PHILADELPHIA PHILLIES (30-23) vs LOS ANGELES DODGERS (25-29)

Thursday, May 31, 2018 – Dodger Stadium – 4:35 EDT – Game 54; Road 26

RHP Aaron Nola (6-2, 2.27) vs LHP Clayton Kershaw (1-4, 2.86)

- LAST NIGHT'S ACTION:** The Phillies fell to the Los Angeles Dodgers, 8-2, at Dodger Stadium ... Starter Zach Eflin (L, 1-2) went 4.0 inning and allowed 5 runs on 7 hits with 1 walk and 5 strikeouts ... Carlos Santana had 2 hits, Nick Williams crushed a solo-shot to center field and Cesar Hernandez reached base two more times as the Dodgers took a 2-1 series advantage.
- TRANSACTIONS:** Prior to tonight's game, the Phillies recalled RHP Mark Leiter Jr. and OF Dylan Cozens ... To make room on the 25-man roster, OF/1B Rhys Hoskins was placed on the 10-day DL (retro to 5/30) and RHP Drew Hutchison was designated for assignment ... If he appears in tonight's game, Cozens, celebrating his 24th birthday, would be the first Phillies player since 2008 (LHP R.J. Swindle, 7/7/08 vs NYM) to make his major league debut on his birthday ... Cozens will wear #25.
- A LOOK BACK AT MAY:** Today marks the Phillies' final game in the month of May as they currently stand at 14-11 for the month ... Regardless of today's outcome, the Phillies have clinched a winning record during the month for the first time since 2012 when they went 16-13 ... Additionally, Philadelphia reached the 30-win mark this season on May 29, 49 days earlier than last year when they reached 30 wins on July 16, as they won their fourth game back after the All-Star break to move to 30-60 ... Lastly, Phillies pitching has posted a 3.08 combined ERA during the month ... If that holds, it would be the club's lowest ERA in a month since April of 2012 (3.03 ERA) ... However, if that ERA were to drop below 3.03, it would be the lowest team ERA during a month since September of 2011 (2.92) ... A sub 3.00 ERA for month for Philadelphia would mark just the 20th time in the last 50 seasons that has been accomplished.
- (F)ACE OFF:** Tonight, Aaron Nola and Clayton Kershaw square off for the first time in their respective careers ... Nola will take the hill tonight for his first ever start at Dodger Stadium ... Over his first 42 career starts, from July 21, 2015-June 16, 2017, Nola was 15-16 with a 4.39 ERA (117 ER, 239.2 IP), .261/.313/.397 slash line and 23.2% strikeout rate ... However, since June 22, 2017 (tonight marks his 30th start in that span), Nola is 15-8, 2.72 ERA (57 ER, 188.1 IP), with a .223/.276/.345 slash line and 27.2% strikeout rate ... **Since June 22, 2017, Nola's 188.1 innings pitched are the most of any starter in the National League and are the fourth-most of any starter in the majors, trailing only CLE's Corey Kluber (223.0), HOU's Justin Verlander (199.2) and NYY's Luis Severino (190.0)** ... Nola currently ranks 3rd among all NL starters in opponents OPS (.547) & pitches per inning (14.8), 4th in WHIP (0.98) and 5th in ERA (2.27).
- A TALE OF TWO MONTHS:** Over 23 games and 62 plate appearances during the month of May, Nick Williams is slashing .273/.355/.582 with 5 HR and 5 walks ... His 5 homers during the month are tied for 2nd-most on the team with Cesar Hernandez (5) trailing only Carlos Santana (7) ... Williams started the year with a .532 OPS through 59 plate appearances from 3/29-4/30 but from May 1 until on, has posted a .937 OPS in 62 plate appearances.
- PHILLIE SPECIAL:** After getting off to a 1-4 start to 2018, the Phillies have gone 29-19 over their last 48 games (4/5-current) ... Their .604 win percentage in this span ranks 2nd among all NL teams (best: MIL, .627) and 4th in the majors (best: BOS, .680) ... Philadelphia's +36 run differential is fourth-best in the NL and seventh-best in MLB this season.
- I'M GOING GOING, BACK BACK, TO CALI CALI:** This series marks Gabe Kapler's return to Dodger Stadium for the first time as Phillies manager ... Kapler, born in Hollywood, CA., served as the director of player development for the Dodgers from November of 2014 to October of 2017 ... Named the 54th manager of the Phillies on October 30, 2017, Kapler guided his team to a 29-21 record through the first 50 games of the 2018 season ... Kapler became the first Phils skipper to win at least 29 of his team's first 50 games since Larry Bowa in 2001 (32-18 start) ... Per Elias, prior to Kapler, the last Phillies manager to win at least 29 of his first 50 ever managed in the big leagues was Dallas Green, who went 29-21 over his first 50 games from 1979-80 ... To find the last manager before Kapler to win 29 or more of his first 50 games in one season, with no prior managerial experience, you have to go all the way back to 1907, when Billy Murray guided his team to a 31-19 start.
- YES SER!** Since making his major league debut on May 7, Seranthony Dominguez has tossed 11.2 scoreless innings over 10 appearances and has allowed only two singles with no walks and 13 strikeouts ... The Phillies are 9-1 in games which Dominguez has pitched and had won each of the first nine games he appeared in prior Monday night ... His 11.2-inning scoreless streak to begin his career is the longest by a Phillies reliever since Todd Frohwirth began his career with 14.2 scoreless innings (1987-88), per *Elias*.
- GO WEST, YOUNG MAN:** Tonight marks the fourth game of a 10-game, 11-day road trip that will begin at Dodger Stadium for four games (5/28-31), followed by a three-game set against the Giants in San Francisco (6/1-3) before concluding with three games against the Cubs at Wrigley (6/5-7) ... Following this trip, the Phillies will head home where they will play 15 of their final 21 games of the month of June at Citizens Bank Park.

