## HERE'S THE STORY...

- ♦ The D-backs' 10-3 start is the best 13-game start in team history.
- ♦ The D-backs have won 10 consecutive games vs. Dodgers, tied for their second longest winning streak vs. a single opponent in franchise history (see chart below).
- ♦ With a win today or tomorrow, Arizona would win their fifth consecutive series vs. Los Angeles for the first time in team history.
- ♦ A win today or tomorrow would give the D-backs 5 consecutive series victories to open the season for the first time in franchise history... prior to this season, the D-backs had never won more than their first 2 series of a season in a row.
- ♦ Arizona has swept Los Angeles in 3 consecutive series and has only swept an opponent in 4 consecutive series 1 time (Reds, May 15, 2001-June 22, 2003).
- ♦ The D-backs are 28-10 (.737) vs. NL West opponents since Aug. 25 of last season.
- ♦ **Taijuan Walker** was 2-0 with a 1.64 ERA (2 ER in 11.0 IP) last season @ Dodger Stadium.
- ♦ **Paul Goldschmidt** is a career .305/.378 OBP/.560 SLG hitter with 28 home runs and 92 RBI in 115 career games vs. Dodgers, the most homers and RBI by an active player.

## YESTERDAY'S RECAP

- ♦ The D-backs won their 10th consecutive regular-season game vs. Dodgers, 8-7.
- ♦ **Daniel Descalso** went 2-for-4 with a 2-run home run (2) and 4 RBI... **Nick Ahmed** belted a solo home run (2) and **Jarrod Dyson** was 1-for-4 with a RBI double.
- ♦ **Zack Greinke** (1-1) earned the win, allowing 4 runs and striking out 7 in 6.1 innings... **Brad Boxberger** earned his fifth save of the year with a scoreless frame.

## LOVIN' LEFTIES

- ♦ The D-backs have won each of their 8 games when their opponent starts a left-handed pitcher since Sept. 26, 2017, with the opposing lefties posting a 8.82 ERA (34 ER in 34.2 IP).
- ♦ Since Aug. 12, 2017, Arizona is 19-3 when its opponent starts a left-handed pitcher.

## FOUR SCORE AND MANY WINS AGO

- ♦ Arizona has won 10 of its last 11 games when scoring 4 or more runs since Sept. 26, 2017, as well as 14 of its last 16 since Sept 13, and 24 of its last 29 since Aug. 22.

## THE 'JUAN TO WATCH

- ♦ **Taijuan Walker** was 2-0 with a 1.64 ERA (2 ER in 11.0 IP) last season @ Dodger Stadium.
- ♦ Has allowed 1 run or fewer in 5 of his last 6 road starts dating back to 2017, going 2-1 with a 1.95 ERA (7ER in 32.1 IP).
- ♦ Is 6-2 with a 2.63 ERA (21 ER in 72.0 IP) and a .230 average in his last 12 starts vs. NL West.

## GOLDSCHMIDT HAPPENS TO LA

- ♦ **Paul Goldschmidt** is a career .305/.378 OBP/.560 SLG hitter with 28 home runs and 92 RBI in 115 career games vs. Dodgers.

- ♦ Is a career .322 (67-for-208)/.392 OBP/.563 SLG hitter with 14 home runs and 38 RBI in 53 games @ Dodger Stadium...his career .955 OPS @ Chavez Ravine is second best in ballpark history, behind only Ryan Braun (.982) [min. 120 PA].

## TOUCHING ALL THE BASES

**ARCHIE BRADLEY BOBBLEHEAD:** The first 20,000 fans to Chase Field on April 21 vs. Padres will receive an Archie Bradley audio bobblehead, courtesy of Gila River Hotels and Casinos...the bobblehead will commemorate Bradley's triple in the 2017 National League Wild Card Game and will feature audio clips from D-backs radio broadcasters Greg Schulte and Tom Candiotti.

