Tonight at **Progressive Field** the Reds and Indians are continuing the 21st annual **Ohio Cup** series...previous winners of the season series' **Most Outstanding Player** award, as voted by Reds and Indians media, were Reds **OF Adam Dunn** (2008) and **C Ramon Hernandez** (2009), Indians **OF Shin-Soo Choo** (2010) and **SS Asdrubal Cabrera** (2011), Reds **2B Kristopher Negron** (2014), Indians **2B Jason Kipnis** (2015), Indians **CF Rajai Davis** (2016) and Indians **1B Carlos Santana** (2017)...no award was given following the 2012 or 2013 series.

TONIGHT'S GAME: Is **Game 2** (1-0) of a 3-game series vs **John Krepp's** first-place **Indians** and **Game 5** (2-2) of a 10-day, 9-game road trip heading into the **All-Star break** that included a **2-1 series loss** at Chi's **Wrigley Field** and features an upcoming weekend series at StL's **Busch Stadium** (off day, 3g)...the Redlegs will open up the championship season's second half on **Fri, 7/20** with a 10-game homestand vs the **Pirates** (3g), **Cardinals** (3g) and **Phillies** (4g).

SERIES NOTES: The Redlegs won or tied **12** of the first **20 Ohio Cup** season series, including **9** of the **last 12**, but lost **2** of the **last 3** season series (1-5, 0-4, 2-2)...the Indians have won **6** of the **last 8 games** at **Progressive Field** and **16** of the **last 19 games** here...beginning in **2002** and with a minimum of 40 games played, Cin's **.333 winning percentage at Progressive Field** (14-28) ties for its lowest at any current road ballpark in that span (17-34, **.333 at Phi**; 35-69, **.337 at StL**; 19-36, **.345 at Col**)...**Reds vs Indians** information is on media guide **Page 332**.

INTERLEAGUE NOTES: This season the Reds are **9-2 vs the American League** (2-1 at Min, 2-0 at KC, 2-0 vs Det, 2-1 vs Sox, 1-0 at Cle), including a **6-game winning streak vs the AL** from 4/29-7/2 that ranks as their **longest interleague winning streak**...their **2-1 series win** at Min's **Target Field** in April was their first interleague road series win of at least 3 games since a **3-0 series sweep** at Hou's **Minute Maid Park** in **September 2013**...between those series wins the Reds went **0-9 in interleague road series** of at least 3 games and **4-23 in games** in those series...the remaining interleague schedule includes home games vs the **Indians** (3g, 8/13-8/15) and **Royals** (2g, 9/25-9/26) and road games at Det's **Comerica Park** (2g, 8/1-8/2)...beginning in **1997** the Reds are **147-199 all-time vs the AL**, at **.425** the **second-lowest interleague winning percentage** of any Major League team (SD, 151-213, **.415**)...Cin hasn't produced a **winning record vs the American League** since **2013** (11-9)...in **5 seasons** since then are **32-59 vs AL** (.395)...**Reds vs AL opponents** information is on media guide **Page 332**.

APRIL 19: The Reds are **37-36** since 4/19, when they replaced manager **Bryan Price** and pitching coach **Mack Jenkins**...bench coach **Jim Riggleman** became interim manager, Class AAA Louisville manager **Pat Kelly** (#60) was promoted to serve as interim bench coach, and Class AA Pensacola pitching coach **Danny Darwin** (#52) joined the Reds' Major League staff as interim pitching coach...**Price** went **279-387 (.419)** in his 5 seasons as manager, including **3-15 this year**.

STREAKING: In their previous 3 series vs **first-place teams**, played consecutively from **6/21-7/1**, the Redlegs went **4-0 vs Cubs**, **2-1 at Atl** and **2-2 vs Mil**...the Reds' **2-1 series loss** at Cubs completed Sunday snapped their **5-series unbeaten streak** (2-0 vs Det, 4-0 vs Chc, 2-1 at Atl, 2-2 vs Mil, 2-1 vs Cws), their longest since a **6-series winning streak** from **7/15-8/4, 2016**...in **fifth place** since the **fourth day of the season**, the Reds have pulled to within **2.5 games** of the fourth-place **Pirates**...at **15-11** (.577), the Redlegs had the best record in the NL Central Division in **June**.

ALL-STAR INFIELD: The Reds' **infield** includes **3 National League All-Stars** and collectively leads the Major Leagues in **hits** (413), **batting average** (.288) and **on-base percentage** (.369)...**All-Star 1B Joey Votto** leads the National League in **on-base percentage** while ranking third in **walks**...**All-Star 2B Scooter Gennett** ranks second in the NL **hitting**, just .001 behind the leader...**All-Star 3B Eugenio Suárez** leads the National League in **RBI** while ranking second in **slugging percentage**, third in both **on-base percentage** and **hitting with RISP** (.382), sixth in **HR** and seventh in **hitting**...**SS José Peraza** in his last 36 apps beginning 5/27 is hitting **.317** with a **.378 on-base percentage**.

