Robinson Canó has hit safely in 9 of 12 games with 7 multi-hit contests on Jackie Robinson Day...overall on April 15 in his career he is batting .348 (16x46) with 11 runs scored, 2 doubles, 4 home run, 10 RBI and 4 walks.

Kyle Seager has hit safely in 5 of his last 6 games (4/7-c), including 4 multi-hit games...during this span, Seager is batting .440 (11x25) with 6 runs, 3 doubles, 3 home runs and 9 RBI.

TODAY'S TILT...the Mariners continue their second homestand of the season with the final of 3 games vs. the Oakland Athletics (2-0)...following this series, will face the Houston Astros for 4 games...the Mariners went 4-3 on a recently-completed 10-day, 7-game road trip to San Francisco (1-1), Minnesota (1-1) and Kansas City (2-1)...today's game will be televised on ROOT SPORTS NW and broadcast live on 710 ESPN Seattle and the Mariners Radio Network.

ODDS AND ENDS...Seattle has won 4 straight games and 5 of their last 6...team is 4-3 during the day and 4-1 at night...Seattle is 4-1 at Safeco Field and 4-3 on the road.

- **Left vs. Right** - the Mariners are 3-0 when facing a left-handed starter and 5-4 vs. right-handed starters.
- **Four Square** - Seattle is 7-1 when scoring 4 runs-or-more, but 1-3 when scoring 3-or-fewer runs.
- **Series Record** - Seattle has won or tied each of its first 5 series (3-0-2) to begin the season for the 2nd time in club history, trailing only the 2001 team which began the season with 9 consecutive series without a loss.
- **Green Light** - Dee Gordon leads the Majors with 7 stolen bases, ranking ahead of Tim Anderson-CWS and Trea Turner-WAS, who each have 6.
- **Walk This Way** - Robinson Canó has recorded at least 1 walk in each of his last 4 games (7 BB)...marks the 9th time in his career to walk in 4 straight games (last: 6/17-20/17) and trails only his career-high 5-game walk streak (3x: 6/22-27/13, 7/5-9-13 & 9/11-15/15).

HOW SWEEP IT IS...the Mariners are looking for their first sweep of the season and their first sweep vs. the Oakland Athletics since Sept. 1-3, 2017 at Safeco Field...overall, the Mariners have recorded 18 sweeps of the A's in a series of at least 3 games.

JACKIE ROBINSON DAY...on April 15, 1947, Jackie Robinson broke Baseball's color barrier when he made his historic MLB debut...throughout his Hall of Fame career, the Brooklyn Dodgers legend played an integral role in leading the movement for equal rights for all, and, in doing so, established a legacy that inspires future generations to this day...every year on April 15, our game honors Jackie's legacy by celebrating his life, values, and accomplishments...in proudly wearing "42", Baseball demonstrates a powerful, unified, tribute to the Jackie Robinson legacy...this year marks the 73rd anniversary of Jackie Robinson signing his first professional contract with the Brooklyn Dodgers organization in 1945, which was the first step toward his eventual breaking of the color barrier.

HE KNOWS JACK...Jack Roosevelt Robinson made his Major League debut April 15, 1947 (70 years ago today) as the Dodgers took on the Braves, breaking the color barrier and paving the way for African-Americans to take their place in Major League Baseball...Seattle has had two players named Robinson, one first name (Robinson Canó) and one last name (Trayvon Robinson)...the Mariners have had 5 Jack's: Jack Lazorko (1985), Jack Perconte (1984-85), Jack Hannahan (2009), Jack Wilson (2009-2011) and Jack Cust (2011), and no Roosevelt's.

