SCORING CHANGE: Miami's official scorer has made a scoring change from the game on July 1...In the eighth inning Todd Frazier was originally credited with an RBI double...That has been changed to an error on centerfielder Lewis Brinson.

BACK IN THE SIX: José Bautista will play his first game in Toronto as a visitor since June 24, 2004 as a member of the Rays tonight...From 2008-2017, Bautista hit 288 homers, the second-most in franchise history...He ranks third in team history with 766 RBI, second in walks (803), had a .372 OBP and appeared in the fifth-most games in team history (1,235).

JOSÉ BAUTISTA: Has a .418 OBP since joining the Mets on May 22...Has reached base safely in 15 of his last 16 games...Bautista he has three homers and six RBI over his last nine contests...He is hitting .300 (12-40) with five doubles, three homers, 10 RBI and 11 runs scored over his last 14 games...He has drawn 15 base-on-balls in his last 16 games and 24 walks in 36 games with the Mets since May 22.

METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets are 1-2 on their five-game road trip...The Mets are 2-8 in their last 10 games, 6-22 in their last 28 games and 8-27 in their last 35 contests...New York has gone 12 straight series without a series win (10 series losses, two splits) since sweeping Arizona from May 18-20...The Mets are 16-39 since May 1.

ON THE ROAD: The Mets are 19-22 on the road this season...New York is 6-14 in its last 20 road games.

VS. TORONTO: The Mets were 12-0 vs. the Blue Jays in New York before losing on May 16...New York went 1-1 vs. Toronto this year at Citi Field, May 15-16...The 12-game home winning streak vs. the Blue Jays is the longest such streak in interleague history...The Mets are 6-8 in Toronto all-time, including going 0-2 in 2015 during their last trip.

INTERLEAGUE ACTION: New York New York is 2-5 in Interleague action this year, after going 7-13 vs. the AL last year...Since 1997, when Interleague play began, the Mets are 187-182...The .507 Interleague winning percentage is the best all-time among NL clubs, percentage points ahead of St. Louis.

ASDRÚBAL CABRERA: Swatted his 14th home run of the year on Sunday in Miami, equally last year's output in 168 fewer at-bats...Cabrera has 45 RBI, his second-highest total prior to the All-Star break during his career...He had 51 RBI in 2011 for Cleveland in the first half...He is hitting .339 (19-56) with two doubles, three homers, nine RBI and seven runs scored in his last 13 games.

HOME RUN NOTES: The Mets have hit 26 home runs in their last 22 games and 40 homers in their last 36 games, but, 29 of those have been solo blasts...New York's pitching staff has surrendered 25 homers in its last 11 games and 39 home runs in its last 21 contests.

AMED ROSARIO: Has walked six times in his last three games, including at least one walk in three straight games...Is hitting .286 (12-42) with a .388 OBP over his last 16 games.

METS-BLUE JAYS NOTES: New York's winning percentage .667 (18-9) vs. Toronto is its best all-time vs. any club.

HONORING RUSTY STAUB: Mets Hall of Famer Rusty Staub passed away on March 29 at age 73...The Mets will wear a patch on the right sleeve on their home and away uniforms during the 2018 season honoring Staub...A six-time All-Star, he had 2,716 hits and 292 homers during his 23-year career.



FRIENDLY FACE: Curtis Granderson hit 95 home runs, 106 doubles and drove in 247 runs in 573 games with the Mets from 2014 until he was traded to the Dodgers on August 19, 2017 for RHP Jacob Rhamme...He is tied for the franchise record with 21 leadoff homers...Granderson signed with the Blue Jays on January 23, 2018.

ZACK WHEELER: Has pitched at least 6.0 innings in 11 of his 15 starts this year, including seven of his last eight starts...Eight of those 11 starts of at least 6.0 innings have been quality starts...Wheeler enters tonight's game with 8.0 scoreless innings dating to June 22.

FLORES FLOURISHING: Wilmer Flores has driven in nine runs in his last eighth games and has 12 RBI in his last 13 games...Flores has hit in career high-tying nine straight games, going 10-34 (.294)...Also had a nine-game streak from August 18-31, 2016...He has reached base in a career-best 16 straight games with a plate appearance...Over his last 35 games, Flores is batting .294 (32-109) with nine doubles, four home runs, 20 RBI, 11 runs scored, 10 walks and a .347 OBP (dating back to May 4).

MICHAEL CONFORTO: Has a 15.2% walk rate for the year, ranking ninth in the majors...Conforto has 45 walks this year, his second-most behind the 57 he had last year in 373 at-bats...He has four doubles, three homers, 12 walks and eight RBI in his last 18 games...Conforto has a .385 on-base percentage during that span.

BRANDON NIMMO: Is 11th in the NL with a .381 on-base percentage, eighth in the NL with a .528 slugging percentage and is sixth in the NL with a .909 OPS...He is tied for fourth in the majors with six triples...Nimmo is tied for second in the majors with 12 hit by pitches...Nimmo has a career-high 12 home runs...He has 10 homers since May 23 tied for the 13th-most in the majors during that span...Nimmo's previous professional career-high was 11 homers in 97 games (392 at-bats) with Las Vegas (AAA) in 2011.

