ROSTER MOVES: Prior to tonight's game, the Mets placed LHP Jerry Blevins on the Paternity Leave List, recalled LHP Buddy Baumann from Las Vegas (AAA) of the Pacific Coast League, recalled RHP Jacob Rhamé from Las Vegas (AAA) and optioned RHP Corey Oswalt to Las Vegas (AAA)...In addition, infielder Dominic Smith was optioned to Las Vegas (AAA) after the game on May 13 and outfielder Jay Bruce was returned from the Paternity Leave List on May 14.

WELCOME BACK: The Mets welcome back outfielder Curtis Granderson...The team will show a tribute video at 7:00 p.m... Granderson hit 95 home runs, 106 doubles and drove in 247 runs in 573 games with the Mets from 2014 until he was traded to the Dodgers on August 19, 2017 for RHP Jacob Rhamé...He is tied for the franchise record with 21 leadoff homers...Granderson signed with the Blue Jays on January 23, 2018.

METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets are 2-8 in their last 10 games and after starting the year 11-1, the club has gone 8-17...New York is 7-10 at home and has lost six straight home games.

VS. TORONTO: The Mets are 11-0 all-time vs. the Blue Jays in New York...The Mets have swept all four previous series vs. Toronto in the Big Apple (1997, 1999, 2001 and 2015)...The 11-game home winning streak is tied for the second-longest in franchise history vs. one club...Prior to this streak, the last time the Mets won 11 or more straight home games vs. one team was an 11-game home winning streak vs. Atlanta (1989-1990)...The franchise record is 14 straight home wins over the Pirates from April 21, 1986-June 7, 1987.

INTERLEAGUE WIN STREAKS: New York's 11-game home winning streak vs. the Blue Jays is tied for the longest such streak in Interleague history according to the Elias Sports Bureau...The Giants had two separate 11-game home winning streaks vs. Texas and Oakland.

INTERLEAGUE: New York went 7-13 vs. the AL last year...This marks the Mets first Interleague series of the year...The Mets will travel to Toronto on July 3-4...Since 1997, when Interleague play began, the Mets are 185-177...The .511 Interleague winning percentage is the best all-time among NL clubs.

HOME RUNS: The Mets have eight home runs in their last five games.

YO!: Yoenis Céspedes is tied for eighth in the NL with 28 RBI and tied for 10th with eight homers this season...Is batting .360 (18-50) with three homers and seven RBI in his last 16 games.

ASDRÚBAL CABRERA: Is third in the National League and ninth in the majors with a .326 batting average...He is ninth in the NL with a .552 slugging percentage, is tied for eighth with 19 extra-base hits and tied for fifth in the NL with 12 doubles...Cabrera is hitting .337 (30-89) with eight doubles, three homers, 18 RBI and 11 runs scored over his last 22 games.

HONORING RUSTY STAUB: Mets Hall of Famer Rusty Staub passed away on March 29 at age 73... The Mets will wear a patch on the right sleeve on their home and away uniforms during the 2018 season honoring Staub...A six-time All-Star, he had 2,716 hits and 292 homers during his 23-year career.



WE MEET AGAIN: The Mets acquired Noah Syndergaard along with catchers Travis d'Arnaud and John Buck and outfielder Wilmer Becerra from the Blue Jays in exchange for RHP R.A. Dickey and catchers Josh Thole and Mike Nickeas on December 17, 2012...Syndergaard has made one career start vs. the team that drafted him 38th overall in the 2010 First-Year Player Draft... He had a no-decision on June 15, 2015, his seventh major league start...Syndergaard pitched 6.0 innings, allowed two hits, one run and struck out 11.

NOAH SYNDERGAARD: Is tied for sixth in the NL with 54 strikeouts and fourth with 5.40 strikeout-per-walk rate.

SYN-SENTIONAL: Among active pitchers with at least 60 starts, Noah Syndergaard's 2.91 ERA (133 earned runs/410.2 innings) trails only Clayton Kershaw's 2.37 ERA and teammate Jacob deGrom's 2.90 ERA.

INTERESTING TO NOTE: The Mets are 5-1 after a scheduled off day this year.

JEURYS FAMILIA: Is tied for third in the majors with 11 saves... Familia has 111 saves since 2015, the third-most in the majors during that span

JASON VARGAS: Will pitch a simulated game today.

EQUIPMENT DRIVE: The Mets are teaming up with the Baseball Tomorrow Fund for their annual Equipment Drive at Citi Field on Sunday, May 20 before the Mets take on the Arizona Diamondbacks at 1:10 p.m...Any individual that donates either three baseballs, three softballs, a glove, a helmet, set of catcher's equipment or bat will receive a voucher redeemable for two tickets to select Mets home games in 2018...Items most in need are: baseballs, softballs, bats, gloves, catcher's equipment and helmets.