#42...Seattle has had 18 players don the jersey #42 in club history, but no one has worn it in a game (other than Jackie Robinson Day) since 1999 when Butch Huskey appeared in 74 games... MLB officially retired #42 on April 15, 1997...the list of Mariners to wear #42: Tom Brown (1978), Dave Henderson (1981-86), John Christensen (1987), Omar Vizquel (1989), Vance Lovelace (1990), Kerry Woodson (1992), Ted Power (1993), Roger Salkeld (1993), Jim Mecir (1995), Mike Jackson (1996), Ken Griffey Jr. (1997/1g), Butch Huskey (1999)...4 players (Batista, Beltre, Rhodes, Betancourt) and manager John McLaren donned #42 in 2008, and the entire team has worn #42 on Jackie Robinson Day in each season since 2009.

GREEN AND GOLD...since 2015, the Mariners are 39-20 (.661) in 59 games vs. the Athletics, including winning 10 of their last 11 games vs. Oakland (7/9/17-c)...Seattle's .661 winning percentage vs. the Athletics is the best record by an American League team against a division opponent during this span: Seattle vs. Oakland (39-20/.661), Houston vs. Seattle (37-20/.649), Cleveland vs. Detroit (38-21/.644), New York-AL vs. Tampa Bay (37-22/.627) and Los Angeles-AL vs. Oakland (40-24/.625).

DON'T YOU KNOW...Robinson Canó has reached base safely in all 12 games this season, including 11 games with at least 1 hit...it is the longest streak of his career to reach base safely via a hit, walk or HBP to start a season (previous, 11 in 2017)...overall, he is batting .405 (15x37) with 12 runs scored, 4 doubles, 4 RBI, 2 HBP and 11 walks...among American League leaders, he ranks 1st in on-base percentage (.560), 2nd in average (.405), T3rd in walks (11) and 4th in OPS (1.074).

STREAKING...dating back to Sept. 26, 2017, Dee Gordon has hit safely in 18 consecutive games, batting .359 (28x78) with 15 runs scored, 2 doubles, 1 triple, 1 home run, 4 RBI, 1 HBP, 2 walks and 11 stolen bases...his 18-game hitting streak combined over the last 2 seasons is career-high (previous: 17-game hitting streak, Aug. 27-Sept. 14, 2017)...also dating back to Aug. 27, 2017, Gordon has hit safely in 41 of 45 games, including 22 multi-hit contests, batting .362 (71x196) with 34 runs scored, 4 doubles, 4 triples, 2 home runs, 12 RBI, 1 HBP, 4 walks and 21 stolen bases...during this stretch, Dee's .356 average ranks 1st in the Majors (min. 75 PA), ahead of Jose Martinez-STL (.362/50x138).

MILESTONE TRACKER...Kyle Seager is in his 8th season with Seattle after making his debut with the Mariners in 2011 and is quickly ascending the all-time offensive rankings in club history:

- Seager (217) passed Raúl Ibañez (216) for 5th-most doubles in franchise history.
- Seager (536) passed Bret Boone (535) for 8th-most RBI in franchise history.
- Seager (156) is tied with Raúl Ibañez (156) in home runs for 6th-most in club history.
- Seager (364) trails Raúl Ibañez (367) by 3 walks for 8th-most in club history.

AS YOU KNOW...Félix Hernández is 25-9 with a 2.60 ERA (90 ER, 311.1 IP) in 46 career starts vs. the Oakland Athletics in his career, including going 10-2 with a 2.50 ERA (31 ER, 111.2 IP) dating back to 2014...**AND AS YOU MAY KNOW**...among all active players vs. the A's, Félix ranks first in wins and innings pitched, while also ranking 2nd in ERA (2.60) and 3rd in opponent batting average (.229)...**BUT DID YOU KNOW?**... Félix is the only active pitcher with 25 win vs. a single opponent?...the next closest pitcher is Justin Verlander, who has 23 career wins vs. the Royals.

ABOUT FÉLIX...

