### TODAY IN YANKEES HISTORY

**April 5, 2005:** Derek Jeter hits his only career regular season "walk-off" HR, breaking a 3-3 tie vs. Boston with a ninth-inning solo shot off Keith Foulke.

**April 5, 1995:** The Yankees acquire closer John Wetteland from Montreal. Wetteland would go on to become the 1996 World Series MVP, recording a save in each of the Yankees' four wins.

**April 5, 1913:** The Yankees lose to the Brooklyn Dodgers, 3-2 in an exhibition game at Ebbets Field, marking the stadium's first contest.

### TOMORROW IN YANKEES HISTORY

**April 6, 1982:** A freak snowstorm blankets the Northeast, forcing the cancellation of the season opener vs. Texas at Yankee Stadium and postponement of the Yankees' first four scheduled games. They finally open 1982 with a doubleheader vs. the White Sox on 4/11.

**April 6, 1974:** The Yankees play their first home game at Shea Stadium as Yankee Stadium begins a two-year remodeling effort.

**April 6, 1973:** At Fenway Park in Boston, the Yankees' Ron Blomberg becomes the Major League's first designated hitter. Batting in the top of the first inning, he walks with the bases loaded off Luis Tiant. He goes 1-for-3 with 1 RBI as the Yankees lose to the Red Sox, 15-5.

**AT A GLANCE:** The Yankees continue their six-game homestand with the opener of a four-game series with the Orioles tonight (through Sun.)...completed a two-game sweep over the Rays earlier this week...following an off day on Mon., will begin a six-game road trip: 3G at Boston (4/10-12) and 3G at Detroit (4/13-15).

- ▶ Are scheduled to play their first 13G vs. the AL East.
- ▶ Are 2-0 thus far on a stretch of 16 of 22G at home (4/3-26).
- ▶ Seven of the Yankees' first 10G are day games (3-2).
- ▶ Have two scheduled off days (4/9, 18) before starting a season-long stretch of games on 18 straight days (4/19-5/6).

**YESTERDAY'S NEWS:** The Yankees completed a two-game sweep with a 7-2 win on Wed. vs. Tampa Bay...**RHP Luis Severino** (7.1IP, 5H, 2ER, 1BB, 7K, 0HR) earned his second win in the longest start by a Yankee this season...**LF Giancarlo Stanton** (1-for-4) hit his first HR as a Yankee in Yankee Stadium, a two-run shot in the first...**DH Gary Sánchez** (1-for-4, 2RBI) hit his first homer of the season in the third, snapping an 0-for-17 drought...**RF Aaron Judge** (1-for-3, 2R, 1BB) also hit his first homer of the season with a two-run HR in the fourth inning...**LHP Aroldis Chapman** (1.0IP, 1K) tossed a perfect ninth inning.

- ▶ Was the first time that Judge, Stanton and Sánchez all homered in the same game together.
- ▶ Marked their first comeback win of the year (trailed, 1-0).
- ▶ Have won 11 consecutive home series vs. the Rays, their longest such streak ever vs. Tampa Bay and the longest streak over any opponent at the current Yankee Stadium.

**SEVY SEASON:** **RHP Luis Severino** won his second consecutive start to open the 2018 season on Wed. vs. Tampa Bay by yielding 2ER over 7.1IP (5H, 1BB, 7K)...is the first Yankees starter to record an out in the eighth inning of a start within the team's first 6G since Andy Pettitte tossed 8.0IP on 4/4/13 vs. Boston.

- ▶ Is one of three Major League pitchers with multiple wins in 2018, along with Arizona starter Patrick Corbin and Oakland reliever Justin Hatcher.
- ▶ Is the first Yankees starter to win his first two outings of a season since Andy Pettitte reeled off three straight wins to begin 2013.

**FOR STARTERS:** **Yankees starters** rank second in the Majors with a 1.64 ERA (33.0IP, 6ER), trailing only Boston (1.03)...the 6ER are the rotation's fewest across a stretch of six starts since allowing 6ER over seven starts from 6/7-13 last year.

- ▶ Have allowed 2R-or-fewer in all six starts this season, the second Yankees rotation since at least 1908 to accomplish the feat over the first six starts of a season (also 1911)...are one of 14 MLB staffs to turn the trick in that span, including Boston this year.
- ▶ Have held opponents to a .103 BA (3-for-29) with RISP.
- ▶ For the first time in franchise history (since earned runs became an official statistic in the AL in 1913), the Yankees allowed 1ER-or-fewer in each of the club's first five starts.

