WINTER WONDERLAND: The Cardinals set a record yesterday with a first pitch of 37 degrees (29 degree wind chill), marking the coldest first pitch in St. Louis in recorded history, surpassing the 38 degrees on April 16, 1961 vs. Cincinnati... today's temperature at game time is forecasted to be 43 degrees at the scheduled 1:15 p.m. Central Time first pitch.

SHERRIFF TO D.L.; BREBBIA RECALLED: RHP John Brebbia was recalled from Memphis (AAA) today as LHP Ryan Sherriff was placed on the 10-day disabled list (retroactive to April 6) with a right great toe fracture. Brebbia had yet to make an appearance in a game in Memphis this season.

THIS BUD'S FOR YOU: Bud Norris recorded the first save of the season for the Cardinals yesterday afternoon. It was the 20th career save for Norris, who began his career as a starting pitcher before appearing in 60 games last season (57 in relief) for the Angels with 19 saves. Only the Braves, Astros, Dodgers and Marlins have yet to record a save this season.

GETTING BULLISH: The Cardinals bullpen has not allowed an earned run since their two homers allowed in a walk-off loss on Tues. at Milwaukee, holding their opposition to one unearned run over their last 10.0 innings with 13 strikeouts while stranding all eight inherited runners. Only two other team's bullpens have not allowed an earned run since Tuesday (Arizona 7.2 IP & Kansas City 5.0 IP).

SILVER SLUGGER PRESENTATIONS: Outfielder Marcell Ozuna and pitcher Adam Wainwright will be presented their 2017 Louisville Silver Slugger Awards at approximately 5:45 p.m. during pregame on Monday...both are the first of their careers...current Cardinals with Silver Slugger Awards include Matt Carpenter (2B, 2013), Yadier Molina (C, 2013) and Willie McGee (1985, OF).

ONLY TAKES THREE: Luke Weaver is 9-0 in his career and the Cardinals are 11-0 when the Cardinals right-hander is backed with three or more runs of support in any of his starts.

TAKE YOUR BASE: Matt Carpenter has reached base safely in all eight games to begin 2018...his multi-walk game Thursday was the 100th of his career, 11th-most in Cardinals history and five behind Keith Hernandez (10th, 105 games)...his 99 multi-walk games since his first full season in 2012 are ranked 6th in all of MLB...D-Backs Paul Goldschmidt ranks 3rd on that list with 123 such games.

BACKSTOP BREAKOUT: Yadier Molina's three home runs are the most ever by a Cardinals catcher in the team's first eight games, tying his own mark from 2014...Lou Brock hit a club record six round-trippers in the team's first eight games to begin 1967.

STILL TO COME: The only Cardinals player yet to see action after the first seven games this season is catcher Francisco Peña, who joins Cincinnati LHP Cody Reed, and Kansas City LHP Eric Skoglund as the only active players yet to appear who began the season on an Opening Day roster (Elias).

IT'S GOOD TO BE DEJONG AGAIN: Shortstop Paul DeJong as hit 28th career home run since his since his ML debut (May 28, 2017 at COL)...only Minnesota's Brian Dozier (31) has more among MLB middle infielders since...DeJong's 28 homers in his first 116 MLB games also ties him with Albert Pujols for most by a Cardinal in his first 116 career games.

TODAY IN CARDINALS HISTORY

April 8, 1997: Willie McGee hit his first career walk-off home run, coming off Ugueth Urbina in the bottom of the 9th inning, as the Cardinals snapped a franchise record six-game losing streak to open a season, with a 2-1 win over Montreal in the 1997 home opener at Busch Stadium. McGee was pinch-hitting for Mark Petkovsek and hit the first of his two career walk-off home runs, both hit in 1997.

ARIZONA CONNECTIONS

Cardinals pitcher **Dominic Leone** pitched parts of two seasons (2015-16) with Arizona...originally traded by Seattle with catcher Wellington Castillo and infielder Jack Reinheimer to Arizona for pitcher Vidal Nuno and outfielder Mark Trumbo (June 3, 2015).

Cardinals assistant hitting coach **Bill Mueller** played parts of two seasons (1995-96) for the Phoenix Firebirds (AAA) as a member of the San Francisco Giants organization.

Cardinals assistant coach **Willie McGee** rehabbed for four games with the Phoenix Firebirds (AAA) as a member of the San Francisco Giants organization in 1991.