- 32-year-old right-hander is making his 379th career start and his 47th career start vs. Oakland today.
• Is the only active pitcher in MLB who holds his current club's all-time record for career wins and career strikeouts...
• Signed a 7-year deal through the 2019 season on Feb. 13, 2013.
• In 2010 won the AL Cy Young, garnering 21 of 28 first-place votes...
• ML debut Aug. 4, 2005 at Detroit...
• At 19 years, 118 days old at debut, was the 3rd-youngest player to debut in Mariners history & 2nd-youngest pitcher...
• Born in Valencia, VZ...
• A.L. All-Star: 2009, 2011, 2012, 2013, 2014 (starter) & 2015, most by any Mariner pitcher...
• Threw the first Perfect Game in Mariners history, and 23rd in ML history...
• Is 32-17 with a 2.68 ERA (130 ER, 437.0 IP) in 66 career GS in March/April.

LAST OUTING...earned his second win of the season in an 8-3 Mariners victory in Kansas City...allowed 3 runs on 6 hits and 1 walk while striking out 3 in 5.2 innings...retired 9 of the first 10 batters he faced through 3.0 innings before allowing the leadoff batter to reach in the 4th inning, followed by a 2-run home run by Mike Moustakas...allowed 3 of the 5 batters he faced to reach in the 6th inning, including an RBI single by Moustakas.

ATHLETICS TALENT...in his last 10 starts vs. Oakland (May 10, 2015-c), Félix is 6-2 with a 2.47 ERA (17 ER, 62.0 IP)...in that same span, he is 3-1 with a 2.03 ERA (7 ER, 31.0 IP) in 5 starts (4 quality starts) against the Athletics at Safeco Field...his 2.60 career ERA vs. Oakland ranks second among qualifying active pitchers (Ervin Santana, 1.95 ERA/45 ER, 208.0 IP).

NOW THAT'S QUALITY...of Félix's 46 career starts against the Athletics, 36 are quality starts...since the Athletics moved to Oakland in 1968, no pitcher has recorded more quality starts vs. the Athletics than Hernández...he ranks ahead of Frank Tanana (34), Bert Blyleven (31), Tommy John (29), Ervin Santana (27) and Roger Clemens (27).

BRIGHT AND EARLY...since 2013, Félix is 23-13 with a 3.31 ERA (116 ER, 315.2 IP) with 292 strikeouts and 106 walks in 50 daytime starts...of those 50 starts, 32 have been quality starts...the Mariners are 31-19 in Félix's last 50 starts during the day...overall, he is 55-37 with a 3.12 ERA (292 ER, 841.1 IP) in 127 career daytime starts...he has fanned 776 batters while issuing 253 walks in those 127 career starts during the day...MLB defines a day game as any game that begins prior to 5:00 p.m. local time.

HOT STARTER...in 66 career starts in March/April, Félix has recorded a 2.68 ERA (140 ER, 437.0 IP), the lowest among active pitchers and the 14th-lowest ERA in March/April in ML history...owns the 2nd-most March/April wins among active pitchers, with 32, trailing only Bartolo Colon (40).

SPRING TRAINING RECAP...in 2 Cactus League starts, compiled a record of 1-0 with a 3.60 ERA (2 ER, 5.0 IP) with 5 strikeouts and 1 walk...Félix exited his first spring start after 1.1 innings on 2/26 at CHC after being hit by a line drive on right forearm (1.1,1,1,1,0,2)...allowed 1 R over 3.0 innings in MiL game on 3/19 at SD-AAA (3.0,3,1,1,0,5)...threw 3.2 innings on 3/24 vs. CHC, allowing a leadoff home run before retiring 10 of the last 14 batters he faced (3.2,4,1,1,1,3).

2017 SEASON RECAP...went 6-5 with a 4.36 ERA (42 ER, 86.2 IP) with 78 strikeouts and 26 walks in 16 starts...placed on the 10-day DL on April 26 with right shoulder inflammation...activated on June 23 after making three rehab starts (6/6, 6/11, 6/17 w/AAA Tacoma)...spent a second stint on the 10-day DL on Aug. 5 (retro to Aug. 2) with right shoulder bursitis...activated on Sept. 14.