IN THE MINORS: Las Vegas (AAA) infielder Jeff McNeil has hit in 14 straight games and in 15 of the 16 games since he was promoted to the 51s...McNeil is batting .391 (25-64) with seven doubles, two homers, 14 RBI and a .444 OBP in 16 games with Las Vegas.

LAST TIME OUT: Pitched 7.0-shutout innings, yet was dealt his seventh no-decision of the season as the Mets fell to the Pirates, 5-3, at Citi Field on June 27...The righty allowed five hits while walking one and tallying seven strikeouts... Wheeler's scoreless performance was his second of the season and his second-career scoreless start at Citi Field (also, June 6 vs. Baltimore)...Was the seventh scoreless start of his career...Punched out at least seven batters for the third-straight start and eighth time overall this season.

VS. TORONTO: Tonight's start is Wheeler's second vs. the Blue Jays and first start at Rogers Centre...Received the loss in his only career start against Toronto on May 16 of this season at Citi Field...In that start, Wheeler threw 4.0 innings, giving up six runs, earned, on seven hits while fanning seven and walking three in a 12-1 Mets setback.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: Tonight's start is Wheeler's eighth away from Citi Field this season...In his first seven road starts, he is 2-1 with a 4.54 ERA (20 earned runs/39.2 innings)...The Mets have won four of his seven away starts this season... In 43-career road starts, Wheeler is 15-9 with a 3.34 ERA (92 earned runs/247.2 innings)...Has fanned 231 and walked 102 batters on the road...Last season, he was 1-2 with a 4.34 ERA (18 earned runs/37.1 innings) in seven road starts.

JULY: Wheeler will be making his 15th-career start in the month of July...In 14-career July starts, he is 6-2 with a 2.85 ERA (26 earned runs/82.0 innings)...His six wins in July are tied for his most in any month (also, six wins in August) while his 2.85 ERA is his lowest in any single calendar month in his career.

QUALITY WHEELS: Wheeler has completed at least 6.0 innings in 11 of his 15 starts this season, including nine of his last 11 starts...Six of those 11 starts of at least 6.0 innings have been quality starts...Four of his last six starts have been quality outings...Has eight quality starts overall after posting six quality starts in all of 2017 (17 total starts).

BY INNING: This season, Wheeler has a 6.00 ERA (10 earned runs/15.0 innings) in the opening frame...From the second inning onward, his ERA is 4.15 (34 earned runs/73.2 innings)...Wheeler has a 5.00 career ERA (45 earned runs/81.0 innings) in the first inning...Owns a 3.80 career ERA (160 earned runs/379.1 innings) in all subsequent innings.

CAREER-BEST STRIKEOUT PACE: Wheeler owns a lifetime 8.56 K/9 ratio (438 strikeouts/460.1 innings)...In his 15 starts this season, he is striking out batters at a rate of 8.73 K/9 (86 strikeouts/88.2 innings)...Has fanned seven or more batters in eight of his 15 starts this season, including each of his last three outings...His 86 strikeouts are one strikeout shy of the most he's produced in his first 15 starts of a single season in his career (had 87 strikeouts through 15 starts in 2014).

COMPARED TO 2017: In his last start, his 15th of the season, Wheeler surpassed last season's total of 86.1 innings (done in 17 starts)...Also eclipsed last year's 81 strikeouts with his 86 strikeouts this season...Has a 1.33 WHIP and 4.47 ERA in 88.2 innings through 15 starts this season...Through 15 starts last season, had a 1.51 WHIP and a 4.86 ERA in 76.0 innings.

TOMORROW'S STARTER: RHP COREY OSWALT (0-1, 9.82)

LAST START: Made his first-career start and took the first loss of his major league career as the Mets fell to the Marlins, 8-2, at Marlins Park on June 29...Gave up six runs, earned, in 2.2 innings while allowing six hits and two walks with one strikeout.

2018 SEASON: Oswalt has made 10 starts for Triple-A Las Vegas this season, going 4-4 with a 5.32 ERA (28 earned runs/47.1 innings)...Has 49 strikeouts and 18 walks for the Las Vegas 51s...Has appeared in two games over four stints with the Mets... Made his major league debut out of the bullpen on April 26 at St. Louis, pitching 4.2 innings and allowing two runs, earned, with four strikeouts.

- Reached base safely in 15 consecutive games from June 15-30 (.500 OBP in that time).
- Owns a .458 OBP since June 15, the sixth-highest in the majors in that time (min. 50 PA)...His 1.049 OPS in that span ranks ninth in the NL.
- Returns to Toronto for the first time since playing for the Blue Jays from 2008-2017...In 1,235 games in a Jays' uniform, Bautista hit .253 with 219 doubles, 288 home runs, 766 RBI, 790 runs scored and had 1,103 hits...His 288 home runs are second-most in Jays history behind Carlos Delgado (336) while he also ranks among the franchise-leaders in hits (1,103, sixth), doubles (219, seventh), RBI (766, third), walks (803, second) and games played (1,235, fifth)...His 37.0 career WAR as a Jays position player is second-most in team history only to Tony Fernandez (37.5 WAR).
- Saw action at second base on June 13 in Atlanta...Was his sixth career appearance at second base and first since September 18, 2008 with Toronto.
