LEADING OFF: Angels play the eighth contest (4-3) of a 10-game, 11-day trip to **Houston** (2-2), **Texas** (2-1) & **Chicago White Sox** (Sept. 7-9)...LAA is 5-4 in last nine games but have dropped 10 of 15 overall and are 19-24 since the break...**Halos have spent last 71 days in fourth place**...19 of 21 remaining games are with divisional foes: Six with **Texas** (6 at home), six vs. **Oakland** (3 home, 3 road), four vs. **Seattle** (all at home) & three at **Houston**...Following the trip, Angels return home to face **Rangers** (Sept. 10-12) & **Seattle** (Sept. 13-16).

OHTANI MEDICAL UPDATE: On Wednesday, RHP/DH Shohei Ohtani underwent an MRI on his right elbow which revealed new damage to his ulnar collateral ligament (UCL). UCL reconstruction surgery is the recommended plan of care. Updates to come when appropriate.

PEÑA TONIGHT: Over his last four starts, **Felix Pena** has posted a 2.88 ERA (25 IP – 8 ER)...He is pitching to a 2.14 ERA (33.2 IP – 8 ER) on the road this season.

LAST GAME: In Wednesday's 9-3 win at **Texas**, **Jaime Barria** earned his 10th win of season, his fourth victory in last six starts (1.82 ERA in the six games)...**Shohei Ohtani** posted his second career multi-HR game (also 8/3 at **Cleveland**), matched his career high with four hits (also 8/3), and set career bests with four runs scored and five times on base...**David Fletcher** had two hits and two runs to finish the series 6-for-10...**Andrelton Simmons** posted his 10th HR, third time in his career with double-digit HR total (17 in 2013, 14 in 2017).

SHO OFF: **Shohei Ohtani's 18 HRs (82 G)** have matched the MLB rookie record by a Japanese native set by **Kenji Johjima** in 2006 with **Seattle** (144 games)...**Ohtani** is the first player in MLB history with 15+ HR & 50+ pitching Ks in same season (**STATS**) and is the first player since **Babe Ruth** in 1919 with at least 50 IP and 15 HR in a single season...**Ohtani is the only player in MLB this season with multiple games of two home runs and a stolen base (11 other players have 1 such game) – ESPN STATS.**

DID YOU KNOW? Since August 14th, **David Fletcher** is batting .387 (24/62) in 15 road affairs...**RHP Junichi Tazawa** is the fifth Japanese native in Angels' history (**Shigetoshi Hasegawa**, **Hideki Matsui**, **Hisanori Takahashi** & **Ohtani**)...**Ohtani** is batting .316 (6/19) with four runs, a double, two home runs and four RBI as a pinch hitter this season - tied for A.L. lead among pinch hitters with 13 total bases (**D. Palka**, **CWS**).

YOUTH SERVED: In his last eight outings, **Jaime Barria** is 6-1 with 2.43 ERA (40.2 IP – 11 ER)...Has allowed one earned run or less five of last six starts...**Leads MLB rookie starters with 10 wins (min. 10 GS).**

PUJOLS SURGERY: On August 30th, **Albert Pujols** underwent an arthroscopic debridement of his left knee. A general timetable to return to playing following this procedure is 6-8 weeks. Updates will be provided when appropriate...**Pujols** ranks 23rd all-time with 3,082 hits (**Ichiro** is 22nd with 3,089) and sixth all-time with 633 home runs (**Willie Mays** is 5th w/660 HR)...**He is one of four players with 3,000 hits & 600 HR (Mays, Hank Aaron & Alex Rodriguez).**