IMPRESSIVE START...since 2005, has recorded 55 starts where he has thrown at least 6.0 innings and not allowed a run...that total ranks 2nd among starting pitchers behind only Clayton Kershaw (63)...the next closest AL pitcher (all starts in AL) is Verlander with 47...during this stretch Félix has recorded 247 quality starts, the 2nd-most in the Major Leagues, behind only Verlander (254).

HE'S OUR LEADER...became the Mariners all-time career leader in strikeouts on April 23, 2016 at the Angels (previous: Randy Johnson, 2,162)...became the club's all-time career leader in wins on May 9, 2016 vs. the Rays (previous: Jamie Moyer, 145)...is the only active pitcher in MLB who holds his current club's all-time record for career wins and strikeouts...Chicago-AL's James Shields holds both records for Tampa Bay, while Arizona's Jorge De La Rosa owns both records for Colorado.

VENEZUELAN PRIDE...Félix is one of two pitchers from Venezuela to win the Cy Young (also: Johan Santana, 2004 & 2006)...among pitchers born in Venezuela, Félix holds the all-time record for wins (162), starts (378), innings pitched (2,517.1) and strikeouts (2,350).

CAREER...has spent entire pro career with Seattle...6-time All-Star (2009, 2011-15), 2-time ERA champ (2010, 2014), 2010 AL Cy Young Award winner...is 162-115 with a 3.22 ERA (901 ER, 2517.1 IP) in 378 career starts with 25 CG, 11 ShO, and 1 perfect game...holds Mariners all-time career records for wins (162), starts (378), quality starts (247), innings pitched (2517.1) and strikeouts (2,350).

Félix is making his 47th career start against Oakland...is 25-9 with a 2.60 ERA (90 ER, 311.1 IP) with 288 strikeouts and 78 walks in 46 career starts vs. the Athletics...was 2-0 in 2 starts vs. Oakland in 2017, a 4-0 Mariners win on July 9, 2017 (6.0,2,0,0,3,8), and a 7-1 Mariners win on Sept. 25, 2017 (6.0,2,1,1,2,2,HR)...here is how Félix has fared against current A's batters:

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER: LHP James Paxton (0-2, 5.74)

29-year-old left-hander is scheduled to make his 4th start of the season tomorrow against the Astros...did not factor into the decision but tied a career high in strikeouts in his last start, a 4-2 Mariners win, on April 11 at KC (6.0,6,2,2,1,10)...L#2 in a 2-4 Mariners loss on April 5 at MIN (5.0,4,2,2,5,1,HR-1)...L#1 in his first start of the season, a 5-6 Mariners loss on March 31 vs. CLE (4.2,6,6,6,4,4, HR-2)...SPRING TRAINING: Went 1-0 with an 8.27 ERA (15 ER, 16.1 IP) with 17 strikeouts and 5 walks in 5 starts...2017: Went 12-5 with a 2.98 ERA (45 ER, 136.0 IP) with 156 strikeouts and 37 walks in 24 starts...named the 2017 Mariners Pitcher of the Year by the Seattle BBWAA...led club in wins (12) and strikeouts (156)...earned a career-high 12 wins...logged 136.0 IP, the most in his career (previous: 121.0 IP in 2016)... CAREER: 30-21 with a 3.37 ERA (164 ER, 437.2 IP) in 77 starts in parts of 6 seasons...selected by Seattle in the 4th round of the 2010 MLB First-Year Player Draft... vs. HOU: Is making his 9th career start against Houston...is 3-3 with a 3.38 ERA (17 ER, 45.1 IP) in 8 career starts...in 4 starts vs. the Astros in 2017, went 2-1 with a 1.69 ERA (4 ER, 21.1 IP), including consecutive starts of 6.0+ shutout innings on April 5, 2017 (6.0,2,0,0,1,5) and April 10, 2017 (7.0,4,0,0,2,8).
