MARINERS NOTES:

- The Mariners went 6-1 against the Orioles this year...are now 16-6 in the last 22 meetings between the two clubs.
 - Improve to 40-29 this season at Safeco Field and 56-18 when scoring 4-or-more runs.
- Edwin Díaz** collected his Major League-leading 53rd save of the season...his 53 saves are tied with Trevor Hoffman-SD (1998), Randy Myers-CHC (1993) and Mariano Rivera-NYY (2004) for 5th-most in single-season Major League history.
 - Equaled the club record by striking out 8 consecutive batters over 3 appearances, spanning Sept. 1-5...marks the 2nd time this season he has accomplished this feat (also: 7/3-11).
 - Has now struck out his 1st batter faced in 32-of-67 (47.7%) appearances this season, most in the Majors.
 - The Mariners are now 62-0 this season when he enters with a lead.
- Nelson Cruz** (2x4, HR, 2 R, RBI, BB) hit his 160th home run with the Mariners, moving into a tie with Alvin Davis for 6th-most career home runs in club history...**Kyle Seager** is 5th with 173 home runs.
 - Has reached base safely in 59 of 63 career games (w/AB) against the Orioles, including 56 games with at least 1 hit...overall he is batting .355 (66x186) with 48 runs, 18 doubles, 1 triple, 13 home runs, 52 RBI, 3 HBP, 29 walks and 4 stolen bases.
 - Hit his team-leading 34th home run of the season.
 - Is now 1 RBI away from 1,000 in his career...will be the 12th active Major Leaguer with at least 1,000 RBI.
- Denard Span** (3x3, HR, 2 R, 2 RBI, BB, SB) has hit safely in 18 of his last 25 games (8/6-c), batting .329 (26x79) with 12 runs, 5 doubles, 3 triples, 3 home runs, 10 RBI, 2 HBP and 6 walks.
 - Hit his 11th home run of the season (last: 8/25 at ARI).
 - Recorded his 8th stolen base of the year (last: 7/29 at LAA).
- Alex Colomé** recorded his 26th hold of the season...despite recording his 1st hold of the season on May 28, his 26 holds are tied for 2nd-most in the American League (also: Matt Barnes-BOS and Chaz Roe-TB)...his 26 holds are also tied for 4th-most in single-season club history (also: Jeff Nelson, 2001, and Mark Lowe, 2009).
- Mitch Haniger** (1x4, HR, R, RBI, BB) extended his career-high hitting streak to 17 games, the longest active streak in the Majors...during that span, he is batting .305 (22x72) with 13 runs scored, 4 doubles, 1 triple, 5 home runs, 7 RBI, 2 hit by pitch and 9 walks.
 - Has hit safely in 30 of his last 34 games (7/31-c), batting .329 (47x143) with 22 runs scored, 14 doubles, 1 triple, 6 home runs, 17 RBI, 2 HBP and 12 walks.
 - Hit his 24th home run of the year, tied for 2nd on the team (also: Ryon Healy).
- Robinson Canó** (1x4, 2B, BB) recorded his 527th career double, moving into sole possession of 44th place on the all-time Major League leaderboard...was tied with Dave Parker (526)...next up: Cap Anson and Frank Robinson (528).
- Mike Leake** earned his first win since June 23 at Boston...marks his 14th quality start in his last 18 starts (5/22-c).
- Nelson Cruz** and **Denard Span** hit back-to-back home runs in the 5th inning...marks the 6th time this season the Mariners have gone back-to-back (last: 8/31 at OAK, Canó and Cruz).
- Jean Segura** (1x5) has hit safely in 16 of 23 games (since 8/5), batting .340 (33x97) with 10 runs, 2 doubles, 1 triple, 1 home run, 9 RBI, 2 HBP, 4 walks and 5 stolen bases in that span.

ORIOLES NOTES:

- Adam Jones** (3x4, 2B) has hit safely in 26 of 35 games with an at-bat since the All-Star Break, batting .314 (43x137) in this stretch.
 - has hit safely in 6 of his last 8 games (8/27-c), batting .394 (13x33) with 5 runs, 1 double, 1 home run and 6 RBI...has 4 multi-hit games in that span.
 - Collected his 39th multi-hit game of the season, his 14th game with 3+ hits.
 - Hit his team-leading 32nd double of the season.

- **Joey Rickard** (1x4) extended his hitting streak to 6 games (8/19-c), batting .368 (7x19) during that span.
- **Jonathan Villar** (1x5, SB) extended his hitting streak to 5 games, batting .261 (6x23) with 2 home runs, 4 runs, 3 RBI and 2 stolen bases during that span.
- **Cedric Mullins** (1x4, 2B, HBP) has recorded a hit in 14 of 22 games with an at-bat for the Orioles.
- **Caleb Joseph** (1x4, 2B, R) snapped his 0x18 streak with a single in the 6th inning.
- **Andrew Cashner** is now 2-5 with a 4.26 ERA (28 ER, 59.2 IP) against Seattle in his career... on the road this year, he is 2-8 with a 5.30 ERA (43 ER, 73.0)
 - Has surrendered a career-high 24 home runs this season, adding 3 to that total tonight... has given up at least one in 16 of his 27 starts.

BALTIMORE MANAGER BUCK SHOWALTER:

On missed opportunities:

"There were some opportunities there. It seems like every play we make is magnified by our inability to score runs. Andrew (Cashner) had a lot of counts in his favor, he just couldn't finish off some guys. He had a chance. He threw 100 pitches to get through 5.0 with the lead and it was a grind. He just couldn't get those last few guys out. We didn't take advantage of the opportunities we had."

On Edwin Díaz and the Mariners:

"He's having a great year. They have the great fortune to have him. He's comes and gets some outs. He's not sitting around throwing 25 pitches. They have a lot of pieces over there now, but just like everybody they're trying to be consistent through their starting pitching. They have a lot of pieces on the bench and they can move a lot of things in and out. They're tough."
