



# Tonight's Pitcher - #47 Sal Romano, RHP

## RED HOTS

**Sal Romano** at just **24 years old** is in his **second Major League season**...was born in **Syossett, NY** and graduated from **Southington (CT) High School**... tonight is making his 24th appearance and 22nd start of the season and his **40th Major League appearance**...will be the fourth career start and second of the season vs the **Mets** and his second career appearance at **Citi Field**...with **7 quality starts** is tied with **Tyler Mahle** for the staff lead...in the fourth inning of the 6-4 loss on **7/15 at StL**, the final game prior to the **All-Star break**, pitched out of the bullpen for the first time after **35 career starts**...pitched in relief of starter **Anthony DeSclafani**...during the first 3 games of the second half was available out of the bullpen but did not pitch, then started the Reds' sixth game after the **All-Star break**...made his second relief appearance on **7/28 vs Phi**.

# Tomorrow's Pitcher - #55 Robert Stephenson, RHP

## RED HOTS

**Robert Stephenson** doesn't turn **26 years old** until **February** but already is pitching in his third **Major League season**...tomorrow will make his season debut and his **20th Major League start**...will be his third career appearance and start vs **NYM** and his first career appearance at **Citi Field**...is filling the scheduled spot in the rotation vacated by **RHP Anthony DeSclafani**, who had to pitch **Sat at Wsh** following Fri night's weather postponement...**Stephenson** has spent the entire season at Class AAA Louisville, where he ranks among the International League's leaders in **wins** (11, T1st), **strikeouts** (135, 2nd) and **ERA** (2.87, 6th)... opponents are hitting just **.184**, lowest in the IL...in his **last 7 starts** for the Bats went **6-0, 1.23** (44ip, 6er)...on **7/30** was named **International League Pitcher of the Week** (2gs, 1-0, 1.29)...in the **3-0 win on 7/24/g1 vs Buffalo** (7ip, 2h, 2bb, 3k, 87p) became the first Bats righthander to throw a shutout since **RHP Homer Bailey** did it on **5/2/2009/g1**, also vs **Buffalo**.

# REDS BATTERS

## REDS BATTERS

**Road Trip: .237 (56-236), 5 HR, 23 runs (3.29 r/g)**

- Hit .260 prior to the All-Star break and .238 so far in the second half (133-560).
- Since the All-Star break are hitting .203 with RISP (25-123).
- Beginning 7/1, Anthony DeSclafani has all 3 hits by Reds pitchers...Reds pitchers otherwise are 0-for-47 in that span.

## 16 TUCKER BARNHART, c

**Road Trip: 5gs, 1-15 (.067), 1bb**

- The switch-hitter ranks 11th in the National League in hitting vs LHP (.317), second on the team to Eugenio Suárez (.380, 2nd in NL).
- Made the only 2 apps of his Major League career at 1B in the ninth inning of the 8-2 win on 7/14 at StL and in the last 2 innings of the 9-2 loss on 7/22 vs Pit.
- Is hitless in his last 13 AB with RISP.
- In the starting lineup batted second (32), fifth (3), sixth (23), seventh (20) and eighth (4)...from 5/22-7/8 made 31 consecutive starts batting second, his first career starts at that spot in the order...his 32 starts overall batting second are the most by a Reds catcher in that spot in the order since Smoky Burgess made 56 starts there in 1955...last batted second in the order on 7/20 vs Pit.
- In 2017 became only the third catcher in Reds history to win a Rawlings Gold Glove Award for defensive excellence, joining Johnny Edwards (1963, 1964) and 10-time winner Johnny Bench (1968-1977).

## 38 CURT CASALI, c

**Road Trip: 3g, 2gs, 3-9 (.333), 1 2b, 2rbi**

- His media guide bio is available on the home page at [www.redspressbox.com](http://www.redspressbox.com).
- Hit safely in each of his last 3 starts (4-10, .400, 2 2b, 3rbi, 3bb).
- Has made 15 starts, most recently in Sat's 7-1 win at Wsh (2-5).
- Started 2 of the 3 shutouts by Reds pitchers.
- In the ninth inning of the 12-1 loss on 7/20 vs Pit made his first career apps at a defensive position other than catcher...began the inning at 1B, then moved to 2B following Alex Blandino's season-ending knee injury...became the second Major League player this year to make his first career apps at 2 different positions in the same game...Det's Ronny Rodriguez, in his Major League debut, played 2B & 3B on 5/31 vs LAA and then on 7/10 at TB played 1B & SS.
- On 5/31 was acquired from the Rays for cash considerations...the next day was promoted to the 25-man roster, replacing C Tony Cruz (optioned to Louisville).
- On 6/2 at SD started in his first Major League appearance of the season...in the second inning homered off Eric Lauer to become the first player to homer in his first Reds plate appearance since Adam Duval on 8/31/15 at Cubs (off Justin Grimm).
- On 1/18 was signed by the Rangers to a minor league contract...on 3/21 was released...on 3/22 was signed by the Rays to a minor league contract...prior to his trade to the Reds spent the season at Class AAA Durham (.28g, .274, 5 2b, 4hr, 20rbi).