DOT...DOT...DOT: Reds prospects **RHP Hunter Greene** and **OF Taylor Trammell** are on the U.S. roster for the **SiriusXM All-Star Futures Game** (Sunday, 4:00et, MLB Network)...the Reds **trailed in 8** of their **last 13 victories**...Sun's 10-inning, 6-5 loss at Cubs snapped a streak in which the Reds had won the **final game of 9 straight series**.

REHABBING: **RHP Homer Bailey** is 5 apps into a **rehabilitation assignment** at Louisville (5g, 4gs, 1-2, 5.84, 24.2ip, 30h, 16er, 4bb, 15k, 4hr, 1hbp)...he has been disabled since **6/2** with **right knee inflammation**...made his most recent appearance **Sun vs Toledo**, in relief threw the sixth and seventh innings of the **Bats'** 6-1 win (2ip, 1h, 0r, 2bb, 1k, 42 pitches, 25 strikes)...was his first regular season relief appearance since he pitched out of the bullpen once on rehab for **Louisville** in **2010**.

SLAMMING: The Reds lead the Major Leagues with **9 grand slams**, tying the **2002 franchise single-season record** and including a streak of **6 slams** over a **17-game span** from 6/13-7/1...the **1996 Expos**, **1997 Braves** and **2006 Mets** are the only other teams in **Major League history** to produce at least **6 grand slams** over a **17-day span**...the **9 grand slams** tie the **2010 Yankees** for most ever prior to the **All-Star break**...the National League record for grand slams in a season is **12** (1997 Braves, 2000 Cardinals), while the Major League record is **14** (2000 Athletics, 2006 Indians)...the Reds hit **5 in June**, a new club record for **grand slams** in a **calendar month**...the Reds' **9 grand slams** were hit by **Adam Duval** (2), **Scooter Gennett**, **Eugenio Suárez**, **Joey Votto**, **Jesse Winker**, pitcher **Anthony DeSclafani**, **Michael Lorenzen** (pinch-hit) and **José Peraza**...on **6/23** vs **Chi** (off **Brian Duensing**), **DeSclafani** became only the fourth pitcher in Reds history to hit a **grand slam** (**Bob Purkey** 1959, **Al Hollingsworth** 1936, **Ice Box Chamberlain** 1892)...**Lorenzen** on 6/30 off Mil's **Jacob Barnes** became the first pitcher to produce a pinch-hit slam since **Tommy Byrne** of the **Sox** on **5/16/1953** at **NY**.

RUTHIAN: As a pinch hitter, **RHP Michael Lorenzen** is **3-for-6** (2hr, 5rbi) this season and **4-for-13** (3hr, 6rbi, 1bb, 4k, 1sh) in his career, with **home runs** on **4/6/17** off Phi's **Adam Morgan**, **6/24/18** off Chi's **Mike Montgomery** and **6/30/18** off Mil's **Jacob Barnes** (grand slam)...5 times in his career **Lorenzen** has come off the bench to homer, as a reliever or as a pinch hitter...all other active Major League pitchers combine for just 2 such games...over **5 consecutive plate apps** from **6/7-6/30**, he **singled**, **homered** (pinch hit), **walked**, **homered** and **homered** (pinch-hit grand slam)...he became the first Major League pitcher to homer in **3 consecutive at bats** since Col's **Mike Hampton** in **2001**...his **3 HR** are the most by a Reds batter whose primary position is pitcher since **Micah Owings** had **3 homers** in 2009...on 6/7 vs Col **Lorenzen** pinch hit and produced a 116.5-mile-per-hour single off **Tyler Anderson**, the hardest-hit ball in the Statcast era by any **Reds batter** or by any **Major League pitcher**...information courtesy **Elias Sports Bureau** and **Stats**.

RED HOTS

Sal Romano at just **24 years old** is in his **second Major League season**...tonight is making his 19th start of the season and his **35th Major League** appearance and start...will be his first career appearance vs the **Indians**, his fifth start of the season vs an **American League** team (**2-1, 2.55, 24.2ip, 7er**) and his **sixth career start vs the AL (2-2, 3.77, 28.2ip, 12er)**...from **6/12-6/24** produced a career-high **14.2-inning scoreless streak**...in the 10-inning, 5-1 win on **6/12 at KC** threw **8.0 innings**, tying his career high and the most by a Reds pitcher this season.

