2018 SEASON

- Was 1 of 5 rookies on the Opening Day roster (RHP Tyler Mahle, RHP Jackson Stephens, RHP Zack Weiss, OF Jesse Winker)...was his first Opening Day roster.
- Overall had 3 stints on the Reds' roster, from Opening Day-4/25 (16g, 8gs), 6/21-6/23 (3g) and 7/20-remainder of the season (59g, 48gs).
- Made his 56 starts in LF (29gs), RF (24gs) and CF (3gs)...following 19 consecutive starts in LF (8/26-9/19), made his last 5 starts of the season in RF while Scott Schebler played LF...also made 1 pitching appearance (8/8 at NYM).
- Made 42 of his 56 starts after 7/30, when LF Adam Duvall was traded to the Braves.
- With 1 out in the eighth inning on 7/23 vs StL broke up the Cardinals' no-hitter with a pinch-hit single off reliever Jordan Hicks...in that game, Cardinals starter RHP Daniel Ponceleon made his Major League debut with 7.0 hitless innings (3bb, 3k).
- With 2 outs in the bottom of the eighth of the 8-0 loss on 8/8 at NYM made the first pitching appearance of his career, induced Devin Mesoraco to ground out and end the inning...was the third of 4 Reds position players to pitch in 2018 (Cliff Pennington, Alex Blandino, Brandon Dixon).
- In the 11th inning of the 2-1 win on 8/17 vs SF hit the first walkoff HR of his career (solo off Ray Black).
- In the 12-6 win on 9/7 win vs SD produced his first career 2-HR game (off Matt Strahm, Miguel Diaz), a career-high 4 runs and tied career highs with 3 hits and 4 RBI...was 1 of only 2 Reds batters to score 4 runs in a game in 2018 (José Peraza).

first career start (RF, 8/17 at Chi)...joined the Reds for the final time on 8/25, when OF Jesse Winker was disabled...for the Reds played LF (5g, 1gs), RF (5g, 3gs) and CF (9g, 7gs)...after Billy Hamilton suffered a fractured thumb on 9/6, started in the outfield in 3 of the Reds' 4 games (2gs in CF, 1gs in LF) until Jesse Winker came off the DL on 9/12...in the second inning of the 12-8 loss on 4/22 vs Cubs made his Major League debut as a pinch hitter and off Jake Arrieta hit into a fielder's choice...on 8/16 at Cubs entered the game in RF as part of a double switch and homered off Hector Rondon for his first Major League hit...became the first Reds batter to homer for his first career hit since Juan Encarnacion did it on 9/18/09 vs Fla off Leo Nunez... in the 13-10 win on 8/17 at Cubs made his first career start (RF) and hit a 2-run HR in the top of the seventh inning that snapped the 9-9 tie (3-4, 1 2b, 1hr, 4rbi, 1bb, 3r)...entered the season rated by *Baseball America* the 18th-best prospect in the organization.

2018 SEASON

- Spent most of the season at Class AAA Oklahoma City, where he produced 32 extra-base hits in just 79 games, but also made 39 apps during 3 stints with the National League champion Dodgers.
- Made his first Major League Opening Day roster and made 30 apps for the Dodgers before he was optioned to Oklahoma City on 5/13...made 2 more apps for LAD during a second stint from 6/15-6/19, then appeared in 7 additional games as a September callup.
- For LAD played primarily 3B (26g, 14gs) but also made 4 apps behind the plate and 2 apps/1 start at 1B.

2017: In his Major League debut made 20 apps during 3 stints with the National League champion Dodgers... was promoted on 7/28 and 2 days later vs SF made his first career appearance...in the bottom of the 11th inning of that 3-2 win at Dodger Stadium on 7/30, pinch hit and produced a game-ending, 2-run double off Albert Suárez...became the first player in franchise history to produce a walkoff hit in his first Major League plate appearance and the first player on any team to do it since Tor's Tomas Perez on 5/3/95...became the first Dodgers player to produce a walkoff win with his first career hit since pitcher Darren Dreifort's RBI-single on 5/27/94 vs Pit and the first Dodgers position player to do it since Greg Brock's RBI-single on 9/5/82 vs Pit...spent most of the season at Class AA Tulsa and Class AAA Oklahoma City, where he played C (51g), 3B (29g), 2B (6g), 1B (6g) and SS (2g)...produced his only Postseason RBI on a sacrifice fly in Game 3 of the National League Championship Series vs the Cubs.

2015: With 40 doubles at Class A Rancho Cucamonga and Class AA Tulsa ranked T9th among all minor league batters...following the season played for Glendale in the prestigious Arizona Fall League (.293/.323/.517, 7 2b, 2hr, 13rbi).

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS

- As Kansas City's top pick in the June 2014 first-year player draft was selected 17th overall...was scouted and signed by Chad Lee.
- When promoted in September 2014 became just the third Royals draft pick to debut in the same season he was selected, joining Bo Jackson (4th round, 1986) and Jeff Granger (1st round, 1993).
- Is the only player ever to appear in the NCAA College World Series and Major League Baseball's World Series in the same year...made 7 Postseason relief apps during the Royals' run to the 2014 American League championship, including 2 apps in the World Series vs the eventual champion Giants.

