TWINS NOTES:

- **THE TWINS** pitching allowed two hits tonight, their fewest against the Yankees since June 26, 2016 at Yankee Stadium, when they also allowed two (Teixeira & Hicks).
- **JAKE ODORIZZI** Made his 30th start of the season tonight, he threw 7.1 innings (120 pitches), tying his career-high, done previously on June 3, 2016 at Target Field as a member of Tampa Bay (6.0 IP), did not allow any hits before allowing a double by Greg Bird in the eighth inning...he is now 5-4, 4.41 ERA (IP, ER) in 15 home starts this season.
- **JOE MAUER** (2-for-4) recorded two singles tonight, now with 2,103 hits...now has 35 multi-hit games on the season, second most on the team...he has multiple hits in five of his last 11 games.
- **JAKE CAVE** (1-for-3) recorded a double in the seventh...he has 14 doubles since June 10, tied for third most on the Twins.
- **EHIRE ADRIANZA** (1-for-3) recorded an RBI-double in the sixth inning...his 16th double of the season, he is now hitting .375 (9-for-24) with seven RBI in his last eight games.
- **MAX KEPLER** (2-for-3) recorded a single in the sixth inning and a double in the seventh inning...the double was his 29th of the season and this marked his 25th multi-hit game of the season.
- **WILLIAMS ASTUDILLO** (1-for-3) entered the game in the 3rd inning and recorded an RBI-single in the seventh inning. He now has nine RBI in 18 games with the Twins this season.
- **MITCH GARVER** was removed from tonight's game for precautionary reasons, initial tests do not indicate a concussion...he was hit in the face by a foul ball in the second inning.

YANKEES NOTES:

- **THE YANKEES** lose the series finale to the Twins to finish the nine-game road trip 4-5...fall to 42-32 on the road overall...have lost consecutive games against the Twins after winning nine straight over Minnesota...finish the season 23-10 against the AL Central...fall to 6-8 over their last 14 games...with the Red Sox win tonight, fall to 10.0 games behind Boston for first place in the AL East...12th series loss of the year...fall to 21-15 in one run games and 10-20 in games in which they don't hit a home run...fourth time this year with two or fewer hits...have on off day tomorrow before starting a three-game series with Toronto at home on Friday.
- **LUIS SEVERINO** suffered the loss after allowing one run on four hits with five strikeouts over 5.2 innings...fewest runs allowed in a start since shutting out Boston over 6.2 innings on July 1...retired 15 batters in a row after allowing a leadoff single to Joe Mauer in the first, then yielded three consecutive hits in the sixth inning...in 16 road starts, is now 8-5 with a 4.01 ERA (94.1 IP, 42 ER).
- **GREG BIRD** (1-for-3) doubled and drove in a run in the eighth inning, the first hit of the game for the Yankees...now 4-for-his-last-45.

-More -

- **GARY SANCHEZ** (0-for-1) stole second base in the fifth inning, his first stolen base since June 15, 2017 and only his fourth career steal.
- **MIGUEL ANDUJAR** (1-for-4) recorded a single in the fourth inning, extending his current hitting streak to five games, hitting .381 (8-for-17) during the streak.