Tomorrow's Pitcher - #30 Tyler Mahle, RHP

RED HOTS

Tyler Mahle's last name rhymes with **RALLY**...at just **23 years old** is in his **second Major League season**...tomorrow will make his 19th start of the season and 23rd appearance and start of his **career**...will be his first career appearance vs the **Indians**, his fourth start of the season and career vs an AL team (**3-0, 1.45, 18.2ip, 3er**)...leads the staff with **7 wins** and **7 quality starts**...hasn't lost since **5/20**...in **8 starts** since then is **4-0, 2.62 (44.2ip, 13er)**...in **7 starts** beginning **6/1** is **4-0, 2.04 (39.2ip, 9er)** and in that span leads the National League while ranking fourth in the Major Leagues in **ERA (39.2p minimum)**...is the **first winning streak** of his career and ties **Anthony DeSclafani's** for the longest winning streak by a Reds pitcher this season...leads National League rookies in **wins, starts, innings pitched** and **strikeouts** while ranking sixth in **ERA**...ranks second in the Major Leagues in strikeouts among all pitchers **age 23 and younger** (Col's **German Márquez, 98**)...his career-high **12 strikeouts** in his **12-3 win on 6/30 vs Mil** were the most by a Reds pitcher since rookie **LHP Amir Garrett** had **12 strikeouts on 4/19/17 vs Bal** and the most by a Reds righthander since rookie **Raisel Iglesias** had **13 strikeouts on 8/23/15 vs Ari**...in the 12-inning, 9-7 win on **4/24 vs Atl**, took a 5-0 lead and a no-hitter into the seventh before **Freddie Freeman** led off the inning with a solo HR...was the victim of a **blown save** when the Braves tied it at 7-7 with 4 runs in the ninth inning off **Amir Garrett** and **Raisel Iglesias**, including a second HR by **Freeman**, but the Reds won it on **Scouter Gennett's** 2-run, walkoff HR off **Max Fried**...his third-inning single in the 5-0 loss on **4/8 at Pit** was the only Reds hit in **Jameson Taillon's** first career complete game...was the first **Reds pitcher** to record the team's only hit in a game hit since **Earl Yingling** did it on **9/19/1914 at Brooklyn Robins**...was 1 of 5 rookies on the **Opening Day roster (RHP Jackson Stephens, RHP Zack Weiss, OF Phillip Ervin, OF Jesse Winker)** and the only rookie to begin this season in the Reds' starting rotation...when he earned the 1-0 win in his season debut on 4/2 vs Cubs, at **23 years, 185 days** was the youngest pitcher in the Major Leagues with a victory.

- Was born in Cincinnati and lived in nearby Lebanon until he was 9 years old, when his family moved to Sarasota.

- Ranks fourth in the National League in most plate apps per strikeout (8.9)...last night struck out 3 times in a game for the second time this season and for only the third time in his career...twice this season made at least 40 plate apps without a strikeout, from 4/15-4/25 (43pa) and from 5/22-6/2 (40pa).
- Beginning 6/26 has reached base safely in 12 of his last 13 apps (17-53, .321, 1 2b, 3 3b, 3hr, 9rbi, 4sb, .623slg, .390obp, 1.013ops), including a streak of 12 straight games snapped by last night's 0-for-5.
- In his last 36 apps beginning 5/27 is hitting .317 (45-142, 5 2b, 3 3b, 3hr, 18rbi, 9sb, .378obp), raising his BA from .243.
- In the batting order hit first (21gs), second (34gs), seventh (22gs) and eighth (8gs).
- From 5/26-6/24 reached base safely in 23 consecutive apps (.330ba, .392obp)...was the longest on-base streak of his career, the longest by a Reds batter this season and when snapped the third-longest active streak in the Major Leagues.
- On 6/27 at Atl and 6/28 vs Mil homered in consecutive games for the first time in his career, and in the 8-2 win on 7/1 vs Mil produced his first career grand slam (off Aaron Wilkerson)...was the ninth grand slam by a Reds batter this season, tying the 2002 club record.

43 SCOTT SCHEBLER, of Last 26 Reds Games: .274 (23-84), 4hr, 12rbi

- Last night produced his second career-high 4-hit game (6/8/18 vs StL).
- In his last 32 apps beginning 5/30 is hitting .333, raising his season BA from .237 (41-123, 10 2b, 7hr, 18rbi, .585slg, .394obp).
- The lefthanded batter ranks seventh in the National League in hitting vs LHP (.342, 25-73, 3 2b, 2hr, 5rbi, .392obp, .466slg).
- Hit .320 through April (3hr, 11rbi), .200 in May (3hr, 9rbi), .330 in June (4hr, 11rbi, .560slg, .392obp) and .321 so far in July (9-28, 2hr, 5rbi).
- Has made 26 career starts batting leadoff, including 21 times this year (30-92, .326)...in his 26 career starts batting leadoff hit .325 (37-114), including .327 (36-110) in his 25 starts batting leadoff for the Reds...his career on-base percentage while batting first is .376.
- Has made a team-high 46 starts in RF, 14 starts in CF and 1 start at DH.
- From 4/9-4/19 missed 10 games (1-9) while on the 10-day disabled list with a right ulnar nerve contusion...suffered the injury in the third game of the season, when he was hit on the right elbow by a Sean Doolittle pitch.

