First Pitch

OF Ronald Acuña Jr. and Nick Markakis each hit the first pitch of their fifth inning at-bat into the seats yesterday to give the Braves a N.L. high-tying nine home runs on a 0-0 count this season.

The club is hitting .351 (61-for-174) on the first pitch of an at-bat with a N.L. high-tying 24 extra-base hits (12 doubles, three triples, nine home runs).

1B Freddie Freeman is hitting .476 (10-for-21) on 0-0 counts this season, tied with Joey Votto for most first pitch hits in the N.L.

TONIGHT'S GAME: The Braves and Giants open a three-game set tonight with the first game of the Braves' third homestand of the season...This is the first meeting between the clubs this season; the Braves will travel to San Francisco for three games, September 10-12.

A The Braves took three of the four games against San Francisco at SunTrust Park last season, the club's first series win against the Giants in Atlanta since the 2013 season.

A Tonight marks RHP Chris Stratton's first career start against the Braves...He tossed 2.0 scoreless innings over two games in relief against Atlanta in 2016.

A RHP Mike Foltynewicz faces the Giants for the sixth time in his career tonight...He dropped his only appearance against them last season, allowing five runs, earned, over 4.0 innings...Foltynewicz won both his starts against San Francisco in 2016, compiling a 1.32 ERA (2 ER/13.2 IP) with 10 strikeouts.

FIRST PLACE: The Braves have won five straight to move eight games over .500 and take sole possession of first place in the NL East...They have not been in first place this late into a season since after play on July 20, 2014.

A The next day, July 21, the Braves fell out of first place with a 3-1, 10-inning loss vs. Miami...From that defeat through the end of last season, the Braves went 232-317 (.423), the third worst record in MLB.

A The last time the club was eight games over .500 was July 30, 2014, when they were 58-50.

A The Braves have the best run differential in the N.L. at +57...They are one run behind Houston for the best differential in all of baseball.

A They have the fourth-best record in baseball.

ROSTER MOVE: The Braves today selected the contract of INF José Bautista from Triple-A Gwinnett and optioned OF Preston Tucker to the Stripers...Bautista will wear No. 23.

A Bautista hit .256 (11-for-43) with one home run over 12 games in the minors, including .250 (9-for-36) with the Stripers.

A The third baseman hit safely in his final four games with Triple-A, going 6-for-15 (.400) with four RBI and a home run.

SHUT OUT: The Braves tossed consecutive shutouts on Wednesday and Thursday in finishing off their sweep of New York (NL)...The Braves last allowed a run in the ninth inning on Tuesday.

A The last time the Braves tossed consecutive shutouts was the final three games of 2015 against St. Louis at Turner Field.

THE ROTATION: RHP Julio Teheran carried a no-hitter into the seventh inning yesterday before allowing a two-out double to Asdrúbal Cabrera...The 7.0 innings matched a season-high total for a Braves starter this season and came a day after LHP Sean Newcomb also went 7.0 innings.

A Braves starting pitchers have allowed one run or less in five consecutive starts and have collected the victory in each of those turns...They are averaging 14.7 pitches per inning over these five games...For reference, the Houston Astros lead the majors this season using 15.7 pitches per inning.

A Over the last 25 games, dating to April 4, the Braves starting rotation has compiled a 2.41 ERA while going 12-2 (.857)...The ERA is the best in the majors, while the 12 wins are tied for the majors lead with Cleveland and New York (AL)...No starting staff in the majors has less losses over this stretch.

A The Braves starters have won each of their last nine decisions...The last time a Braves starter lost a game was April 10 when Mike Foltynewicz allowed two earned runs over 5.0 innings.

A Over the first five games of the season, Braves starting pitchers had a 7.15 ERA (18 ER/22.2 IP) and the opponents compiled a 1.008 OPS against with seven home runs.

FIRST INNING: The Braves scored three more times in the first inning yesterday and have now scored a MLB-most 32 runs in the first this season...The club's nine home runs are one off the lead of the Colorado Rockies, while their .348 average is the highest in all of baseball...Only two other teams (Kansas City, .333 and Washington, .316) are hitting above .300 in the first.

A The Braves are now 10-2 (.833) when they lead following the first inning.

THE OFFENSE: The Braves offense leads all of baseball in batting average (.277), on-base percentage (.346) and slugging percentage (.456), while their 301 hits are tied for the most...They lead the N.L. in runs (172) and extra-base hits (115)...The club's 242 strikeouts are the fewest in the league.

A The Braves 172 runs through 30 games are the most since the 1999 team set the franchise record with 178 on their way to a 20-10 start.

A The last time the club reached 300 hits in their first 30 games was 2008, when they had 303 hits...The franchise record through 30 games is 321 by the 1959 Milwaukee Braves.

MARKAKIS: OF Nick Markakis hit in all 10 games of the road trip and is now batting a N.L.-high .336 this season.

A His 40 hits are the most in the N.L. and the most by a Braves player through 30 games since 2012 when Michael Bourn had 42.