LAST START: 5/26 vs TOR: ND, 6.2 IP, H, R, ER, 3 BB, 10 SO ... Nola vs Garcia ... Nola, who carried a no-hitter into the 7th inning, retired 18 straight Toronto batsmen at one point ... The Phils scored both of their runs via solo home runs, a line drive to left by Maikel Franco in the 5th and a pinch-hit blast to center by Nick Williams in the 8th ... Seranthony Dominguez (1.1 IP) and Luis Garcia (1.0 IP) made scoreless appearances in relief of Nola.

TONIGHT'S START:

- Flirting with History:** Carried a no-hitter through 6.2 innings in his last start, (longest no-hit bid of his career), at one point retiring 18 straight batters ... Finished with 1 run allowed on 1 hit in 6.2 innings, recording his fourth career double-digit strikeout performance (10) ... **Since 1913, there have only been 11 instances where a Phillies pitcher tossed at least 6.0 innings, allowed 1 or 0 hits and struck out 10+** ... Teammate Jake Arrieta did so on 4/19 vs PIT, but prior to that was Cole Hamels' no-hitter on 7/25/15 at CHI ... The only other time a Phillies pitcher did not earn a win in such a start was 9/15/2002 (Randy Wolf)
- Best of the Best:** Per Fangraphs, in the last calendar year, Nola ranks 7th in IP (210.1), 8th in fewest HR/9.0 IP (0.81), 9th in ERA (3.00), T-10th in SO (226), WHIP (1.11), wins (16) and starts (33) ... **In that span, Nola's WAR of 5.9 ranks 6th, trailing Corey Kluber (9.1), Max Scherzer (7.8), Luis Severino (7.1), Justin Verlander (6.7) and Chris Sale (6.6) ... His counterpart tonight, Clayton Kershaw, is 24th (3.4) ... He ranks 10th among qualifying ML pitchers in least amount of hard contact (29.0 %)**
- Trifecta:** Per Fangraphs, Nola's changeup (T-4th), fastball (5th) and curveball (T-7th) all rank in the top 10 in terms of pitch value among qualified pitchers
- 2018 NL Starter Rankings:** T-2nd in wins (6, T-9th in MLB), 3rd in fewest pitches/IP (14.8, 8th in MLB), 4th in WHIP (0.98), 5th in IP (71.1), 7th in HR/9.0 IP (0.90), 10th in BB/9.0 IP (2.14)
- May Day:** His 1.91 ERA (7 ER, 33.1 IP) is 8th among all qualifying NL pitchers in May ... His 2.76 career May ERA is his lowest of any month
- vs NL West:** 4-4, 4.48 ERA (34 ER, 68.1 IP) in 11 starts

ROAD:

- 2018:** 1-2, 2.73 ERA (9 ER, 29.2 IP) in 5 starts
- Career:** 11-12, 4.11 ERA (94 ER, 205.2 IP) in 36 starts

2018 SEASON:

- Won each of his first 5 home starts, something no Phillie had done since 2010 (Roy Oswalt)
- Allowed 3 ER or fewer in 13 straight starts, 9/7/17-5/13/18
- Struck out a career-high 12 batters on 5/8 vs SF, becoming the first Phillies since 8/3/06 (Hamels) to finish a start with at least 12 strikeouts and 25 or fewer batters faced ... Recorded 9 straight outs via strikeout during his start vs SF (last out of 2nd in 5th)
- His start on 5/2 at MIA (7.1 IP) was the 2nd-longest scoreless start of his career (longest: 8.0 IP, 8/23/15 at MIA)
- Had a 14.1-inning scoreless streak, 4/27-5/8
- Had a 2.58 ERA (11 ER, 38.1 IP) in 6 starts in March/April
- Surrendered 2 runs or fewer in 8 straight starts from 9/13/17 to 4/21/18, marking the 7th time a Phillies starter has accomplished the feat since 1893 when the current mound distance was established (had a PHI record 10 straight last season)
- Allowed 4 or fewer hits in each of his first 4 starts of the season, the first Phillie to do so in his first 4 starts since 2005 (Rob Tejada, 5)
- Tied a career high with 8.0 IP on 4/10 vs CIN
- Made his first career Opening Day start on 3/29 at ATL ... At 24 years, 298 days old, he was the club's youngest Opening Day starter since Dennis Bennett in 1964 (24 years, 192 days old)

2017 SEASON:

- Had the most SO (184) ever by a Phillies pitcher who made fewer than 30 starts in a season
- Averaged 9.86 SO/9.0 IP (184 SO/168.0 IP), becoming the 2nd qualifying Phillie with a SO/9.0 IP that high (other: Curt Schilling, 11.29 in 1997 and 10.05 in 1998)
- Had 10 straight starts with 2 or fewer runs allowed (6/22-8/12), the longest such streak by a Phillie since the current mound distance was established in 1893

CAREER:

- Selected by the Phillies in the 1st round (7th overall) of the June 2014 draft out of Louisiana State University ... Was signed by Mike Stauffer ... Originally selected by Toronto in the 22nd round of the June 2011 draft, but did not sign
- His 23.0-inning scoreless streak, 4/22-5/8/16 remains the longest by a Phillies starter since Cole Hamels' 24.2-inning streak, 6/1-21/14
- Was the first player drafted by Philadelphia to make his ML debut the very next season since Pat Combs in 1989