**GOING, GOING, GIAN:** **OF Giancarlo Stanton** hit his third home run of the season in the first inning on Wed. vs. Tampa Bay, his first HR as a Yankee at Yankee Stadium...also homered here with the Marlins in 2015.

- ▶ His 3HR are the most by a Yankee through six team games since 2011, when Mark Teixeira hit 4HR and Jorge Posada hit 3HR...is one of five AL hitters with at least 3HR this season (4HR-Matt Davidson/Brian Dozier; 3HR-Stanton/Tim Anderson/Edwin Encarnación).
- ▶ The HR was hit with an exit velocity of 117.9 mph (per Statcast)...since Statcast began tracking such data at the start of 2015, he is the second player to hit a HR at Yankee Stadium with an exit velocity of at least 116.0 mph (also Aaron Judge, 6HR).
- ▶ Marked his 270th career home run in his 992nd career game...broke a tie with Juan González (269) for the fourth-most HRs through a player's first 1,000 career games, behind Ryan Howard (279), Ralph Kiner (277) and Harmon Killebrew (272).

**BOMBS AWAY:** **RF Aaron Judge** and **C Gary Sánchez** hit their first home runs of the season on Wed. vs. Tampa Bay, joining **OF Giancarlo Stanton**, who hit his third...marked the first time that all three homered in the same game together.

- ▶ Marked Judge's 57th career homer...tied Rudy York for the most HRs through 188 career games in MLB history.
- ▶ Marked Sánchez's 54th career homer...is tied for the fourth-most HRs through 183 career games in MLB history.
- ▶ The Yankees are tied for second in the AL (tied for fourth in MLB) with 11HR this season...marks the sixth time in club history that they have hit at least 11HR through six team games...is the most since the 2011 club hit 13HR in the first 6G...in 2017, hit just 6HR in the first 6G...seven different players have homered this season.

**TANAKA TIME IN THE BRONX:** **RHP Masahiro Tanaka** makes his 2018 home debut tonight vs. Baltimore...including the 2017 postseason, has tossed 7.0 scoreless innings with 3H in each of his last three starts at Yankee Stadium...during that span, has retired 61-of-72 batters (21.0IP, 9H, 2BB, 30K).

- ▶ Postseason included, has won six consecutive starts here, completing 7.0IP in all six.
- ▶ Since 7/28/17, has permitted 1R-or-fewer in 6-of-8 starts while going 7-1 with a 0.96 ERA (56.0IP, 36H, 7R/6ER, 8BB, 72K, 3HR).
- ▶ With a 29-12 regular season record (.707) in 54 starts at Yankee Stadium, is one of six active starting pitchers (min. 25 decisions) with a winning percentage above .700 at any ballpark...the others: Zack Greinke (.806 at Dodger Stadium; .750 at Chase Field); Max Scherzer (.780 at Comerica Park), Drew Hutchison (.750 at Rogers Centre), Jorge De La Rosa (.726 at Coors Field), Clayton Kershaw (.714 at Dodger Stadium).

**'O' MY!** The Yankees scored 154R in 19G vs. Baltimore in 2017, the highest run total by any team vs. any opponent in the Expansion Era (since 1961)...was the highest total since Chicago-AL scored 158R in 22G against Boston in 1960...was the Yankees' highest single-season run total vs. any opponent since 1956, when they scored 158R vs. the Kansas City A's.

- ▶ Went 8-2 vs. Baltimore at Yankee Stadium, their most home wins vs. the Orioles since 1960 (10-1 at the original Yankee Stadium) and tied for the second-highest single-season win total against any opponent at the current Stadium (10-0 vs. Toronto in 2013).
- ▶ **RF Aaron Judge** hit .426/.588/1.049 (26-for-61) with 31R, 5 doubles, 11HR, 24RBI and 24BB vs. Baltimore in 2017...his 31R were the most by any player vs. any opponent in one season since Ted Williams scored 31R in 1947 vs. St. Louis-AL...his 11HR were the most by a Yankee vs. a single opponent since 1961, when Roger Maris hit 13HR vs. Chicago-AL and Mickey Mantle hit 11HR vs. Washington-AL...was just the second player in the last 14 seasons (since 2004) to hit 11HR vs. an opponent, joining Minnesota's Brian Dozier (11HR vs. Kansas City in 2016)...his 24BB were the most by a Yankee vs. an opponent since 1959.

**EARLY BIRD SPECIAL:** Tonight marks the first of seven weeknight games scheduled to start at 6:35 p.m. at Yankee Stadium this season...the next three games with a 6:35 p.m. first pitch are the first three games of the next homestand (4/16-17 vs. Miami, 4/19 vs. Toronto).