## 4 BRANDON DIXON, inf/of

**Road Trip: 2gs in RF, 1gs at 1B, 2-12, 2-run HR**

- Since his promotion on 7/21 is 2-for-19 (.105, 1hr, 2rbi) in 10 apps and 4 starts.
- Was recalled on 7/21, when Alex Blandino was disabled...in 49 apps for Louisville hit .346 (18 2b, 2 3b, 6hr, 23rbi, 9sb, 14gs at 1B, 12gs at 2B, 5gs at 3B, 11gs in LF, 2gs in RF).
- Made his 7 starts for the Reds at 1B (5/24 vs Pit, 8/5 at Wsh), 2B (6/7 vs Col, 7/23 vs StL) and RF (3gs, last on 8/4 at Wsh)...was credited with another start on 6/27 at Atl, when he played 1B in the bottom of the first following Joey Votto's ejection in the top of the inning.
- In the ninth inning on 6/16 at Pit, on his father's birthday, produced his only Major League home run (solo off Michael Feliz).
- Was promoted the first time on 5/22 and that night vs Pit pinch hit in his Major League debut (P9 off Jameson Taillon).
- In the 5-4 win on 5/24 vs Pit made his first start, played 1B and produced the first 3 hits of his Major League career (2 singles, 1 double).
- Began the season at Louisville and hit .326 in 37 apps there before he was promoted on 5/22...made 29 apps and 3 starts for the Reds before he returned to Louisville on 7/4...in his most recent stint with the Bats (7/4-7/20) hit .400 in 12 apps and in that span led the International League in runs (12) and OPS (1.114) while tying for the lead in hits (20).
- On 7/18 at Rochester became the sixth player in Louisville history to hit for the cycle (Scott Schebler 7/26/2016, Chris Dickerson 7/26/2007, Anderson Machado 5/18/2007, David Bell 8/11/1995, Stan Royer 7/19/1991).

## 27 PHILLIP ERVIN, of

**Road Trip: 4gs in LF, 7-17 (.412), 1 2b, 1 3b, 1hr, 4rbi**

- Since the All-Star break started 10 of the Reds' 17 games (5gs in RF, 1gs in CF, 4gs in LF) and hit safely in 11 of his 16 apps (16-40, .400, 4 2b, 1 3b, 1hr, 9rbi, .625slg, .435obp).
- On 7/20 was promoted from Louisville to replace disabled OF Scott Schebler.
- Is his third stint with the Reds this season...began the year with the Reds and made 16 apps and 8 starts before he was optioned to Louisville on 4/26...from 6/21-6/23 was on the roster for 3 days during Schebler's stint on the bereavement list (3g, 0-1).
- In 48 games overall for the Bats hit .289 (12 2b, 4 3b, 5hr, 38rbi, 10sb, 35gs in LF, 8gs in CF, 3gs in RF)...in his last 23 apps at Louisville hit .384 with 13 multi-hit games (5hr, 29rbi, .450obp, .663slg, 1.113 ops).

## 4 SCOOTER GENNETT, 2b

**Road Trip: 4-24 (.167), 1 2b, 2bb, 1r**

- Is a first-time All-Star.
- Ranks sixth in the National League in hitting.
- Since the All-Star break is hitting .211 (12-57, 3 2b, 1hr, 4rbi).
- In his last 162 apps beginning 7/30/17 is hitting .301 with 33 doubles, 1 3b, 26 HR and 105 RBI (.488slg, .351obp).
- In the first half hit .326 to become the first Reds batter to lead the NL in hitting at the All-Star break since George Foster in 1979...no Reds batter has finished a season leading the NL in batting average since Pete Rose hit .338 in 1973...the list of Reds batters who led the league in hitting is on media guide page 397.
- His team-high 115 hits were the most by a Reds batter prior to the All-Star break since Sean Casey had 118 hits in 1999.
- Was born in Cincinnati and lived in nearby Lebanon until he was 9 years old, when his family moved to Sarasota.