MINOR MENTIONS: Salt Lake shortstop **Luis Rengifo** split time on three minor league levels this season (**A+ Inland Empire – 41 G, AA Mobile – 40 G & AAA Salt Lake – 46 G**). The Venezuelan prospect combined to hit .299 (150/502) with 109 runs, 30 doubles, 13 triples, seven home runs, 64 RBI and 41 stolen bases in 127 games played. **Rengifo**, who batted leadoff for the **Bees**, boasted a .399 on-base percentage this season...**LHP Patrick Sandoval** (Mission Viejo HS), made seven combined starts in Angels' system at **Mobile (AA) & Inland Empire (A+)** allowing just three earned runs in 34.1 IP (0.79 ERA; 3 R, 3 ER, 18 H, 14 BB, 48 K)...**All told, he went 11-1 with two saves and a 2.43 ERA (122.1 IP – 28 ER; 29 BB, 145 K) in 26 games 20 starts) this season.**

2019 SCHEDULE: Angels' highlights of the 2019 schedule include a two-game series (**May 4-5**) against **Houston** at **Estadio de Béisbol in Monterrey, Mexico**...LAA heads south of the border for first time since 2000 when hosting an exhibition game vs. **Arizona** in **Hermosillo, Mexico**...Angels previously played internationally in **San Juan, Puerto Rico** for a three-game series with **Montreal** in 2003... Matching up against the **N.L. Central** for interleague play, LAA faces **St. Louis** at **Busch Stadium (June 21-23)**, **Albert Pujols'** first visit to **St. Louis** as an opponent.

THE NEW ME: In 66 games in return from D.L., **Kole Calhoun** is batting .281 (68/242) with 49 runs, 14 doubles, a triple, 17 HRs & 44 RBI (*hit .145 with 1 HR and 11 RBI over first 50 games*)...**Calhoun's 17 HRs since June 18th rank tied for fourth in A.L.**

HI, MY NAME IS... 58 players (35 pitchers - 14 starters) have appeared in 2018 to set single-season franchise marks (**MLB record for players used is 64 by 2014 Texas Rangers**)...14 players have made MLB debuts in 2018 breaking team record of 12 (1996 & 1975).

TROUT TRIFECTA: With an MLB-leading 109 walks, **Trout** is the first player in MLB history with three seasons of **25 home runs, 20 stolen bases and 100 walks** by age-26 season-or- younger...Joins **Jeff Bagwell** (3), **Bobby Abreu** (3) & **Barry Bonds** (7) as only players with at least three such seasons in career.

GOLD STANDARD: Three-time **Gold Glover Andrelton Simmons** leads A.L. shortstops with 204 putouts (2nd in MLB) and has second fewest errors (8) in junior circuit among shortstops (min. 100 GS)... **Leads MLB with a 16.1 Ultimate Zone Rating in 2018 (UZR) – FanGraphs**...**Since 2015, his 95 defensive runs saved (DRS) also lead MLB...Thru 908 career games, Simmons' defensive WAR is 25.0 – best by any shortstop in MLB history.**

GLOVE STORY: With 67 errors committed, Angels are on pace to break club record for fewest miscues in a full campaign (80 set last season)...**Fewest in a strike-shortened season is 76 in 1994**...Club ranks fourth in A.L. with .987 fielding pct...**Halos lead MLB turning 149 double plays (team record is 203 in 1985)**...Catchers own a 41.2 caught stealing pct. (28 of 65), tops in A.L...**Mike Trout** is only CF in MLB (min. 70 G) with a 1.000 fielding pct...**Kole Calhoun's 27 OF assists since 2016 lead A.L.**

BULLPEN BITS: 3.74 bullpen ERA ranks sixth in A.L...**Halo relievers lead MLB in inherited runners scored pct. allowing just 22.0 % to score (49 of 223)**...Bullpen has logged 532 IP, second in A.L. to **Tampa Bay**...**Since 2016, Jose Alvarez's 197 games pitched lead A.L. (163.2 IP)**...Over last two seasons (2017-18), **Alvarez** is tied for A.L. lead with 133 games pitched and **Blake Parker** ranks tied for third in the span (132 games pitched).