**MINOR THREAT:** The 2018 minor league baseball season begins tonight across the U.S., with three of the Yankees' four full-season affiliates in action: Double-A Trenton vs. Richmond (7:00 p.m.); Single-A Tampa at Lakeland (6:30 p.m.); Single-A Charleston at Lexington (7:05 p.m.)...Triple-A Scranton/Wilkes-Barre opens its slate tomorrow night at 7:05 p.m. vs. Syracuse.

- ▶ According to *Baseball America*, the Yankees have the No. 2 farm system in baseball.

**YANKEES vs. BALTIMORE ORIOLES**

**OVERALL TRENDS/FACTS:** The Yankees and Orioles will meet 19 times in 2018 (9G in the Bronx, 10G in Baltimore), beginning with a four-game series in the Bronx from Thurs.-Sun....have won three straight series between the clubs since 6/9/17, going 8-2 in that span...is their longest streak of series won against the O's since winning three in a row from 7/5-9/12/13...last won four straight series from 9/17/10-7/31/11...are 215-137-2 vs. Baltimore since 1998, the club's most wins over any opponent in that span (next: 210-143 vs. Tampa Bay)...**IN 2017:** Went 12-7 vs. Baltimore, including 8-2 at home and 4-5 in Baltimore...marked their first season series win over the O's since going 10-9 in 2013 and their most wins since they were 13-5 in 2011...Yankees batters scored 154R vs. Baltimore in 2017, the highest run total by any team vs. any opponent in the Expansion Era (since 1961) and the club's highest single-season total vs. any opponent since 1956 (158R vs. the Kansas City A's and 152R vs. the Washington Senators)...**IN SEASON SERIES:** With a 12-7 mark in 2017, snapped a streak of three consecutive season series losses (2014-16), which marked their first time losing consecutive season series to the O's since 1980-82...are 15-3-2 in 20 season series since 1998...**AT YANKEE STADIUM:** Went 8-2 vs. Baltimore at Yankee Stadium in 2017, their most home wins vs. the Orioles since 1960 (10-1 at the original Yankee Stadium) and tied for the second-highest single-season win total against any opponent at the current Stadium (10-0 vs. Toronto in 2013, 8-2 vs. Tampa Bay in 2017)...the Yankees' 102R in 10 home games vs. Baltimore in 2017 were their most against an opponent at Yankee Stadium in a single season (previously 64R in 9G vs. Baltimore in 2011)...scored 8R-or-more in six straight home games vs. the O's from 6/9-9/16/17, their longest such streak vs. an opponent since at least 1908...are 55-30 (.647) vs. the O's at the current Yankee Stadium, their most wins vs. any opponent here (next-most: 54-30 vs. Toronto)...have won the opener in 14 of their last 15 home series vs. Baltimore since the start of 2013 (all except a loss on 9/30/16)...have gone 18-2-0 in home season series vs. Baltimore the last 20 years (1998-2017), with the only sub-500 marks coming in 2014 (4-6) and 2012 (3-6).

## TONIGHT'S STARTING PITCHER: RHP MASASHIRO TANAKA (1-0, 1.50 ERA)

**RHP Masahiro Tanaka** will make his second start of the season today vs. Baltimore...the 29-year-old will pitch on extended five days' rest after winning his season debut in Friday's at Toronto (6.0IP, 3H, 1ER, 8K)...went 13-12 with a 4.74 ERA (178.1IP, 180H, 100R/94ER, 41BB, 194K, 35HR) in 30 starts in 2017...the Yankees went 16-14 in his 30 starts in 2017...recorded his 600th strikeout on 8/27/17 vs. Seattle, becoming the sixth Japanese pitcher to record at least 600 Major League strikeouts...was the first Yankee to record at least 600K through his first four Major League seasons...has 152 career wins between MLB (53) and NPB (99)...his 5.18 career K/BB ratio (639K/125BB) is the highest (min. 500.0IP) in the Modern Era (since 1900)...the 2014 AL All-Star was acquired by the club via the posting system from the Rakuten Golden Eagles of Japan and signed to a seven-year contract on 1/22/14...his contract runs through the 2020 season.

**LAST START:** Earned the win on Fri. at Toronto, giving up just 3H and 1ER in 6.0IP (8K, 0BB)...permitted his only run on a Randal Grichuk solo HR in the second...retired his last 13BF...threw just 79 pitches (61 strikes) to get through 6.0IP, his second-lowest pitch count for a start of at least 6.0IP (fewest: 78 in 7.0IP on 6/3/15 at Seattle)...marked his first win in a season debut since winning his Major League debut in 2014...was his 13th career start with at least 8K and 0BB, tied for eighth-most in the Majors since 2014...was his 69th start with 1BB-or-fewer and is 38-19 with a 3.15 ERA (459.1IP, 161ER) in those games.