Cardinals President of Operations **John Moze-liak** attended the University of Arizona before graduating from the University of Colorado at Boulder.

Cardinals Senior Special Assistant to the General Manager **Bob Gebhard** worked for the Diamondbacks as Vice President & Special Assistant to the GM for 12 seasons (2005-16).

Diamondbacks infielder **Daniel Descalso** played parts of five seasons in a Cardinals uniform (2010-14)...appeared in 44 postseason games and was a member of the 2011 World Champion Cardinals...originally selected by St. Louis in the 3rd round of the 2007 MLB Draft.

Diamondbacks outfielder **David Peralta** was originally signed by the Cardinals as a non-drafted free agent pitcher (September 26, 2004)...pitched three minor league seasons (2005-07)...underwent pair of left-shoulder surgeries...released in May 2009.

Diamondbacks pitcher **Fernando Salas** pitched parts of four seasons with St. Louis (2010-13)...was a member of the 2011 World Series Champions...converted a team-leading 24 saves for St. Louis in 2011...originally purchased by St. Louis from Triple-A Saltillo Saraperos of the Mexican League (April 5, 2007).

Diamondbacks Vice President, Player Development **Mike Bell** is the younger brother of former Cardinals Bench Coach **David Bell**...Mike also played in eight games for the Triple-A Memphis Redbirds in 2005.

Cardinals Hall of Fame Manager **Tony La Russa** served as the Diamondbacks Chief Baseball Analyst for four seasons (2014-17).

Diamondbacks First Base Coach **Dave McKay** served in the same position for the Cardinals (1996-2011) under La Russa.

Diamondbacks Pitching Strategist **Dan Haren** was drafted by St. Louis in the 2nd round of the 2001 MLB draft...pitched two seasons in a Cardinals uniform (2003-04)...later traded by the Cardinals with catcher Daric Barton and pitcher Kiko Calero to Oakland for pitcher Mark Mulder (December 18, 2004).

Diamondbacks Pro Scout **Pete Vuckovich** pitched three seasons in St. Louis (1978-80)...later traded by the Cardinals with pitcher Rolie Fingers and catcher Ted Simmons to the Brewers for pitchers Lary Sorensen and Dave LaPoint and outfielders David Green and Sixto Lezcano (December 12, 1980).

Diamondbacks Player & Media Relations Intern **Sydney Sloas** served as the Cardinals 2017 Spring Training Intern at Jupiter, Fla.

2018 SPRING TRAINING

- Was 2-0 with a 0.55 ERA (16.1 IP/1ER) and 19 strikeouts in five Spring starts.
- Opposing hitters were only 6-for-53 (.113).

CAREER

- Averaging 10.62 K/9 IP over his career 101.2 career Major League innings.
- His 120 career strikeouts are the 3rd-highest total all-time among Cardinals through their first 23 career games, behind Shelby Miller (124) and Michael Wacha (122)... through 24 games, Miller finished with 128 and Wacha with 127.
- Won team-leading seven consecutive 2017 starts (8/2-9/20/17) was the 4th-longest in the National League and the longest by any MLB rookie in 2017...is the first Cardinals rookie to achieve the feat since Ted Wilks (1944) & Johnny Beazley (1942) (*Elias*).
- Became the fifth rookie pitcher in the last 70 years to allow two runs or fewer over seven consecutive winning starts, joining Fernando Valenzuela (eight straight in 1981), Cal Eldred (1992), Jered Weaver (2006) and Steven Matz (2016) (*Elias*).

2017

- Pitched the majority of the second half of the season with St. Louis, pitching in 13 games (10 starts) over three stints. Was the 7th different Cardinals pitcher to make a start behind the original starting five and Marco Gonzales.
- Struck out 72 over 60.1 IP to average 10.74 K/9 IP, the 5th-highest mark among National League starters (min. 60.0 IP), trailing Robbie Ray (12.11), Max Scherzer (12.02), Rich Hill (11.01) and Dinelson Lamet (10.94).
- Was one of five rookie pitchers to sport a pair of double-digit strikeout games (8/23 & 8/29) in 2017: COL's German Marquez, SF's Chris Stratton, PHI's Nick Pivetta & SD's Dinelson Lamet.
- As a starter in 10 outings, was 7-2 with a 4.23 ERA (55.1 IP/26 ER), 69 strikeouts and .255 (55-for-216) average against (St. Louis was 8-2).
