**RAY MATTER**—The Rays have won consecutive games following a 3-game losing streak, and today are attempting to win a third straight game for the first time since July 7-11 (5-0)...through 108 games, the Rays are 55-53 for a second consecutive year, and they are two games shy of matching their high-water mark of the season (48-44).

- + While the Rays are 8 GB of the Mariners and A's for the AL's second Wild Card, they have gained ground in each of the last two days and this is the closest they've been since the end of play on June 5 (7.5 GB)...they were 12 GB at 43-44 at the end of July 6.
- + The Rays are 6-6 since the All-Star break and 7-9 in their last 6 games, but they are 21-13 in 34 games since June 22 and 51-40 in 91 games since April 18 following a 4-13 start to the season.

**SEEKING SWEEP**—Today the Rays are attempting to sweep the Angels for the seventh time in franchise history...it would be their first since May 6-8, 2016 at Angel Stadium and first at home since April 24-26, 2012...this is actually the third consecutive time the Rays have an opportunity to sweep the Angels, but they lost the series finale on July 16, 2017 at LAA and May 20 at LAA...the Rays have swept seven series this season—five 3-game series and two 2-game series...most recently, they swept the Tigers, July 9-11 at home...their seven sweeps are already their most since 2013 (12)...since June 11, the Rays have swept four of seven home series.

**DOMESTIC SWEET DOME**—This is the first series of a 9-game homestand against the Angels (2-0), White Sox and Orioles...since June 11, the Rays are 19-4 (.826) at home, best winning pct. in the majors, ahead of the Red Sox (.789)...this is their best 23-game stretch at home since Sep 24, 2011—May 17, 2012 (19-4), and within the same season since May 29—July 11, 2009 (19-4)...they are 29-13 (.690) at home since April 18 after a 2-7 start.

- + The Rays have won via walk-off six times this season, tied for 2nd in the AL behind the Blue Jays (7) and their most since a club-record 13 walk-off wins in 2013...they have hit three walk-off home runs, more than the previous four seasons (2014-17) combined (2).
- + Including this series, the Rays are 7-1 in the last eight home series.

**RAYS vs. ANGELS**—The Rays are 5-1 against the Angels this season (2-0 at home, 3-1 on the road), clinching the season series for a third consecutive year while improving to 3-0-1 in the last four season series...they are 79-98 all-time against them (39-47 at home, 40-51 on the road), including 47-35 in the Rays era...the Rays are averaging 6.5 runs per game against them this season, incl. 4 games with 7+ runs...since the start of 2010, the visiting team has dominated the matchup of these two clubs: the Angels have gone 17-13 at Tropicana Field, including 7-2-1 in series play, while the Rays are 26-11 at Angel Stadium and have gone 9-1-1 in series play.

**PITCHING PLANS**—Today's game will be started by **Hunter Wood**, the 26th time the Rays will use an opener and their fourth time using Wood in that role...since the debut of the opener on May 19 at LAA, Rays pitching ranks 5th in the majors and 4th in the AL with a 3.56 ERA—before that, their 4.43 ERA ranked 22nd in the majors and 9th in the AL.

- + The Rays announced in spring training a season-opening rotation of Archer (traded), Snell (DL), Eovaldi (traded) and Faria, but they have used other starters in 51 of their 108 games (47.2 pct.).
- + The Rays have used an opener in 25 games, and they are 12-13 in these games...the openers have pitched to a 4.32 ERA (33.1-IP, 16-ER), including a 1.78 ERA (25.1-IP, 5-ER) in the last 17 games...the team has a 3.93 ERA (222.1-IP, 97-ER) in games started by openers.
- + The Rays have employed a bullpen day in an additional 20 games this season, and are 10-10 when doing so...they have used a traditional starter in 63 games, and have gone 33-30 in those games...for clarification, an opener is used to face 3-9 batters, depending on matchups, while a "bullpen day" starter tends to pitch deeper but generally no more than two times through the order.

**PITCHING POINTS**—Last night **Tyler Glasnow** became the 15th different starting pitcher used by the Rays this season, most in the majors, ahead of the Angels/Athletics/Mets (12), and a club record, passing 2003 (14) and 2004 (14)...he became the 31st pitcher used by the club, 2nd-most in the majors behind the Cubs (32), and a club record, passing 2017 (30).