## 6 BILLY HAMILTON, cf

**Road Trip: 5-24 (.208), 1rbi, 2sb**

- With 24 steals ranks 3rd in the National League.
- In each of the last 4 seasons finished second in the league in stolen bases.
- Is tied for the National League lead with 10 outfield assists.
- Since his debut on 9/3/13 leads all Major League players in steals with 267, sixth on the Reds' all-time list since 1898...Reds Hall of Famer Eric Davis is fifth at 270.
- Has made 9 starts batting leadoff, 1 start batting eighth (4/2 vs Chi) and 86 starts batting ninth...his 86 starts batting ninth are the most by any player in the Major Leagues at that spot in the order...has made 75 straight starts batting ninth since he last led off on 4/26 vs Atl...since he started batting ninth regularly on 4/27 is hitting .241 overall (66-274, .305obp).

## 15 DILSON HERRERA, inf

**Road Trip: 2gs at 2B, 1g as PH, 1-8**

- Since he was promoted from Louisville on 7/6, in his Reds debut has made 17 apps, including 3 starts at 2B (7/10 at Cle, 7/31 at Det, 8/4 at Wsh)...are his first apps in the Major Leagues since 10/3/15 for NYM vs Wsh.
- In the 5-run seventh inning of the 9-1 win on 7/13 at StL produced a pinch-hit HR (3-run off Sam Tuivailala), his first Major League hit, HR and RBI since 9/27/15 for NYM at Cin...was his first career pinch-hit home run and tied his career high for RBI in a game (3).
- In 9 apps and 4 starts for the Reds during spring training hit .263 (1 3b, 2rbi)...on 3/13 cleared waivers and was outrighted off the roster.
- Began the season at Class A Daytona (.21g, .298, 3 2b, 2hr, 8rbi)...on 5/3 was promoted to Louisville (.50g, .297, 10 2b, 7hr, 27rbi)...at both stops combined to make 54 apps at 2B and 11 apps at 3B.

## 9 JOSÉ PERAZA, ss

**Road Trip: 6-32 (.188), 2 2b, 1hr, 4rbi**

- Accent mark on the "e" in José.
- Leads the National League in most plate apps per strikeout (9.6)...this season has produced 3 streaks of at least 40 plate apps without a strikeout (45pa from 7/11-7/25, 43pa from 4/15-4/25, 40pa from 5/22-6/2)...current streak is 2 plate apps.
- Has followed an 0-for-17 skid with 6 hits in his last 19 at bats (.316, 2 2b, 1hr, 4rbi).
- In his last 58 apps beginning 5/27 is hitting .318 (74-233, 13 2b, 3 3b, 4hr, 27rbi, 9sb, .365obp).
- From 5/26-6/24 reached base safely in 23 consecutive apps (.330ba, .392obp)...was the longest on-base streak of his career and the longest by a Reds batter this season.
- Leads the team in starts at 3 spots in the batting order, including leadoff (40gs), second (36gs) and seventh (22gs)...also has batted eighth (8gs)...beginning 7/15 made his last 18 starts batting leadoff (19-75, .253, .291obp).
- Produced 11 hits at StL in the series preceding the All-Star break (7/13-7/15), tying the club record for most hits over any 3-game span (Vada Pinson vs Mil/Phi, 8/12-8/14, 1959)...Peraza is the only player in Reds history with 11 hits in a 3-game series.

## 7 EUGENIO SUÁREZ, inf

**Road Trip: 10-26 (.409), 1 2b, 2hr, 7rbi**

- First name is pronounced Ay-you-hay-nee-oh...accent mark on the "a" in Suárez.
- Was voted by his peers to his first All-Star team...has a career-high 26 HR (tied), 87 RBI and .965 OPS.
- Hit safely in all 7 games of this road trip, the longest active hitting streak on the team.
- Is approaching 100 career doubles (96) and 100 career home runs (90).
- Despite missing 16 games in April with a fractured right thumb ranks second in the National League in RBI...Dave Parker in 1985 was the last Reds batter to lead the NL in RBI (125)...the list of Reds batters who led the NL in RBI is on page 397.
- Became only the third Reds batter since 2000 with at least 70 RBI (71) prior to the All-Star break, joining Ken Griffey Jr. in 2000 (72) and Brandon Phillips in 2013 (74).
- Beginning 7/23 has homered in 7 of his last 14 apps, including a streak of 5 straight from 7/23-7/27 that tied the club record for consecutive games with a HR...produced an RBI in 11 of his last 14 apps (16rbi).
- In his last 65 apps beginning 5/22 is hitting .317 (79-249, 10 2b, 1 3b, 19hr, 55rbi, .594slg, .399obp)...this stretch includes a pair of career-high 13-game hitting streaks (6/8-6/23, 6/27-7/10), the longest hitting streaks by any Reds batter this season.
- In his last 162 apps beginning 7/18/17 is hitting .291 with 29 doubles, 2 triples, 39 HR and 123 RBI (.547slg, .384obp, .931ops).
- From 4/9-4/25 was disabled with a fractured right thumb...suffered the injury on 4/8 at Pit, when he was hit by a Jameson Taillon pitch...missed 16 games (3-13).
- On 3/16 signed a 7-year contract extension through the 2024 season with a club option for 2025...following last season was eligible for arbitration for the first time while under team control through 2020.