THIS N' THAT: 34 players are on Angels' current active roster...**Club is 18-26 when lefty starts (50-46 vs. RHS)**...LAA had a club-record 15 players on D.L. simultaneously twice this season...**Halos sent 25 different players to D.L., most in MLB this season...Angels are one of seven teams in A.L. with a positive run differential (+29)**...Angels' 182 HRs hit rank T5th in A.L...**Andrelton Simmons** leads MLB in PA per SO at 15.47 (526 PA/34 K) - also ranks second in MLB batting .293 (49/167) with two strikes...**Mike Scioscia** (1,638 wins) ranks 18th on the all-time managerial wins list (**Jim Leyland** 17th with 1,769)...**A. Heaney** is one strikeout shy of 150, would be first Halo to reach the mark since 2015 (**Garrett Richards**; 176 & **Hector Santiago**; 162).

FISH FACTS: **Mike Trout & Willie Mays** are only players with three 30 HR/20 SB seasons by age-26 season-or-younger (**Trout** is only player in A.L. history)...**Trout** turned age 27 on August 7th...His **62.3 career WAR** is currently second-highest all time by a position player through age-26 season (**Ty Cobb**, **63.4**).

HOT HALOS: **Ohtani** has homered in four of his last eight games overall (5 HR total)...**Jose Fernandez** has hit safely in 13 of 19 games with Angels this season (hits in 10 of 13 starts)...18 of last 21 outings for **Justin Anderson** are scoreless...**David Fletcher** has hits 17 of last 20 games (nine multi-hit efforts) and is batting .354 (29/82) with 13 runs, five doubles, a triple and 10 RBI in span...**Jose Alvarez** has not been scored upon in 17 of last 19 outings (1.08 ERA; 16.2 IP – 2 ER)...**Mike Trout** has successfully reached base in 21 of his last 22 games with 17 runs, six home runs, 13 RBI and 25 walks in that span.

@ WHITE SOX: 2018 season series is tied 2-2...LAA has won 16 of last 19 meetings at home but have dropped three of last four and nine of last 12 in **Chicago**...Angels are 34-20 overall vs. CWS since 2011.

RANGERS ON DECK: Halos lead 2018 season series 8-5 (3-1 at home)...Six games remain with **Texas** (all at home)...**Angels are 29-19 in Arlington since 2014...David Fletcher is batting .414 (12/29) against Texas this season.**

THIS DATE IN ANGELS HISTORY

September 7

(2007) **Garret Anderson** collects an RBI in his 12th consecutive game (Aug. 26 – Sept. 7) to extend his club record...The streak ends the next night as he falls two games shy of matching the A.L. record for consecutive games with an RBI of 14 set by **Tris Speaker** of **Philadelphia A's** in 1928.

September 8

(1996) Angels turned the fifth triple play in club history in a 4-2 victory at **Minnesota**.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER – RHP FELIX PEÑA

