rbi

- First name is pronounced Ay-you-hay-nee-oh...accent mark on the "a" in Suárez.
- Was voted by his peers to his first All-Star team...has a career-high 26 HR (tied), 87 RBI and .965 OPS.
- Hit safely in all 7 games of this road trip, the longest active hitting streak on the team.
- Is approaching 100 career doubles (96) and 100 career home runs (90).
- Despite missing 16 games in April with a fractured right thumb ranks second in the National League in RBI...Dave Parker in 1985 was the last Reds batter to lead the NL in RBI (125)...the list of Reds batters who led the NL in RBI is on page 397.
- Became only the third Reds batter since 2000 with at least 70 RBI (71) prior to the All-Star break, joining Ken Griffey Jr. in 2000 (72) and Brandon Phillips in 2013 (74).
- Beginning 7/23 has homered in 7 of his last 14 apps, including a streak of 5 straight from 7/23-7/27 that tied the club record for consecutive games with a HR...produced an RBI in 11 of his last 14 apps (16rbi).
- In his last 65 apps beginning 5/22 is hitting .317 (79-249, 10 2b, 1 3b, 19hr, 55rbi, .594slg, .399obp)...this stretch includes a pair of career-high 13-game hitting streaks (6/8-6/23, 6/27-7/10), the longest hitting streaks by any Reds batter this season.
- In his last 162 apps beginning 7/18/17 is hitting .291 with 29 doubles, 2 triples, 39 HR and 123 RBI (.547slg, .384obp, .931ops).
- From 4/9-4/25 was disabled with a fractured right thumb...suffered the injury on 4/8 at Pit, when he was hit by a Jameson Taillon pitch...missed 16 games (3-13).
- On 3/16 signed a 7-year contract extension through the 2024 season with a club option for 2025...following last season was eligible for arbitration for the first time while under team control through 2020.

12 PRESTON TUCKER, OF

Road Trip: 1gs at DH, 3gs in LF, 3-15, 1 2b, 1rbi

- Left Mon's game after he was hit on the left foot by a Noah Syndergaard pitch...x-rays were negative...he is day-to-day.
- On 7/30 was acquired from the Braves, along with RHP Lucas Sims and RHP Matt Wisler, in exchange for LF Adam Duval.
- For the Reds has made 5 apps and 4 starts (3gs in LF, 1gs at DH).
- This season made 62 apps for the Braves (.256, 10 2b, 4hr, 22rbi) and 15 apps at Class AAA Gwinnett (.232, 4 2b, 1hr, 5rbi)...for Atl, made all 25 starts in LF.
- Originally was selected by Hou in the seventh round of the 2012 first-year player draft...was traded to Atl in December 2017 in exchange for cash considerations.

19 JOEY VOTTO, 1b

Road Trip: 6-21 (.286), 2 2b, 1rbi, 4bb, 2hbp

- Beginning 6/27/15 has reached base safely in 23 consecutive apps vs the Mets (23-79, .291, .431obp), his longest active on-base streak vs any team...his career on-base percentage of .416 vs the Mets is the second-highest among active players with at least 200 plate apps (Andrew McCutchen, .438).
- Was voted by his peers to his sixth All-Star team, the most All-Star apps ever by a player born in Canada (Larry Walker, 5)...in the 10th inning, became the first player born in Canada to homer in the All-Star Game (off Tor's J.A. Happ).
- Leads the National League in on-base percentage and ranks T2nd in walks...is the only NL player and 1 of only 4 Major League players with an OBP of at least .400.
- In his last 9 apps is hitting .379 (11-29, 2 2b, 3rbi, .500obp).
- Has made 105 starts batting third in the order, 2 starts batting second (8/4 at Wsh, 8/6 at NYM) and 1 start batting cleanup (5/8 at Cubs).
- Reached base safely in 97 of the 111 apps in which he has a plate appearance...from 5/20-6/12 produced a season-high 20-game on-base streak.
- In the Reds' 113 games has made 112 apps and 108 starts...missed his 5 starts on 4/12 vs StL, 5/15 at SF, 5/24 vs Pit, 7/20 vs Pit and 8/5 at Wsh...missed his only full game on 4/12 vs StL, snapping at 202 games his streaks of consecutive games played and consecutive games started...prior to that 4/12 day off, had appeared in and started every Reds game since he was given the day off at StL on 9/2/16, when Ivan De Jesus Jr. played 1B...during his 202-games started streak played 1,733.1 of the Reds' 1,782.1 innings in the field (97%)...was the longest games started streak by a Reds player since Pete Rose started 370 consecutive games from 1973-1976.
- From 4/23-4/29 was the NL Player of the Week, his fifth career weekly award.

46 MASON WILLIAMS, of

Road Trip: 5gs in RF, 7-21 (.333), 2 2b, 1rbi

- Was promoted from Louisville on 7/26, when OF Jesse Winker was disabled with a season-ending right shoulder injury.
- Started 8 of the Reds' last 10 games (7gs in RF, 1gs in CF) and hit safely in 6 of the 8 starts (11-31, .355, 2 2b, 1hr, 4rbi, 4r).
- On 7/27 vs Phi made his second appearance for the Reds and first start, played RF and in the fourth inning hit a 3-run HR off Nick Pivetta that snapped the 2-2 tie...was his second career HR (6/12/15 at Bal, 2-run off Ubaldo Jiménez, his first career hit).
- On 7/26 vs Phi pinch hit in his Reds debut and first Major League appearance since 6/25/17 for NYY vs Tex...prior to this season, made all 25 career apps for NYY.
- In 87 apps for the Bats hit .280 (18 2b, 4 3b, 6hr, 30rbi, 5sb)...made all 83 of his starts in CF...after the Class AAA All-Star break hit safely in 12 of his 13 apps prior to his promotion (.362, 4 2b, 2 3b, 3rbi, .474obp, .532slg, 1.006ops).