- + Rays starters have gone 3 IP or fewer 39 times this season...since

Baseball Reference data is available (1908), the only team with more starts of that type was the 1949 St. Louis Browns (40)...Rays starters have gone 2 IP or fewer 30 times, most by a team since BB-Ref data is available (1908), ahead of the 1977 Mariners (27).

- + No Rays starter has recorded a win since **Nathan Eovaldi** on July 8 at NYM...Rays starters are 0-6 in 19 games since then...the bullpen's 55 decisions are the most in the majors (Dodgers, 46).

**NOT THE RAYS WAY**—Last night the Rays allowed 2 runs, matching their fewest in a game since the All-Star break (also July 25 vs. NYY), while their 6 hits allowed were their fewest since July 10 vs. DET (5)...Rays pitching has a 6.14 ERA (139.1-IP, 106-R/95-ER) in the last 16 games since July 12 at MIN, highest in the majors over that span (Rangers, 6.07)...the Rays have yielded 6 runs or more in nine of these 16 games.

- + Rays pitching has allowed at least 4 runs in a frame 12 times in 22 games since July 6, compared to once in the previous 26 games.

**ABOUT THE OFFENSE**—The Rays have scored 17 runs this series and 22 runs in the last 3 games since Sun at BAL...the Rays offense has averaged 5.95 runs over the last 20 games since July 8, but the club is just 10-10 over that 20-game stretch...they have scored 4 runs or more in 15 of those 20 games, 5 runs or more in 13 games and 8 runs or more in 5 games.

- + Since July 13, the Rays have gone 5-5 (.500) when scoring 5 runs or more...before this, they were 31-1 (.969) when scoring 5+ runs.

**FOUNTAIN OF YOUTH**—Last night the Rays got home runs from 22-year-old **Willy Adames** and 22-year-old **Jake Bauers**...it was the fourth time in franchise history the Rays had multiple players homer in the same game before their 23rd birthday, following **Elijah Dukes** and **Melvin Upton Jr.** on May 10, 2007 at BAL, Dukes and Upton on April 29, 2007 at OAK and Dukes and **Delmon Young** on April 6, 2007 vs. TOR...the only other team to do that this season is the Braves, with home runs from **Ronald Acuña Jr.** and **Ozzie Albies** on May 3 at NYM and April 26 at CIN...Adames and Bauers are two of a club-record 19 rookies used by the Rays this season, tied with the Marlins for most in the majors.

- + Rays rookies have combined for 418 games, most in the majors ahead of the Phillies (405)...the Rays have used seven different rookies as the starting pitcher, totaling 40 starts, 2nd-most in the majors behind the Marlins (47)...today will be the eighth time in the last 10 games the Rays will use a rookie starting pitcher.
- + 17 players on the active roster have less than 2 years of service time, including 10 players with less than 1 year of service time...eleven of the 12 pitchers on the active roster have less than 2 years of service time, with **Sergio Romo** (10.052) the only exception.
- + The average age of the Rays active roster is 26 years, 10 months.

**SPLASH DOWN**—Last night LAA **Kole Calhoun** sent the eighth pitch of the game into the Rays Touch Tank...it was the seventh home run to land in the Rays Touch Tank, sixth in the regular season, since it opened in 2006, and the first since MIN **Robbie Grossman** on Sep 5, 2017...the full list is on Page 122 of the Rays Media Guide...it was also the ninth time this season the Rays allowed a homer on an 0-2 pitch, tied with the Rangers for most in the AL and tied for 2nd in the majors behind the Braves (10).

**NUMBER CRUNCHING**—Last night **Tommy Pham** became the first player to ever play for the Cardinals and Rays in the same season...when he makes his Diamondbacks debut, **Jake Diekmann** will become the first player to play for the Rangers and D-backs in the same season...this will leave only two combinations out of a possible 435 within current franchises that have never occurred: Marlins-Indians and Marlins-Brewers.