## ROAD WARRIORS

- ♦ Over their last 26 road games since Aug. 21, 2017, the D-backs are 18-8 (.692), the best record in the NL and third best in baseball behind the Indians (.783; 18-5) and Red Sox (.731; 19-7).
- ♦ In that time, Arizona's starting pitching has gone 12-6 with a 2.97 ERA (48 ER in 145.2 IP), 165 strikeouts and 56 walks.

## ALL ABOUT THAT BASE

- ♦ The D-backs are tied for third in the Majors with the Astros with 57 walks, trailing only the Nationals (67) and Yankees (61).
- ♦ **Paul Goldschmidt** is fifth in the NL with 11 walks, trailing Bryce Harper/WSH (16) and Freddie Freeman/ATL (16), Matt Carpenter/STL (14) and Cesar Hernandez/PHI (12).

## START ME UP

- ♦ D-backs starters have combined to go 7-1 with a 3.55 ERA (30 ER in 76.0 IP), the second-most wins in the NL behind the Pirates (8), and the sixth-best ERA, trailing the Dodgers (3.09), Nationals (3.23), Phillies (3.29), Mets (3.32) and Giants (3.42).
- ♦ Over the last 11 games, D-backs starting pitchers have gone 5-1 with a 3.03 ERA (22 ER in 65.1 IP), 76 strikeouts, 17 walks and a .214 opponents average, allowing 1 or fewer runs 6 times.

## BULLY-PEN

- ♦ D-backs relievers have posted a 2.18 ERA (11 ER in 45.1 IP) in 13 games, the sixth-best mark in the Majors behind the Braves (1.34), Mets (1.57), Cubs (2.01), Astros (2.05) and Padres (2.05).
- ♦ Arizona relief pitchers have held the opposition to a .196 average, the fifth-best mark in the Majors, behind of Chicago-NL (.178), Atlanta (.181), Cleveland (.187) and San Diego (.188).

## GLOVE WORK

- ♦ The D-backs have a .994 team fielding pct., the second best mark in Majors, trailing only the Rockies (.995).
- ♦ Arizona's 3 errors are tied for the fewest in baseball with the Rockies and Red Sox.

## EARLY BIRD GETS THE WORM

- ♦ Arizona has scored 16 runs in the first inning, the second most in the Majors behind Washington (18).
- ♦ The D-backs have 8 extra-base hits in the first, tied for third most in the Majors with the Rockies, Angels and Dodgers, behind the Braves (12) and Nationals (10).

## FROM THE TRAINING TABLE

- ♦ **Randall Delgado** has made 2 rehab appearances with Single-A Adv. Visalia (3 ER in 1.2 IP)...scheduled to pitch again tonight.
- ♦ **Jake Lamb** began playing catch over the weekend and has begun taking batting practice in the cage.
- ♦ **Steven Souza Jr.** went 2-for-7 with 2 home runs in an extended spring game last Monday @ Salt River Fields, but underwent an MRI following the game after feeling soreness...will resume baseball activities on Monday.

## TOMORROW'S STARTER: RHP ZACK GODLEY (2-0, 0.64)

- ♦ Earned the win in his last outing on April 9 @ Giants, tossing 7.0 shutout innings with 9 strikeouts.
- ♦ Is 2-1 with a 2.97 ERA (12 ER in 36.1 IP) in 9 career regular season games (5 starts) vs. Dodgers...earned the win after throwing 7.0 innings of 1 run baseball on April 3 @ Chase Field.

- ◆ Is in his second season with the D-backs after being acquired from the Mariners with INF Ketel Marte for INF Jean Segura, OF Mitch Haniger and LHP Zac Curtis on Nov. 23, 2016.
- ◆ Named a Top 20 prospect by *Baseball America* 3 times (No. 20 in 2012, 18 in '13 and 11 in '14).
- ◆ Tabbed the No. 1 prospect in the Mariners' system by *Baseball America* twice (2012, '14).
- ◆ Played in MLB All-Star Futures Game in 2012-13.
- ◆ 2012-13 Southern League midseason All-Star.
- ◆ Mariners first-round pick (No. 43) in 2010 draft.