1-4, 4.19 ERA

Owens a 2.14 ERA (33.2 IP – 8 ER) on the road this season

- **IN THE ROTATION:** Making 16th appearance (14th start) of the season for Angels; seventh game (all starts) on the road in 2018...First 38 big league outings came in relief before making first start on June 19 vs. Arizona...Recalled from Triple-A Salt Lake on June 15 for third stint of season with Angels.
- **HOME vs. ROAD:** In his six road starts this season, is 1-1 with a 2.14 ERA (33.2 IP – 8 ER); has pitched to a 6.17 ERA (35 IP – 24 ER) at Angel Stadium this year.
- **LAST TIME OUT:** Did not factor in decision in last start on Saturday at Houston after tossing a career-high seven innings and allowing two runs (one earned) on five hits with no walks and three strikeouts.
- **FIRST TIME ON THE SOUTH SIDE:** Tonight marks first appearance in Chicago as a visiting player...Made Major League debut with Cubs on Aug. 19, 2016...Played parts of two seasons with the Cubs, going 1-0 with a 4.98 ERA (43.1 IP – 24 ER) across 36 appearances (all in relief).
- **12 K'S:** Set career high in strikeouts with 12 on Aug. 21 at Arizona across six innings pitched...Marked fifth time in Angels history a pitcher recorded 12+ strikeouts in six-or-fewer innings, joining **Nolan Ryan, Kelvim Escobar, John Lackey** and **Zack Greinke**.
- **AS A STARTER:** In 13 games as a starter this season, is 1-4 with a 3.95 ERA (66 IP – 29 ER)...In first six starts after joining Angels rotation, pitched to a 2.73 ERA (29.2 IP – 9 ER) and allowed three-or-fewer runs in all six outings, before yielding seven runs in the 1st inning of start on July 29 vs. Seattle...In last six games, is 0-2 with a 3.25 ERA (36 IP – 13 ER).
- **RUN SUPPORT:** Angels have scored just 13 total runs of support (while he is in the game) across his last 10 starts...Is averaging 1.77 runs of support per start this season, with six of his 23 total runs of support coming on June 29 at Baltimore.
- **VS. CHICAGO (A.L.):** Is 0-1 with a 3.00 ERA (6 IP – 2 ER)...Tonight marks second career game vs. White Sox (both this season)...Did not factor in decision in first start of year against Chicago on July 24 at Angel Stadium (6 IP, 4 H, 2 ER, 3 BB, 2 SO).
- **AT GUARANTEED RATE FIELD:** Tonight marks first career appearance at Guaranteed Rate Field.
- **NO-HIT BID:** Carried no hitter into 6th inning of start on Aug. 4 at Cleveland but was charged with loss after tossing 5.1 innings and allowing two earned runs on three hits with three walks and one strikeout; no-hit bid broken up on solo HR by **Leony's Martin** leading off 6th.
- **WIN ANNIVERSARY:** Earned first win as a starter on June 29 at Baltimore after working 5.1 scoreless innings...His only other Major League win came exactly one year earlier on June 29, 2017 in relief for Cubs at Washington.
- **FIRST HALF RECAP:** Finished the first with a 1-0 record and 3.42 ERA (26.1 IP – 10 ER) in seven games (five starts) for Angels.
- **WITH THE BEES:** In 10 games (nine starts) this season with Triple-A Salt Lake, is 1-2 with a 3.51 ERA (33.1 IP – 13 ER)...Recorded 38 strikeouts with 16 walks...Did not allow a run in last 10.2 innings pitched for Salt Lake before being called up by Angels on June 15...The first batter he has faced of each inning with Salt Lake batted .091 (3/33).
- **PREVIOUS HALOS STINTS:** Made Angels debut on April 8 vs. A's (1 IP, 2 H, 1 ER)...Made one appearance for LAA during second stint with team on May 17 vs. Tampa Bay (1.2 IP, 3 H, 2 ER, 2 SO).
- **DOMINICAN NATIVE:** Is a native of San Pedro de Macoris, Dominican Republic...Is one of five Dominican pitcher to start a game for the Angels and the first since **Ervin Santana** in 2012; the other three are **Bartolo Colon, Ramon Ortiz** and **Hector Carrasco**.
- **MAJOR LEAGUE EXPERIENCE:** Pitched parts of last two seasons with Cubs, appearing in 36 total games and going 1-0 with a 4.98 ERA (43.1 IP – 24 ER) and 52 strikeouts...Made Major League debut on Aug. 19, 2016 vs. Colorado.
- **MINOR LEAGUE HIGHLIGHTS:** Was honored as a minor league All-Star in 2013 (Southern League), 2014 (Florida State League) and 2015 (Midwest League).
- **CAREER NOTES:** Originally signed by Cubs as an international free agent...Acquired by Angels from Cubs for cash considerations or a player to be named later on Oct. 9, 2017.