LAST TIME OUT: Syndergaard makes his ninth start of the season, first since May 6 vs. Colorado and sixth of the season at home tonight vs. the Blue Jays...In his last start vs. Colorado, left with the score tied after 6.0 innings and ended up without a decision for an NL-high-tying fifth time this season...Allowed two runs, earned, on six hits while walking a season-high four batters and fanning five...His four walks were the most he'd issued in a start since September 7, 2016 at Cincinnati...The outing was his fourth-consecutive quality start, tied for the third-longest streak of his career...The Mets have lost each of his last two starts by the same score (3-2).

REMEMBER ME: Syndergaard tonight faces Toronto for the second time in his career and first time since his seventh-career start on June 15, 2015...In that start, posted a then-career-high 11 strikeouts while holding the Jays to one run, earned, on two hits in 6.0 innings of work in a 4-3 Mets triumph at Citi Field...The Blue Jays drafted Syndergaard in the first round of the 2010 First-Year Player Draft and the righthander spent his first three professional seasons in their organization before he was packaged and sent to the Mets along with OF Wuilmer Becerra, C John Buck and C Travis d'Arnaud in exchange for RHP R.A. Dickey, C Mike Nickeas and C Josh Thole on December 17, 2012.

SOMETHING'S GOTTA GIVE: Since winning each of Syndergaard's first five starts, the Mets have lost each of the last three times he has toed the rubber, all in one-run games...Syndergaard has posted a quality start in each of those three Mets losses...This current streak is the sixth time in franchise history that the Mets have lost at least three-straight quality starts by the same pitcher, each time falling by one run (first time since the Mets lost three-straight Eric Hillman quality starts by one run in 1993)...The last time the Mets lost at least three-straight quality starts by the same pitcher was in 2016 when New York fell in four-consecutive Jacob deGrom quality outings...In his career, Syndergaard is 22-7 in his 43 quality starts and the Mets are 31-12 (.721 winning percentage) in those games.

SYN-CITI: Syndergaard tonight will pitch at Citi Field for his sixth home start of the season...Is 1-1 with a 3.62 ERA (11 earned runs/27.1 innings) in five home starts this season with 36 punchouts and eight walks...The Mets are 3-2 in those five starts...Owns a 2.70 ERA (69 earned runs/229.2 innings) in 38 games (37 starts) at Citi Field, the second-lowest ERA among all pitchers with at least 120.0 innings pitched at the ballpark, trailing only staffmate Jacob deGrom and his 2.33 ERA at home...Has yielded three or fewer earned runs in 23 of his last 26 home starts.

MAY: Syndergaard's start tonight is the 13th May start (14th game) of his career...His 2.20 May ERA (18 earned runs/73.2 innings) is the fifth-lowest among all pitchers with at least 10 May starts in the Live-Ball Era (since 1920).

THOR ON THE LEADERBOARD: Syndergaard currently ranks in the top 10 in the National League in strikeouts (54, t-sixth), strikeout rate (27.6%, seventh), walk rate (5.1%, seventh) and strikeout-to-walk ratio (5.40 SO/BB, fourth).

IN GOOD COMPANY...: Among active pitchers with at least 60 career starts, Syndergaard's 2.91 ERA (133 earned runs/410.2 innings) trails only Clayton Kershaw's 2.37 career ERA and deGrom's 2.90 career ERA...Syndergaard is one of only five active major league hurlers with at least 60 career starts to sport a sub-3.00 ERA...Ranks third in the NL in strikeout-to-walk ratio since 2015 (5.43 SO/BB), topped only by Kershaw (7.77) and Max Scherzer (5.82).

...AND ALL BY HIMSELF: Syndergaard leads the Mets' starters and ranks fourth in the NL with a 5.40 SO/BB ratio this season (54 strikeouts/10 walks)...He is the only pitcher in major league history to record a SO/BB ratio of at least 5.0 in each of his first three major league seasons...Posted a 5.4 SO/BB ratio in his rookie campaign, a 5.1 mark in 2016 and fanned 11.3 batters per walk issued last season.

RAGNAROKSTAR: Excluding his two starts at the tail end of last season as he recovered from a lat injury (2.0 IP vs. Washington on September 23 and 1.0 IP at Philadelphia on October 1), Syndergaard has pitched at least 5.0 innings in 58 of his 67 remaining starts...43 of those 67 starts have been quality outings...Has pitched at least 6.0 innings 48 times and at least 7.0 innings 25 times.

TOMORROW'S STARTER: RHP ZACK WHEELER (2-2, 5.03)

PREVIOUS START: Wheeler last took the mound May 9 at Cincinnati...In that outing, pitched 6.0 innings and allowed one run, earned, on four hits with three walks and seven strikeouts for his third quality start of the season...Has pitched 6.0 innings in consecutive starts for the second time in 2018 (also, his first two starts on April 11 at Miami and April 17 vs. Washington)

WHEELING & DEALING: Through his first six starts of the 2018 season, Wheeler owns a 8.2 K/9 ratio (31 strikeouts/34.0 innings)...Has fanned seven or more batters in three of his six starts this season, including two of his last three outings.