## WHAT TO KNOW...

- ◆ Will make his fifth career start vs. Dodgers.
- ◆ Was 2-0 with a 1.64 ERA (2 ER in 11.0 IP) last season @ Dodger Stadium.
- ◆ Has allowed 1 run or fewer in 5 of his last 6 road starts dating back to 2017, going 2-1 with a 1.95 ERA (7ER in 32.1 IP).

## LAST START

- ◆ Did not factor in the decision, allowing 1 run on 3 hits in 6.0 innings on April 8 @ Cardinals.
- ◆ D-backs won, 4-1, as Torey Lovullo earned his 100th victory.

## VS. DODGERS

- ◆ Is 2-1 with a 4.91 ERA (14 ER in 25.2 IP) in 5 career starts vs. Dodgers.
- ◆ Has gone 2-2 with a 4.20 ERA (7ER in 15.0 IP in 3 starts @ Dodger Stadium, including a 2-0 mark with a 1.64 ERA in 2 starts in 2017.
- ◆ Received a no decision on April 2 @ Chase Field (3 ER in 5.0 IP).

## WEST COASTIN'

- ◆ Is 6-2 with a 2.63 ERA (21 ER in 72.0 IP) and a .230 average in his last 12 starts vs. NL West.
- ◆ 8 of his 9 wins in 2017 were vs. NL West opponents, tied with Stephen Strasburg, Gio Gonzalez and Max Scherzer for the fourth-most intradivisional wins in the NL, behind Clayton Kershaw (12), Robbie Ray (9) and Alex Wood (9).

## ON THE ROAD AGAIN...

- ◆ Allowed 1 run or fewer in 5 of his last 6 road starts dating back to 2017, going 2-1 with a 1.95 ERA (6 ER in 26.1 IP) during that span.
- ◆ Was sixth in the NL with a 2.92 road ERA in 2017.

## GOING DEEP

- ◆ In 13 starts when working 6.0+ innings in 2017, he was 6-1 with a 2.87 ERA (26 ER in 81.2 IP), a .217 opponent average (65-for-300) and 69 strikeouts.

- ◆ Born in Shreveport, La., but was raised in Yucaipa, Calif....attended Yucaipa High School.
- ◆ Basketball was his first love and made the high school varsity team as a sophomore...he was offered a contract to play professionally in the Philippines, but instead signed with the Mariners.
- ◆ Loves tattoos...he dedicates the art on his left arm to his family and his right arm to his interests... he wanted to get a tattoo of flames when he threw 100 mph, so when he hit 100 mph in 2011, he got it done.
- ◆ Avid Los Angeles Lakers basketball fan and a Seattle Seahawks football fan.

## JUST GIVE ME 3

- ◆ Is 6-1 since 2017 and 24-3 lifetime when receiving 3+ runs in support...D-backs overall are 10-2 during that span.

## 2017 REVIEW

- ◆ Had a career-best 3.49 ERA while his .247 opponent average matched his career low (also: 2016)...his 146 strikeouts were the second-most of his career (157 in 2015) as were his 157.1 innings (169.2 in 2015).
- ◆ Limited lefties to a .230 average (66-for-287).
- ◆ Among NL pitchers at the plate, he tied for second in average (.231) and tied for fourth in hits (12) and on-base percentage (.245).
- ◆ Was on the Paternity Leave List from July 20-23 after he and his wife welcomed their first child.

- ◆ With runners in scoring position last year, held opponents to a .199 average (30-for-151) with 35 strikeouts...over his final 8 starts, held opponents to a .093 average (4-for-43) with 17 strikeouts.

- ◆ 7 of his 9 games have been scoreless.