2018 SEASON

- Spent most of the season at Louisville but from 4/14-5/6 went 0-3, 7.40 in his 5 starts for the Reds.
- Began the season on the Reds' 10-day disabled list with a left biceps strain suffered during spring training...made a rehab start vs Columbus on 4/9, then came off the DL the day of his Reds season debut in a 6-1 loss on 4/14 vs StL.
- Was optioned to Louisville on 5/10, 2 days after the Reds acquired RHP Matt Harvey from the Mets in exchange for C Devin Mesoraco, and spent the rest of the minor league season with the Bats.
- For the Bats, made his first 8 apps as a starter and 19 of his last 20 apps in relief...went 2-6, 7.24 in his first 8 starts, then made 19 consecutive relief apps before he started again in his final appearance of the season.
- On 5/21 at Indianapolis became the first Bats pitcher to homer since Daryl Thompson on 6/11/2011.

2017: On 4/14 turned just 24 years old but pitched in his fourth Major League season after making his second consecutive Opening Day roster...made 4 starts around a pair of stints on the disabled list, from 4/16-6/25 with a strained left lat/trapezius and from 6/28 through the remainder of the season with a strained teres major...both stints included time on the 60-day DL (5/16-6/25, 7/2-10/1)...on 7/7 had season-ending surgery to repair a dislocated right shoulder, an injury suffered away from the field...prior to his first disabling made starts of 7.0, 2.+ and 1.0 inning...after 3 rehabilitation starts for Pensacola and Louisville came off the disabled list for a start 6/26 at Wsh...was injured in the fourth inning and 2 days later was disabled for the rest of the year...in his first start, a 2-0 win on 4/5 vs Phi in the Reds' second game of the season, allowed only 1 walk and Maikel Franco's first-inning single...became the first Reds pitcher to throw at least 7.0 shutout innings while while allowing no more than 1 hit in his first start of a season since Jerry Arrigo in 1967...the Reds went 3-1 in his 4 starts.

YOU COMPLETE ME

Brandon Finnegan's 1-0 loss on 5/23/16 at LAD was the first **complete game** by a Reds lefthander since **Lance Davis** beat the Tigers on 7/16/01 at **Cinergy Field**...Finnegan's **CG** snapped a streak in which **25 Reds lefthanders** made **339 regular-season starts** without finishing a game...in that 1-0 loss to the Dodgers, **Clayton Kershaw** also threw a complete game (9ip, 2h, 1bb, 7k).

2016: In his first full Major League season, tied RHP Dan Straily for the staff lead in starts and ranked second to Straily in wins, innings pitched and strikeouts...produced 15 quality starts, second on the staff to Straily's 20 quality starts...in the second half of the season averaged 9.17 strikeouts per 9 innings, the seventh-best ratio among qualifying National League pitchers...was second in the NL walks allowed and fourth in HR allowed...5 times was the victim of blown saves, the most on the staff...in his last 7 starts beginning 8/20 held opponents to a .199 batting average and posted a 1.93 ERA, dropping his season ERA to 3.98 from 4.54...became 1 of only 5 Reds pitchers to begin a season with 2 consecutive starts of at least 6.0 innings with 3 or fewer hits (Gary Nolan 1968, Dennys Reyes 1998, Steve Avery 1999, Jeff Austin 2003)...his career-high 12 strikeouts (6ip) on 8/26 at Ari were the most by a Reds pitcher since Raisel Iglesias had 13 strikeouts on 8/23/15, also vs the Diamondbacks...twice took no-hitters into the seventh inning...on 4/11 at Wrigley Field, in just his sixth career start didn't allow a hit until former Reds catcher David Ross singled with 2 outs in the seventh...on 8/20 vs LAD, didn't allow a hit until Adrian Gonzalez singled to lead off the seventh...started the 16-0 loss on 4/21 vs Cubs in which Jake Arrieta threw his second career no-hitter...his 1-0 loss on 5/23 at LAD was the first complete game by a Reds lefthander since Lance Davis beat the Tigers on 7/16/01 at Cinergy Field...Finnegan's CG snapped a streak in which 25 Reds lefthanders made 339 regular-season starts without finishing a game...in that 1-0 loss to the Dodgers, Clayton Kershaw also threw a complete game (9ip, 2h, 1bb, 7k)...on 8/14 vs STL, during one stretch retired a career-best 13 straight batters...from 7/29-8/9 produced a 13-inning scoreless streak, the longest of his career...recorded his first career hit on 4/6 vs Phi (single off Aaron Nola) and his first career RBI on 4/11 at Chi (RBI-single off Jon Lester).

2015: On 7/26 was acquired from the Royals, along with LHP John Lamb and LHP Cody Reed, in exchange for RHP Johnny Cueto...was 1 of 9 rookie pitchers who combined for 110 starts for the Reds, both single-season modern club records...the Reds' season-ending streak of 64 consecutive starts by rookies, beginning 7/29, is a modern Major League record...was promoted from Louisville on 9/8 as 1 of 6 roster additions...made his first 2 apps for the Reds in relief (2.2ip, 0h) before finishing the season with 4 straight starts (4.71era)...on 9/18 at Mil earned the 5-3 win in his first career start...became the ninth rookie pitcher to start for the Reds to establish the new single-season modern franchise record...earned his other win in his final appearance, a 3-1 victory on 10/3 at Pit in the season's 161st game.

- On 4/1 vs Wsh made his 600th career appearance and reached 2,000 at bats.
- In the 12-inning, 9-7 win on 4/24 vs Atl produced his third career 2-homer game (off Brandon McCarthy, Max Fried), his first career walkoff HR (2-run off Fried) and a successful suicide squeeze bunt...became the first Major League player to produce in a game a sac bunt and 2 HR, including a walkoff, since LAD's Hee-Seop Choi on 6/20/05 vs Min and the first Reds batter to do it since Reggie Sanders on 5/31/94 vs Montreal.