**BIG WEEKEND AHEAD**—During this weekend's series against the White Sox, the Rays will hold a 10-year celebration of the 2008 American League Championship club...more than 20 alumni are confirmed to attend...at 2:00 p.m. tomorrow, the Rays will hold a press conference at the 20th Anniversary Exhibit, adjacent to the Ted Williams Museum, including **Jason Bartlett**, **Aki Iwamura**, **Scott Kazmir**, **James Shields** and **B.J. **LAST OUTING**—On Sun at BAL, allowed a 4th-inning solo homer to **Austin Wynns**, his first batter faced, and a RBI single to **Jace Peterson** in the 5th inning...threw a career high 45 pitches, and allowed more than 1 run for the first time in his career... also tied career highs yielding 4 hits, 1 BB and 1 HR, and with 4 SO...was one of four pitchers used by the team in the 11-5 loss, each of them allowing a home run.

**THIRD STINT**—Will be making the fourth start of his career, following July 11 vs. DET, July 23 vs. NYY and July 26 at BAL...is 0-0 with a 1.93 ERA (4.2-IP, 1-ER) in his 3 starts...has a 3.31 ERA (16.1-IP, 6-ER) and .230 opp avg. (14-for-61) in 10 apps (3 starts) since his June 30 recall, his first extended action in the majors...all 3 HR have been solo (**JT Riddle**, **Cameron Maybin**, **Austin Wynns**)...was in the majors earlier this season from April 17-24, pitching once, and a 1-day stint on May 14 (did not pitch).

- + Has gone at least 2 IP in five of his 11 apps (3 starts) this season, and recorded 4 outs or more in 7 apps...his starts have been 1 IP, 2 IP and 1.2 IP.

**MINOR MATTERS**—Went 2-2 with a 3.00 ERA (42-IP, 14-ER) and 63 SO in 24 apps (2 starts) with Triple-A Durham...went at least 2 IP in 14 of his 24 outings there, and his season high was 3 IP (twice, last June 7) and 49 pitches (May 6).

- + After his last option, pitched to a 1.75 ERA (25.2-IP, 5-ER) in 14 apps (1 start).
- + Has spent parts of the last two seasons with the Bulls, and is 5-3 with a 3.78 ERA (95.1-IP, 40-ER) and 110 SO in his career at the Triple-A level.
- + Has made 73 career starts in the minor leagues.

**MIX & MATCH**—Is one of 15 different starting pitchers used by the Rays this season, most in the majors ahead of the Angels (12), Athletics (12) and Mets (12)...this is a club record for an entire season, passing 2004 (14) and 2003 (14)...the Rays used eight starting pitchers all of last season—in fact, the 15 starters this season are more than the team's total from the previous three seasons combined (14, 2015-17).

- + This will be the 41st time the Rays start a rookie pitcher, the most in the AL and 2nd-most in the majors behind the Marlins (47).
- + The Rays have used 31 different pitchers, 2nd-most in the majors behind the Cubs (32)...this is a club record for an entire season, passing 2017 (30).

**LAST SEASON**—Spent all of last season in the minors aside from a one-day stint on May 30 at TEX...made his major league debut that night, retiring **No-mar Mazara** for the final out of the 8th inn. ...received the news of his call up with roughly an hour to catch the flight...the family missed baggage check-in at the Montgomery airport by two minutes and had to drive to Birmingham for an alternate flight...he arrived at Globe Life Park in the 2nd inning.

- + He and **José Alvarado** both bypassed Triple-A for their major league debuts, the first Rays to do that since **Scott Kazmir** in 2004.
- + Optioned back to Montgomery after his debut...made 12 starts with the Biscuits and was promoted to Triple-A Durham on June 16...combined for a career-high 115 SO...made 6 starts with the Bulls before making his final 13 apps of the season out of the bullpen.

- + Selected by Astros Manager **A.J. Hinch** to join the AL coaching staff for the All-Star Game for a second consecutive season.
- + Is in his fourth season as Rays manager...at age 40, is the majors' youngest active skipper—5 months younger than **SD Andy Green**.
- + His last ejection was July 18, 2017 at OAK, his seventh ejection as Rays manager...his 7 ejections are tied for 4th in franchise history.
- + Is the sixth Tampa-born manager in major league history, and second

to manage the Rays...that list includes Hall of Famers **Al Lopez** and **Tony La Russa**, **Lou Piniella**, **Dave Miley** and **John Hart**.

- + Played 12 professional seasons as a catcher, incl. parts of eight seasons in the majors (2002-10) and two years (2005-06) in the Rays org.
- + Played in the 1989 Little League World Series (Tampa Northside LL), 1999 College World Series (Florida State) and earned World Series rings in 2007 (Red Sox) and 2009 (Yankees).