7 EUGENIO SUÁREZ, inf Last 26 Reds Games: .344 (33-96), 7hr, 21rbi

- First name is pronounced Ay-yoo-hay-nee-oh...accent mark on the "a" in Suárez.
- Was voted by his peers to his first All-Star team.
- Despite missing 16 games in April with a fractured right thumb leads the National League lead in RBI...no Reds batter has led the NL in RBI since Dave Parker drove in 125 runs in 1985...the list of Reds batters who led the NL in RBI is on page 397.
- Among the National League leaders also ranks second in slugging percentage, third in on-base percentage and hitting with RISP (.382), sixth in HR and seventh in hitting.
- In his last 162 apps beginning 6/20/17 is hitting .280 with 26 doubles, 2 triples, 34 HR and 112 RBI (.510slg, .384obp, .894ops).
- Has a 12-game hitting streak (17-46, .370, 3 2b, 3hr, 10rbi, .630slg, .473obp), the longest active hitting streak in the Major Leagues...his career-high 13-game hitting streak from 6/8-6/23 was the longest by a Reds batter this season and when snapped the longest active streak in the Major Leagues.
- In his last 43 apps beginning 5/22 is hitting .341, raising his season BA from .274 (56-164, 6 2b, 1 3b, 12hr, 36rbi, .610slg, .438obp, 1.048ops).
- Sat and Sun homered in consecutive apps for the third time this season and for the 11th time in his career...has 3 HR in his last 6 apps (7rbi).
- From 4/9-4/25 was disabled with a fractured right thumb...suffered the injury on 4/8 at Pit, when he was hit by a Jameson Taillon pitch...missed 16 games (3-13).
- On 3/16 signed a 7-year contract extension through the 2024 season with a club option for 2025...following last season was eligible for arbitration for the first time while under team control through 2020.

19 JOEY VOTTO, 1b Last 26 Reds Games: .244 (22-90), 3hr, 18rbi

- Was voted by his peers to his sixth All-Star team, the most All-Star apps ever by a player born in Canada (Larry Walker, 5)...last night hit his 266th career HR, moving him past Matt Stairs into second place alone on the all-time list of HR by players born in Canada (Walker, 383).
- Leads the National League in on-base percentage while ranking third in walks...is trying to lead the NL in walks for the sixth time, in on-base percentage for the seventh time and in both categories in the same season for the fifth time.
- Reached base safely in 78 of his 90 apps, including an active streak of 6 games...his season-high 20-game on-base streak was snapped on 6/13 at KC (0-4).
- Scored at least 1 run in each of his last 6 apps (7r).
- Through his third plate appearance on 6/6 was hitting .311 (68-219), his highest batting average since he was 3-for-9 (.333) in the third game of the season.
- On 4/17 at Mil reached 1,000 walks in 1,446 apps, the fourth-fewest games to 1,000 walks in National League history...Pete Rose (1,210) is the only other player in Reds history with at least 1,000 walks...Miguel Cabrera and Albert Pujols are the only other active players in the Major Leagues with at least 1,600 hits and 1,000 walks.
- From 4/23-4/29 was the NL Player of the Week, his fifth career weekly award.

33 JESSE WINKER, of Last 26 Reds Games: .314 (22-70), 3hr, 19rbi

- Among the National League leaders ranks sixth in on-base percentage and seventh in hitting with RISP (.350)...leads NL rookies in walks while ranking second in hits, on-base percentage and multi-hit games (20).
- Has a 5-game hitting streak, including three 2-hit games (8-17, .471, 3 2b, 4rbi).
- In his last 18 apps beginning 6/20 is hitting .408 (20-49, 3 2b, 3hr, 18rbi, 13bb, .653slg, .532obp, 1.185ops).
- Hit .305 through April (0hr, 9rbi, .414obp), .174 in May (1hr, 3rbi), .308 in June (5hr, 20rbi, .432obp) and .450 so far in July (9-20, 5rbi, .600slg, .552obp, 1.152ops)...among National League leaders in June ranked third in on-base percentage, T9th in RBI and 20th in hitting.
- Has made 37 starts in RF, 26 starts in LF and 2 starts at DH...leads the team with 35 starts batting leadoff...on 4/12 vs StL, with Votto off, made his only career start batting third in the order.
- Made his first Opening Day roster...was 1 of 5 rookies on the Opening Day roster (RHP Tyler Mahle, RHP Jackson Stephens, RHP Zack Weiss, OF Phillip Ervin).
- Was the Reds' Opening Day starter in LF...batted leadoff.