## 12 PRESTON TUCKER, OF

**Road Trip: 1gs at DH, 3gs in LF, 3-15, 1 2b, 1rbi**

- Left Mon's game after he was hit on the left foot by a Noah Syndergaard pitch...x-rays were negative...he is day-to-day.
- On 7/30 was acquired from the Braves, along with RHP Lucas Sims and RHP Matt Wisler, in exchange for LF Adam Duval.
- For the Reds has made 5 apps and 4 starts (3gs in LF, 1gs at DH).
- This season made 62 apps for the Braves (.256, 10 2b, 4hr, 22rbi) and 15 apps at Class AAA Gwinnett (.232, 4 2b, 1hr, 5rbi)...for Atl, made all 25 starts in LF.
- Originally was selected by Hou in the seventh round of the 2012 first-year player draft...was traded to Atl in December 2017 in exchange for cash considerations.

## 19 JOEY VOTTO, 1b

**Road Trip: 6-21 (.286), 2 2b, 1rbi, 4bb, 2hbp**

- Beginning 6/27/15 has reached base safely in 23 consecutive apps vs the Mets (23-79, .291, .431obp), his longest active on-base streak vs any team...his career on-base percentage of .416 vs the Mets is the second-highest among active players with at least 200 plate apps (Andrew McCutchen, .438).
- Was voted by his peers to his sixth All-Star team, the most All-Star apps ever by a player born in Canada (Larry Walker, 5)...in the 10th inning, became the first player born in Canada to homer in the All-Star Game (off Tor's J.A. Happ).
- Leads the National League in on-base percentage and ranks T2nd in walks...is the only NL player and 1 of only 4 Major League players with an OBP of at least .400.
- In his last 9 apps is hitting .379 (11-29, 2 2b, 3rbi, .500obp).
- Has made 105 starts batting third in the order, 2 starts batting second (8/4 at Wsh, 8/6 at NYM) and 1 start batting cleanup (5/8 at Cubs).
- Reached base safely in 97 of the 111 apps in which he has a plate appearance...from 5/20-6/12 produced a season-high 20-game on-base streak.
- In the Reds' 113 games has made 112 apps and 108 starts...missed his 5 starts on 4/12 vs StL, 5/15 at SF, 5/24 vs Pit, 7/20 vs Pit and 8/5 at Wsh...missed his only full game on 4/12 vs StL, snapping at 202 games his streaks of consecutive games played and consecutive games started...prior to that 4/12 day off, had appeared in and started every Reds game since he was given the day off at StL on 9/2/16, when Ivan De Jesus Jr. played 1B...during his 202-games started streak played 1,733.1 of the Reds' 1,782.1 innings in the field (97%)...was the longest games started streak by a Reds player since Pete Rose started 370 consecutive games from 1973-1976.
- From 4/23-4/29 was the NL Player of the Week, his fifth career weekly award.

## 46 MASON WILLIAMS, of

**Road Trip: 5gs in RF, 7-21 (.333), 2 2b, 1rbi**

- Was promoted from Louisville on 7/26, when OF Jesse Winker was disabled with a season-ending right shoulder injury.
- Started 8 of the Reds' last 10 games (7gs in RF, 1gs in CF) and hit safely in 6 of the 8 starts (11-31, .355, 2 2b, 1hr, 4rbi, 4r).
- On 7/27 vs Phi made his second appearance for the Reds and first start, played RF and in the fourth inning hit a 3-run HR off Nick Pivetta that snapped the 2-2 tie...was his second career HR (6/12/15 at Bal, 2-run off Ubaldo Jiménez, his first career hit).
- On 7/26 vs Phi pinch hit in his Reds debut and first Major League appearance since 6/25/17 for NYY vs Tex...prior to this season, made all 25 career apps for NYY.
- In 87 apps for the Bats hit .280 (18 2b, 4 3b, 6hr, 30rbi, 5sb)...made all 83 of his starts in CF...after the Class AAA All-Star break hit safely in 12 of his 13 apps prior to his promotion (.362, 4 2b, 2 3b, 3rbi, .474obp, .532slg, 1.006ops).
