The Brewers produced their third shutout of the postseason last night....the team is unscored upon in 49 of 55 innings this postseason.

For Starters

Brewers starting pitchers have a 0.35 ERA this postseason (25.2ip, 1er)....opponents have batted just .136 (12-for-88).

Fine Penmanship

Including the postseason, Brewers relievers are 16-1 with a 2.00 ERA over the last 32 games (143.2ip, 32er)....opponents have batted just .196 (101-for-515, 193k).

Orlando Magic

Orlando Arcia, who had just 3 HR during the regular season in 348 at-bats, has 3 HR in 20 at-bats during the postseason.

IN THE STANDINGS (187 days): The Brewers spent the following number of days alone or tied at each position in the National League Central standings this season: **FIRST:** 66, **SECOND:** 95, **THIRD:** 22, **FOURTH:** 4, **FIFTH:** 0....the team clinched a postseason berth on 9/26 and the NL Central championship on 10/1....prior to clinching the championship with a win at Chicago in game #163, the Brewers had not been in first place since 7/12.

SERIES-LY SPEAKING: The Brewers went 31-15-7 in series play this season....the team won 12 of its last 13 series with the only loss coming from 9/14-9/16 vs. Pittsburgh (1-2).

AT HOME: The Brewers went 51-30 at home, going 16-7-3 in series play....their .630 home winning percentage was best in the National League and tied Tampa Bay for third in the majors....had a season-high 6-game home winning streak from 4/17-4/22 and a season-high 3-game home losing streak from 4/7-4/16....the team went 46-38 at home last season, going 14-9-4 in series play.

ON THE ROAD: The Brewers went 45-37 on the road, going 15-8-4 in series play....their .549 road winning percentage ranked fourth in the National League....their 45 road wins marked the third most in franchise history (47-33-1 in 1982 and 46-34 in 1980)....the team won its last 6 road series and last 5 road games....had season-high 5-game road winning streaks from 4/30-5/11 and 9/23-10/1....had a season-high 6-game road losing streak from 7/11-7/15....the team went 40-38 on the road last season, going 13-11-2 in series play.

MANAGER: **Craig Counsell** completed his fourth season as Brewers manager (316-308) and third full season....he was named the 19th manager in franchise history on 5/4/15, replacing Ron Roenicke....bio is on p. 44 of the media guide.

COACHES: Hitting coach **Darnell Coles** (4th season), pitching coach **Derek Johnson** (3rd season), coach **Jason Lane** (3rd season), bench coach **Pat Murphy** (3rd season), third base coach **Ed Sedar** (12th season, 8th as 3B coach), first base/infield coach **Carlos Subero** (3rd season) and bullpen coach **Lee Tunnell** (6th season) all returned from the 2017 staff.

LET'S GO TO THE VIDEO TAPE: The Brewers made 34 replay challenges during the regular season, going 7-27....the team has made 7 replay challenges in the postseason, going 5-2....their last challenge (won) came in Game 3 of the NLCS at Los Angeles as a legal slide involving Manny Machado at second base was overturned (double play).

GAME 4 STARTER: #47 - LHP GIO GONZALEZ (32gs, 10-11, 4.21 in regular season)

GONZALEZ AT A GLANCE: Gio Gonzalez, 33, is making his second start of the postseason and eighth career postseason start....Gonzalez started Game 1 of the NLCS vs. Los Angeles last Friday and had no decision in the 6-5 win (2ip, 1h, 1r, 1er, 1bb, 1k, 1hr, 32 pitches)....he was acquired on 8/31 from Washington, along with international slot money, in exchange for 1B/C KJ Harrison and INF Gilbert Lara....Gonzalez went 3-0 with a 2.13 ERA in 5 starts with the Brewers during the regular season (25.1ip, 6er)....his teams went 16-16 in his starts (5-0 with the Brewers)....he made 11 quality starts....opponents batted .256 (167-for-652, 17hr)....he reached 30+ starts for the eighth time in his career....bio is available in the press box.

LAST SEASON: Gonzalez went 15-9 with a 2.96 ERA in 32 starts with Washington....he made 30+ starts for the seventh time....he made 22 quality starts, which tied Max Scherzer for the National League lead....he also ranked among the NL leaders in innings (6th, 201.0) and wins (T6th, 15)....his 79 walks led the National League....the team went 18-14 in his starts....opponents batted .216 (158-for-731, 21hr), which ranked fifth in the National League.

CAREER: Is 127-97 with a 3.69 ERA in 313 games / 307 starts (1814ip, 744er)....completed his 11th Major League season....has pitched for Oakland (2008-11), Washington (2012-18) and Milwaukee (2018)....Gonzalez is a two-time All-Star (2011 and 2012).

POSTSEASON CAREER: Has pitched in the postseason in 2012, 2014, 2016, 2017 and 2018, going 0-0 with a 4.76 ERA in 7 starts (28.1ip, 21h, 17r, 15er, 20bb, 27k, 4hr).

CAREER AT MILLER PARK: Has gone 4-3 with a 4.31 ERA in 9 starts (48ip, 23er), including 3-1 with a 2.67 ERA in 5 starts this season (27ip, 8er)....is 3-0 with a 1.27 ERA in 4 starts as a Brewer at Miller Park (21.1ip, 3er).

CAREER ON THE ROAD: Has gone 62-55 with a 4.02 ERA in 163 games / 158 starts (936.2ip, 418r)....went 3-7 with a 4.83 ERA in 16 starts this season (87.2ip, 47er).

CAREER vs. DODGERS (POSTSEASON INCLUDED): Is 4-1 with a 2.44 ERA in 8 starts (44.1ip, 12er)....Gonzalez has made 2 starts against the Dodgers in postseason play, coming in Game 3 of the 2016 NLDS with Washington and in Game 1 of the 2018 NLCS with Milwaukee....he is 0-0 with a 5.68 ERA in those starts (6.1ip, 4er).

CAREER AT THE PLATE: Is a .094 hitter (36-for-385) with 3 HR....has 8 walks and 173 strikeouts....homered in 2012, 2013 and 2014....**THIS SEASON:** Batted .078 (4-for-51) with 1 RBI....had 1 walk and 31 strikeouts....had 3 sacrifice bunts.