Tonight's Game

- A* Makes his seventh start of the season and the 72nd (92nd appearance) of his career.
- A* Has held left-handed batters to just 11 hits in 63 at-bats, a .175 average.
 - A* Among N.L. pitchers who have faced at least 50 left-handed batters, his .175 opponents' average ranks fourth...Just two pitchers have allowed fewer than Foltyniewicz's 11 hits...Johnny Cueto and Brandon McCarthy have each allowed just 10 to lefties.
 - A* For his career, left-handers have batted .288 (227-for-789) against Foltyniewicz, while righties have hit .267 (226-for-846).
- A* Has allowed three earned runs or fewer in each of his last 10 starts, the longest such stretch of his career...Has a 3.04 ERA (18 ER/53.1 IP) and a .221 opponents' average during the run, which dates to 8/27/17 vs. COL.
- A* Has compiled a 2-5 record during the stretch and received just 16 total runs of support...In four of the nine starts, Atlanta has not scored with him on the mound.
- A* Is one of just five starters in the majors to have as long an active streak of three earned runs or fewer, and is the only one with a losing record...The other four pitchers are a combined 40-5.
- A* Is 2-2 with a 4.45 ERA (15 ER/30.1 IP) in five career appearances against San Francisco, all starts...Faced them once last season and allowed seven hits and five runs over 4.0 innings to take the loss on 5/27 at AT&T Park.
 - A* In 21 career appearances against teams from the N.L. West, is 5-7 with a 5.11 ERA (63 ER/111.0 IP)...The 5.11 mark is his highest against any one division.

2018 Recap

- A* Went 6.0 innings and allowed three hits and one run to earn his second win of the season, 4/28 at PHI...Struck out six.
 - A* Threw just 91 pitches, his fewest of the season...Went as deep in a game on as few pitches for the first time since completing 6.0 innings in just 82 pitches on 4/30/17 at MIL...Entered play averaging an MLB-most 19.2 pitches per inning.
- A* Tossed a season-low 4.2 innings, 4/23 at CIN...Allowed three hits, four walks and two runs, striking out seven.
 - A* Foltyniewicz left the game with the score tied 2-2, but Atlanta eventually lost 10-4...The Braves fell to just 1-11 in Foltyniewicz's last 12 starts.
- A* Logged his first "quality" start, 4/17 vs. PHI...Held the Phillies to four hits and one run over 6.0 innings, fanning eight.
 - A* The eight strikeouts matched his season high and gave him 26 strikeouts through 21.1 innings on the season...Through the date of his fourth start, his 10.97 SO/9.0 IP ranked fifth in the N.L. (min. 20.0 IP)
- A* Took his first loss of the season, 4/10 at WSH...Allowed three runs (two earned) over 5.0 innings of work, and struck out a season-low three.
 - A* Faced the Nationals for the second consecutive start, just the second time in his career he started against the same opponent in back-to-back turns...Also did so against Colorado on 7/16 and 7/21/16.
- A* Held the Nationals to four hits and one run over 5.1 innings, 4/4 at SunTrust Park...Walked two and fanned eight to earn his first win of the season and snap a career-worst seven-game losing streak.
 - A* Went 0-7 with a 7.34 ERA (31 ER/38.0 IP) over the spell, the longest losing streak of his career and tied for the second longest active streak in the majors at the time...The run dated to 8/11/17 at STL and spanned eight total starts.
- A* Took a no-decision in his season debut, 3/30 vs. PHI...Allowed five hits and three runs over 5.0 innings, striking out seven.
 - A* The no-decision snapped of streak of seven consecutive losses after he dropped each of his final seven starts of 2017...His skid in consecutive starts was one short of the franchise record, set by Preston Hanna from 1976-1978 and matched by Shelby Miller in 2015.
- A* Made five starts this spring, going 2-1 with a 3.38 ERA (6 ER/16.0 IP)...Allowed just 11 hits and give walks, fanning 10.
 - A* All six runs he allowed came over 2.0 innings in his last outing, 3/25 at DET...Opened his spring with 14.0 consecutive scoreless innings.

2017 Recap

- A* Spent his first full season in the majors and set career-high totals in wins (10), innings (154.0 IP), strikeouts (143), appearances (29) and starts (28).

- A* Was diagnosed with costochondritis on 9/2/15 and sidelined for the remainder of the season...Underwent surgery on 9/21/15, to remove the anterior half of his first rib...The procedure was performed by Dr. William Mayfield at Wellstar Kennestone Hospital in Marietta, Ga.
- A* Acquired by the Atlanta Braves along with RHP Andrew Thurman and INF Rio Ruiz from the Houston Astros in exchange for C/OF Evan Gattis and RHP James Hoyt on 1/14/15.

- Has seven extra-base hits, the most in franchise history for a player's first eight games... His 13 hits are also the most in a player's first eight games in Atlanta (since 1966) franchise history, and the most by any Braves player since 1961, when Mack Jones also had 13 in his first eight career games.
- Became the youngest player to homer for the Braves since Andruw Jones in 1997, hitting a solo shot off Homer Bailey for his first career homer on 4/26 at CIN.
- Atlanta selected his contract from Triple-A Gwinnett, 4/25, for his first appearance on a major league roster...Is the youngest player in baseball.
- Opened the season with Gwinnett and batted .232/.321/.304 over 17 games...Had 11 hits, seven runs, two extra-base hits and three steals in his last eight games.
- Entered the 2018 season tabbed as Atlanta's top overall prospect by both Baseball America and MLB.com, and as the top overall outfield prospect in the minors... MLB.com named him as the No. 2 prospect overall in the minor leagues.
- Named Minor League Player of the Year by both Baseball America and USA Today, Hitting Prospect of the Year by MLB Pipeline.com and Organizational Player of the Year by the Braves last season.

- Started with Single-A Florida, appearing in two games and collected two hits in seven at-bats...Made his Stripers debut on 4/23 and hit .250 (9-for-36) with his lone home run.
- Appeared in 157 games with Toronto last season, hitting .203 (119-for-587) with 23 home runs and a .308 on-base percentage.