**VS. BALTIMORE:** Is 2-2 with a 3.58 ERA (55.1IP, 22ER) in eight career starts vs. the Orioles...six-of-eight starts have been quality starts...made three starts in 2017 (two road/one home) vs. Baltimore and went 1-1 with a 6.11 ERA (17.2IP, 12ER) and 17K...snapped a four-game winless streak against the O's on 9/14/17.

✦ Is 2-1 with a 2.95 ERA (36.2IP, 12ER) in five starts at home against Baltimore...has pitched at least 7.0IP and has allowed 3R-or-fewer in all starts.

**DOZEN BY DOZEN:** Is one of two pitchers in Yankees history to win at least 12 games in each of his first four Major League seasons (also Andy Pettitte, first nine seasons, 1995-2003)...is one of five Major League pitchers to earn at least 12 wins in each of the last four seasons (Greinke, Kershaw, Sale, Scherzer).

**A BRONX TALE:** Went 9-5 with a 3.22 ERA (95.0IP, 34ER) in 15 regular season home starts in 2017, tied for fifth in the AL in home wins...the Yankees were 10-5 in those starts.

- ✦ Allowed 2ER-or-fewer in each of his last six home regular season starts, going 5-1 with a 1.29 ERA (42.0IP, 7R/6ER)...allowed exactly 1ER in four straight home starts from 7/28-9/2/17, tied for the longest streak of starts with 1ER-or-fewer at the current Yankee Stadium (also CC Sabathia twice: 6/25-7/26/11 and 9/26/09-5/18/10)...allowed 1ER-or-fewer in seven of his last nine and 9-of-15 regular season home starts overall.
- ✦ Completed 6.0IP in 12-of-15 regular season home starts in 2017...his 112K were the third-highest total in a season at the current Yankee Stadium.
- ✦ Additionally, went 2-0 and did not allow a run (14.0IP, 6H, 2BB, 15K) in two postseason starts at home (ALDS Game 3 and ALCS Game 5).
- ✦ Since the beginning of 2016, is 16-6 with a 3.54 ERA (190.2IP, 75ER) in 30 regular season home starts...the Yankees are 23-7 in those games.

**K ZONE:** Has recorded 647K in 106 career regular season starts, the most strikeouts through 106 career regular season games in Yankees history...are the 17th-most through 106G in Major League history...was the first pitcher in Yankees history to record at least 600 strikeouts through his first four Major League seasons by a Yankees pitcher.

- ✦ Recorded a career-high 194K in 2017 (previously 165K in 2016), the ninth-highest strikeout total by a Japanese pitcher (second in 2017 to Yu Darvish-209)...along with Luis Severino (230K), marks the first time the Yankees have had two pitchers each record at least 190K in a season since 2009 (CC Sabathia-197, A.J. Burnett-195).

**SPRING TRAINING:** In four official spring training starts, went 0-3 with a 7.24 ERA (13.2IP, 17H, 11ER, 3BB, 19K, 5HR)...made his final spring start on 3/23 vs. Boston, taking the loss despite allowing only 1ER in 5.2IP (5H, 0BB, 6K, 1HR).

**2017:** Went 13-12 with a 4.74 ERA (178.1IP, 180H, 100R/94ER, 41BB, 194K, 35HR) in 30 starts in 2017...ranked eighth in the AL in strikeouts, seventh in K/9.0IP ratio (9.79), fourth in K/BB ratio (4.73), and third in BB/9.0IP ratio (2.07).

- ✦ Was placed on the 10-day D.L. on 8/12/17 (retroactive to 8/10) with right shoulder inflammation (team record: 6-5)...was his third career trip to the D.L., first since 4/29-6/3/15 (right wrist tendinitis and a right forearm strain).

**2017 POSTSEASON:** Made three postseason starts on the Yankees' run to the ALCS, going 2-1 with a 0.90 ERA (20.0IP, 10H, 2ER, 3BB, 18K)...was the fifth-lowest ERA by a Yankee in one postseason (min. 18.0IP)...was the third Yankees pitcher to record multiple scoreless starts of at least 7.0IP in a single postseason, joining Roger Clemens (2000) and Whitey Ford (1960)...was the fifth pitcher in Baseball history with multiple scoreless starts with at least 7.0IP and 3H-or-fewer in one postseason, joining San Diego's Kevin Brown (1998), the Yankees' Roger Clemens (2000), Arizona's Randy Johnson (2001) and Detroit's Kenny Rogers (2006).
